MR. CENCI: The parties have come to an agreement on terms for an Offer in Compromise that has been submitted to the Board just a few minutes before we started today.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. And so if there os am Offer in Compromise then I need you to review the Offer in Compromise and tell us whether or not you believe the Board has not seen this Offer in Compromise. It was sent to the Board. It was sent to the Board but we have not seen it and so have not reviewed it. So, I would like the parties to review and put into the record what they offer and the compromise is.

I will ask Mr. Bianco if this is the Offer in Compromise. I'll have the Board Members ask questions if they can and then the Board will probably end up going back into Executive Session to further this with Legal.

So, what I'll ask you to do, Mr.

Cenci, is to tell us what happened, why we're

here today and so just give us some background

about what happened and then I need you to go

1 through the terms of the Offer in Compromise. 2 You have to read the entire thing, you have to read the entire document because we have 3 to put this in the record for the Court Report. 4 5 Okay? MR. CENCI: Yes, Mr. Chair. 6 7 By way of background on the case this 8 essentially arose from an incident that took 9 place the morning of Monday, January 8th, in which in Sound Bar to be addressed in front of me. INVESTIGATOR MILLINGTON: My first name

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Thank you.

All right. Go ahead, sir.

MR. CENCI: Yes. So, at the establishment Sound Bar located at 1909 9th Street, Northwest, Washington, D.C. 20007. The morning of January 8th a patron assaulted three other patrons inside of the establishment's restroom with a sharp object stabbing three of them causing injuries to all three. One person was taken -- two people were taken to the hospital for treatment of their injuries. And the third person refused medical treatment. To our knowledge, the person who committed the assault remains at large.

When MPD arrived on the scene within minutes of the assault taking place, it was found that the staff of Sound Bar was already mopping up the floors. Mopping up blood, destroying evidence that had resulted from the incident.

After reviewing the establishment's records the parties have come to an agreement about a security plan to be put in place that

1 will hopefully prevent future incidents like this 2 for taking place at the establishment. And I'm glad to read the OIC into its 3 entirety onto the record that details the terms 4 5 of the security plan, that the establishment The security plan is attached to the 6 submitted. 7 party's submission as well. And it's our 8 understanding that the terms of the OIC are 9 accurately captured in the security plan. I believe the only issue remaining we 10 11 may need to do a quick edit for the Board's review but the establishment's LLC name is not 12 13 correct at the top of the security plan. that's a minor edit that we can address before 14 it's finalized. 15 16 The OIC also --17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What I need you 18 to do, sir, because we have to establish a 19 record. 20 MR. CENCI: I would read the entirety 21 of the OIC onto the record as well. 2.2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Oh. Okav. 23 Fine. 2.4 MR. CENCI: It's in your summary. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Fine.

And I believe the investigator's report notes that upon review of the video it showed that patrons were, in fact, being checked at the door on their way in. And I think that's important because the security plan and the OIC puts into place additional procedures for admissions of patrons but I didn't want that to suggest that there was some failure here by the establishment to actually do that. They were conducting the searches.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you for that, Mr. Bianco. And I guess you probably answered the question that I was going to ask that once I hear, once I listened to the details of the OIC because I did take notes on the underlying offense. So, I just want to make sure that whatever the -- that the Offer in Compromise that's provided that it covers, it addresses the issues in the underlying offense. So, thank you for alerting me to that. So, I guess I will sit up straight when I listen to the terms. Okay. Go ahead, sir.

MR. CENCI: Yes, Mr. Chair.

The parties understand that if the Board approves the Offer in Compromise the case will conclude. Respondent will be obligated to abide by the terms of the Offer in Compromise as read further. If the Board does not approve the Offer in Compromise mitigation of the summary suspension action will continue.

Respondent has been advised that there is no obligation to accept the Offer in Compromise. Respondent has been advised through service of the notice of Summary Suspension that at any Summary Suspension hearing or other proceedings Respondent may be represented by legal counsel, have subpoenas issued to require production of witnesses and evidence, produce witnesses and evidence, cross-exam the witnesses,

and apply to the Board for a qualified interpreter.

The Offer in Compromise terms are as follows.

Section 1, Security Plan. Respondent shall submit a security plan to ABCA and the Office of the Attorney General, OAG. The Board shall review and deem acceptable the security plan before lifting the suspension of respondent's ABC license. If the Board does not consider the security plan acceptable, the suspension shall not be lifted and a security clearance shall comply with all applicable requirements under D.C. Code, Title 25 and corresponding regulations including DCMR Chapter 23.

The security plan shall include 1A, Respondent shall utilize a District of Columbia licensed security agency to provide unarmed security personnel for crowd control, conflict resolution and emergency response services.

1B. After 9:00 p.m. upon entry or reentry all patrons regardless of gender shall be subject to search by metal detector wand, physical examination of all bags and purses and

1 pat down searches based on wanding results. 2 Respondent shall hire additional security as needed to wand and search female 3 4 patrons. 5 1C. Respondent shall not permit any employees, patrons or other persons to bring 6 7 firearms, knives or other dangerous weapons as 8 that term is defined in D.C. Code Section 224514 into the establishment. 9 10 1D. Established procedures for 11 handling violent incidents, emergencies, contact 12 to the Metropolitan Police Department, crowd 13 control, over-crowding prevention, security personnel locations, the number of security 14 15 cameras, preventing intoxication and preventing 16 entry of service to underage patrons. 17 1E. All employees must undergo a 18 criminal background check before starting 19 employment. 20 1F. Respondent shall utilize at least 21 two security personnel for operational floor 2.2 from, 10:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m. when the 23 establishment is operating. All security personnel shall be 2.4 25 equipped with portable two-way communication

systems and flashlights to maintain constant awareness of incidents.

1H. Security personnel shall check photo identification with visual scanners for all patrons at the door from 9:00 p.m. to 3:00 a.m. when the establishment is operating and shall not permit entry to anyone presenting counterfeit identification or failing to present identification.

- 1I. Staff shall not serve alcoholic beverages to any patron who is or appears to be intoxicated.
- 1J. Respondent shall preserve all crime scenes and scenes of any violent incidents and all staff and security personnel must remain on scene after a crime or violent incident until interviewed by MPD or ABCA and excused.
- 1K. All staff must provide accurate information during the investigations to MPD and ABCA. Upon a finding by the Board or stipulation by the respondent that the licensee knowingly obstructed an official investigation the employees who committed the obstructing act shall be immediately terminated.
 - 1L. Respondent shall utilize the

reimbursable detail officer or RDO program at least on weekends and holidays from 10:00 p.m. to 3:00 a..m. when the establishment is operating.

To comply with this provision the respondent may participate in the RDO contract established in conjunction with Shaw main streets for service to the establishment on the block of 1900 block, 9th Street, Northwest, or any similar arrangements which may be available in the future.

1M. Respondent shall submit to ABCA before reopening a diagram showing the location of all security cameras for the establishment which shall meet the technical requirements adopted by the Board in accordance with D.C. Code Section 25836G4 such as resolution, things for record, storage, retention, image quality standards.

Staff shall regularly monitor security cameras and at least one camera shall be positioned to have an unobstructed view of the front entrance of the establishment at all times that the establishment is open.

1N. All security cameras shall be kept in good working order when the establishment

The log shall be updated within 48 17 18 hours of an incident or weapon confiscation. Respondent shall surrender confiscated weapons to 19 20 MPD within 24 hours. Respondent shall make the 21 incident logo available to ABCA investigators and MPD within 48 hours of a request. 2.2 23 Respondent shall implement 1R. training and certification on how to identify and 2.4 25 handle intoxicated patrons, the escalation of

threats and violence, conflict resolution,
maintaining order, emergency protocols, first
aid/CPR and all reporting of incidents of
violence or injury to the ABC Board-approved
manager and any other appropriate authority and
preserving the scene of the crime security
supervisor.

Retraining on each of those issues shall be conducted quarterly for all staff and security personnel and new staff and security personnel shall be trained on the security plan and each of those issues within 14 days of hire. Training on the security plan for all staff shall be a precondition for reopening.

1S. Security personnel shall properly separate and remove patrons who initiate or participate in a violent altercation as soon as possible under the circumstances providing that doing so can be accomplished safely.

If more than one patron is involved, adverse patrons shall be separated and care shall be taken so the parties are not expelled at the same time, through the same exits or in any other manner not designed to minimize further confrontation.

Each member of the staff and security team shall certify by signature that they have completed the revised security plan training. Signed certifications shall be maintained by the respondent and shall be provided to ABCA within 24 hours of a records request.

1U. Security personnel shall wear uniforms with the words Staff or Security or other such similar words or phrase.

- 1V. Security personnel shall maintain order throughout the establishment including the outside entrance, stairwells and first and second floor interior.
- 1W. Respondent shall actively communicate with the Metropolitan Police

 Department and ABCA, share information about potential safety issues.
- 2. Security Cameras. Before the Board lifts the suspension of respondent's ABC license, the respondent shall insure that all security cameras are in working order and that footage from all cameras can be saved and

Within 30 days of the Board's order approving this Offer in Compromise respondent shall pay fine of \$4,000, including a \$2,000 fine for interfering with an ongoing investigation by providing false or misleading statements with the intention of influencing, impeding or obstructing the investigation under D.C. Code Section 25823A5C and a \$2,000 fine for interfering with an ongoing investigation by tampering with evidence under D.C. Code Section 25823A5D and A10S.

A failure to pay the fines within 30 days result in the immediate and indefinite suspension of respondent's license until the fines are paid in full.

- 4. Compliance Walk Through. Before the Board lifts the suspension of respondent's ABC license, an ABCA investigator shall conduct a walk through of the licensed establishment with respondent to insure compliance with the OIC requirements including the security cameras are operational as required herein.
- 5. Suspension. The ABC license suspension shall be lifted as soon as all

1 applicable OIC requirements are satisfied. 2 That is the property of the Offer in 3 Compromise and as I mentioned along our 4 submission of the written Offer in Compromise, a security plan was submitted to the Board that's 5 based on our review does comply with the Offer in 6 7 Compromise as we have outlined. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, sir. 9 10 Just a couple of questions before I 11 turn to Mr. Bianco. Do you believe that if the Board was 12 13 to approve this Offer in Compromise that it would 14 address the underlying issue why we're here 15 today? 16 MR. CENCI: Yes, I do. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And do you 18 believe that's an offer in the best interest of the residents of the District of Columbia that 19 20 this Offer in Compromise be accepted at least 21 from your point of view? This is, unfortunately, there are incidents occurring in establishments and we don't know. We need to do whatever we need to do to try to address those incidents.

I believe that's an excellent Offer in Compromise and I hope that this matter is no longer, it doesn't repeat itself.

I would ask the licensee, I'm not sure, I was told that it was an object in the bathroom that was utilized so maybe this is something that the licensee needs to figure out, okay. How can we change what's in the bathroom to insure that there are no objects in a bathroom that can be utilized anymore as a weapon. So, that's just my food for thought. Maybe this is something that should be looked out to see if any changes can be made.

I know we can't have cameras in the

bathrooms. So, I'm not faulting anyone for that. But just as a precautionary measure we now know that at least in this case your guests if they can't bring a weapon within the establishment that they're looking for weapons within the establishment to utilize. So, therefore, I would hope that the licensee take a look at its business model and try to keep its facility clear of any potential weapons.

I know that you can never know what it is. But that's just food for thought. Okay.

All right.
