4	tell you that we are conducting roll call
5	hearings via the online Webex platform which was
6	provided by the office of open government.
7	This case is Liff's Market. That's
8	Liff's Market, Case #20-PRO-00049, Liff's Market
9	LLC t/a Liff's Market, 600 Alabama Avenue, SE,
10	License No. ABRA-088858, Retailer Class B,
11	Application to Renew License. Is Mr. Mpras
12	MR. MPRAS: Yes.
13	MS. FLETCHER: Great. I see that you
14	made it in. Is your client present as well?
15	MR. HAILE: Yes.
16	MR. MPRAS: Yes.
17	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Mr. Mpras,
18	would you please spell your name for the record?
19	MR. MPRAS: Sure. First name is
20	Emanuel, E-M-A-N-U-E-L, M P-R-A-S.
21	MS. FLETCHER: Okay. And if you can
22	have your client state his name and spell it for
23	the record?
24	MR. HAILE: My name is Habtom Haile.
25	First name is H-A-B-T-O-M, last name is Haile, H-

	A-1-U-E.
2	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. And
3	who's present on behalf of the ANC 8C? Mr. Adofo,
4	are you present?
5	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Commissioner Salim
6	Adofo is present on behalf of Neighborhood
7	Commission 8C.
8	MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Adofo, would you
9	spell your name for the record?
10	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: S-A-L-I-M, last
11	name Adofo, A-D-O-F-O.
12	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. ANC
13	8C does have standing as a Protestant. I'm going
14	to set a date for the mediation. I'm going to
15	give you the next available day. Next available
16	day for mediation in Thursday, January 14, for
17	any time between 9am and 1pm. That's on Thursday,
18	January 14.
19	MR. MPRAS: This will be virtual,
20	correct?
21	MS. FLETCHER: I'm sorry, what was
22	that?
23	MR. MPRAS: This will be a virtual
24	mediation, correct?
25	MS. FLETCHER: Yes, and I'll send you

a WebEx invitation.

MR. MPRAS: Ms. Fletcher, before we get started, I would like to bring to your attention and object to the ground for protest, because the ANC has not stated their applicable matter for protest.

MS. FLETCHER: Just a second, please.

MR. MPRAS: This is a license renewal application, and this specifically falls in the lines of 25.2.1.4, which is digital considerations for new license applications for transfer of license to new locations only.

The appropriate protest standard for renewal is 25.3.1.3 and/or 25.3.1.5. We ask that the protest be dismissed for failing to state a valid protest claim.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, while I'm reviewing this, Mr. Adofo, do you have a response to that?

COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Not at this time.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Mr. Mpras, the Board in the past has allowed Protestants to file protests based on over-concentration. That's one of the bases of this protest, and based on that, I'm going to go ahead and grant standing to

	ANC 8C. As you know, the Board has the final say.
2	MR. MPRAS: I understand.
3	MS. FLETCHER: I'm going to grant
4	standing to ANC 8C, based on the fact that the
5	Board has allowed over-concentration as a basis
6	in the past. I will proceed in setting the date
7	for mediation. Is January 14 going to be okay?
8	MR. MPRAS: It will, ma'am. But I just
9	want to let you know that pursuant to 25.3.1.4,
10	over-concentration, 4(a), does not apply to
11	retailers class B, which is this.
12	MS. FLETCHER: I understand. And Mr.
13	Mpras, I assume you're going to file a motion to
14	dismiss the protest, but I'm making a decision
15	based on my past experience.
16	MR. MPRAS: Yes, ma'am.
17	MS. FLETCHER: The 14th is an option.
18	Mr. Mpras, that would give you time to file a
19	motion to dismiss the ANC, if that is your
20	intention.
21	MR. MPRAS: Yes, ma'am. The 14th is
22	fine for me. What time? 10am, preferably.
23	MS. FLETCHER: Would 10:00 be okay for
24	you, Mr. Adofo?
25	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: No, ma'am. I would

-	need to have a list of all the available dates	
2	for mediation so I can see which one will work	
3	best for us.	
4	MS. FLETCHER: Well, there are many	
5	dates available, but I'll give you the next	
6	available day. The next available day is Tuesday,	
7	January 19.	
8	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: I think that would	
9	be better. But our commission meets Wednesday, so	
10	I would need to talk with the commission to find	
11	out which is the best day for us as a commission.	
12	I am unable to confirm a date right now.	
13	MS. FLETCHER: Who's going to attend	
14	the mediation?	
15	MS. FLETCHER: So the commission has to	
16	vote on when you're going to attend the	
17	mediation?	
18	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: No, ma'am, but I	
19	would like to have some other commissioners there	
20	as well.	
21	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, so when do you	
22	meet?	
23	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: We meet on	
24	Wednesday.	
25	MS. FLETCHER: Wednesday the 13th?	

1	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: The 6th. We meet
2	in two days.
3	MS. FLETCHER: You think you would know
4	before the 14th? If you meet on the 6th, does
5	that give you enough time to know?
6	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Yes, ma'am.
7	MS. FLETCHER: So can we go with the
8	14th? The 19th would be better?
9	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: What I'm saying is
10	that we meet on this Wednesday and I would like
11	to bring it up in our meeting, so that
12	(Telephonic interference)
13	MS. FLETCHER: You don't think the 14th
14	will be enough time? We can move it to the 19th.
15	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Well, I don't know
16	if we'll be available until we meet this
17	Wednesday.
18	MS. FLETCHER: Exactly. And so the
19	mediation will be after this Wednesday.
20	COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Correct. And I
21	will tell them I was given the dates of the 14th
22	or the 19th.
23	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, so I'm going to
24	give you one day. I'm going to give y9u the day
25	of the 19, anytime between nine and one. Is 10:00

1 okay for you? I know you have to check first, but can we start with that? 2 3 COMMISSIONER ADOFO: Yes, ma'am. 4 MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Mpras, is 10:00 on 5 the 19th okay for you? 6 MR. MARAS: That's fine. No problem. 7 MS. FLETCHER: Mediation is set for Tuesday, January 19, at 10:00 a.m. At that time I 8 9 may have the status and protest basis for you, but I don't have those today.
