3	MR. CHEN: But you called my name.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But your case
5	is the next case. All right, hold on. Since you
6	are here Okay, hold on. This case is Case
7	Number 19-CC-00134 and 19-CC-00151. Okay, this
8	is this case, right, Mr. Chen. All right, that's
9	that case.
10	So, Ms. Krupke, can you please
11	identify yourself for the record, please?
12	MS. KRUPKE: Jessica Krupke on behalf
13	of the government.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Chen, can
15	you identify yourself for the record, please?
16	MR. CHEN: Chen. Joey Chen, J-O-E-Y,
17	last name C-H-E-N, the owner for Towne Wine &
18	Liquor.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
20	Thank you. Are there But, all right, okay.
21	All right. This hearing is canceled because the
22	parties entered an offer in compromise.
23	So, all right, Mr. Chen, you had
24	agreed to an OIC with the government, is that
25	correct?

1	MS. KRUPKE: Yes.
2	MR. CHEN: Yes.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. You
4	know what, let me All right. This case was,
5	and I'm going to do something that is somewhat a
6	little bit crazy, so this is what I am going to
7	do since you are here, Mr. Chen.
8	All right. This matter is on our
9	legal agenda for today. However, I have not read
10	the legal agenda as yet. However, because the
11	parties are here, I am going to go over the terms
12	of the OIC since the parties are here.
13	So, Ms. Krupke, do you have a copy of
14	the OIC in front of you?
15	MS. KRUPKE: I do. Let me just pull
16	it up. Okay, I have it.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
18	MS. KRUPKE: Would you like me to read
19	it?
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, please.
21	Mr. Chen, are you still there?
22	MR. CHEN: Yes, I am here.
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So,
24	Ms. Krupke, please
25	MR. CHEN: My camera is on?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, yes, sir.	
MR. CHEN: Oh.	
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So can you	
please read the terms of the OIC? And let me	
start, it's my understanding that there And	
this is somewhat a little bit different, so	
because of COVID an OIC was presented that would	
have been read on our legal agenda for today.	
But since I am calling the case and	
the parties are online I am, therefore, asking	
the government to review the OIC, which is for	
the case that is on our calendar and I will deal	
with it once I get to the legal agenda that is	
later on today.	
So that is how as Board Chair I am	
aware that there is an OIC because an OIC was	
presented earlier today to the Board. It was in	
writing and the Board would have considered it on	
its legal agenda for today.	
But because the parties are here, I	
will just have the parties state what the OIC is	
concerned and when I do the legal agenda later on	
then I will address that.	
So go ahead, Ms. Krupke, what are the	
terms of the OIC?	

Neal R. Gross and Co., Inc. Washington DC

1	MS. KRUPKE: So there is a total of
2	two charges and the terms are as follows. For
3	Charge 1, which is the sale to a minor, the
4	statutory authority is D.C. Code 25-781 and 25-
5	823.
6	For this charge, the fine is agreed to
7	be \$3000 for each case. So that's two cases, 19-
8	CC-00134 and 19-CC-00151, for a total of \$6000 to
9	be paid within 90 days or the license will be
10	suspended until the fine is paid.
11	Additionally, there is a term of
12	suspension. The license shall be suspended for
13	ten days for each case for a total of 20 days
14	with eight days to be served, which represents
15	four days per case, and 12 days stayed for one
16	year, which represents six days per case,
17	provided there are no violations in that time.
18	In addition, the establishment will
19	serve five suspension days activated from Case
20	Number 18-CC-00130 for a total of 13 days served.
21	The date of the 13-day suspension shall be
22	Monday, January 4, 2021, through Saturday,
23	January 16, 2021, and the license suspension
24	shall be lifted at 8:00 a.m. on Sunday, January
25	17, 2021.

1	Additionally, there is another term
2	that all employees who serve alcoholic beverages
3	in the licensed establishment shall complete an
4	alcohol training program within three months from
5	the OIC date.
6	For Charge 2, which is failure to take
7	reasonable steps necessary to ascertain the legal
8	drinking age, the statutory authority of D.C.
9	Code 25-783 and 25-823, there is no fine and no
10	suspension. This charge is dismissed for each
11	case.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
13	Thank you. All right, Mr. Chen, it is my
14	understanding that there is an offer in
15	compromise and the offer in compromise is that
16	there are two cases and these two cases are the
17	two cases Case Number 19-CC-00134 and Case Number
18	19-CC-00151, that for each case there is a fine
19	of \$3000 for a total fine of \$6000 to be paid
20	within 90 days. If the fine has not been paid
21	within 90 days the license will be suspended
22	until the fine is paid.
23	For Charge Number 2, there is a
24	suspension that the license shall be suspended
25	for ten days for each case for a total of 20 days

with eight days to be served, four days per case, and 12 days stayed for one year, six days per case, provided there are no violations in that time.

In addition, the establishment will 5 serve five suspension days activated from Case 6 7 Number 18-CC-00130 for a total of 13 days served. 8 The date of the 13-day suspension shall be 9 Monday, January 4, 2021, through Saturday, 10 January 16, 2021. The licensee's suspension 11 shall be lifted at 8:00 a.m. on Sunday, January 12 17, 2021.

13 Term Number 3, other terms, all 14 employees who serve alcoholic beverages in the 15 licensed establishment shall complete an alcohol 16 training program within three months from the OIC 17 date, which is today's date.

18 Charge Number 3, failure to take 19 reasonable steps necessary to ascertain legal 20 drinking age, there is no fine, there is no 21 suspension, and this charge has been dismissed 22 from each case. So, Mr. Chen --23 MR. CHEN: Yes? 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- is this your 25 understanding, sir, of the offer in compromise?

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1	MR. CHEN: Yes.
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you aware
3	that by accepting an offer in compromise that you
4	are giving up your right to a hearing?
5	MR. CHEN: Yes.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you also
7	aware that by accepting an offer in compromise
8	you are giving up your right to appeal this
9	matter?
10	MR. CHEN: Yes.
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: With that said,
12	I make a motion that the offer in compromise of a
13	fine for the two cases is a total fine of \$6000
14	to be paid within 90 days. If the fine is not
15	paid within 90 days, the license will be
16	suspended until the fine has been paid.
17	That's term 2, that the license shall
18	be suspended ten days for each case for a total
19	of 20 days with eight days to be served, four
20	days per case, and 12 days stayed for one year,
21	six days per case, provided there are no
22	violations in that time.
23	In addition, the establishment will
24	serve five suspension days activated from Case
25	Number 18-CC-00130 for a total of 13 days served.

1	The date of the 13-day suspension shall be	
2	Monday, January 4, 2021, through Saturday,	
3	January 16, 2021. The license suspension shall be	
4	lifted at 8:00 a.m. on Sunday, January 17, 2021.	
5	Term 3, other terms, all employees who	
6	serve alcoholic beverages in the licensed	
7	established shall complete an alcohol training	
8	program within three months from the OIC date.	
9	Charge Number 2, failure to take	
10	reasonable steps necessary to ascertain legal	
11	drinking age, there is no fine, no suspension.	
12	This charge has been dismissed in each case.	
13	I then make a motion that the OIC be	
14	accepted. Is there a second?	
15	MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short. I second.	
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has	
17	seconded the motion. We will now have a roll	
18	call vote on the motion that has been properly	
19	seconded by Mr. Short. Mr. Cato?	
20	MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato.	
21	(Simultaneous speaking.)	
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Cato.	
23	I apologize.	
24	MEMBER CATO: Yes.	
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short?	

1 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short. I agree. 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Wahabzadah? 3 MEMBER WAHABZADAH: Rema Wahabzadah. 4 I agree. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Crockett? 6 MEMBER CROCKETT: Rafi Crockett. I 7 agree. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen? 9 MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen. I agree. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis? 11 MEMBER GRANDIS: Ed Grandis. I 12 disagree. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson. 14 I agree. The matter passes 6-1 with Mr. Grandis 15 in disagreement. 16 Thanks to the parties for agreeing to 17 this OIC today. And as you are aware, Mr. Chen, 18 the terms of the suspension starts yesterday on 19 the 4th and so your business is suspended until 20 Sir, in COVID, I see that your 21 Sir, in COVID, I see that your 22 business is closed for a significant period of 23 time. I will say to you, sir, and I tell this to 24 everyone, that I recommend th		
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	25	everyone who comes to your establishment, sir,

should be asked to prove their age. 1 It's a District law. No one can 2 3 refuse to show you ID when they are buying 4 liquor. You see you have to pay a \$6000 fine and 5 I see that your business now is shut down. You will not be able to serve alcohol for 13 days. 6 7 And especially in COVID, this is a 8 significant fine, sir, but I hope that you 9 utilize the model that everyone who comes to your 10 establishment that before they, no matter what 11 they look like, sir, you need to ask them for ID 12 to make sure that whoever has been sold, if they 13 are 21 years of age, okay. Thank you. 14 Okay. MR. CHEN: 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 16 Have a great day. Thank you very much. 17 MR. CHEN: Okay. 18 MS. KRUPKE: Thank you. 19 MR. CHEN: Thank you. So I am good to 20 qo? 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. Yes, sir, 22 you are free to go. Thank you. 23 MR. CHEN: Thank you. 24 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter 25 went off the record at 2:51 p.m.)
