The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met via WebEx videoconference, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson presiding.

3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case						
4	on our calendar is Case No. 21-CMP-0000, Hiwot						
5	Ethiopian Restaurant and Market, License No.						
6	100297.						
7	Ms. Andrews, can you please elevate						
8	the rights of the Government. I believe its Mr.						
9	Lui, and the Licensee, please.						
10	MS. ANDREWS: Sure. Stand by.						
11	Mr. Lui, your rights have been						
12	elevated.						
13	Ms. Teshome, your rights have been						
14	elevated.						
15	That's all, Mr. Chair.						
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.						
17	Ms. Teshome, can you please do you						
18	have a camera? If you have a camera, can you						
19	open your camera, please?						
20	MS. TESHOME: Yes.						
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Please open						
22	your camera. I'm sorry?						
23	MS. TESHOME: Okay. Is it open now?						
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, I cannot						
25	see you, ma'am. That's better. Thank you. Ms.						

1	Teshome, it's my understanding that you have			
2	requested a translator for this morning. Is that			
3	correct?			
4	MS. TESHOME: Yes, that is okay. I			
5	can go.			
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So are you			
7	stating that you are comfortable with moving			
8	forward with this hearing without a translator?			
9	Is that correct?			
10	MS. TESHOME: Yes, yes.			
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, fine.			
12	Thank you.			
13	Can I have the parties introduce			
14	themself for the record starting with the			
15	Government. Please state and spell your name,			
16	please. I cannot hear you, Mr. Lui. I cannot			
17	hear you.			
18	MR. LUI: Can you hear me?			
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, I can hear			
20	you now.			
21	MR. LUI: Good morning, Mr.			
22	Chairperson. John Lui on behalf of the District			
23	of Columbia. That's J-O-H-N L-U-I. Thank you.			
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.			
25	Ms. Teshome, can you state and spell			

1	your name for the record, please.
2	MS. TESHOME: Okay. My name is Sara
3	Teshome, S-A-R-A, last name is T-E-S-H-O-M-E.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What is your
5	relationship to the establishment?
6	MS. TESHOME: I am the owner.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
8	Mr. Lui, are there any preliminary
9	matters in this case?
10	MR. LUI: Yes, there is, Mr.
11	Chairperson.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is
13	that, please?
14	MR. LUI: There is an offer in
15	compromise to present for the Board's approval.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
17	Please tell us what it is.
18	MR. LUI: Certainly. There are 10
19	terms. No. 1, Respondent shall serve a 15-day
20	suspension of its ABC license. The date of the
21	15-day suspension to be served shall be Monday,
22	February 1, 2021, through Monday, February 15,
23	2021, which includes time served during the
24	summary suspension period. The ABC license
25	suspension shall be lifted at 8:00 a.m. on

Tuesday, February 16, 2021 provided all other applicable requirements in this OIC have been satisfied by the Respondent.

No. 2, Masks. Except when eating or drinking while seated during the public health emergency, the Respondent shall require that all owners and employees of the establishment wear a mask, a face covering while present on the licensed premises regardless of whether they are on duty.

Respondent shall also require patrons during the public health emergency to wear masks or face coverings prior to entering or while waiting in line outside the licensed premises, while travel to use the restroom, or until they are seated and eating or drinking.

No. 3, Music and Entertainment.

Respondent shall not offer live music or entertainment including disc jockeys while the District of Columbia maintains subject to the Mayor's Orders 2020-067, 2020-075, 2020-080, 2020-119, and in accordance with the Board's Notice of 9th Emergency Rulemaking. The Respondent shall only offer recorded or background music that is played at a

conversational level.

No. 4, Operating Hours. Respondent shall not sell, serve, or permit the consumption of alcoholic beverages past 10:00 p.m. but may operate for patrons until midnight from any day of the week while the District of Columbia remains subject to the Mayor's orders and in accordance with the Board's ruling.

No. 5, Dining Activities. Respondent shall only serve food and alcoholic beverages to patrons seated at tables while the District of Columbia remains subject to the Mayor's orders and in accordance with the Board's ruling. Tables shall be placed so that patrons in different parties are placed at least six feet apart from one another with no more than six patrons per table.

Respondent shall have a menu in use containing a minimum of three prepared food items available for purchase and shall require patrons to purchase one or more of the prepared food items per table. Patrons shall be permitted to walk around the establishment but food and/or alcoholic shall not. Excuse me, patrons shall not be permitted to walk around the establishment

with food and/or alcoholic beverages.

No. 6, Bar Activities. Respondent shall not seat patrons at indoor or outdoor bars that are being staffed or utilized by a bartender. Patrons shall not be permitted to stand at an indoor or outdoor bar to order food or alcoholic beverages.

No. 7, Contact Tracing System.

Respondent shall implement a reservation system by phone, online, or on site and keep customer logs to facilitate contact tracing with D.C.

Health.

No. 8, Capacity. Respondent shall limit its indoor dining capacity to no more than 25 percent of the lowest indoor occupancy load or seating capacity on a Certificate of Occupancy excluding employees and outdoor seating while the District of Columbia remains subject to the Mayor's orders, whichever applies, and in accordance with the Board's ruling.

No. 9, Social Distancing. Prior to lifting the suspension of the establishment's alcoholic beverage license, an ABRA investigator shall conduct a walk-through of the licensed establishment with Respondent to evaluate the

establishment's complaints with the District's 1 2 social distancing requirements. This evaluation 3 shall include an assessment of the establishment's compliance, with the Mayor's 4 5 orders, and 23 DCMR Section 810. No. 10, Show Cause. This matter will 6 7 be referred to the Office of the Attorney General 8 for possible show cause proceeding. 9 That is it, Mr. Chairperson. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, 11 thank you. 12 Ms. Teshome, it's my understanding 13 that there is an offer in compromise and Mr. Lui 14 just stated the terms of the offer in compromise 15 and in pertinent part stated that your business will remain closed from February 1st until 16 17 February 15th and that the suspension will be 18 lifted at 8:00 a.m. on February 16th. Is this 19 your understanding of the offer in compromise? 20 MS. TESHOME: Yes. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you aware 22 that by accepting an offer in compromise that you 23 are giving up your right to a hearing? 24 MS. TESHOME: Yes.

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Are you also

1	aware that by accept an offer in compromise that			
2	you are giving up the right to appeal this			
3	matter?			
4	MS. TESHOME: Yes.			
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.			
6	With that said, I make a motion that the offer in			
7	compromise that was read into the record by Mr.			
8	Lui be accepted. Is there a second?			
9	MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short. I second.			
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has			
11	seconded the motion. We will now have a roll			
12	call vote on the motion that has been properly			
13	seconded by Mr. Short.			
14	MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short. I agree.			
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato.			
16	MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato. I agree.			
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Wahabzadah.			
18	MEMBER WAHABZADAH: Rema Wahabzadah.			
19	I agree.			
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Crockett.			
21	MEMBER CROCKETT: Rafi Crockett. I			
22	agree.			
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen.			
24	MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen. I agree.			
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis.			

1	MEMBER GRANDIS: Edward Grandis. I
2	agree.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And Mr.
4	Anderson. I agree. The matter, therefore,
5	passes 7-0-0.
