3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.
4	We are the record. Good morning, everyone.
5	As Chairperson of the Alcoholic
6	Beverage Control Board for the District of
7	Columbia and in accordance with D.C. Official
8	Code Section 25764 of the Opening Meetings Act
9	I'm welcoming you to an emergency meeting of the
10	Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.
11	This meeting is being conducted
12	pursuant to guidance made available by the
13	District of Columbia's Office of Open Government
14	regarding electronic meetings held by public
15	bodies during the public emergency.
16	Pursuant to this guidance notice of today's
17	meeting was provided 48 hours in advance of the
18	meeting on ABRA's website and on the District's
19	central meeting calendar. The notice included
20	the time, date, agenda, and call-in or log-in
21	information for public participation.
22	This electronic meeting is being
23	hosted by a Webex account provided by the
24	District of Columbia government. Please address
25	any questions or complaints to the OOG at
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opengovoffice@dc.gov. 1 My name is Donovan Anderson. 2 I'm 3 Chairman of the Board. I would like to introduce 4 the other Board members, the members of the ABC 5 Board who are also participating electronically pursuant to Mayor's Order 2022-007. Please 6 7 respond when I announce your name. 8 Mr. James Short? 9 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. James Short. 10 Present. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Jeni 12 Hansen? 13 MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen. Present. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Edward 15 Grandis? 16 MEMBER GRANDIS: Edward Grandis. 17 Present. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board four 18 19 members in conduct -- I'm sorry, the Board has 20 four members in attendance today for the conduct 21 of business and that constitutes a quorum. 22 Just to advise the public, three 23 members of the Board -- any time there's three 24 members of the Board, that constitutes a quorum. 25 Our first -- our only order of

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business today is that the Board has convened today to announce its decision regarding the summary suspension action in Case No. 22-CMP-00006, which resulted in the summary suspension of ABRA License No. 087398 held by Drane Flannery Restaurant, trade name The Big Board, at 421 H Street, N.E., Washington, D.C.

8 On January 28th, 2022 the Board 9 executed a notice issued by the Office of the 10 Attorney General suspending the retailer's class 11 CT license held by Drane Flannery Restaurant, 12 LLC, trading under Big Board, under the authority 13 granted by the D.C. Official Code Section 25826, 14 23 DCMR Section 810, Mayor's Order 2021-147, 15 Mayor's Order 2021-148, and Mayor's Order 2022-16 007.

17 Specifically, the notice alleged that 18 between January 14th, 2022 and January 22nd, 2022 19 the ownership intentionally failed to comply with 20 emergency masks and proof of vaccination checking 21 requirements implemented to curb the spread of 22 COVID-19 in the District of Columbia in violation 23 of 23 DCMR Section 810.3(n), (o), (p), (q), (r) 24 and (s). The notice further alleged that these 25 violations constituted an imminent danger to the

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health and safety of the public.

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2 The Respondent subsequently requested 3 a hearing, which after the granting of the continuance, was held on February 10th, 2022. 4 At 5 the hearing the Government presented evidence that the spread of COVID remains a threat to 6 7 residents and visitors of the District of 8 Columbia. The spread of the disease threatens 9 the ability of our hospitals and other health 10 care providers to provide timely adequate and 11 lifesaving medical treatment, that bars and 12 restaurants remain a significant source of 13 outbreaks in the District, and that mask wearing 14 and proof of vaccine checking requirements are 15 necessary measures to protect the health, safety, 16 and welfare of the public. 17 The Government demonstrated that The 18 Big Board failed to comply with required mask 19 wearing, sign posting, and proof of vaccine 20 checking requirements in January of this year. 21 The Board further provided an 22 opportunity for The Big Board to mount a defense. 23 Nevertheless, during the hearing it did not 24 significantly challenge the facts, did not 25 demonstrate that COVID-19 is not a danger to the

public, did not demonstrate that our medical
system was not in danger of collapse, and did not
demonstrate that the District's mitigating
measures were necessary.

5 The Board further notes that whatever 6 objections The Big Board has regarding the 7 District's mitigating measures, such objections 8 were not significantly elaborated upon.

9 It should be further noted that The 10 Big Board did not share any specific legal 11 objections to the Board's actions which had they 12 had any merit whatsoever could have impacted the 13 Board's final decision. Therefore, as far as the 14 Board is concerned such objections are waived in 15 this forum.

In light of this record where the 16 17 Government's case has been proven without 18 significant objection, the Board finds that the 19 continued operation of The Big Board presents an 20 imminent danger to the public, specifically the 21 past refusal of the owner of The Big Board, Eric 22 Flannery, to comply with emergency mask wearing 23 and proof of vaccine checking requirements on an 24 ongoing basis constitutes a threat to the health, 25 safety, and welfare of the public, and the

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ability of the District to offer adequate timely and immediate medical care.

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3 Even worse, the owner's known and repeated refusal to require his employees to wear 4 masks jeopardizes his own staff's health and 5 well-being. Simply put, Mr. Flannery's actions 6 7 constitute a disturbing use of the 8 employer/employee -- employee/employer 9 relationship that demonstrates a mentality akin to a mine owner that puts his miners in danger by 10 11 ignoring safe mining regulations.

12 Indeed, it is simply mind-boggling 13 that Mr. Flannery could show so much little 14 regard for the people who work for him and put 15 food in his mouth on a daily basis.

In this case the Board further 16 considered the Respondent's proposal to only 17 18 permit carry-out and mandated mask wearing --19 with mandated mask wearing. However, the Board 20 rejects this proposal because Mr. Flannery cannot 21 be trusted to diligently comply with any COVID-19 22 mitigation measures where ABRA investigators 23 visited the establishment on multiple occasions 24 and gave multiple verbal and written warnings to 25 Mr. Flannery that were intentionally ignored.

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1	Simply put, if Mr. Flannery is not
2	going to respect the warnings of the Board's
3	agents and emergency orders issued by the mayor,
4	there is no reason for the Board to believe that
5	he would follow any requirements imposed by the
6	Board with the diligence that we would require.
7	Consequently, because the Board's
8	The Big Board's ownership cannot be trusted to
9	diligently comply with the critical COVID-19
10	mitigation rules, the license shall be suspended
11	until all mask wearing and proof of vaccine
12	checking requirements acting on premises
13	retailers regulated by the Alcohol Beverage
14	Regulation Administration are no longer in effect
15	and have been repealed, amended, or superseded.
16	An order describing the Board's
17	opinion and reasoning shall be available today to
18	the parties. And this decision was voted 6-0-0
19	by the Board.
20	That's the Board's decision. Thank
21	you very much. Have a great day.
