MS. FLETCHER: I'm calling the matter of Randall Grocery. This is Case Number 20-PRO00057, B\&S Enterprises, Inc., 2924 Minnesota Avenue, Southeast, License Number ABRA 019046. This is a Retailer Class B License Renewal. The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet.

May I have introductions beginning with the Applicant, please? Mr. Shin, if you would state your name, and spell it for the record.

MR. SHIN: Yes, my name is James Shin, J-A-M-E-S. Last name is Sine.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, and how do you spell the last name, Mr. Shin?

MR. SHIN: Shin, S-H-I-N.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. Crystal Sin, you are going to be interpreting for your dad today?

MS. SIN: Yes, that is correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Could you spell your name for the record, please?

MS. SIN: Crystal, C-R-Y-S-T-A-L, S-I-

N, Sin.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Present on behalf on ANC 7B.

MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: This is Stephanie Griffith-Richardson.
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. BROWN: Wait, wait, that is
Tiffany.
MS. FLETCHER: ANC 7B.
MS. BROWN: I need to unmute to talk.
(Laughter.)
MS. BROWN: You think I would get this. I do this all day long.

MS. FLETCHER: I know.
MS. BROWN: Okay. All right, Tiffany L. Brown, T-I-F-F-A-N-Y, middle initial L, last name Brown, $B-R-0-W-N, ~ C h a i r ~ o f ~ A N C ~ 7 B . ~$

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Ms. Brown. Present on behalf of the Group of eleven.
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Howard-Chittams, you are the designated representative.

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Yes, Patricia Howard-Chittams, P-A-T-R-I-C-I-A, Howard, H-O-W-A-R-D, hyphen, Chittams, C-H-I-T-T-A-M-S.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Anyone else present with the Group of eleven?

MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: Yes, Stephanie Griffith-Richardson. Traditional spelling of Stephanie, Griffith, G-R-I-F-F-I-T-H, hyphen, Richardson, R-I-C-H-A-R-D-S-O-N.

MS. FLETCHER: Well, Ms. Griffin, hyphen --

MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: It's Griffith, I-T-H.

MS. FLETCHER: It's Griffith.
MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: Yes, ma'am.
MS. FLETCHER: Did you say -- and did you say hyphen?

MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: Yes, I -yes, ma'am, it's hyphen, hyphenated. Hyphen Richardson, so you have captured both parts of the name.
(Laughter.)
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you very much.
(Pause.)
MS. FLETCHER: ANC 7B has standing as a protestant. There is a group of eleven that is being granted standing as a protestant. Ms.

Howard-Chittams, I am aware that there was a larger group, but we granted standing to the 11 who provided us with their mailing address, and SO --

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Correct, I understand.

MS. FLETCHER: So conditional standing is being granted to the Group of eleven. Ms. Griffith-Richardson, did you sign the protest letter?

MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: Yes, I did, ma'am.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. That means that two are present today from the Group of eleven. The Board needs to see at least five individuals, which means that three more people from the Group of eleven will need to be present at the upcoming status hearing.

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: No problem.
MS. FLETCHER: At that point the Board will grant full standing to the Group of eleven. Today the group is granted conditional standing.

Ms. Howard-Chittams, do we already have email addresses for the additional three people that you want to appear for the status
hearing? If not, just send them to me.
MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Yes, ma'am, they should be on the form that was sent to you with the letter, but I can --

MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: -- resend them all again.

MS. FLETCHER: I will take a look at it. If I need it I will email you after the roll call hearing.

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Yes, ma'am.
MS. FLETCHER: Is there any particular three that you want to attend? We only need three more.

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: I would say the more the merrier.

MS. FLETCHER: Well, we do not need but three. So what is going to happen is this, if nine more people appear it does not change anything on this end.

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Correct.
MS. FLETCHER: We only need to see five, so with five --

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Okay.
MS. FLETCHER: -- people we will grant
full standing to the entire Group of eleven. So for us it doesn't matter if you have - - we do not need -- we just need to see five people. We still grant standing to the Group of eleven, but we only need to see five people, but if you want all nine people to come $I$ will invite all nine people, it's no problem. If that is your preference.

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Okay. Just Luwam (phonetic) and Emma -- I would suggest -(Simultaneous speaking.)

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: I would suggest -- my two suggestions -- and Luwam.

MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: Yes, and Luwam. Emma, Luwam --

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Your husband?
MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay, well, you can --
MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: I will email you the names and the email addresses to you.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Whatever you decide.

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Okay.
MS.FLETCHER: Three, nine --
MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Right.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. The Group of eleven is granted conditional standing until the additional -- at least three additional people appear for the status hearing. We need to set a date for a mediation and a status hearing. I am going to give you the date for the status hearing first, and you are going to receive a WebEx invitation to attend the status hearing as well. The status hearing is set for February the 11th. February the 11th at 10:00 a.m. Ms. Chittams, Howard-Chittams you are the only designated representative for the group. Are you the only designated representative?

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Myself and Stephanie Griffith-Richardson.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, I will add Ms. Griffith-Richardson as a designated representative as well.

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: We now need to set a date for a mediation. Ms. Sin, did you need to translate? I'm talking, not giving you an opportunity to translate. Do you need to translate at this point?

MS. SIN: Yes, I think we are okay for
now.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
MS. SIN: And then -- thank you so much.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, you're welcome. I'll give you the next available day for mediation. We try to make it before the status hearing, if possible, if not, you would attend the status hearing and let the Board know that the mediation is upcoming, but I'll give you the next dates available prior to the status hearing. The next available date for mediation is Monday, February 8th at 11:30, or 1:00 p.m. That is Monday. If you need something earlier we can do it another day. That would be 11:30 or 1:00 p.m. on Monday, February 8th.

MS. BROWN: That date is good for the ANC.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: It's good for me.

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: As of now that is -- it's good for Stephanie? What time?
(Pause.)
MS. FLETCHER: So it can be -- is that
good for you, Mr. Shin?
(Pause.)
MS. SIN: It's fine for the Monday. We would prefer if we could do the earliest spot, the 11:30.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Does that work for the ANC and the Group of eleven, 11:30?

MS. BROWN: 11:30 can work, yes.
MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: 11:30 can work.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
(Pause.)
MS. FLETCHER: Mediation is set for Monday, February 8th at 11:30. Does anyone have any questions about mediation?

MS. SIN: Since this is our first time going through the process I just want to make sure that we are clear, if there is anything that we need to prepare and/or just to understand the process in terms of coming through next.

MS. FLETCHER: Understanding the process, Ms. Sin, is pretty much all you would need to know at this point, and the purpose of the mediation is to give the parties an opportunity to come together to try and resolve
this matter. Basically, that is what happens, and Mr. Shin has an opportunity to hear from the protestants about their concerns, and to respond to them. If there is a way to resolve them then we do that in writing by way of a settlement agreement. If we get to that point and you submit the settlement agreement to resolve the concerns of the community. If the Board approves the settlement agreement, then the license -- the renewal license -- the renewed license is issued. MS. SIN: Okay, great. Thank you. MS. FLETCHER: If the -- and so, Ms. Sin, just so that you know, if the matter is not resolved -- it is not mandatory that the matter is resolved, it is just mandatory that everyone participate.

MS. SIN: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: If the matter cannot be resolved we move forward to the protest hearing-MS. SIN: Okay.

MS. FLETCHER: -- where the Board will hear testimony from both sides, and then the Board will decide whether or not to impose any conditions on the license, or whether or not the license should be renewed.

MS. SIN: Okay.
MS. FLETCHER: The mediation is just an opportunity to resolve this matter as an alternative to the protest hearing.

You are going to receive a WebEx invitation from me to attend the mediation same as you received to attend the roll call today. Mr. Shin, I will request a Korean language interpreter that will be invited to the mediation and will be present for the mediation.
(Pause.)
MS. SIN: All right. Thank you so much.

MS. FLETCHER: Once I get the name of the person I will email Mr. Shin the name of the interpreter.

MR. SHIN: Okay.
MS. SIN: If you could cc me on the response. I just want to make sure that I follow up.

MS. FLETCHER: I will. I will copy you on everything.

MS. SIN: Okay. Appreciate it. That you so much, Ms. Fletcher.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, you are very
welcome. Okay, any other questions?
MS. BROWN: Yes, is it possible to get
-- the ANC would like to probably -- we would like to enter into a settlement agreement given the history of this business, probably a more strict one to make sure things are done and enforced? So is it possible to get Mr. Shin's email address and his daughter's email address also?

MS. SIN: Yes, $I$ can respond in the chat with my email address. What would be also helpful from my perspective -- from an email communication my father is not tech savvy, so I will bring in further communication. I think it would be -- I think there is a miscommunication and understanding of the actual protest, so that can help mediate just more of the business matter. That would just be helpful just for the context and history, if there is any, just so that $I$ can help resolve any settlement concerns there are and so we can cut through resolving that matter simply in the next two weeks.

MS. FLETCHER: So for that, if you would put your information in the chat and I will

MS. SIN: Correct, I did that.
MS. FLETCHER: I would ask Ms. HowardChittams, as being the former ANC of that area and a close neighbor by, her and Ms. Griffith could probably give you better understanding of what the issues are with the --

MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: We can.
MS. FLETCHER: Yes, with the --
MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: Actually, I kind of think that the statement that Ms. Fletcher mentioned initially regarding the peace and safety of the community is sufficient at this juncture.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, so let me say this, Ms. Griffith-Richardson, during the negotiation process you will need to inform Mr. Shin specifically what you mean when you say he is having an adverse impact on peace, order and quiet in the neighborhood. He will need to know what it is that he is doing to adversely affect the neighborhood, so that he would be in a position to respond. So it was okay to file your protest based on peace, order and quiet, but right now we do not know what that means. So you do not need to discuss it today, --

MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: Understood, but I have looked at videos, and --

MS. FLETCHER: -- but at the point --
MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: -- yes. Oh, yes, we understand that when we sit down at the mediation that it is -- you cannot negotiate what you do not know, so we do understand that that would be part of the negotiation to inform in detail, or as much detail as we are willing to provide at that juncture. Trust me, we have decades of detail of --

MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
MS. GRIFFITH-RICHARDSON: -- what this business has done in terms of its deleterious impact on the community itself.

MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Brown, do you know if there is an existing settlement agreement with Randolph Groceries?

MS. MS. BROWN: No.
MS. FLETCHER: I have not checked that yet.

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: No, it is not.
MS. BROWN: No, it is not.
Unfortunately, there was an intent to do that before, but unfortunately the prior ANC did not
notify the community.
MS. FLETCHER: Well, if you are able to resolve this matter without mediation you can let me know, and I would cancel the mediation on February 8th, but $I$ will leave it on the calendar just in case we are going to come together. Anything else? Mr. Shin, any questions? Ms. Sin?

MS. SIN: No, I don't think so. I guess I will look out from an email from Patricia Howard, is that correct, from you directly?

MS. HOWARD-CHITTAMS: An email? I don't understand. We're meeting on --

MS. SIN: Or is that Tiffany --
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. BROWN: So Ms. Howard Chittams is the former ANC Commissioner for that area. I'm the ANC Chair of ANC 7B. The current ANC is Chioma Iwuoha.

MS. SIN: Okay.
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. SIN: I think I actually sent it to the host reply back to you directly. You have -- you do have my email?

MS. BROWN: It is csin, S-I-N.

MS. SIN: Yes.
MS. BROWN: Yes.
MS. SIN: Perfect. Yes, that is correct, yes.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, well, if there is nothing more, I'm going to call the next case. You're free to leave, or you can stay on the line if you like.
(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 10:25 a.m.)
