Thank you. All right. This matter comes before the Board as a protest on the application to renew TMI International, trade name Sip, 1812 Lounge, Retailer Class Tavern, License No. 095164, located at 1812 Hamlin Street, Northeast.

By way of background, the Board's record reflects the following: the renewal application was placarded on April 5th, 2019.

ANC 5C represented by Commissioner Jeremiah Montague, Jr. filed a protest. ANC 5C was granted standing at the roll call hearing held on December 19th, 2019.

A status hearing was held on November 5th, 2020. The protest hearing was originally scheduled for August 8th, 2020 but was canceled due to the public health emergency and the COVID-19 pandemic. The Board began resuming its hearing in October 2020, and here we are today for the protest hearing.

Let us know turn to the attention to those preliminary matters that need to be addressed by the Board to determine whether we will proceed with this hearing. Last night, our legal division received a motion to continue this hearing filed by the applicant, Mr. Ijiti. This

morning, we received an opposition to motion to continue filed by the ANC.

Because these filings were made in the 11th hour and because the Board has not had an opportunity to fully consider the motion and opposition, I am asking the parties to argue their pleadings. Please tell me why the motion should be granted or not granted.

So Mr. Ijiti, as I've stated before, you have been aware that this case has been scheduled for a significant period of time. And now last night at the last moment, you filed a motion to continue. So can you, again, for the record, tell us why is it that you file this motion to continue and why should the Board grant your motion, sir?

MR. IJITI: Okay. Actually, I was out of the country and I didn't get the emails until I got back. So when I got back, I was trying to get in touch with my attorney. I couldn't get in touch with him until the last minute. And he said it wasn't a good time because he has no -- he doesn't have the full case on it at hand.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So I don't -- so I'm sorry, Mr. -- so when were you aware that

this hearing was scheduled for today?

MR. IJITI: When I got back on the 9th -- on the 8th, 9th of January.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you got back on January -- today is -- I'm sorry. So I know that we had -- I know we had the protest status hearing. And yes, I know that I did not issue a date for the hearing at the protest status hearing that I recall because we were not giving dates out.

So you're saying that you came back on January 8th, 9th, and that's when you were told. But why did you not -- that was just a couple of days ago. So why did you not inform us prior to 6:00 o'clock last night?

MR. IJITI: Because I was trying to get in touch with my attorney. And I believe he was on vacation too. So when I finally got in touch with him, yesterday was kind of too late for him to represent me.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But you were also aware that during the protest status hearing, I did inform both parties that if you're going to -- whatever documents or witnesses that you're going to rely on that that was supposed to

have submitted to the agency seven -- at least seven days prior to the hearing. So I'm just curious. And the notice was sent to all the parties on -- we sent the notice to inform you of the hearing on December 28th.

that you did not -- you tried to call your attorney. But you -- based on the instructions that were provided, I told each party that seven days prior to the hearing you were supposed to disclose your documents and witnesses. So even if your attorney had told you that he could represent you, you still never complied with -- you should have let us know at least from last week that you were having these problems. I don't understand why you waited until 6:00 o'clock last night to inform the Board that I need to hire an attorney and so therefore I'm asking for a continuance.

MR. IJITI: Basically because of a family emergency, that's why I was not able to inform the Board on time.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm not going to -- anyway, Mr. Montague, what is it that you're requesting that the Board should do?

MR. MONTAGUE: I'm asking for the Board to continue given the discussion and the presentation that you just made with ample time. And we complied with the requirement to do our filings. And we only became aware of this continuance request after 6:00 o'clock last night.

So we did what we were supposed to do.

I don't understand why the licensee should be
afforded an opportunity to continue. This matter
has been well known for quite a while. So it
seems unfair to the ANC and to the community that
we're going to drag this on longer.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you have anything that you want to say, Mr. Montague? Or is that the extent of your comments?

MR. MONTAGUE: That's the extent of my comments.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Ijiti, any other comments that you wish to make?

MR. IJITI: Like I said, I was in Nigeria. I didn't get the emails because due to the internet, the points and their connection over there. I didn't get the email until I got back. And I don't -- as far as with the exhibit,

it was too late because according to the email, I was supposed to turn them in before the 7th. So at least I did seek an attorney's advice to see what to do moving forward.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: My concern, Mr. Ijiti, is that you were given notice on the 28th of December. And I know that we are connected. So I'm just not convinced what you're saying that you did not get an email because you were in -- I mean, no matter -- one of the things that I know is that wherever you are in the world, the internet works. One can get email.

You run a business, sir. And I just don't understand how is it that you don't check email to find out if you're missing something where you can say I don't have connection with you. So therefore, I didn't get the email until I came back to this country. That's just --

MR. IJITI: Your Honor, it's very possible. It is possible, especially when you're in a rural area with the family, with grandparents. It's possible.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Thank you, Mr. Montague. Thank you, Mr. Ijiti,

for your comments. Mr. Ijiti, I am going to

reluctantly going to ask the Board to grant the motion to continue the hearing. While we do not appreciate the late filing, given that this hearing was originally scheduled for April of 2020, and because the applicant knew in November of the status hearing that this matter was going forward, the applicant is entitled to obtain counsel.

So with that, I'm going to ask the Board to schedule this matter for -- so therefore, I'm going to make a motion that we grant the hearing. However, I -- that we grant the continuance. This matter therefore will be scheduled for February 10th at 1:30 p.m.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All parties are required to submit their disclosure notice, their PIF seven days before the hearing.

MR. IJITI: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: This Board will grant no further continuances. The only way I'll grant the continuance is if both parties come to us and say that we're asking for a continuance.

and sympathize with you, Mr. Montague. I know that you were prepared to move forward today. However, because of the representation by Mr. Ijiti that he's trying to find an attorney and I can't afford for us to -- for this matter to go to court where we are -- the Board had been told that a continuance was requested in order for the licensee to obtain the services of an attorney.

And that is -- that can be considered good cause by the court in the sense that the court requires that you have adequate representation. And so that is the only reason why the Board has granted this request today because of the fact he states that he's seeking an attorney and he needs an attorney to adequately represent him. So I'm making that statement, sir, to say that it's not that I don't believe that your position is genuine.

But unfortunately, because he's asking 1 2 for an attorney and I do not want to deny the 3 request based on that reason alone. Okay? All right. All right.
