CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good afternoon everyone, and welcome to the ABC Board. This afternoon's hearing consists of, this afternoon's calendar consists of four cases. I want to introduce the members of the Board who are participating here today electronically.

My name is Donovan Anderson, I'm

Chairman of the Board. Joining us today is Mr.

James Short, Ms. Rafi Crockett, Mr. Edward

Grandis, Ms. Jeni Hansen, and Mr. Bobby Cato. We
do have six members here today, and so we do have
a quorum to conduct business.

Before we get underway with today's hearing calendar, I need to make a few instructions very clear so that the conduct of these hearings is understood by everyone.

There are four cases scheduled for today on this afternoon's calendar. Once your case is called, I will take a moment for our IT specialist to elevate the rights for each party to enable their camera and microphone. Then and only then will you have the ability to engage your equipment.

If your case has not been heard, you will remain mute and your camera will be disabled. Should you have any questions or require technical assistance during the hearing, please submit them using the question and answer feature, or email simone.andrews2@dc.gov.

Our first order of business for the afternoon is, it's a Summary Suspension Hearing for Case # 20-CMP-00116. Ms. Andrews, can you please elevate the rights of Mr. Richard Bianco, who's the attorney representing the licensee and Mr. Stephen Ortiz, who is the attorney representing the Government.

And if there are any other parties regarding this matter, please elevate their rights too. Thank you.

MS. ANDREWS: Mr. Ortiz, your rights have been elevated. Mr. Bianco, I'm not sure what device you are using. I cannot elevate your rights, but I can unmute you. Could you please announce yourself?

MR. BIANCO: Can you hear me?

MS. ANDREWS: Yes, we can hear you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Bianco, is
the licensee joining us today? Mr. Bianco?

24	something else you can do to make sure that we
25	can get a clear connection from you, sir?

8	back in and I just elevated his rights. Mr.
9	Bianco, can you unmute your line, please?
10	MR. BIANCO: Yes. I believe I've
11	unmuted my line. Is the Board able to hear me?
12	MS. ANDREWS: Yes.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, I can hear
14	you. Do you have a camera, Mr. Bianco? Or
15	that's fine. I'm just asking.
16	MR. BIANCO: I do and I'm enabling
17	that right now.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
19	MR. BIANCO: Hopefully you can see me.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, we can.
21	Okay. Good afternoon. All right. Good
22	afternoon everyone. I know that sometimes we
23	have some technological challenges, but it now
24	works. All right, can we have the parties
25	identify themselves for the record, starting with

	Mr. Ortiz. And spell your name please.
2	MR. ORTIZ: Good morning Board
3	members. This is Stephen Ortiz on behalf of the
4	District of Columbia. It's S-T-E-P-H-E-N, O-R-T-
5	I-Z.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr.
7	Ortiz. Mr. Bianco, can you identify yourself for
8	the record, please?
9	MR. BIANCO: Sure. Richard Bianco on
10	behalf of the respondent. Last name is spelled
11	B-I-A-N-C-O.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
13	Good afternoon Mr. Ortiz. This is a Summary
14	Suspension Hearing. Are there any preliminary
15	matters in this case?
16	MR. ORTIZ: Yes. The party's had a
17	recent offer in compromise we would like to
18	present to the Board at this time.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is
20	that offer in compromise, sir?
21	MR. ORTIZ: Well the OIC terms are as
22	follows. Paragraph one
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Bianco
24	I'm sorry, Mr. Ortiz. Can you just preface why
25	are we here today, please? Preface why we're

here before you go to the preliminary matter.

MR. ORTIZ: Yes. We are here based on the Summary Suspension that was issued on the establishment, to the establishment on December 3rd, based on violation of the Mayors orders that presenting an imminent danger to the public.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So as a result of the Summary Suspension Hearing, the Government then has negotiated with the licensee and they have an offer in compromise. So what is the offer that is being presented now?

MR. ORTIZ: Yes. The offer in compromise, as to the terms, are as follows: Paragraph 1, regarding suspension, the respondent shall serve a 40 day suspension of his ABC The dates of the 40 day suspension to license. be served shall be Friday, December 4th, 2020, through Wednesday, January 13th, 2021, which includes time served during the Summary Suspension period. The ABC license suspension shall be lifted at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, January 14th, 2021 provided all other applicable requirements in this OIC have been by the respondent.

Paragraph 2, masks. Except when

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eating or drinking while seated, during the public health emergency, the respondent shall require that all owners and employees of the establishment wear a mask or face covering while present on the licensees premises, regardless of whether they are on duty. The respondent shall also require patrons during the public health emergency to wear a mask or face coverings prior to entering or while waiting in line outside the licensees premises, while traveling to use the restroom, or until they are seated and eating or drinking.

Paragraph 3, music and entertainment.

Respondent shall not offer live music or
entertainment, including disc jockeys, while the
District of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's
order 2020-067, Mayor's order 2020-075, Mayor's
order 2020-080, Mayor's order 2020-119, and in
accordance with the Board's notice of the eighth
emergency rule making. The respondent shall only
offer recorded or background music that is played
at a conversational level, that is not heard in
the homes of the District residents.

Paragraph 4, operating hours.

Respondent shall not sell, serve, or permit the

consumption of alcoholic beverages past 10:00 p.m., but may operate for patrons until midnight during any day of the week, while the District of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's order 2020-067, Mayor's order 2020-075, Mayor's order 2020-080, and Mayor's order 2020-119, in accordance with the Board's rule making.

Paragraph 5, dining activities. Respondent shall serve food and alcoholic beverages to patrons seated at tables while the District of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's order 2020-067, Mayor's order 2020-075, and Mayor's order 2020-119, in accordance with the Board's rule making. Tables shall be placed so that patrons in different parties are placed at least six feet apart from one another, with no more than six patrons per table. Respondent shall have a menu in use containing a minimum of three prepared food items available for purchase and shall require patrons to purchase one or more prepared food items per table. Patrons shall not be permitted to walk around the establishment with food and/or alcoholic beverages.

Paragraph 6, bar activities.

Respondent shall not seat patients at indoor or

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outdoor bars that are being staffed or utilized by a bartender. Patrons shall not be permitted to stand at an indoor or outdoor bar to order food or alcohol beverages.

Paragraph 7, contact tracing system.

Respondent shall implement a reservation system

by phone, online, or onsite, and keep customer

logs to facilitate contract tracing by D.C.

Health.

Paragraph 8, capacity. Respondent shall limit its indoor capacity to no more than 25 percent of the lowest indoor occupancy load, or seating capacity, on a certificate of occupancy, excluding employees and outdoor seating, while the District of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's order 2020-119, or Mayor's order 2020-075, whichever applies in accordance with the Board's rule making.

Paragraph 9, social distancing of walkthrough. Prior to lifting the suspension of the establishment's alcoholic beverage license, an ABRA investigator shall conduct a walkthrough of the licensed establishment with respondent to evaluate the establishment's compliance with the District's social distancing requirements. This

evaluation shall include an assessment of the respondent's compliance with Mayor's order 2020-075, Mayor's order 2020-080, and Chapter 23 of the DCMR, Section 810.2.

Paragraph 10, show cause. This matter will be referred to the Office of the Attorney General for possible show cause proceeding.

Paragraph 11, temporary dining restriction. Respondent shall comply with Mayor's order 2020-127, which prohibits indoor dining from 10:00 p.m. on December 23rd, 2020, to 5:00 a.m. on January 15, 2021.

That concludes the terms of the OIC.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Thank you, Mr. Ortiz. All right. Okay. Is it your recommendation to the Board that if the Board accepts the terms of the OIC, that it will address the emergency OIC that the establishment would be scheduled to be reopened tomorrow, but it says here that if the Board was to accept this OIC, they would address the emergency?

MR. ORTIZ: Yes. It's my assessment that it would address the emergency. Also, just for the record, the establishment has already gone through with part of the OIC. The social

distancing walkthrough was, has already occurred. 1 That occurred on Monday, January 11th at 7:00 2 3 p.m. 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 5 Thank you. Mr. Bianco, it's my understanding 6 that there's an offer in compromise, and Mr. 7 Ortiz just read the terms of the offer in 8 compromise in the record. Is this your 9 understanding, sir, of the offer in compromise? 10 MR. BIANCO: Yes. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And has this 12 information been shared with your client? 13 MR. BIANCO: Yes. My client signed 14 the offer in compromise. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And is your 16 client aware that by accepting an offer in 17 compromise that they're giving up their rights to 18 a hearing? 19 MR. BIANCO: Yes. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And is your 21 client also aware that by accepting offer in 22 compromise that they're giving up their right to 23 appeal this matter? 24 MR. BIANCO: Yes. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. I'm going to make a motion that the offer in compromise be accepted, and the terms of the offer in compromise's Term 1, that there's a suspension, the respondent shall serve a 40 day suspension of his ABC license. The dates of the 40 day suspension to be served shall be Friday, December 4th, 2020, through Wednesday, January 13th, 2021, which includes time served during the Summary Suspension period.

The ABC license suspension shall be lifted at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, January 14th, 2021, provided all other applicable requirements in this OIC has been satisfied.

Term 2, by the respondent, Term 2, masks. Except when eating or drinking while seated during the public health emergency. The respondent shall require that all owners, and employees of the establishment wear a mask or face covering while present on the licensed premises, regardless of whether they are on duty.

The respondent shall also require patrons during the public health emergency to wear masks or face coverings prior to entering, or while waiting in line outside of the licensed premises while traveling to use the restroom, or

until they are seated and eating or drinking.

Term 3, music and entertainment.

Respondent shall not offer live music or entertainment, including disc jockeys, while the District of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's order 2020-067, Mayor's order 2020-075, Mayor's order 2020-080, Mayor's order 2020-119, and in accordance with the District's notice of eighth emergency rule making, and the Board's rule making.

Respondent shall only offer recorded or background music that is played at a conversational level, that is not heard in the homes of district residents.

Number 4, operating hours. Respondent shall not sell, serve, or permit consumption of alcoholic beverages past 10:00 p.m. but may operate for patrons until midnight during any day of the week while the District of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's order 2020-067, Mayor's order 2020-075, Mayor's order 2020-080, and Mayor's order 2020-119, in accordance with the Board's rule making.

Term 10, dining activities.

Respondent shall only serve food and alcoholic

beverages to patrons seated at tables while the District of Columbia remains subject to Mayor's order 2020-067, Mayor's order 2020-075, and Mayor's order 2020-119, in accordance with the Board's rule making.

Tables shall be placed so that patrons in different parties are placed at least six feet apart from one another, with no more than six patrons per table. Respondent shall have a menu in use containing a minimum of three prepared food items, available for purchase, and shall require patrons to purchase one or more prepared food items per table. 17	MEMBER CROCKETT: Rafi Crockett. I
18	agree.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen?
20	MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen. I agree.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis?
22	MEMBER GRANDIS: Edward Grandis
23	disagrees.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson,
25	I agree. The matter passes five to one with Mr.

Grandis in opposition.

I want to thank the parties for agreeing, coming together with this offer in compromise. Mr. Bianco, I know that Term 11 of the OIC basically stated that there is no indoor dining as of -- there should be no indoor dining after -- through January 15th, 2020 -- 2021. I just want to remind you to remind your client that the Board will be on our legal agenda today, there is this -- we're going to vote on the suspension of on premises sale, consumption, and consumption notice of tenth emergency rule making.

So we will be voting on that today and I believe, and I believe the term of that emergency rule making is that on premises dining is suspended, I believe through January 21st, 2021. So although the terms of the OIC states that that emergency expires on the 15th, I just want to let you know that once I do our legal agenda today, a subsequent Mayor's order was issued and that indoor dining will, the Board will be voting to cut it by notice of the Mayor's order to extend the suspension of indoor dining, I believe, through January 21st, 2021.
