The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met via WebEx videoconference, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson presiding.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good afternoon, everyone, we're back on the record. Welcome to the afternoon session of the ABC Board, my name is Donovan Anderson, I'm Chairman of the Board today.

All seven members are here in attendance. The members are participating today online are Mr. Short, Mr. Bobby Cato, Ms. Wahabzadah, Ms. Rafi Crockett, Ms. Jeni Hansen, and Mr. Edward Grandis.

The Board has seven members in attendance for the conduct of business and that constitutes a quorum.

This afternoon there are seven cases that are on our calendar for the afternoon. Once your case is called I will take a moment for the IT specialist to elevate the rights for each party to enable their camera and microphone.

Then and only then will you have the ability to enable your equipment. If your case has not been heard, you will remain mute and your camera will be disabled.

At the conclusion of each case, the

parties will have the option to leave. 1 If the 2 party chooses to stay, all cameras and microphones for the concluded case will be 3 4 disabled. 5 Should you have any questions or 6 require technical assistance during the hearing, 7 please submit them using the question-and-answer feature or email Simone at 8 9 simone.andrews2@dc.gov. Our first order of business for this 10 11 afternoon, it's our Case Number 21-CMP-00003 for 12 Swahili Village The Consulate, license number 13 114799. 14 Ms. Andrews, could you please elevate 15 the rights of the Government and the licensee in 16 this case, please. 17 Standby. Mr. Adams, MS. ANDREWS: 18 your rights have been elevated. 19 MR. ADAMS: Thank you. 20 MS. ANDREWS: Mr. Chair, I do not 21 believe the licensee is online but if there's a 22 representative, please acknowledge yourself in 23 the chat. 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who is the 25 licensee, Mr. Adams?

	MR. ADAMS: The licensee isi'm
2	trying to look it up. He has a representative
3	and the representative's name is SeanHe just
4	sent me an email.
5	Sean Morris, this is Counsel. And
6	I'll pull up the notice to see who
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Sean T. Morris.
8	Mr. Morris, if you're on the line could you
9	please if you have some difficulties, can you
10	please identify yourself in the chat?
11	MR. ADAMS: I don't know if any link
12	was given to him or anything like that but let me
13	just see here.
14	MS. ANDREWS: Mr. Chair, we have Mr.
15	Kevin Onyona as the representative and they are
16	not online.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: He's the
18	managing member but the attorney, Sean Morris?
19	So, Mr. Morris is also the attorney representing
20	Mr. Onyona.
21	MS. ANDREWS: And the attorney is not
22	online.
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Adams, do
24	you have an email address for the attorney to
25	send him a quick email, please?

1	MR. ADAMS: Actually, I'm on the line			
2	with Counsel right now on the phone. I was just			
3	going to speak with Counsel about the hearing and			
4	how to get on.			
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.			
6	MR. ADAMS: Hi, Mr. Chairman, this is			
7	Walter Adams. I'm actually on the phone now with			
8	Counsel for Swahili Village, Mr. Sean Morris.			
9	I'm not sure if there's a call-in			
10	number so he can call in directly but I do have			
11	him on my speakerphone right now.			
12	MR. MORRIS: Hi, Mr. Chairman, this is			
13	Sean Morris on behalf of Swahili Village. Thank			
14	you.			
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Andrews,			
16	can we provide Mr. Morris with call-in			
17	information?			
18	MS. ANDREWS: No problem. The call-in			
19	number, I can email Mr. Adams if I had his email			
20	address?			
21	MR. ADAMS: They said they can email			
22	it to you. Did you hear that?			
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, she can			
24	email it to him. What's his email address?			
25	(Simultaneous Speaking.)			

	Mb. AMDREMS. I don a want to put his
2	email address in the public record. He can just
3	enter it in the chat.
4	MR. ADAMS: I'll put your email
5	address in the chat. Give me one second. So,
6	what's your email address, Sean?
7	MS. ANDREWS: I've received the email
8	address. I just sent him the link, the call-in
9	number, the hearing password and the access code.
10	Mr. Adams, you're still on mute, just to let you
11	know.
12	MR. ADAMS: I apologize, I did not
13	realize I was on mute. So, Mr. Morris is going
14	to call in at this point so I'll disconnect him
15	from my phone.
16	So, we're just waiting for Mr. Morris
17	to call in.
18	MS. ANDREWS: Okay, Mr. Chair, I see
19	that he has called in, I'm going to go ahead and
20	unmute his line.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
22	MS. ANDREWS: Your line has been
23	unmuted, sir.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: This is the
25	Chairman and again, this is Case Number 21-CMP-

6	MR. ADAMS: Walter Adams representing						
7	the District of Columbia.						
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Morris?						
9	MR. MORRIS: And good afternoon, Mr.						
10	Chairman, Sean Morris on behalf of the licensee						
11	and thank you for your courtesy and I apologize						
12	for the confusion.						
13	I really appreciate your						
14	accommodations this afternoon.						
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You're welcome.						
16	Is the licensee joining us this afternoon?						
17	MR. MORRIS: The licensee himself will						
18	not be joining. I'll be here on his behalf.						
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's fine.						
20	Mr. Adams, this is a summary suspension hearing						
21	this afternoon. Are there any preliminary						
22	matters in this case?						
23	MR. ADAMS: There is a preliminary						
24	matter, Mr. Chairman. The parties have discussed						
25	the summary suspension, have tried to make						

efforts to settle the case, and are able to 1 provide the Board with an offer of compromise. 2 3 And I'm able to let you know the terms of what the offer of compromise is. 4 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What are those, please? 6 7 Chairman, for this summary MR. ADAMS: 8 suspension case the parties made the following 9 offer and compromised the terms as follows. 10 Number 1, that there would be a 11 suspension and the Respondents will pay or serve 12 a 13-day suspension of its ABC license. 13 The day of the 13-day suspension to be 14 served shall be Thursday, January 21, 2021 15 through Wednesday, February 3, today, 2021, which 16 includes time served doing the summary suspension 17 The ABC license suspension period. shall be lifted at 8:00 a.m. on Thursday, 18 19 February 4th, providing all their applicable 20 requirements in this OIC have been satisfied by 21 the Respondent. 22 Number 2, masks, as such when eating or 23 drinking while seated during the public health 24 emergency, the Respondents shall require that all

owners and employees of the establishment wear a

mask or face covering while present on the license's premises regardless of whether they are on duty.

Respondents shall also require patrons during the public health emergency to wear a mask or face coverings prior to entering or waiting in line outside the license premises while traveling to use the restroom or until they are seated or eating or drinking.

Number 3, music and entertainment.

Respondent will not offer live music or entertainment, including disc jockeys, while the District of Columbia remains subject to the nearest order 2020-067, nearest order 2020-075, nearest order 2020-080, nearest order 2020-119 in accordance with the Board's notice of the emergency ruling.

The Respondent shall only offer recorded background music that is played at a conversational level that is not heard in the homes of District residents.

Number 4, Respondent shall not sell, serve, or permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages past 10:00 p.m. but may operate for patrons until midnight during any day of the week

while the District of Columbia remains subject to the nearest order 2020-067, nearest order 2020-075, nearest order 2020-080, nearest order 2020-119, in accordance with the Board's rulemaking.

Number 5 is dining activities.

Respondent shall only serve food and alcoholic beverages to patrons seated at tables while the District of Columbia remains subject to the nearest order 2020-067, nearest order 2020-075, nearest order 2020-119.

In accordance with the Board's rulemaking, tables should be placed so that patron in different parties are placed at least six feet apart from one another, no more than six patrons per table.

Respondents will have a minimum use continuing a minimum prepared food items available to purchase and require patrons to purchase one or more prepared food items per table.

Patrons shall not be permitted to walk around the establishment with food and/or alcoholic beverages.

Number 6, bar activities. Respondent shall not seek patrons at indoor or outdoor bars

that are being staffed or utilized by a bartender. Patrons will now be permitted to stand at an indoor or outdoor bar to order food or alcoholic beverages.

Number 7, contact tracing system,
Respondent shall implement a contact tracing
system by phone, online, or on site and keep
customer logs to facilitate contact tracing by
D.C. Health.

Number 8, capacity. Respondent shall limit its indoor capacity to no more than 25 percent of the lowest indoor occupancy load overseeing capacity on its certificate of occupancy excluding employees and outdoor seating. While the District of Columbia remains subject to nearest order 2020-119, nearest order 2020-075, whichever applies in accordance with the Board's rulemaking.

Number 9, social distancing walkthrough. Prior to lifting this restriction of the establishment's alcoholic beverage license, an ABRA investigator shall conduct a walk-through of the licensed establishment with Respondent to evaluate the establishment's compliance with District's social distancing requirements.

This evaluation shall include 1 2 assessment of the response to the District's 3 nearest order 2020-075, nearest order 2020-080, and 23 DCMR Section 810.2. 4 5 Lastly, hearing to show cause, this matter will be referred to the Office of Attorney 6 7 General for a possible show-cause proceeding. 8 And this offer in compromise was signed by both 9 Counsel and the licensee on January 26, 2020, Mr. Chairman. 10 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Adams, 12 you're presenting this offer in compromise for the Board's consideration. 13 14 So, it's your view that if the Board 15 was to consider this offer in compromise and the 16 issues it addresses, it would address the issue 17 why the summary suspension was -- why there was a 18 summary suspension closer off to some than this 19 establishment? 20 Absolutely, Mr. Chairman, MR. ADAMS: 21 it does. 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Morris, Mr. 23 Adams went through the listing of the terms of 24 the OIC regarding summary suspension. 25 Did Mr. Adams correctly recite the

1	terms that you and your client agreed to, sir?
2	MR. MORRIS: Yes, he did, Mr.
3	Chairman. All was accurate in all respects.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is your client
5	aware that by accepting an offer of compromise
6	he's giving up his right to a hearing?
7	MR. MORRIS: Yes, he does.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And is your
9	client also aware that by accepting an offer in
10	compromise, they're giving up their right to
11	appeal this matter?
12	MR. MORRIS: Yes, he is aware of that.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I believe that
14	there is someone else for this case who wants to
15	be elevated, I was told.
16	So, I'm not sure, is this Mr. Shoeb?
17	Are you here for the Swahili case?
18	MR. SHOEB: Yes, sir, I am.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Morris, are
20	you familiar with this person?
21	MR. MORRIS: I'm sorry, I'm not. I
22	don't know who this might be.
23	MR. SHOEB: Sean, this is Emad Shoeb.
24	MR. MORRIS: Okay.
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you spell

1	and state your name for the record, sir, please?
2	MR. SHOEB: E-M-A-D, S-H-O-E-B.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Are
	-
4	there any questions by any Board Members
5	regarding the terms of the offer in compromise?
6	Hearing none, I then make a motion
7	that the Board accepts the offer in compromise.
8	The terms were just placed in the record by the
9	Government so there's really no need for me to
10	repeat them.
11	So, is there a second?
12	MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I second.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has
14	seconded the motion. We'll now have a roll call
15	vote on the motion that has been properly
16	seconded by Mr. Short.
17	Mr. Short?
18	MEMBER SHORT: I agree.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato?
20	MEMBER CATO: I agree.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Wahabzadah?
22	MEMBER WAHABZADAH: I agree.
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Crockett?
24	MEMBER CROCKETT: I agree.
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen?

1 MEMBER HANSEN: I agree. 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis? 3 MEMBER GRANDIS: I agree. 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson, 5 I agree, the matter therefore passes 7-0-0. I 6 would like to thank the parties for agreeing to 7 an offer in compromise in this matter, as stated 8 by the Government. 9 He believes that it effectively 10 addresses the emergency, why this matter was --11 why we are here today. So, I want to thank the 12 parties for their participation and have a great 13 day. 14 Thank you very much. 15 MR. ADAMS: Thank you very much, Mr. 16 Chairman. 17 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. MR. MORRIS: CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You're welcome. 18 19 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter 20 went off the record at 2:01 p.m.) 21 22 23 24 25
