CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Our next case is case number 22-PRO-00001, Hillview Market, license number 119160. Ms. Fashbaugh, can you please elevate the rights of the parties in this case, please?

MS. FASHBAUGH: Please stand by. Dinesh Tandon, your rights have been elevated or rather $I$ can't elevate you so $I$ will unmute you. It has been communicated to me that he will be representing his wife for Hillview Market. Kirby Vining, your rights have been elevated. (Pause.) Eric Tomasi, your rights have been elevated. (Pause.) I do not see Commissioner Teri Janine Quinn. Commissioner Dianne Barnes, your rights have been elevated. (Pause.) That is all, Mr. Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. I need to make sure that we have a representative from the Stronghold Civic Association, the group of five or more, the Bloomingdale Civic Association and ANC 5E. So, I think we're missing -- are we missing? Who are we missing? (Pause.) We have the group of five or more. Is
there someone representing the Bloomingdale Civic Association? (Pause.) Do we have any representatives of the Bloomingdale Civic Association? (Pause.) Do we have a representative of ANC 5E?

MS. BARNES: Yes.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
MS. BARNES: I'm not showing the video. I did -- I was able to unmute myself.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. You should be able to show your video if you have a video. Do we have someone from the Stronghold Civic Association? Yes. All right, thanks. Do we know who the representative of the -- is Teri Quinn the representative of the Bloomingdale Civic Association? Ms. Quinn, if you're on line can you please identify yourself through the chat? (Pause.) All right. Okay, good morning again everyone. This case is the Hillview Market. Who is the licensee? Can we have the licensee, please, identify him or herself and spell and state their name for the record?

MS. TANDON: Hi, Your Honor. My name is Mithi Tandon. I am Dinesh Tandon's wife and for the license number 119160, the Hillview

Market.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, can you please spell and state your name for the record, ma'am?

MS. TANDON: It's I-T-H-I Mithi first name and the last name is Tandon T-A-N-D-O-N.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And are you on the license, ma'am?

MS. TANDON: I'm sorry?
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you on the license?

MS. TANDON: Yes, yes, sir.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. All right. You're from the Hillview Market, is that correct?

MS. TANDON: Yes. Yes.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Let's have the representative of the Stronghold Civic Association please spell and state your name for the record, please.

MR. VINING: Yes, can you hear me?
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir.
MR. VINING: I'm Kirby Vining. I'll spell $K$ as in Kenneth-I-R-B-Y last name Vining V as in Victor-I-N-I-N-G. I'm one of the elected
officers of the Stronghold Civic Association representing them today.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank you. Who is here from the group of five or more? (Pause.)

MR. TOMASI: Yes, hello, my name is Eric Tomasi. My name is spelled E-R-I-C last name T-O-M-A-S-I and I'm the designated representative for the group of five.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Ms. Barnes? Can you spell and state your name for the record and your representation, ma'am?

MS. BARNES: Yes, Dianne Barnes D-I-A-N-N-E Barnes B-A-R-N-E-S. I'm representing ANC.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is there anyone here from the Bloomingdale Civic Association? (Pause.) Is there anyone (Simultaneous speaking.)

MS. BARNES: Ms. Quinn stated that she would be here, but she does have an assistant. Could I ask you to get her on the line?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: If you're able to get someone from the Bloomingdale Civic Association, please do because if not, I'm going to make a motion that ***11:00:26 be dismissed.

MS. BARNES: Okay.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So that's why I want to make sure that they're not having any technical difficulties. (Pause.)

MS. TANDON: Excuse me, Your Honor.
Can I authorize my husband, Dinesh Tandon, to talk on behalf of me?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is your husband on the license, ma'am? Yes, yes you can. You can. You're saying that he wants to represent you, that's fine, ma'am. What is your husband's name and is he on the line?

MS. TANDON: Yes.
MR. TANDON: Yes. Hello, Your Honor. My name is Dinesh Tandon.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you spell and state your name for the record, please, sir?

MR. TANDON: Dinesh is D as in David-I-N-E-S-H last name Tandon T-A-N-D-O-N.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And you are -are you on the license, sir?

MR. TANDON: Sir, I'm not on the license, no.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, but your wife is authorizing you to speak --

MR. TANDON: Yes, sir.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: For her today?
All right, now do you guys have a camera? (Simultaneous speaking.) So we can see (Simultaneous speaking.)

MR. TANDON: I tried my best, but I for some reason, $I$ don't know why it's -- I don't --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay.
MR. TANDON: I have a camera, but I don't know how to turn it on. (Pause.)

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. (Pause.)

MR. TANDON: I am not being able to turn on the camera, sir. I'm very sorry.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, that's fine. That's fine. (Pause.) Ms. Barnes, are you able to find someone from the Bloomingdale Civic Association?

MS. BARNES: Okay, do I need to send a link to Ms. Evelyn Brown?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, who?
MS. BARNES: Evelyn Brown is the assistant to Teri for the Bloomingdale Civic Association. (Pause.)

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, yes, yes, Mr. Vining?

MR. VINING: Yes, $I$ just sent an email to Ms. Quinn and her alternate and I just this second received a note from Ms. Quinn saying she's on her way. She's having trouble logging in. It's Teri Janine Quinn.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Do we know what type of -- do you know what type of problem she has to logging in, sir? She can, if not, she can call in on the telephone.

MR. VINING: She didn't say. She just had trouble logging in. I'll pass that along.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: There's a phone number where she can call in and if she calls in, we can elevate her rights. The reason why I'm taking this time is because all parties have to be here for the status hearing. If they're not here, $I$ will make a motion to dismiss them, so that's one of the reasons $I$ want to make sure that folks are not having technical difficulties in logging in. And they're not here because they're not here, not because they're having difficulties. So, if she is on the line and she wants us to elevate her rights or she's on the
telephone, just let us know and we will elevate her, we will unmute her line on the telephone or elevate her rights virtually. (Pause.) Has anyone heard from Ms. Quinn or from her assistant so we can move on because we need to move on with this.

MS. BARNES: I forwarded the e-mail to Ms. Brown, who is her alternate.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do we know are they trying to log in? Do we need to do --

MS. BARNES: Let me give her a call back and see.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do we need to -- do their rights need to be elevated? So I need to know that they're there so I can have our IT specialist elevated their rights, so that's what I'm trying to find out.

MS. BARNES: Okay. (Pause.)
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Barnes, please mute yourself, madam.

MS. FASHBAUGH: Chairperson? We have a new call in user.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who is that?
MS. FASHBAUGH: The number starts with
a two. I'm going to unmute them to see if they
are Teri Janine Quinn.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, thank you. (Simultaneous speaking.)

MS. QUINN: Hi, this is Teri Janine Quinn.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, okay, fine. Thank you. All right, good morning everyone. This is again the protest hearing for case number 20-PRO-00001. Hillview Market, license number 119160. All right, so I'll have the parties introduce themselves again for the record. So I would like Mr. Tandon. You had stated that your wife had stated that you were representing her so can you please spell and state your name for the record, please? The licensee.

MR. TANDON: My name is Dinesh Tandon.
D-I-N-E-S-H last name T-A-N-D-O-N.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is your relationship to this establishment, sir?

MR. TANDON: I am licensee's husband.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Is the licensee with you?

MR. TANDON: Yes, Your Honor.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can she also
identify herself for the record, please?
MS. TANDON: My name is Mithi Tandon. First name M-I-T-H-I Mithi and the last name is Tandon T-A-N-D-O-N, Tandon.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank you very much. Representative from the Stronghold Civic Association, please spell and state your name for the record, please.

MR. VINING: Yes, this is Kirby Vining representing the Stronghold Civic Association. Spell my name K-I-R-B-Y last name V-I-N-I-N-G. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. The group of five or more?

MR. TOMASI: Yes, the designated representative, my name is Eric Tomasi. First name E-R-I-C, last name T-O-M-A-S-I.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Bloomingdale Civic Association, will the representative please spell and state your name for the record?

MS. QUINN: Yes, it's Teri Janine Quinn. Hang on, let me --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, ma'am, can you spell your name for the record?

I'm having some problems hearing you. (Pause.) Ms. Quinn? (Pause.) Ms. Quinn? (Pause.) Ms. Quinn? (Pause.) Ms. Quinn, we appear to have lost you. (Pause.) Ms. Barnes, one more time, please. Spell and state your name for the record and your representation.

MS. BARNES: Sir, what did you say?
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you, one more time, please spell and state your name for the record and your representation, ma'am?

MS. BARNES: D-I-A-N-N-E Dianne Barnes B-A-R-N-E-S.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, fine, thank you. I just want to say for the record, all the protestants are here. I know that Ms. Quinn from the Bloomingdale Civic Association had started to -- she came on the line. I don't know what concerns that she's having. Hopefully she'll be able to join us on, but there should be no issues because she did identify herself as one of the protestants. So for the board's purpose, she was here today so I'm not going to ask the board to vote to deny standing to the Bloomingdale Civic Association because they were here today and I'm not quite
sure what's now going on with her connection.
All right, are there any preliminary matters that each side needs to make? Any preliminary matters that need to be brought to the attention of the board? And I will start off with the licensee.

MR. TANDON: No, sir. It is just that we are asking for addition of liquor to the existing beer and wine.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry. I'm sorry to cut you off. I don't want to go into the substance.

MR. TANDON: Okay.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: This is more so do you have any problems, which is if there is stuff you don't understand when I say preliminary, so not necessarily the substance of the case but just preliminary if you have any issues.

MR. TANDON: No, sir. It's all good.
Thank you.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
Thank you. What about the Stronghold Civic Association? Any preliminary matters that need to be brought to the attention of the board?

MR. VINING: No preliminary matters that we're aware of that need to be addressed. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Mr.
Tomasi?
MR. TOMASI: No, as mentioned by Dinesh, I think, I believe he mentioned this. We are still working on mediation.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Ms.
Barnes?
MS. BARNES: No, none for ANC.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is Ms. Quinn, has she joined us? Is she back? (Pause.) All right.

MS. BARNES: I think Ms. Evelyn showed up. Do you see her name? Oh, there's Ms. Quinn. She's back on the phone.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Ms. Brown, can you please identify yourself for the record, please?

MS. BROWN: Myself, Evelyn Brown. I'm with the Bloomingdale Civic Association. I am the alternate to Teri Janine Quinn.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Fine, can you spell your name for the record, ma'am?

MS. BARNES: Evelyn E-V-E-L-Y-N last name is Brown B-R-O-W-N.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank you. All right, this (Simultaneous speaking.)

MS. QUINN: Hi, I'm also back. This is Teri Janine Quinn. I've been able to dial back in.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, Ms. Quinn. Can you please spell and state your name for the record, again, ma'am?

MS. QUINN: Sure, it's Teri T-E-R-I Janine J-A-N-I-N-E Quinn Q-U-I-N-N and I'm here as President of the Bloomingdale Civic Association.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, fine, thank you. Do you have any preliminary matters that you need to bring to the attention of the board?

MS. QUINN: I do not.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, fine. Thank you. All right, this matter then is scheduled for a protest hearing on April 20, 2022 at 1:30 p.m. I heard the parties spoke about the fact that they are working on mediation. There
are a lot, there are four protestants groups in this matter. The board supports settlement, the parties negotiating and coming to an agreement if possible. One of the reasons why the board supports settlement, this is an establishment within the boundaries of your neighborhood where you live and so if the parties are able to discuss the matter and come to terms it would be helpful. However, if the parties are unable to come to terms, then we will have a protest hearing on the 20th. I just want to remind the licensee that in going to mediation that you have four separate groups that you have. You have to speak to all of the groups --

MR. TANDON: Yes, sir.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: To come to an agreement. I just want to let you know that if you come to an agreement with just the ANC, the group of five or more will fall; however, the Stronghold Civic Association and Bloomingdale Civic Association can still move forward with the protest hearing if they do not agree to settlement. So I just want to let you know that you have to speak to all the parties and hopefully in whatever agreement, if an agreement
is reached, then you are negotiating with all the parties.

MR. TANDON: Yes, sir.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, so just want bring that to your attention.

MR. TANDON: Thank you.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, okay. I just want to let the parties know that if we do go to a hearing, I would like the parties to try to figure out who is going to represent the groups in the sense that we're not going to allow four separate hearings to move forward. I'm hoping we don't go to a hearing, but if we do go to a hearing, the parties should think about the fact that who would be the designated representative to present the case if we were to move forward at a protest hearing. All right?

MR. TOMASI: Mr. Anderson, this is Eric Tomasi from the group of five.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Tomasi, yes, sir.

MR. TOMASI: I have a question about the board's policy. From what I just heard, you are stating that we must have a combined agreement with the Applicant --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It doesn't have to be a combined agreement, but I was just letting the licensee know that he has to negotiate with all the different groups. As the group of five or more, the only exception though is if the agency signs a settlement agreement, if the group of five or more does not agree with the terms of the agreement, the group of five or more, they will lose standing to move forward with a hearing. Only the group of five or more (Simultaneous speaking.)

MR. TOMASI: My question is actually in the opposite --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir.
MR. TOMASI: If the group of five would come to an agreement, but the ANC and the associations would still want to go directly to a protest, how would the board look at that?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The group of five would provide a settlement agreement to the board. The board would review it and the board would, if it's appropriate, the board would sign off on a settlement agreement that the group of five or more presents and then the group of five or more would fall out of the protest hearing and
the other groups would move forward.
MR. TOMASI: Okay, thank you.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: If any side can come to an agreement, sign an agreement then they would fall out, but the civic associations they have their individual standing and the ANC has their individual standing. If there is a settlement agreement, the only group that would fall aside would be the group of five or more because the law says that the ANC in theory represents all the residents. Okay?

MR. TOMASI: Thank you.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You're welcome, sir. All right, now the board is planning for a protest hearing, there are a few things that I would like to instruct you about because the board's practices under the COVID restrictions have changed.

As you know, the board's hearings are conducted virtually so it is very important that protest hearings are focused and address only those issues that are being protested. Following this hearing, you will receive an e-mail from ABRA legal assistant Imani Moreland that will include a copy of a protest information form
(PIF) and a copy of an exhibit form as well as specific instructions for the hearing. You are required to complete and submit the PIF and exhibit form at least seven days before the date of the hearing. Again, seven days before the date of the hearing, each side must disclose their documents and witnesses that they are going to rely on. These documents and witnesses needs to be disclosed to each side and it also must be provided to ABRA Legal.

Please know that these documents greatly assist the board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process and keeping the parties on point during the hearing. Each side is limited to no more than five witnesses and you will have only 60 minutes to present your case. This includes all direct and cross examination. The board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to those issues that are being protested. Are there any questions?

MR. TANDON: No, sir.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any questions by anyone?

MR. TANDON: No, sir.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. We thank you for your cooperation. If you have any questions in the time leading up to the hearing, please do not hesitate to contact Ms. Moreland at 202-442-6942 or contact her by e-mail. Thank you very much. I wish you good luck in your mediation. If there is any assistance that the agency can provide, please contact Ms. Moreland. I'm hoping that the parties can settle this matter, but if you're unable to settle this matter, we will see you on April 20th at 1:30 for a hearing.

Thank you very much and have a great day.

MR. TANDON: Thank you.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
