The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board
met via WebEx videoconference, Chairperson
Donovan W. Anderson presiding.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good afternoon,
4 everyone. We're back on the record. I apologize
5 for the delay.

6 Welcome to the afternoon session of
7 the ABC Board. We have seven members in
8 attendance today who are participating online.
9 Our seven Board members are Mr. James Short, Mr.
10 Bobby Cato, Ms. Rema Wahabzadah, Ms. Rafi
11 Crockett, Ms. Jeni Hansen, and Mr. Edward
12 Grandis. My name is Donovan Anderson. I'm
13 chairman of the Board. We have seven members who
14 are participating today, and so therefore we do
15 have a quorum that's going on.

16 Before we get underway with this
17 afternoon's calendar, I need to make a few
18 instructions for which are clear, so that the
19 conduct of these hearings is understood by
20 everyone.

21 There are 20 cases scheduled for this
22 afternoon. Once a case is called, I will take a
23 moment for our IT specialist to elevate the
24 rights for each party to enable their camera and
25 microphone. Then, and only then, will you have

1 the ability to engage your equipment. If your
2 case is not heard, you will remain mute, and your
3 camera will be disabled.

4 If you have any questions or require
5 technical assistance during the hearing, please
6 submit them using the question and answer feature
7 or email Simone at andrews@dc.gov.

8 All right. Our first order of
9 business today, and I just want to remind
10 everyone, our afternoon schedule, all the cases
11 are scheduled for 1:30. So I do have a calendar
12 that has all the cases. So don't try to figure
13 out when your case is going to be called. I'm
14 going to call, I will call them, because all the
15 cases are scheduled for 1:30.

16 It's just like when we have them in
17 the morning, we have the roll call at 9:30, and I
18 call all the cases. So all these cases will be
19 called starting at 1:30. And once I get to your
20 case, I will get to your case, okay.

21 All right. For this afternoon's
22 schedule then, the first case on our calendar is,
23 there's a summary suspension hearing, Case Number
24 20-CMP-00117 and 20-CMP-00118. And it's Barcode,
25 License Number 11593.

1 And Ms. Andrews, can you please
2 elevate the Government and please elevate the
3 licensee, please.

4 MS. ANDREWS: Sure, standby, Chair.

5 Mr. Asim, your rights have been
6 elevated.

7 Mr. O'Brien, your rights have been
8 elevated. That's all, Mr. Chair.

9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. I
10 would like the parties to introduce themselves
11 for the record -- I'm sorry, the parties to --
12 Mr. O'Brien, are you there? Yes? All right.

13 MR. O'BRIEN: Yes, Mr. Chair, I am
14 here.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. I
16 would like the parties to introduce themselves
17 for the record starting with the Government.
18 Please state your name and spell your name,
19 please.

20 MR. ASIM: Good afternoon, members of
21 the Board. My name is Shahzeb Asim, S-H-A-H-Z-E-
22 B, and last name, A-S-I-M. And I'm representing
23 the District of Columbia.

24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good afternoon,
25 Mr. Asim. Mr. O'Brien please?

1 MR. O'BRIEN: Yes, Stephen O'Brien for
2 Respondent Barcode. Barcode is a trade name, DMT
3 Group, LLC, is the entity name.

4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right,
5 thank you, Mr. O'Brien.

6 All right, this is a summary
7 suspension hearing that we have this afternoon
8 regarding Barcode.

9 Mr. Asim, are there any preliminary
10 matters in this case?

11 MR. ASIM: Yes, Mr. Chair, parties
12 have an offer in compromise they would like to
13 present to the Board.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Asim.
15 What is the, what's the offer in compromise,
16 please?

17 MR. ASIM: The offer in compromise
18 terms are as follows. Number one, suspension,
19 Respondent shall serve a 30-day suspension of its
20 ABC license. The date of the 30-day suspension
21 shall be Friday, December 11th, 2020, through
22 Sunday, January 10th, 2021, which includes time
23 served during summary suspension period.

24 The ABC license suspension shall be
25 lifted at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, January 11th,

1 2021, provided all other applicable requirements
2 in the OIC have been satisfied by the Respondent.

3 Number two, fine, Respondent shall pay
4 a \$1,000 fine for the citation previously issued
5 in Case Number 20-CIT-00445 within 90 days.

6 Number three, masks, accept when
7 eating or drinking while seated during the public
8 health emergency, the Respondent shall require
9 that all owners and employees of the
10 establishment wear a mask or face covering while
11 present on the licensed premises, regardless of
12 whether they are on duty.

13 The Respondent shall also require
14 patrons during the public health emergency to
15 wear masks or face covering prior to entering or
16 while waiting in line outside of the licensed
17 premises, while traveling to use the restroom, or
18 until they are seated and eating or drinking.

19 Number four, music and entertainment,
20 Respondent shall only offer recorded or
21 background music that is played at a
22 conversational level while the District of
23 Columbia remains subject to Mayor's Order
24 2020-067, Mayor's Order 2020-075, Mayor's Order
25 2020-080, Mayor's Order 2020-119 and in

1 accordance with the Board's notice of Eighth
2 Emergency Rulemaking.

3 Number five, operating hours,
4 Respondent shall not sell, serve, or permit the
5 consumption of alcoholic beverages past 10:00
6 p.m. but may operate for patrons until midnight
7 during any day of the week while the District of
8 Columbia remains subject to Mayor's Order 2020-
9 119, or Respondent shall not sell, serve, or
10 permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages
11 past 12:00 a.m. while the District of Columbia
12 remains subject to Mayor's Order 2020-067,
13 Mayor's Order 2020-075, and Mayor's Order 2020-
14 079, whichever applies in accordance with the
15 Board's rulemaking.

16 Number six, dining activities,
17 Respondent shall only serve food and alcoholic
18 beverages to patrons seated at tables while the
19 District of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's
20 Order 2020-067, Mayor's Order 2020-075, and
21 Mayor's Order 2020-119 in accordance with the
22 Board's rulemaking.

23 Tables shall be placed so that patrons
24 in different parties are placed at least six feet
25 apart from one another with no more than six

1 patrons per table. Patrons shall not be
2 permitted to walk around the establishment with
3 food and/or alcoholic beverages.

4 Number seven, patrons exiting with
5 alcoholic beverages, Respondent shall not permit
6 patrons to exit the establishment with alcoholic
7 beverages except when such beverages are in
8 closed containers and are accompanied by prepared
9 food.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Asim, hold
11 on. Do want to - Mr. O'Brien, can you please
12 mute your phone, please?

13 Go ahead, Mr. Asim.

14 MR. ASIM: Number eight, bar
15 activities, Respondent shall not seat patrons at
16 indoor or outdoor bars that are being staffed or
17 utilized by a bartender. Patrons shall not be
18 permitted to stand at an indoor or outdoor bar to
19 order food or alcoholic beverages.

20 Number nine, smoking, Respondent shall
21 not permit hookah smoking or any other form of
22 smoking at the establishment while the District
23 of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's Order
24 2020-067, Mayor's Order 2020-075, and Mayor's
25 Order 2020-119, in accordance with the Board's

1 rulemaking.

2 Number ten, capacity, Respondent shall
3 limit its indoor capacity to no more than 25
4 percent of the indoor occupancy load on its
5 certificate of occupancy, excluding employees and
6 outdoor seating, while the District of Columbia
7 remains subject to Mayor's Order 2020-119, or 50
8 percent of the indoor occupancy load on its
9 certificate of occupancy, excluding employees and
10 outdoor seating, while the District of Columbia
11 remains subject to Mayor's Order 2020-075,
12 whichever applies in accordance with the Board's
13 rulemaking.

14 Number 11, social distancing
15 walkthrough, prior to lifting the suspension of
16 the establishment's alcoholic beverage license,
17 an ABRA investigator shall conduct a walkthrough
18 of the licensed establishment with Respondent to
19 evaluate the establishment's compliance with
20 District's social distance requirements.

21 The evaluation shall include an
22 assessment of the Respondent's compliance with
23 Mayor's Order 2020-75, Mayor's Order 2020-080,
24 and 23 DCMR-810.2.

25 Twelve, show cause, the offer in

1 compromise, upon acceptance by the Board
2 constitutes resolution of the matters encompassed
3 by the above referenced case numbers.

4 Number 13, temporary dining
5 restrictions, Respondent shall comply with
6 Mayor's Order 2020-127 which prohibits indoor
7 dining from 10:00 p.m. on December 23rd, 2020, to
8 5:00 a.m. on January 15th, 2021.

9 And that concludes the offer in
10 compromise.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr.
12 Asim. Just a couple of quick questions, Mr.
13 Asim. This was a summary suspension hearing that
14 there was an incident occurred. And the Agency
15 issued, there was a summary suspension so the
16 establishment is closed.

17 Is it your position that if the Board
18 accepts this OIC that it would address the
19 emergency that existed?

20 MR. ASIM: Yes, Mr. Chairman. We
21 believe the OIC terms sufficiently address the
22 issues raised in the summary suspension. For
23 example, the OIC requires that patrons wear masks
24 at all times except when eating or drinking which
25 was one of the problems that ABRA investigators

1 observed when they visited the establishment.

2 The OIC terms also include a provision
3 that prohibits smoking while the Mayor's orders
4 are in place which was another thing that the
5 ABRA investigators found on their visit to the
6 establishment.

7 Another issue that is resolved in the
8 OIC is the capacity of the establishment is
9 limited to the applicable Mayor's orders,
10 whatever they may be at the time. And there is
11 also a term that prevents patrons from exiting
12 with alcoholic beverages, with certain
13 exceptions, which was something else that ABRA
14 investigators had observed on their visit to the
15 establishment.

16 And furthermore, the social distancing
17 walkthrough, which is required before the
18 establishment can reopen and the suspension is
19 lifted, will ensure that the establishment is
20 compliant with Mayor's orders and the Board's
21 emergency rulemaking.

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right,
23 thank you, Mr. Asim.

24 Mr. O'Brien, it is my understanding
25 that there is an offer in compromise that was

1 read into the record by Ms. Asim. If the Board
2 was to accept this offer in compromise, is your
3 Client aware that - but before I move on, the
4 terms that were read into the record by Mr. Asim,
5 is this your understanding of the offer in
6 compromise, sir?

7 MR. O'BRIEN: Yes, it is.

8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
9 Now, is your Client aware that, by accepting an
10 offer in compromise, that they are giving up
11 their right to a hearing?

12 MR. O'BRIEN: Yes, sir.

13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is your Client
14 also aware that, by accepting an offer in
15 compromise, that they're giving up their right to
16 appeal this matter?

17 MR. O'BRIEN: Yes, sir.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Are
19 there any questions by any Board members to
20 either Mr. Asim or Mr. O'Brien regarding the OIC
21 that was presented?

22 (No response.)

23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right,
24 hearing none, I then make a motion that the offer
25 in compromise be accepted. Is there a second?

1 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I second.

2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has
3 accepted the offer in compromise. And before we
4 have a vote on the offer in compromise, I need
5 to, again, read the terms of the offer in
6 compromise into the record.

7 The terms of the OIC are as follows.
8 Term Number 1, suspension, Respondent shall serve
9 a 30-day suspension of its ABC license. The date
10 of the 30-day suspension shall be Friday,
11 December 11th, 2020, through Sunday, January
12 10th, 2021, which includes time served during the
13 summary suspension period.

14 The ABC license suspension shall be
15 lifted at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, January the 11th,
16 2021, provided all other applicable requirements
17 in the OIC have been satisfied by the Respondent.

18 Term Number 2, fine, Respondent shall
19 pay a \$1,000 fine for the citation previously
20 issued in Case Number 20-CIT-00445 within 90
21 days.

22 Mr. O'Brien, please mute your phone,
23 please.

24 Number three, masks, accept when
25 eating or drinking while seated during the public

1 health emergency, the Respondent shall require
2 that all owners and employees of the
3 establishment wear a mask or face covering while
4 present on the licensed premises, regardless of
5 whether they are on duty.

6 The Respondent shall also require
7 patrons during the public health emergency to
8 wear masks or face covering prior to entering,
9 or while waiting in line outside of the licensed
10 premises, while traveling to use the restroom, or
11 until they are seated and eating or drinking.

12 Term Number 4, music and
13 entertainment, the Respondent shall only offer
14 recorded or background music that is played at a
15 conversational level while the District of
16 Columbia remains subject to Mayor's Order
17 2020-067, Mayor's Order 2020-075, Mayor's Order
18 2020-080, Mayor's Order 2020-119 and in
19 accordance with the Board's notice of Eighth
20 Emergency Rulemaking dated November 24th, 2020,
21 Board rulemaking.

22 Operating hours, number five,
23 operating hours, Respondent shall not sell,
24 serve, or permit the consumption of alcoholic
25 beverages past 10:00 p.m. but may operate for

1 patrons until midnight during any day of the week
2 while the District of Columbia remains subject to
3 Mayor's Order 2020-119, or Respondent shall not
4 sell, serve, or permit the consumption of
5 alcoholic beverages past 12:00 a.m. when the
6 District of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's
7 Order 2020-067, Mayor's Order 2020-075, and
8 Mayor's Order 2020-079, whichever applies in
9 accordance with the Board's rulemaking.

10 Number six, dining activities,
11 Respondent shall only serve food and alcoholic
12 beverages to patrons seated at tables while the
13 District of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's
14 Order 2020-067, Mayor's Order 2020-075, and
15 Mayor's Order 2020-119, in accordance with the
16 Board's rulemaking.

17 Tables shall be placed so that patrons
18 in different parties are placed at least six feet
19 apart from one another with no more than six
20 patrons per table. Patrons shall not be
21 permitted to walk around the establishment with
22 food and/or alcoholic beverages.

23 Number seven, patrons exiting with
24 alcoholic beverages, Respondent shall not permit
25 patrons to exit the establishment with alcoholic

1 beverages except when such beverages are in
2 closed containers and are accompanied by prepared
3 food.

4 Number eight, bar activities,
5 Respondent shall not seat patrons at indoor or
6 outdoor bars that are being staffed or utilized
7 by a bartender. Patrons shall not be permitted
8 to stand at an indoor or outdoor bar to order
9 food or alcoholic beverages.

10 Number nine, smoking, Respondent shall
11 not permit hookah smoking or any other form of
12 smoking at the establishment while the District
13 of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's Order
14 2020-067, Mayor's Order 2020-075, and Mayor's
15 Order 2020-119, in accordance with the Board's
16 rulemaking.

17 Number ten, capacity, Respondent shall
18 limit its indoor capacity to no more than 25
19 percent of the indoor occupancy load on its
20 certificate of occupancy, excluding employees and
21 outdoor seating, while the District of Columbia
22 remains subject to Mayor's Order 2020-119, or 50
23 percent of the indoor occupancy load on its
24 certificate of occupancy, excluding employees and
25 outdoor seating while the District of Columbia

1 remains subject to Mayor's Order 2020-075,
2 whichever applies in accordance with the Board's
3 rulemaking.

4 Number 11, social distancing
5 walkthrough, prior to lifting the suspension of
6 the establishment's alcoholic beverage license,
7 and ABRA investigator shall conduct a walkthrough
8 of the licensed establishment with Respondent to
9 evaluate the establishment's compliance with
10 District's social distance requirements.

11 This evaluation should include an
12 assessment of Respondent's compliance with
13 Mayor's Order 2020-75, Mayor's Order 2020-080,
14 and 23 DCMR, Section 810.2.

15 Number 12, show cause, this offer in
16 compromise of an acceptance by the Board
17 constitutes resolution of the matters encompassed
18 by the above referenced case numbers.

19 Number 13, temporary dining
20 restrictions, Respondent shall comply with
21 Mayor's Order 2020-127, dated December 18th,
22 2020, which prohibits indoor dining from 10:00
23 p.m. on December 23rd, 2020, to 5:00 a.m. on
24 January 15th, 2021.

25 That is the term of the OIC that has

1 been properly seconded by Mr. Short. We will now
2 have a roll call vote on the -

3 MR. GRANDIS: (Audio interference.)

4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis,
5 can you -- we will not have a roll call vote on
6 the motion that has been properly seconded by Mr.
7 Short.

8 Mr. Short?

9 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I agree.

10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato?

11 MEMBER CROCKETT: Bobby Cato, I agree.

12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Wahabzadah?

13 MEMBER WAHABZADAH: Rema Wahabzadah, I
14 agree.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Crockett?

16 MEMBER CROCKETT: Rafi Crockett, I
17 agree.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen?

19 MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen, I agree.

20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis?

21 MEMBER GRANDIS: Ed Grandis, I agree.

22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson, I
23 agree. The matter passed 7-0-0.

24 I would like to thank the parties for
25 working this matter out for the OIC, and this

1 matter - thank you very much. Have a great day.

2 MR. ASIM: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
