3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The
4 next case on our calendar is Case No. 23-PRO-
5 00010, Sports and Social, License No. 123418.

6 Mr. Orellana, can you please elevate
7 the rights of the parties in the case. I see
8 that Mr. Kim is already here.

9 MR. ORELLANA: Their access has been
10 elevated. Sabel Harris, your access has been
11 elevated.

12 That appears to be all, Chairman.

13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank
14 you.

15 Mr. Kim, can you please identify
16 yourself for the record?

17 MR. KIM: Sure, Jisoo Kim for the
18 Applicant, Sports and Social. Jisoo, J-I-S-O-O,
19 Kim, K-I-M.

20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.

21 Ms. Harris, can you please identify
22 yourself for the record.

23 MS. HARRIS: Good morning. I'm Sabel
24 Harris, S-A-B-E-L H-A-R-R-I-S, and I represent
25 ANC 1B.

1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And, I see
2 there's a Jamie Dunsmore. Can that person please
3 identify themselves for the record, please?

4 Who is the Dunsmore person in this
5 case?

6 MS. DUNSMORE: My name is Jamie
7 Dunsmore on behalf of the Applicant, being
8 represented by Mr. Kim today.

9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Also, can you
10 please spell and state your name for the record,
11 so the camera can tell who the person is.

12 MS. DUNSMORE: First name is Jamie, J-
13 A-M-I-E, last name is Dunsmore, D-U-N-S-M-O-R-E.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank
15 you.

16 All right. Good morning, everyone,
17 and as I stated before this is a protest hearing
18 status.

19 As a preliminary matter, I will raise
20 this. The Board is aware that the parties have
21 exchanged two things regarding this protest. The
22 Board has reviewed the motion to dismiss, and the
23 opposition to that motion, and it will be, it's
24 on our legal agenda today. And so, therefore,
25 let me state our position. So, we need to vote

1 on the motions, and hold on one second.

2 MR. KIM: Chairman Anderson?

3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is that, when
4 you speak just please identify yourself.

5 Yes, Mr. Kim.

6 MR. KIM: Yes, Jisoo Kim for the
7 Applicant. Just FYI, I believe we filed our
8 reply brief in support of the Motion to Dismiss
9 yesterday. I wasn't sure if you were able to
10 review that in full.

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, the Board
12 is aware of that. So, it's my understanding that
13 on March 1st, a motion was filed by the Applicant
14 to dismiss. And, on March 9th, we received a
15 response from the Protestants. And, as you
16 stated, on, yesterday on March 14th, a reply was
17 submitted.

18 The Board has reviewed the motion and
19 the reply, and I'm going to make a recommendation
20 to, and the Board and the Executive Committee, we
21 did review the motion.

22 And so, what I'm going to recommend
23 this morning for the Board to vote on, I'm going
24 to make a motion that the motion be denied.

25 Is there a second?

1 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I second.

2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has
3 seconded the motion. We'll have the roll call on
4 the motion.

5 Mr. Short?

6 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I agree.

7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato?

8 MEMBER CATO: Cato, I agree.

9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Crockett?

10 Ms. Crockett, I can't hear you.

11 MEMBER CROCKETT: Rafi Crockett, I
12 agree.

13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen?

14 MEMBER HANSEN: Agree.

15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis?

16 MEMBER GRANDIS: Edward Grandis, I
17 agree.

18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And, I agree,
19 the motion passes 6-0-0, so therefore we have,
20 the Board has voted to deny the motion, the
21 Motion to Dismiss.

22 Any other preliminary matters that
23 need to be addressed by the parties today?

24 MR. KIM: Not that I'm aware of,
25 Chairman.

1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So,
2 this matter, a mediation was held on the 2nd, and
3 this matter is scheduled for a Protest Hearing on
4 April 12, 2023, at 1:30 p.m.

5 Are the parties familiar, do I need to
6 read the provisions for a protest hearing? And,
7 I know that the parties are familiar with the
8 process, but just reminding you that seven days
9 before the hearing the parties are required to
10 submit a PIP, the PIP needs to be exchanged to
11 the other side, and also to the ABRA legal.
12 Failure to -- hold on, hold on, we are just off
13 the record for one minute.

14 We are back on the record.

15 So, as I stated before, seven days
16 before the hearing you are required to exchange
17 the PIP. Failure by either side to exchange
18 documents and witnesses seven days before the
19 hearing the Board might prevent either the
20 protestors or the applicant to rely on documents
21 that have not been disclosed seven days before
22 the hearing.

23 If the parties believe that this
24 matter would be settled, I will ask that you
25 alert the Agency as soon as possible, so we don't

1 have to assign an investigator to this case.

2 Any questions?

3 Ms. Harris said no, and Mr. Kim has
4 said no.

5 All right, so thank you very much for
6 your participation this morning, and good luck
7 with your negotiation. If this matter is not
8 settled, then we will see you on April the 12th at
9 1:30 p.m.

10 Have a great day. Thank you.

11 MR. KIM: Thank you, Chairman.

12 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter
13 went off the record at 11:02 a.m.)
