Our first case this morning, it's a protest hearing status, Case No. 23-PRO-00096, DC Food Market, License No. -- Mr. Short, can you please mute your line? License No. 106962.

Good morning, Mr. Orellana. Can you please elevate the rights of the Licensee and the Protestant?

MR. ORELLANA: Good morning.

Stevan Lieberman on behalf of Emanuel Mpras, your access has been elevated.

And Patrick O'Keefe, your access has been elevated.

13	I saw and heard that this was for DC
14	Food Market. And I think I just heard Mr.
15	Lieberman mention King Convenience. So are we
16	discussing DC Food Market or King Convenience?
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Lieberman,
18	the case I called is 23-PRO-00096, DC Food
19	Market.
20	MR. LIEBERMAN: I'm sorry. In that
21	case, I'll be representing DC Food Market.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
23	Thank you. All right. Mr. Lieberman, are there
24	any preliminary matters that you need to bring to

the attention of the Board?

1 MR. IJEBERMAN: Just that there's 2 nothing to report at this time. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. And Mr. O'Keefe, is there any 4 5 preliminary matter you want to report to the Board? 6 7 MR. O'KEEFE: Nothing to report at 8 this time. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 10 Thank you. 11 This matter goes to a hearing. 12 scheduled for a protest hearing on March 21st at 13 10:00 a.m. Now that we've scheduled this matter 14 15 for a protest hearing, there are a few things 16 that I would like to instruct the Applicant and 17 the Protestants about so that the protest hearing 18 is focused and addresses only those issues that 19 are being protested. The Board does not intend to hear 20 21 testimony on matters that are not relevant to 2.2 this case. You should have received by 23 electronic or regular mail a letter explaining 2.4 the protest process, a copy of the protest

information form, and a copy of the exhibit form.

If you do not have these documents, please contact our legal office following this hearing. It is imperative that you review the rules closely and adhere to them before and during the protest hearing.

You're also required to complete and submit the protest information form (PIP) and the exhibit form seven days before the date of the hearing.

These two forms and accompanying documents need to be submitted to ABCA's Legal Division and to all opposing parties in this matter. If we do not receive a copy of your PIP, your application or your protest, whichever side you're representing, may be subject to dismissal.

Likewise, if we do not receive a copy of the exhibit form and the exhibits themselves, your exhibits may be excluded from the record upon a finding that the opposing party has been prejudiced or no good cause for failure to submit has been shown.

Likewise, witnesses other than a party may also be subject to exclusion if not identified on the PTP.

Accordingly, these forms are very

important. They greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process, and keeping the parties on point during the hearing. They likewise provide notice to opposing parties, enabling them to better prepare for the hearing.

Also, as you're aware, all our hearings are now conducted virtually. You will have one hour to present your case. You will only be allowed to call five witnesses. If you require more time, you are welcome to file a motion with the Board to request more time.

We thank you greatly for your cooperation. If you have any questions today or at any time leading up to the hearing, please do not hesitate to contact ABCA's Legal Division. Thank you.

Good luck with your negotiations. If this matter is not settled, we will see you on March 21st at 10:00 a.m. -- I'm sorry -- not 10:00 a.m. That should be 10:30 because we start at 10:30. So it's March 21st at 10:30.
