At the conclusion of each case, the parties will have the option to leave. If the party chooses to stay, all cameras and microphones for the concluded case will be disabled.

Our first order of business today on our calendar, it's a protest hearing status, Case Number 21-PRO-00085, Spar Liquor, License Number 105207. Ms. Fashbaugh, can you please elevate the rights of the parties in this case?

MS. FASHBAUGH: There's nobody on the line for this case.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. I will recall this case. So if there's anyone on the line for Spar Liquors, can you please identify yourself through the tech. I will -- I'm sorry, there's -- I see Commissioner Adofo just showed up on the line.

MS. FASHBAUGH: Yes. He's been elevated. I cannot find someone for -- oh, it looks like the licensee is here as well. It's Berhane Hailu. Your rights have been elevated. That is all, Mr. Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Go ahead, Hailu if you -- okay, good. All right.

Thank you. All right. I would like to have the parties identify themselves for the record. I will start with the licensee. Could the licensee please spell and state his name for the record and their relationship with the establishment, please? Mr. Hailu. You sir, yes. Yes, sir, you. Ms. -- hold on -- is his -- has his microphone unmuted, Ms. Fashbaugh, because I can't hear him. So I'm not sure if it's -- who's end.

MR. ADOFO: I am the Chairperson of Advisory Neighborhood Commission 8C and the representatives for the Commission.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Good morning. Thank you. All right. Are there any preliminary matters in this case that the parties wish to bring to our attention, to the Board's attention?

MR. ADOFO: We are working on a settlement agreement. We had a mediation yesterday.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Thank you. I'm glad to hear that. I -- the Board supports settlement if the parties are able to settle this matter. The Board supports settlement because at the end of th day, this is both of your community and if you can come to some agreement to coexist, then that's fine. least the Board will deal with that. The parties will work it out rather than the Board have to make a decision where one side might be happy, the other side is unhappy. So any other preliminary matters that either side needs to bring to the attention? Mr. -- I'm sorry, how do

HAILU: CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No? 6 7 No, not right now. MR. HAILU: 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 9 Okay, fine. All right. This matter then is 10 scheduled for a protest hearing on March 2, 2022 11 at 1:30 p.m. So this mater is now settled. 12 We'll have a protest hearing on March 2, 2022. 13 That clear with everyone? 14 (No audible responses.) 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Now 16 that I've scheduled this matter for a protest 17 hearing, there are a few things that I would like 18 to instruct you about because the Board's 19 practices under the COVID-19 restrictions have 20 changed. As you know, the Board's hearings are 21 conducted virtually, so it is more important than 22 ever that the protest hearings are focused and 23 addresses only those issues that are being 24 protested. 25 Following this hearing, you will

receive an email from ABRA Legal Assistant, Imani Moreland, that will include a copy of a protest information form, PIP, and a copy of an exhibit form as well as specific instructions for the hearing. You are required to complete and submit the PIP and exhibit forms at least seven days before the date of the hearing. If we do not receive a copy of your form seven days before the hearing, your application or your protest may be subject to dismissal. These documents need to be submitted to ABRA legal and to the opposing parties. Please know that these documents greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process, and keeping the parities on point during the hearing.

Each side is limited to no more than five witnesses, and you will have 60 minutes to present your case. This includes all direct and cross-examination. The Board does not intend to hear testimony in matters that are not relevant to the issues that are being protested. Any questions by anyone, please?

(No questions posed.)

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. We thank you greatly for your cooperation. If you
