CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Good morning everyone. As Chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the District of Columbia, and in accordance with D.C. Code Section 2571 et seq. of the Open Meetings Act, OMA, I'm welcoming you to the regular scheduled meeting of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

This meeting is being conducted pursuant to guidance made available by the District of Columbia's Office of Open Government regarding electronic meetings held by public bodies. Electronic meetings by the ABC Board are authorized pursuant to Section 2577(a) of the D.C. Code.

Pursuant to the OMA requirements, notice of today's meeting was provided 48 hours in advance of the meeting on ABRA's website and on the District's Central Meeting Calendar. The notice included the time, date, agenda, and a call in or log in information for public participation.

I would like to introduce 5 the other Members of the ABC Board who are also 6 7 participating electronically. 8 Please respond when I announce your Mr. James Short? 9 name. MEMBER SHORT: Mr. James Short 10 11 present. Mr. Bobby Cato? 12 CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: 13 MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato, present. CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Ms. Jeni Hansen? 14 15 MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen, present. 16 CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Edward Grandis? 17 18 MEMBER GRANDIS: Present. CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: The Board has five 19 members for the attendance of the -- for the 20 21 conduct of business today and that constitutes a 2.2 quorum. 23 Before we get underway with today's hearing calendar I need to make a few 2.4 25 instructions very clear so that the conduct of

these hearings are understood by everyone.

There are eight cases scheduled on our calendar for this morning. Once a case is called, I will take a moment for our IT specialist to elevate the rights for each party to enable their camera and microphone.

Then and only then will you have the ability to enable your equipment. If your case is not being heard, you will remain mute and your camera will be disabled.

At the conclusion of each case, the parties will have the option to leave. If the party chooses to stay, all cameras and microphones for the concluded case will be disabled.

9	CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: All right. Thank				
10	you. All right, are there any I'm sorry, Mr.				
11	Hines, let me ask you a question.				
12	So, the only protestant in this case				
13	is the abutting property owner. Did the ANC				
14	protest your liquor, your renewal, sir?				
15	MR. HINES: No, they did not.				
16	CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Okay. Fine then.				
17	I just wanted to make sure of that. All right.				
18	All right, are there any preliminary				
19	matters that either side wants to bring to the				
20	attention? Mr. Hines, just preliminary, any				
21	problems or issues you've been having?				
22	MR. HINES: No.				
23	CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: No. And, Mr.				
24	Brown, any on your part?				
25	MR. BROWN: After our mediation, there				

was some delay in getting that information from the mediator to connect us with the investigators at ABRA.

We had discussed in our, and agreed that we would have folks come out. We would get our tenants to let us in and have ABRA there to help resolve some of the noise issues by having them present. And, Mr. Hines had disclosed that he had a new system that could be remotely controlled.

I did finally get that information and then got in contact with the Investigations

Branch Chief. And, just the other day, I was able to connect with the investigator who offered to come out this weekend.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: All right. I'm glad, I'm glad to hear that, that you were able to get that to occur.

And, one of the things I'll say, if you believe, if the parties truly believe this matter will be settled, this matter is schedule for a protest hearing -- a protest hearing on March 29, 2023, at 1:30 p.m.

So, if the parties believe that this matter will be settled, then I would ask that you

1 just advise our legal office so that we don't 2 have to assign another investigator to write a 3 report. But, I hope that if the parties are 4 5 able to solve the problems on time, we support settlements. Because, at the end of the day, you 6 7 both might have to coexist in the same space. 8 And so, therefore, if the parties are 9 able to come to some type of agreement, then you will be able -- you would -- you're able to solve 10 11 the problem rather than having the Board issue a 12 decision that one side might be happy and the 13 other side unhappy. 14 So, but so if the parties can truly 15 settle this matter, we just -- we support that. What I said before, this matter is scheduled for 16 17 a protest hearing on March 29, 2023. 18 And, I have -- are you -- are you, are 19 the parties -- are the parties familiar with 20 this, with the process if we were to go to a 21 protest hearing? 2.2 (No response.) 23 CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Well, I'll read 2.4 the other part.

MR. HINES: I am familiar with it.

1 CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Mr. Hines? 2 I was just saying, I am MR. HINES: 3 familiar. And, I am retaining counsel to help to walk me through this as well. 4 5 CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: If you retain 6 counsel, then you make sure that, and, if we're 7 going to go to a hearing, please make sure that 8 counsel, if we are truly going to the hearing, 9 make sure that your counsel provides the agents who are on, with the notice of appearance. 10 11 So, there is some formal documentation 12 that needs to be filed with the agency to advise 13 us that you, that someone else will be, you'll 14 have counsel representing you. 15 But, anyway, all right. So, following 16 this hearing, you'll receive an email from ABRA legal that will include a copy of a Protest 17 18 Information Form, PIF, and a copy of an Exhibit 19 Form, as well as specific instructions for the 20 hearing. 21 You are required -- you are required 2.2 to complete and submit the PIF and Exhibit Forms

forms seven days before the hearing, your application or your protest may be subject to dismissal. These documents need to be submitted to ABRA legal and to the opposing parties.

Please know that these documents greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process, and keeping the parties on point during the hearing.

Each side is limited to no more than five witnesses, and you'll only have 60 minutes to present your case. So, I just want to remind folks that no more than five witnesses, and you have 60 minutes to present your case.

The Board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to those issues that are being protested.

Any questions?

MR. HINES: No.

MR. BROWN: None.

CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: Okay. All right, we thank you for your cooperation. If you have any questions, please reach out to ABRA legal and we will provide guidance to both sides in -- in how to, if we're going to move to a hearing.
