CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, we're on the record. Good morning, as chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board for the District of Columbia, and in accordance with D.C. Code Section 2571 of the Open Meetings Act, OMA, I'm welcoming you to the regularly scheduled meeting of the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board.

This meeting is being conducted pursuant to guidance made available by the District of Columbia's Office of Open Government regarding electronic meetings held by public bodies. Electronic meetings by the ABC Board are authorized pursuant to Section 2577A of the D.C. Code. Pursuant to the OMA requirements, notice of today's meeting was provided 48 hours in advance of the meeting on ABCA's website, and on the District's central meeting calendar.

The notice includes the time, date, agenda, and call in or log in information for public participation. This electronic meeting is being hosted by a Webex account provided by the District of Columbia Government. Please address

My name is Donovan Anderson, I'm chairperson of the board. 3 I would like to introduce the other 4 5 members of the ABC Board who are also participating electronically. Please respond 6 7 when I announce your names. Mr. James Short. 8 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. James Short, 9 present. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Silas 10 11 Grant. Mr. Silas Grant, 12 MEMBER GRANT: 13 present. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The board has 14 15 three members in attendance for the conduct of 16 business, and that constitutes a quorum. we get underway with today's hearing calendar, I 17 18 need to make a few instructions very clear so 19 that the conduct of these hearings is understood 20 by everyone. There are ten cases scheduled on 21 our calendar today. Once a case is called, I will take a 2.2 23 moment for our IT specialist to elevate the 2.4 rights for each party to enable their camera and 25 microphone. Then, and only then will you have

the ability to enable your equipment. If your case has not been heard, you will remain mute, and your camera will be disabled.

At the conclusion of each case, the parties will have the option to leave. If a party chooses to stay, all cameras and microphones for the concluded case will be disabled. Should you have any questions or require technical assistance during the hearing, please submit them using the question and answer feature.

I'd also like to apologize for the public for not starting on time promptly at 10:30 this morning. We had a long administrative meeting this morning, so I do apologize that we did not start properly at 10:30. All right, our first case on our calendar today is a protest hearing status. This is case number 24-PRO-00009 DC Smoke, license number 126787.

23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,					
24	sir.					
25	MR. LEE: Good morning.					

1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, good 2 morning everyone. Now, this is a protest hearing 3 status for DC Smoke, and all right, Mr. McGowan, are there any preliminary matters in this case? 4 5 MR. MCGOWAN: No, Chairman. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, Mr. 6 7 Shankle, on behalf of the ANC? MR. SHANKLE: There are no preliminary 8 9 matters. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, this 11 matter is then scheduled for a protest hearing on 12 April 3rd, 2024, and this is -- is this a medical 13 cannabis facility? 14 MR. MCGOWAN: Yes. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, I 16 was just asking for our -- so, I just want to 17 read the instructions for a protest hearing. Ι 18 know that Mr. Shankle is familiar with a protest 19 hearing, but I'm not sure if you, Mr. McGowan, 20 are as familiar with a protest hearing, because 21 we have not -- we've still not had a hearing as 2.2 yet on medical cannabis. 23 So, I don't know, most of the cases

that we've had so far have settled, so just want

to let the parties know the process and

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procedures if we do move forward with a hearing.

Now that we have scheduled this matter for a

protest hearing, there are a few things that I

would instruct the applicant and the protest

about.

So that the protest hearing is focused, and addresses only those issues that are being protested. The board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to this case. You should have received by electronic or regular mail, a letter explaining the protest process, a copy of the protest information form, and a copy of the exhibit form.

If we do not have these documents, please contact our legal office regarding the hearing. It is imperative that you review the rules closely and adhere to them before and during the protest hearing. You're also required to complete and submit the protest information form, PIP, and the exhibit form seven days before the date of the hearing.

These two forms, and accompanying documents, need to be submitted to ABCA's legal division, and to all opposing parties in this matter. If we do not receive a copy of your PIP,

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your application, or your protest, whichever side you're representing, may be subject to dismissal.

Likewise, if we do not receive a copy of the exhibit form, and of the exhibits themselves, your exhibits may be excluded form the record upon a finding that the opposing party has been prejudiced, or no good cause for failure to submit has been shown. Likewise, witnesses other than a party may be subject to exclusion if not identified on the PIP.

Accordingly, these forms are very important, they greatly assist the board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process, and keeping the parties on point during the hearing. They likewise provide notice to opposing parties, enabling them to better prepare for the hearing. As you are aware, all our hearings are now conducted virtually.

You will have one hour to present your case, and you will only be allowed to call five witnesses. If you require more time, please make a formal motion to the board for more time, and more witnesses if that's appropriate. Any questions?

MR. SHANKLE: No, sir.

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CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. We thank you greatly for your cooperation. If you have any questions today, or at any time leading up to the hearing, please do not hesitate to contact ABCA's legal division. If this matter can be settled through a settlement agreement, the board of course supports settlement.

But if this matter is not settled,

But if this matter is not settled, then we will see you for a protest hearing on April 3rd at 1:30, okay?

MR. SHANKLE: Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman. We are working with the applicant on reaching a settlement agreement. We just needed some more time to review that agreement before we can resolve that.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank you very much, and if you believe that this case, the parties believe that this case will truly settle, please let the agency know so we do not have to assign an investigator to this case, all right?

MR. SHANKLE: Thank you, sir.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good luck with your negotiation, have a great day, thank you very much.
