CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Our first order	
of business is protest hearing status for Case	
Number 22-PRO-00004, Lidl, License Number 119890.	
Ms. Fashbaugh, can you please elevate	
the rights of the parties in this case?	
MR. JAIN: Good morning, Mr. Chair.	
Please stand by.	
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.	
MR. JAIN: Commissioner Brown, your	
rights have been elevated. Stephen O'Brien, your	
rights have been elevated. And Manelle Mahmoud	
(phonetic), I do not see on the list. That's	
all, Mr. Chair.	
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.	
Good morning.	
MR. O'BRIEN: Good morning, Mr. Chair.	
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,	
Mr. O'Brien. Good morning, everyone. I would	
like could the parties please identify	
themselves for the record, please, starting with	
the ANC. I'm sorry.	
COMMISSIONER BROWN: Tiffany Brown, T-	
I-F-F-A-N-Y, middle initial L, last name Brown,	

B-R-O-W-N. I am the chair of ANC 7B. I am also 1 2 the single member commissioner for 7BL2. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning. 4 Mr. O'Brien. 5 MR. O'BRIEN: Yes. Stephen O'Brien for the applicant, Lidl. 6 It's S-T-E-P-H-E-N, 7 last name O-apostrophe-B-R-I-E-N. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Perfect. Mr. 9 O'Brien, do you have a camera? 10 MR. O'BRIEN: Yes. I thought I had --11 how about now. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. I can see 13 I also would like for the record to 14 reflect at some point, I was an ANC Commissioner 15 in ANC 7B, and so while I was an ANC Commissioner, I have not been an ANC Commissioner 16 17 in this ANC for over four years now. I did work with Ms. -- Commissioner Brown as an ANC 18 19 Commissioner, and I do -- although this is not my 20 single member district, but I do live in the 21 vicinity where this supermarket potential 22 licensee is located. However, based on although 23 I am -- I'm familiar with the area, I know 24 Commissioner Brown, I believe that my previous

knowledge of Ms. Brown and knowing the area will

not impact the decisions that I can make in this case. I just wanted the record to reflect that, my familiarity with the Commissioner and also with the area. But I believe that I can make, as I've always made, decisions that are in the best interest overall for the residents of the District of Columbia.

MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Chairman?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Short.

MEMBER SHORT: Yes. I would also like to go on the record as stating that I do live in 7B, in Hillcrest, Southeast Washington, D.C., have for the last 33 years. And that will have no bearing on my decision-making involving this case. I can do this fairly and will do it fairly and in the best interests of all the citizens of the District of Columbia. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. O'Brien,

I've stated my position. Do you have anything
you want to state for the record?

MR. O'BRIEN: I certainly have no objection to the Chair or Chief Short hearing this case. This is -- what, the District is only 64 square miles. If physical proximity to a location were grounds for disqualification,

there'd be disqualifications in every single case that comes before the Board. So we certainly have no objection to the full Board including the Chair and Chief Short hearing this case.

O'Brien. Part of the licensing it was important enough, so I want the record to reflect my -- I normally don't have one of these things I'll state as living in Ward 7, one of the -- at least in the area of Ward 7, but I live -- I usually do not have to make these disclosures because we do not have many licensees, at least in my specific area. So it does shield me from making these statements, because of the -- I live, for me for choice, my choice, that there are not necessarily a lot of licensees where I specifically live.

All right. Are there any preliminary matters in this case that the parties wish to bring to the Board? We'll start with you, Mr. O'Brien.

MR. O'BRIEN: No, sir.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Brown?

COMMISSIONER BROWN: No.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

This matter then -- if this matter goes to a

hearing, it's scheduled for a show cause -- I'm sorry -- a protest hearing on April 6, 2022 at 1:30 p.m. I just want to remind the parties that if this matter goes to a show cause -- I'm sorry, why am I saying show cause -- a protest hearing, that each party is required to exchange documents and witnesses seven days prior to the hearing. If the parties fail to disclose these documents to each side and to the agency, the -- either side might be prevented from relying on documents or witnesses that were not disclosed prior. again, because these hearings are now done virtually, each side is no -- each side will have one hour to present its case, and you can have no more than five witnesses, but -- I'm sorry, let me -- one of the -- hold on one minute, please. I want to make sure that I'm reading the -- yes, each side will have no more than five witnesses if this matter goes to a protest hearing.

As I always do, I -- the agency or the Board supports the parties settling or having a settlement agreement. We support that and we prefer that if there's an agreement, at least both sides will leave happy rather than having the Board make a decision, because once the Board

2	other side might be unhappy. So the Board always		
3	supports settlement in all these protest matters.		
4	Are there any questions while you

6	COMMISSIONER BROWN: No, none for me.		
7	MR. O'BRIEN: That's right.		
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
