I just want to remind both parties that if this matter goes -- that following this hearing, you will receive a copy of the PIF -- I'm sorry, let me make sure and go back and I'm reading the proper instructions.

Following this hearing, you'll receive an email from ABRA legal that will include a copy of a Protest Information Form, PIF, and a copy of an Exhibit Form, as well as specific instructions for the hearing.

You are required -- you are required to complete and submit the PIF and Exhibit Forms at least seven days before the date of the hearing.

1 If we do not receive a copy of your 2 forms seven days before the hearing, your application or your protest may be subject to 3 dismissal. These documents need to be submitted 4 5 to ABRA legal and to the opposing parties. Please know that these documents 6 7 greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest 8 issues, facilitating the process, and keeping the 9 parties on point during the hearing. Further, each side is limited to no 10 11 more than five witnesses, and you'll only have 12 one hour to present your case. So, the Board 13 does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to those issues that are being 14 15 protested. 16 Any questions? Hearing none --17 MR. KLINE: No, we're -- we have none. 18 MR. LAKATOS: I do not. 19 CHAIRMAN ANDERSON: All right. Thank 20 you. Mr. Lakatos, any -- all right. 21 I wish you good luck in your 2.2 negotiations. And, as I stated before, March 29, 23 at 1:30, currently our schedule is, looks bad. 2.4 So, to the parties, I support, and the 25 Board always supports settlements. And so, if
