CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The next case on our calendar is Case Number 19-CMP-00172, La Dulce Noche, License Number 92426.

Ms. Andrews, can you please elevate the rights of the parties? The parties, my understanding, you have the Government, you have the Licensee, and you have an interpreter. And I'm not sure if the Licensee has -- I don't know what, if any, witnesses the Government has and I'm not sure who else, what witnesses, if any, that the Licensee has, but those are the parties that I'm aware of.

MS. ANDREWS: Sure, stand by.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thanks.

MS. ANDREWS: Mr. Ortiz, your rights have been elevated. Ms. Pleitez, your rights have been elevated. Mr. Solloso, your rights have been elevated. Mr. Sejas, your rights have been elevated. That's all, Mr. Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Mr. Sejas, can you please unmute your phone and turn on your microphone, please? I'm sorry, turn on your camera, please, if you have one?

1	MR. SEJAS: Yes. Good afternoon, Mr.
2	Chairman and Members of the Board.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, hold
4	on, please. Mr. Sejas, can you raise your right
5	hand, please?
6	MR. SEJAS: Sure.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you what
8	language is this, please?
9	MR. SEJAS: I'm sorry.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What language?
11	MR. SEJAS: It's Spanish.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Do
13	you solemnly affirm that you will faithfully and
14	accurately interpret the proceedings in this
15	matter from English into Spanish and from Spanish
16	into English to the best of your ability?
17	MR. SEJAS: Yes, I do, Mr. Chairman.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you please
19	say and spell your name for the record and your
20	role here, sir?
21	MR. SEJAS: My name is Erik Sejas, E-R-
22	I-K, Sejas, the last name is S-E-J-A-S. And I am
23	the Spanish interpreter hired by ABRA to be here,
24	present at the hearing.
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, good

1	afternoon. Can you please tell Mr. Solloso to
2	unmute his microphone and elevate his camera,
3	please?
4	MR. SOLLOSO: (Speaking through
5	interpreter, unless otherwise indicated) Where it
6	says mute, right? It's on, is it on?
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm not able to
8	see him at the moment, so
9	MR. SOLLOSO: Can you see me now?
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No.
11	MR. SOLLOSO: So, it's logged in. I
12	already selected video.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We'll wait a
14	couple of minutes to see.
15	MR. SOLLOSO: It said video and it's
16	supposed to work, here we go.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, let him know
18	we can see him.
19	MR. SOLLOSO: My son was helping me.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank
21	you. I need the parties to introduce themselves
22	for the record. Let's start with the Government,
23	need the Government to spell and state his name.
24	MR. ORTIZ: Good afternoon, Board
25	Members. Stephen Ortiz on behalf of the District

	of Columbia. That's Stephen, S-T-E-P-H-E-N,
2	Ortiz, O-R-T-I-Z.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Ortiz, do
4	you have a potential witness with you? Can you
5	identify the person and I'll have that person
6	identify themselves.
7	MR. ORTIZ: Yes, Mr. Chairperson. I
8	have Investigator Vanessa Pleitez as my witness.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Pleitez, can
LO	you please state your name for the record and
L1	spell your, state and spell your name, please?
L2	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: My name is
L3	Vanessa Pleitez. My last name is spelled P-L-E-
L <b>4</b>	I-T-E-Z.
L5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Mr.
L6	Solloso, can you please spell and state your name
L <b>7</b>	for the record, please?
L8	MR. SOLLOSO: My name is Jose Solloso.
L9	Last name is S-O-L-L-O-S-O.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso, do
21	you have any witnesses with you, today?
22	MR. SOLLOSO: (Speaking for himself)
23	No, sir.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank
25	you. Mr. Ortiz, are there any preliminary

matters you need to bring to the attention of the 1 2 Board? 3 MR. ORTIZ: No, there are -- we do not 4 have any preliminary matters at this time. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Ortiz, are you ready to move forward? 6 7 MR. ORTIZ: Yes. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Ortiz, do 9 you wish to make an opening statement? 10 MR. ORTIZ: Yes, I'd like to make a 11 brief opening statement. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 13 MR. ORTIZ: Good afternoon, Board 14 Members. We are here today in the show cause 15 matter of 3566 14th Street Northwest, LLC, 16 trading as La Dulce Noche, located at 3566 14th 17 Street Northwest. The show case notice issued in this 18 19 matter concerns the charge the that Licensee 20 failed to follow the terms of its Board approved 21 license by operating outside the approved hours 22 of sales, in violation of D.C. Code Section 25-23 823(a)(7) and 23 DCMR Section 705.9. 24 The evidence will show that on Sunday, 25 September 15, 2019, at approximately 3:17 a.m.,

an ABRA Investigator observed patrons in the 1 2 establishment consuming alcoholic beverages. 3 establishment's licensed hours of operation end 4 at 3:00 a.m. 5 And that is all for my opening statement, I'm ready to call my first witness. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso, do 8 you wish to make an opening statement at this 9 juncture or do you want to wait until you present 10 your case? 11 MR. SOLLOSO: I would prefer to wait 12 and talk about my case later. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank 14 you. Mr. Ortiz, do you have a witness you wish 15 to call? 16 MR. ORTIZ: Yes. At this time, the 17 Government would like to call ABRA Investigator Vanessa Pleitez. 18 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Pleitez, can 20 you raise your right hand, please? Do you swear 21 or affirm to tell the truth and nothing but the 22 truth? 23 INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes. 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Your 25 witness, Mr. Ortiz.

_	DIRECT EXAMINATION
2	MR. ORTIZ: Thank you. Good afternoon,
3	Investigator Pleitez. Can you please state your
4	name and spell your last name for the record?
5	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: My name is
6	Vanessa Pleitez, my last name is spelled P-L-E-I-
7	T-E-Z.
8	MR. ORTIZ: And where are you currently
9	employed?
LO	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: I'm an
L1	investigator for the Alcoholic Beverage
L2	Regulation Administration.
L3	MR. ORTIZ: And how long have you been
L <b>4</b>	an investigator?
L5	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Approximately
L6	five years.
L <b>7</b>	MR. ORTIZ: What are your duties and
L8	responsibilities as an investigator?
L9	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: I investigate
20	and conduct regulatory inspections for alcohol
21	establishments within the District of Columbia.
22	MR. ORTIZ: And are you familiar with
23	the establishment called La Dulce Noche?
24	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes, yes.
25	MR. ORTIZ: And how are you familiar

1	with this establishment?
2	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: I conducted an
3	undercover investigation on September 15, 2019 at
4	La Dulce Noche.
5	MR. ORTIZ: And did you create a case
6	report?
7	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes.
8	MR. ORTIZ: I'm going to direct you to
9	a document marked as Government Exhibit 1 for
10	identification.
11	(Whereupon, the above-referred to
12	document was marked as Government
13	Exhibit No. 1 for identification.)
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Ortiz, do
15	you need to share your screen?
16	MR. ORTIZ: Yeah, I can share my
17	screen. I didn't know if you all wanted to do
18	that on your own, but I can definitely share my
19	screen.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, we do not
21	have the documents, so I need you to share your
22	screen so she can testify from the document on-
23	screen.
24	MS. ANDREWS: Mr. Ortiz, stand by.
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, thank you.

1	MS. ANDREWS: Mr. Ortiz, you may share
2	your screen now.
3	MR. ORTIZ: All right. Now, I'm going
4	to scroll through this, Investigator Pleitez, but
5	please take a moment and review Exhibit 1. I'll
6	scroll through it.
7	All right. And do you recognize it?
8	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes, it's my
9	case report.
LO	MR. ORTIZ: All right. And what is it?
L1	Oh, sorry, why did you create this report?
L2	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: I did the case
L3	report because the establishment was in violation
L <b>4</b>	of operating after hours.
L5	MR. ORTIZ: And what is the date on
L6	this report?
L <b>7</b>	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: September 15,
L8	2019.
L9	MR. ORTIZ: Did you attach exhibits to
20	this report?
21	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes.
22	MR. ORTIZ: Is this a fair and accurate
23	copy of the case report that you created for La
24	Dulce Noche on September 15, 2019?
25	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes.

1	MR. ORTIZ: And you created this report
2	as part of your duties as an investigator?
3	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes.
4	MR. ORTIZ: Mr. Chairperson, at this
5	time, the Government will now move Government
6	Exhibit 1, the case report, into evidence.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso, do
8	you have an objection to moving this document
9	into evidence?
10	MR. SOLLOSO: No.
11	MR. ORTIZ: Thank you.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So moved.
13	(Whereupon, the above-referred to
14	document was received into evidence as
15	Government Exhibit No. 1.)
16	MR. ORTIZ: Investigator Pleitez, can
17	you please describe the events that led to the
18	investigation of La Dulce Noche?
19	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, hold
21	on, hold on, hold on. Mr. Solloso, can
22	you please mute your telephone? This is Ms.
23	Pleitez is the one I'm sorry, tell Mr. Solloso
24	to mute his telephone.
25	Let him know that Ms. Pleitez is the

person who's testifying and he's not allowed --1 2 if he has an objection to a question that's 3 asked, he can raise an objection, but she's the one who the questions are being asked to. 4 So, 5 let him know that, please. MR. SOLLOSO: I do have my microphone 6 7 off now. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Go 9 ahead, Mr. Ortiz. MR. ORTIZ: All right. And, 10 11 Investigator Pleitez, can you please describe the 12 events that led to the investigation of La Dulce 13 Noche? 14 INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes. On 15 September 15, 2019, Investigator Puente and 16 myself were conducting monitoring on the 14th 17 Street Corridor. 18 At 2:55 a.m., Investigator Puente and 19 myself noticed a group of individuals going into 20 La Dulce Noche. Investigator Puente and myself 21 pulled over to monitor the establishment. 22 At approximately 3:00 a.m., we noticed 23 a female closing the curtains of the front of the 24 establishment. 25 At approximately 3:17 a.m., I decided

to conduct an undercover investigation and enter the establishment. So, at 3:17, I approached the front door of the establishment, which was unlocked, and it goes into a foyer. The second door was locked, so I knocked on the door.

A male opened the door, who was later identified as the owner, Mr. Solloso. Mr. Solloso asked me, or I asked Mr. Solloso if I could use the bathroom and Mr. Solloso asked me where I was coming from.

I advised Mr. Solloso that I had came from one of the other establishments down the street. He asked me why I didn't use the bathroom at that establishment. I told him that when I left, I didn't need to use the bathroom, but that I needed to use the bathroom now.

Mr. Solloso allowed me to enter the establishment and directed me towards the restroom.

When I entered the establishment, I observed three patrons sitting at a table towards the front of the establishment with beer bottles that were half full and three patrons that were standing at the bar.

I approached the restroom, however,

there was someone in the restroom, so I waited until that person was done. While I was waiting, Mr. Solloso turned on, put the music up and started flickering the lights and stated, in Spanish, I'm going to make you guys feel like you're at the club.

The patron exited the bathroom, so I entered the restroom. I contacted Investigator Puente to tell him what was going on in the establishment and asked him to come in for assistance.

I exited the restroom to unlock the front door, the door to the establishment. When I exited the restroom, I saw a patron hand Mr. Solloso \$20. Mr. Solloso poured out two shots of tequila and handed the patron one shot and simultaneously took the shot with the patron.

So, I unlocked the door and
Investigator Puente entered the establishment.
At that time, Investigator Puente and myself
identified ourselves as ABRA investigators to Mr.
Solloso and asked to speak to an ABC manager or
owner. At that time, Mr. Solloso introduced
himself as the owner of the establishment and
handed us his identification.

	At that time, Mr. Solloso began asking
2	the patrons to exit the establishment and to
3	finish paying their balance on their checks. Mr.
4	Solloso became very upset and stated that he only
5	allowed me to enter the establishment because I
6	was a female and because I needed to use the
7	restroom.
8	I advised Mr. Solloso of the
9	violations, that he was operating after hours.
10	Mr. Solloso appeared to be intoxicated.
11	Therefore, I handed his ID back and I let him
12	know that I was going to return to do a
13	regulatory inspection on a later date.
14	MR. ORTIZ: Thank you, Investigator
15	Pleitez. And after the investigation, what did
16	you conclude?
17	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: I concluded that
18	La Dulce Noche was in violation for operating
19	after hours on September 15, 2019.
20	MR. ORTIZ: And what are La Dulce
21	Noche's hours for sale and operation for Saturday
22	evenings into Sunday mornings.
23	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: 9:00 a.m. to
24	3:00 a.m.
25	MR. ORTIZ: And how do you know that?

INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: I conducted a 1 2 regulatory inspection of the establishment on 3 September 28, 2019, at which time, I do look at the ABC license, along with their certificate of 4 5 occupancy to conduct my regulatory inspection. For the record, I stated my RI was 6 7 September 28, 2019. 8 MR. SEJAS: The interpreter has a 9 question or petition, he is not familiar with the 10 acronym. 11 INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Regulatory 12 inspection. No, I'm sorry, it's the 28th of 13 September. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you have any 15 other questions, Mr. Ortiz? 16 MR. ORTIZ: My apologies, Board 17 Members, there were some technical difficulties 18 on my end. It was saying there was low bandwidth 19 and I don't know where Investigator Pleitez left 20 off and/or any questions that were posed after 21 that. 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I think she 23 answered your last question. She answered your 24 last question, and there was just some

clarification where she stated that she went back

1	to do a regulatory inspection on September 28,
2	that was just a clarification that she provided
3	the record.
4	MR. ORTIZ: Okay. Thank you, Mr.
5	Chairperson. I do have a couple more questions.
6	Investigator Pleitez, I'm going to
7	direct you to a document marked as Government
8	Exhibit 2 for identification.
9	(Whereupon, the above-referred to
10	document was marked as Government
11	Exhibit No. 2 for identification.)
12	MR. ORTIZ: And do you recognize this
13	document?
14	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes, this is the
15	ABC license for La Dulce Noche.
16	MR. ORTIZ: And how do you know that
17	this is La Dulce Noche's ABC license?
18	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: This is the
19	ABRA-generated ABC license that was provided to
20	La Dulce Noche.
21	MR. ORTIZ: And does La Dulce Noche's
22	name appear anywhere on this ABC license?
23	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes, it's at the
24	top of the page.
25	MR. ORTIZ: Is this a fair and accurate
ı	

	copy of the ABC license for La Dulce Noche?
2	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes.
3	MR. ORTIZ: Mr. Chairperson, at this
4	time, the Government moves Exhibit 2, La Dulce
5	Noche's ABC license, into evidence.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso, do
7	you any objection?
8	MR. SOLLOSO: Well, yes.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What's the
10	nature of your objection, sir?
11	MR. SOLLOSO: Well, I oppose what she
12	is describing, what she's telling us.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, Mr.
14	Solloso. The only question I'm asking you, the
15	Government is trying to move in a copy of your
16	license into evidence, do you have any objection
	to this document, moving this document into
17

	evidence? MR. SOLLOSO: No, no.

1	Investigator Pleitez, can you please read the
2	hours of sales and operation that are stated on
3	La Dulce Noche's ABC license for Saturdays?
4	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: 9:00 a.m. to
5	3:00 a.m.
6	MR. ORTIZ: And when was this ABC
7	license issued to the establishment?
8	MR. SEJAS: The interpreter has a
9	question or petition, where or when? The
10	interpreter didn't hear.
11	MR. ORTIZ: My apologies, sorry. When
12	was this ABC license issued?
13	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: March 29, 2019.
14	MR. ORTIZ: All right. Then, I have no
15	further questions for Investigator Pleitez.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr.
17	Ortiz. Mr. Solloso, this is you now have an
18	opportunity to ask Investigator Pleitez questions
19	about her testimony. So, now, you're asking her
20	questions, sir, okay?, about what she just
21	testified to.
22	CROSS EXAMINATION
23	MR. SOLLOSO: Very well. So, I would
24	like to ask Ms. Vanessa about the approximation
25	that she approach on September 15. You are

saying that you were on the street at 2:55 a.m. and that you were looking outside La Dulce Noche?

INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Yes.

MR. SOLLOSO: So, you said that you saw a bunch of people accessing the place when you later said that there were only two or three people inside.

INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: No, I stated that there was patrons standing outside of the establishment going into the establishment. And when I entered to use the restroom, there was approximately six patrons inside of the establishment, three at a table and three at the bar.

MR. SOLLOSO: So, you were saying that the patrons were able to access before and how come if you also said that the door was locked for you and you didn't have direct access?

INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: I'm not sure what the question is.

MR. SOLLOSO: Well, my question is that the door was already locked and when, at 2:55, I was upset because I was trying to get rid of the people and they haven't paid off yet. So, that's what I was doing there at 2:55.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, hold 1 2 on, hold on for a minute. 3 MR. SOLLOSO: (Speaking for himself) Okay. 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I know with the 5 Spanish, with the interpretation that there might 6 7 be some issues in the sense that maybe it's not 8 necessarily a question posed. 9 But Ms. Pleitez, if you're able to 10 answer the question that is posed, I know that 11 you're -- because he's saying, and it's going 12 through a translator, so it might not necessarily 13 be the way, but if you understand what's being 14 asked, try to give an answer. If you're unable 15 to answer, then say that I'm unable to answer. 16 But I know that there's some issues, 17 but I'm not sure if it's being translated word 18 for word and so, therefore, there might be some -19 - all right? 20 INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Okay. To my 21 understanding, his question was, how did I 22 observe patrons going into the establishment 23 when, when I went into the establishment, the 24 door was locked?

Like I stated, the first door that

goes into the foyer was unlocked, the second door 1 was locked when I went into the establishment at 2 3 3:17 a.m. I'm not sure exactly if the door was locked or not at 2:55, but I did witness patrons 4 5 enter the establishment at 2:55. MR. SOLLOSO: So, it's my turn to 6 7 speak, right? 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, sir. Do you 9 have any other questions you want to ask her? 10 Hold on, hold on, hold on. 11 Mr. Solloso, you're asking her a question and I'm 12 getting the impression that you're trying to 13 testify. So, you're going to get your chance to 14 testify. 15 MR. SOLLOSO: (Speaking for himself) 16 Okay. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What you're 18 doing right now is that, she just testified. 19 MR. SOLLOSO: (Speaking for himself) 20 Okay. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: If you have any 22 questions you want to ask her, you ask her these 23 questions now, based on the testimony she just 24 That's where we are now. You'll get a gave. 25 chance later on to present your case.

MR. SOLLOSO: I do understand, I do 1 2 understand. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mister, Mister, you don't need to translate that, he said he 4 5 understands, okay? MR. SEJAS: The interpreter would like 6 7 to say, the question was --8 MR. SOLLOSO: Well, I'm telling you 9 nobody was able to get in, nobody from the outside was able to get in. The door was locked. 10 11 I was trying -- they were only able to get out if 12 they were inside. 13 So, she asked me about the restroom, 14 I objected, I said it's closed. She asked me as 15 a personal favor. I was trying to get rid of the 16 people that were still inside and it was close to 17 3:00 a.m. 18 MR. SEJAS: So, wait a minute, you need 19 to ask questions, I am under the impression that 20 you are -- I have to say this in Spanish. 21 MR. SOLLOSO: I did understand. 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. And 23 I'm not native to Spanish, but I figured out that 24 he wasn't asking her a question, he was 25 testifying. That's why I stopped, to clarify

that he's going to get an opportunity, all right? 1 2 All right, thank you. Do you have any 3 other questions you want to ask her, sir? other questions before I dismiss her? 4 MR. SOLLOSO: Yes, I would like to 5 know, she has accused me that I was apparently 6 7 intoxicated, I would like to ask her, what proof 8 did you have about that? 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I can't hear, Ms. Pleitez. 10 11 INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Sorry about 12 I wrote in my report that he appeared to that. be intoxicated, I could smell alcohol in his 13 14 breath. And I also witnessed him take a shot of 15 teguila with a patron while I was in the 16 establishment. 17 MR. SOLLOSO: I believe you don't have 18 any proof about that action, the same as I don't 19 have any proof to say that you didn't show me 20 your badge when you asked me to get access. 21 INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: At that time, I 22 was in an undercover capacity. 23 MR. SOLLOSO: How long do you consider 24 you were, from the time that we opened the door

to the time that you went to unlock the door for

Investigator Puente to get in?

INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: I approached the establishment approximately 3:17 a.m. I waited for the restroom for approximately two minutes.

And I was in the restroom for maybe a minute.

So, total, maybe seven to ten minutes.

MR. SOLLOSO: So, when you opened the door for Investigator Puente, Mr. Puente didn't say anything to me, he just said that's fine, and you chased after the clients, is that true?

INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: No.

MR. SOLLOSO: So, after you left, did
I remain with the clients inside, with the
patrons inside?

INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: No. To clarify the last question, Mr. Solloso, when I asked you for your identification, Investigator Puente entered with his badge around his neck and we advised you that we were investigators with ABRA and asked you for your identification and you provided us with your ID.

MR. SOLLOSO: Neither Mr. Puente or Ms. Vanessa asked me for my ID, they just said that I was outside the law.

MR. ORTIZ: Objection, Mr. Chairperson.

He needs to ask a question. 1 2 MR. SOLLOSO: The question --3 MR. ORTIZ: Again, I raise the same objection --4 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, hold on, hold on, I'm sorry. What's the objection? 6 7 MR. ORTIZ: Mr. Solloso is testifying This is a -- and the time, this is 8 at this time. 9 for cross examination, he needs to pose a 10 question. In the last two statements, they have 11 been statements and not questions. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: As I stated, Mr. 13 Ortiz, I mean, there is some issue, I'm saying to 14 work through this to see when it comes through 15 the translator, what is being requested. I'm not 16 sure if you're a native Spanish speaker, and I 17 don't know if Ms. Pleitez is a native Spanish 18 speaker, I am not, but I do know some Spanish. 19 I do get the impression that he's 20 testifying. However, I'm waiting to hear what 21 comes out of the mouth of the translator. 22 hear from the translator, if it's not a question, 23 then I'm not going to pose it. 24 So, although he might be testifying,

because it's in Spanish, it is not in the record.

All that's going to be in the record is what's coming out of the mouth of the translator.

So, I understand and I'm trying to hold it together, in spite of the -- so, that's the reason, I'm waiting to hear what the translator states. And once I hear what the translator states, then I will not allow that to be in the record, okay? But I hear.

MR. ORTIZ: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I mean, I appreciate, I said this before, I appreciate it and I appreciate that I kind of get the impression that he's testifying, but I have to wait until I hear what comes out of the mouth of the translator before I will say, this is going to be in the record or I will allow Ms. Pleitez to respond, okay?

MR. SEJAS: The interpreter would like to say, this was the initial questions.

MR. SOLLOSO: Well, my question is that Investigator Puente did have his badge hanging, but you didn't show me any badge until you came back the second time from the door. And then, you just told me that I had broken the law, that it was after hours.

So, it was 3:00 a.m., you're saying I 1 2 was serving liquor, you don't have any proof 3 about that. There was no liquor on the table. You will not be able to prove this. 4 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, hold on, hold on, hold on, please. I'm not going to 6 7 allow anything that -- there is no question 8 presented. 9 Mr. Ortiz, you're correct, he's 10 testifying. So, I'm going to sustain your objection. And so, none of what was just put in 11 12 the record by the interpreter will be admitted, 13 because it's not a question. All right. 14 All right. Mr. Solloso, this is, as 15 I stated before, you're going to have the 16 opportunity to present your case, sir, she's 17 testifying, she testified, if you have a specific 18 question for her, ask a question. If you don't 19 have a specific question, we will move on. 20 So, I don't want you to just -- if you 21 have questions, ask questions. If it's not a 22 question, you will have an opportunity later on 23 to give an explanation to whatever she says. 24 Any other questions? 25 MR. SOLLOSO: No, let's just move

forward, because all the questions that I make 1 2 does not correspond to what I wish. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, can you repeat what you just said? 4 5 MR. SOLLOSO: So, my question for Ms. Vanessa is if she has proof that I was serving 6 7 alcohol. She said she entered 2:55 and she was 8 like three minutes, so if it was -- if she has 9 any proof that I was serving alcohol? 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That question 11 was asked and answered. Okay. Let's move on. 12 She testified that someone bought --13 I heard she testified that someone gave you \$20, 14 you gave them a drink and you took a shot. 15 asked and answered. So, that's the testimony I 16 heard. 17 Is there another question? 18 MR. SOLLOSO: No, let's continue. 19 am not an attorney, so let's please continue. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 21 Thank you. Ms. Pleitez, I'm confused, was this 22 Saturday going into Sunday morning or Sunday 23 going into Monday, when you went to the 24 establishment? 25 INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: It was Saturday

1 into Sunday. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 2 3 did you ask for the ABC manager or owner, or did you know that Mr. Solloso was the owner of the 4 5 establishment? INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: When 6 7 Investigator Puente entered the establishment, I 8 did ask to speak to an ABC manager or owner. 9 was behind the bar with another bartender, a 10 female bartender, and he stated that he was the 11 owner of the establishment. At which time, I did 12 ask him for his ID, which he provided. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, do you 14 remember -- so, what time, if you remember off 15 the top of your head, is sales and service on a 16 Saturday? I just want to clarify for the record, 17 what time should that end? 18 INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: At 3:00 a.m. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 20 I don't have any other questions. 21 any other Board Member have any questions for Ms. 22 Pleitez? 23 MEMBER SHORT: Yes, Mr. Chair, I had a 24 question for Investigator Pleitez.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr.

2	MEMBER SHORT: Good afternoon,
3	Investigator Pleitez.
4	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Good afternoon.
5	MEMBER SHORT: Thank you for your
6	excellent report. And I'd just like to ask,
7	again, what time did you enter the establishment
8	during this undercover investigation?
9	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: I entered at
10	approximately 3:17 a.m.
11	MEMBER SHORT: I do thank you for that
12	testimony. That's all I have, Mr. Chair.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any other
14	questions by any other Board Members?
15	I want to just ask you one more
16	question, Ms. Pleitez. Based on their license,
17	was this establishment supposed to be open at
18	3:17 a.m.?
19	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: No, Mr. Chair.
20	Their license for operation and sales end at 3:00
21	a.m.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, do you know
23	approximately what time both you and the other
24	investigator exited the establishment?
25	INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: I can say that

approximately 3:25.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And when you exited the establishment at 3:25, who was left in the establishment?

INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: To my recollection, it was the owner, two waitresses, and one patron that hadn't paid, he was very intoxicated and he was attempting to pay his bill.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. All right. Thank you. Mr. Solloso, again, this is just questions. Both myself and Mr. Short asked questions of Ms. Pleitez. Do you have any questions of her based on the questions that we both asked?

Can -- hold on, can you tell Mr.

Solloso, there should be no one in the background speaking to him? I can hear someone speaking to him. So, no one should be talking to him, because I can hear.

MR. SOLLOSO: It must be just echo.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso,

there's no echo, someone is speaking to you. I'm

not going to play games, okay? This is not the

first time. It doesn't matter, sir.

MR. SOLLOSO: (Speaking for himself) I 1 2 am alone. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Another voice, it's not an echo, there's a female voice in the 4 5 background speaking to you. That is not an echo. So, let's move on. I'm just saying, I do not 6 7 want, during this process, I do not want anyone 8 to be having a conversation with you, sir. 9 So, one last time, do you have any 10 questions of Ms. Pleitez based on the questions 11 that I asked and Mr. Short asked? 12 MR. SOLLOSO: I don't know what else to 13 do, I don't know what to do. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, you 15 don't have any other questions. Mr. Ortiz, do 16 you have any questions of Ms. Pleitez based on 17 the questions that I asked and Mr. Short asked? 18 MR. ORTIZ: No, I do not. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Ms. 20 Pleitez, thank you for your testimony today. 21 INVESTIGATOR PLEITEZ: Thank you. 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Ortiz, do 23 you have another witness you want to call? 24 MR. ORTIZ: No, sir, the Government 25 does not have any more witnesses to call.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And does the
2	Government rest?
3	MR. ORTIZ: Yes, the Government rests.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
5	Okay. Mr. Solloso, this is your opportunity to
6	defend your case. You can state whatever you
7	want to do to defend your case, all right?
8	Mr. Solloso, can you raise your right
9	hand, please? Do you swear or affirm to tell the
LO	truth and nothing but the truth?
L1	MR. SOLLOSO: (Speaking for himself)
L2	Yes, I do.
L3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. I
L <b>4</b>	want to thank the interpreter for doing his job
L5	excellent, but clearly, the witness answered the
L6	question. So, if the witness answered the
L7	question, he understood. You don't have to
L8	interpret once the witness has answered the
L9	question, but I appreciate the fact that you're
20	doing your job, sir, okay? Thank you.
21	All right. Go ahead, sir.
22	MR. SOLLOSO: To tell you the truth, I
23	do understand English, but I don't speak it very
24	well, that's why I get ahead some times.
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And I'm fine

with that, sir, not a problem.

#### DIRECT EXAMINATION

MR. SOLLOSO: So, my summary about this problem. On September 15, Ms. Vanessa presented herself at 2:15 a.m., requested the restroom at my business, because the door was locked.

So, I did answer effectively that I'm not allowing people to enter. She said, it's an emergency. So, I did open the door, and she was not showing a badge or anything.

I was struggling with my clients, because I was trying to get them out. So, I didn't follow her to the restroom, she went to the restroom.

In the meantime, I was trying to get what they owe me, because the clients didn't pay me yet. That's why Ms. Vanessa was saying that I had \$20 on my hand.

Another issue is that Ms. Vanessa said that five and six people were inside and then, she says that only two waitresses, and one customer, the one that apparently was intoxicated and didn't want to pay.

And then, Ms. Vanessa opened the second door to allow the other inspector to get

in. The other investigator didn't need to introduce himself, he had a badge. So, it's only at that moment that Ms. Vanessa put her badge on and she identified herself as an inspector.

So, at that moment, neither Kevin -the interpreter thinks Mr. Puente -- neither
Kevin or herself ask me for an ID. They just
said that they were -- I was under the
investigation and I had committed a violation.

So, at that time, there were two patrons leaving, because we opened the door for them to leave. And she testified that there were two waitresses and just one patron left. So, I don't know what other people she wants to include.

In another question that I didn't know how to formulate, she was saying that I am seated behind the bar. I was never behind the bar, I was always next to the door, checking the exit.

MR. SOLLOSO: (Speaking for himself) To open the door for the exit of people and nobody can come.

MR. SOLLOSO: Therefore, I don't know how we can call this that she can generate, how can we say, a good report. Well, regarding the

schedule, probably I got past a few minutes, but 1 2 without serving any alcohol. This is all I can 3 say about my case. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso, now 4 5 Mr. Ortiz will have an opportunity to ask you questions on the testimony that you just gave, 6 7 sir, okay? Mr. Ortiz? 8 CROSS-EXAMINATION 9 MR. ORTIZ: Thank you, Mr. Chairperson. 10 Mr. Solloso, your testimony today is that a 11 patron paid you \$20, correct? 12 MR. SOLLOSO: That is correct, because 13 he owed that, he owed that from way before, it 14 was before 3:00 a.m., it was something that they 15 had consumed. 16 MR. ORTIZ: And this same patron paid 17 you the \$20 after Investigator Pleitez entered 18 the establishment, correct? 19 MR. SOLLOSO: Well, yes, because we are 20 arguing the case, the matter, that he didn't pay. 21 MR. ORTIZ: I have no further 22 questions. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso, Ms. 24 Pleitez testified that you had a shot of 25 something while she was in the establishment, is

that correct, sir?

MR. SOLLOSO: As I said before, I never approached the bar. I remained next to the door until Ms. Vanessa and Mr. Kevin left.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's not -the question is, she stated that, whether or not
you were at the door, behind the bar, in front of
the bar, she testified that someone gave you \$20
and you had a shot. Are you denying this?

MR. SOLLOSO: Of course. There was no tip that he gave me, the \$20 was just to pay off the bills he owed. There were two customers that were seated, they owe me.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso, what time was, on that Saturday night, what time is your hours of operation?

MR. SOLLOSO: Based on what I was checking on my watch, I was below 3:00 a.m. And my time at 3:00 is not to serve alcohol.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, what is supposed to happen at 3:00, sir?

MR. SOLLOSO: Well, it means that I didn't serve alcohol, and I didn't. It means that I cannot kick them out, I cannot start kicking people.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What is supposed to occur at 3:00, sir? What is supposed to occur at 3:00?

MR. SOLLOSO: It's supposed that you don't serve alcohol and it's supposed you don't have customers, I agree on that. But if I had two customers that their credit card bounced and we are trying to settle, I think it shouldn't be such a big issue.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Sir, my confusion is that your hours of operation and your hours of service is 3:00 a.m., meaning that the doors need to be, I'm asking, does that mean that the doors need to be locked and that no customers should be in your establishment at 3:00 a.m.? Is that what that means, in your view?

MR. SOLLOSO: I believe it means that at 3:00, you don't serve alcohol anymore. And that the doors should remain locked.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, suppose there -- so, are there supposed to be any customers in the establishment past 3:00 a.m.?

MR. SOLLOSO: No, they were just trying to pay off, there were only two customers and the employees, one or two waitresses and one cook.

And these customers left and that's what Ms.

Vanessa said she saw, the money that she saw.

When Mr. Kevin entered, he didn't see anything,

because they were already gone.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you have a last call, and if you have last call, what time is last call?

MR. SOLLOSO: Yes, sir, I always do it.

I call at 2:30 a.m., every time a last call, and

I will repeat it at 2:45. So, that doesn't mean
that the music is on, like Ms. Vanessa was
saying. I turn it off, because the clients are
leaving. And when the customers leave, I remain
to broom and take out the trash. But that's not
an issue.

The issue is that the door is not open since 2:30 a.m., it's closed and nobody can enter, they can only exit. So, the door doesn't allow anybody to open it from the outside, it only allows somebody to operate it from the inside to get out.

That's why Ms. Vanessa couldn't access without my permission, because it only allows to exit. And that's why Ms. Vanessa had to go and open the door for Mr. Puente, because after she

1	enter, I close the door again.	
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.	
3	There's no question presented. Are there any	
4	other questions any of the Board Members want to	
5	ask?	
6	MEMBER SHORT: Yes, Mr. Chair.	
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr.	
8	Short.	
9	MEMBER SHORT: Yes. Good afternoon,	
10	Mr. Solloso.	
11	MR. SOLLOSO: (Speaking for himself)	
12	Yes, sir.	
13	MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Solloso, how long	
14	have you been in business at this establishment?	
15	MR. SOLLOSO: Six years.	
16	MEMBER SHORT: In those six years, have	
17	you ever sold alcohol after your permitted	
18	licensed hours?	
19	MR. SOLLOSO: No, not exactly.	
20	MEMBER SHORT: I'd like to ask you an	
21	exact question. And the question is, on March 9,	
22	2017, your record indicates that you had a	
23	similar charge to what Vanessa Pleitez,	
24	Investigator Pleitez is charging you with now.	
25	Did that happen?	

MR. SOLLOSO: At the time, we had these 1 2 containers -- the interpreter thinks jugs -- of 3 beer on top of the countertop. We were preparing them to get them inside the refrigerator, the 4 5 freezer. MEMBER SHORT: Did you ever pay a fine 6 7 for that incident? 8 MR. SOLLOSO: Yes, I do believe that, 9 yes, I remember, yes. 10 MEMBER SHORT: Were you guilty? 11 MR. SOLLOSO: Well, if I had beer on 12 top after hours, I just admitted that I was 13 liable, I was guilty. 14 MEMBER SHORT: Thank you, Mr. Solloso. Mr. Chair, I have no further questions. 15 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Are 17 there any other questions from any other Board 18 Members? Mr. Ortiz, do you have any questions of 19 Mr. Solloso based on the questions that were 20 asked by the Board? 21 MR. ORTIZ: No, I do not have any other 22 questions, Mr. Chairperson. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Solloso, 24 based on the questions that I asked you and the 25 questions that Mr. Short asked you, do you need

1 to clarify the record? Do you need to clarify 2 any statement based on those specific questions 3 that were asked of you? MR. SOLLOSO: No, it's correct. 4 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank Prior to making closing, Mr. Solloso, do 6 7 you rest? Do you have anything that you want to 8 say? I'm going to give you an opportunity to 9 wrap up your case, but do you have any further 10 testimony to present? 11 MR. SOLLOSO: I would like to request 12 your mercy --13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, hold 14 on, hold on, hold on. All right. I don't need 15 to hear that now, I don't need to hear that now. 16 I'm going to give you an opportunity to say that, 17 but this is not the appropriate time for that. 18 All right. All right. 19 So, I suppose you rest. All right. 20 All right. All right. 21 Mr. Ortiz, do you wish to make a 22 closing statement? 23 MR. ORTIZ: Yes, Mr. Chairperson, I do, 24 just briefly. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, go

ahead.

MR. ORTIZ: All right. The Government has proven to the Board by a preponderance of the evidence that alcoholic beverages were sold and consumed at the establishment after licensed hours, in violation of D.C. Code Section 25-823(a)(7) and 23 DCMR Section 705.9.

We heard from Investigator Pleitez that after 3:00 a.m., she observed several patrons drinking alcohol at the establishment.

We further heard from Investigator
Pleitez that she observed Mr. Solloso pour shots
of what appeared to be tequila in exchange for
\$20 from a patron. We also heard Mr. Solloso
testify to the effect that the patron paid him
\$20 after Investigator Pleitez entered the
establishment.

The Government has, therefore, proven the charge in the notice to show cause. And the Government recommends that the Board apply a penalty consistent with D.C. Code Section 25-830. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Okay. Mr. Solloso, this is your opportunity to wrap up your case and what is it that you want

the Board to do?

MR. SOLLOSO: Well, as I said before in the case, for me, I believe no charges are valid, because nothing was served after 3:00 a.m. The money was charged after 3:00 a.m., because that was owed.

And as I said before also, this all happened in 2019, in September, when the business was going more or less resolving and working.

Then, we had the pandemic and for more than a year, 18 months, we don't have income generated.

So, I couldn't even hire a lawyer to defend me today. And I am thinking that I will be forced to close. So, I just implore for compassion.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's all you need to say, sir, nothing else?

MR. SOLLOSO: So, is it more or less
what I should have said, what I have to say?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yeah, I just
wanted to make sure that you're done, that's all.

MR. SOLLOSO: Yes, sir.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Thank you. Just before, did you, Mr. Solloso, did you provide any documents to the Board that you wanted to be in the record? I know that

although you didn't testify to any documents, but 1 2 as a part of the disclosure, did you submit any 3 documents? MR. ORTIZ: I'm sorry, Mr. Chairperson. 4 5 Could you repeat the question and the interpreter can translate --6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Did he, were any 8 documents, did he disclose any documents to you, 9 Mr. Ortiz? 10 MR. ORTIZ: No, he did not disclose any 11 documents. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So, I was just asking, okay. 13 right. Thank you 14 for clarifying the record, Mr. Ortiz. All right. The record is now closed. Do the parties 15 Okay. 16 wish to provide a proposed findings of fact and 17 conclusion of law? Or just rest on the --18 MR. ORTIZ: The Government waives its 19 right. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The question I 21 just asked, Mr. Solloso, do you want just to rest 22 on -- do you want us to make the decision on the 23 testimony and evidence that's presented today? 24 That's what I'm asking. 25 MR. SOLLOSO: Right now, I don't know

if we just wait or if we just take a decision right now.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, I'm not going to give a decision right now. I was just saying that you want the Board to make its decision on the evidence that's presented, that's all. That's all, there is no -- we're not going to make a decision right now.

MR. SOLLOSO: Very well, that will be fine.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Good. All right. Thank you.

As Chairperson of the Alcoholic
Beverage Control Board for the District of

3	seconded the motion. I will now take a roll call
4	vote on the motion before us, now that it has
5	been seconded. Mr. James Short?
6	MR. SOLLOSO: Mr. James Short, I agree.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Bobby Cato?
8	MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato, I agree.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Rema
10	Wahabzadah?
11	MEMBER WAHABZADAH: Rema Wahabzadah, I
12	agree.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Rafi
14	Crockett?
15	MEMBER CROCKETT: Rafi Crockett, I
