3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case
4	on our calendar is Case Number 21-CMP-00031,
5	Bread and Chocolate, License Number 94780.
6	Ms. Fashbaugh, can you please elevate
7	the rights of the parties in this case?
8	MS. FASHBAUGH: Please standby.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
10	MS. FASHBAUGH: I do not see the
11	Licensee on the line. Collin Cenci, your rights
12	have been elevated. George Garcia, your rights
13	have been elevated. And Lamont Mahone, your
14	rights have been elevated.
15	That is all Mr. Chair.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Mr.
17	Cenci, can you please state and spell your name
18	for the record, please?
19	MR. CENCI: Yes, good afternoon, Mr.
20	Anderson. This is Collin Cenci, C-O-L-L-I-N C-
21	E-N-C-I, appearing on behalf of the District of
22	Columbia.
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And who is here
24	with you this afternoon sir, if this matter goes
25	to a show cause hearing?
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MR. CENCI: We do have Investigator 1 2 George Garcia. I do not believe that Mr. Mahone 3 is necessary for today's hearing. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 4 5 Thank you. All right, Mr. Garcia, can you please state and spell your name for the record, please? 6 7 (No response) 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Garcia? 9 Well, let's move on until later on. Mr. Garcia, 10 can you please state and spell your name for the 11 record, please? 12 (No response) 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I cannot hear you, sir. 14 15 (No response) 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, well 17 we'll come back to you, Mr. Garcia. All right. 18 Mr. Cenci, have you -- I see that the Licensee is 19 not here. Have you been in contact with the 20 Licensee? 21 Do you know, were they expected today? 22 MR. CENCI: We have been in contact 23 with the Licensee, and I was expecting them to be 24 present today. 25 It should be, I believe Mihailina

Damian, if she is on the line. 1 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Fashbaugh, 3 can you see if -- if that person is either on the 4 line or on the phone line? It seems that that 5 individual is trying to appear before this -- oh, yes, this person, the Licensee is here. 6 7 Ms. Damian? Hello? 8 MS. DAMIAN: Yes, good afternoon. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good afternoon. 10 Can you -- can you spell and state your name for the record, please? 11 12 Okay. (Inaudible) MS. DAMIAN: 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hello ma'am? 14 MS. DAMIAN: Can you hear me? 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I can hear you 16 now, ma'am. 17 MS. DAMIAN: Yes. My name is 18 Mihailina Damian. And that's -- (inaudible) 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You're breaking 20 up, ma'am. I can't hear you now. I don't know 21 what -- I don't know what location you're in. 22 But, you are -- you're -- I cannot hear you. MS. DAMIAN: We can talk about the 23 24 place where I'm on the phone. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I cannot hear

1 you, ma'am. When you say you want to call in, do 2 you want to call in instead on the phone? 3 MS. DAMIAN: Yes. 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Then you can do 5 that, ma'am. And when, we will look for you. Do 6 you have the call in number? 7 MS. DAMIAN: No, I don't. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Fashbaugh, 9 can you please provide Ms. Damian with the call in number? 10 11 And do you have a pen and paper, 12 ma'am, so you can write this information down? 13 MS. DAMIAN: Yes. 14 MS. FASHBAUGH: Good afternoon. The 15 call in number is 1-650-479-3208. The access 16 code is 23031368587. That is all. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. 18 MS. DAMIAN: Can you repeat that 19 number? 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, what 21 did you say, ma'am? 22 Can you repeat it one MS. DAMIAN: more time? 23 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Fashbaugh, 25 could you?

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The call in 1 MS. FASHBAUGH: Yes. 2 number is 650-479-3208. The access code is 3 23031368587. Thank you. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. 4 Did 5 you receive that, ma'am? MS. DAMIAN: Yes, I did. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We'll wait for 8 you to call in then. Ms. Damian, are you on the 9 -- I see that you're also here on the line. 10 Have you called in, ma'am? 11 MS. DAMIAN: Yes. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Can 13 you -- all right, can you spell and state your 14 name again for the record, ma'am? 15 MS. DAMIAN: M-I-H-A-I-L-I-N-A D-A-M-16 I-A-N. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is 18 your relationship to this establishment, ma'am? 19 MS. DAMIAN: I am the owner of the Bread and Chocolate. 20 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 22 Thank you. Mr. Cenci, this is a -- or Mr. 23 Mahone, it's my understanding based on Mr. Cenci 24 that you are not needed for this hearing, sir. 25 So, unless you want to be here, it's

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not -- it's my -- based on the representation 1 2 made by counsel, he stated that he's not calling 3 you as a witness, sir. 4 (No response) 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I can't hear you, sir. 6 So, --7 MR. MAHONE: Can you hear me now? 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir. Ι 9 can hear you. 10 MR. MAHONE: Okay. I'll sign out. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 12 Thank you. Mr. Garcia, can you please spell and 13 state your name for the record, please? 14 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: George Garcia, 15 G-E-O-R-G-E G-A-R-C-I-A. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what's your 17 -- what is your job title, sir? 18 **INVESTIGATOR GARCIA:** Investigator. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: For what 20 agency, sir? 21 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: For the 22 Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, sir. 24 All right, Mr. Cenci, this is a -- I'm sorry, oh, 25 Yes, this is a show cause hearing, sir. okay.

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Are there preliminary matters in this 1 2 case? 3 MR. CENCI: There are no preliminary matters for the District. 4 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, fine. All right. And ma'am, have you been to a 6 7 -- have you been to a show cause hearing before? Ms. Damian? 8 9 MS. DAMIAN: No, I haven't. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 11 Well, it's going to be somewhat -- all right, so 12 basically how this case operates, ma'am, how a 13 show cause hearing operates is that the 14 Government will make an opening statement. 15 You are then -- you can then make an 16 opening statement. The Government then will call a witness, its witnesses to -- on the charge. 17 Once the Government has called its 18 19 witness -- its witness or witnesses, then the 20 Government will rest. 21 Then you will have an opportunity to 22 prove then your case. Do you plan to call any 23 witnesses today, ma'am? Or is it just you, 24 yourself going to testify? 25 MS. DAMIAN: No, it's myself.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 1 2 Then what I will do, I can't see you, but what 3 I'll do -- do you have -- do you have a camera, 4 ma'am? 5 MS. DAMIAN: Yes. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you able to 6 7 turn your camera on? 8 MS. DAMIAN: Yes. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, I can see 10 you now, ma'am. All right. Okay. So, I've left 11 it here, so once the Government has presented its 12 case, then you will have an opportunity to 13 present your case. 14 I will swear you in. And then once 15 that's done, the Board will take this matter 16 under advisement and make a decision at a later 17 date. All right? 18 All right. So, Mr. Cenci, do you wish 19 to make an opening statement, sir? 20 MR. CENCI: Yes, I do, Chairperson 21 Anderson. 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, sir. MR. CENCI: Good afternoon Chairperson 23 24 Anderson and Members of the Board. You are here 25 today in the show cause matter of Bread and

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Chocolate, Incorporated, traded as Bread and
 Chocolate, located at 2301 M. Street, Northwest,
 Washington, D.C. 20037.

This is a case about a licensed establishment's failure to keep an ABC manager or owner on duty while alcohol is available for sale, service, and consumption at the establishment.

9 Today you will hear that when an ABRA 10 Investigator visited the establishment to conduct 11 a regulatory inspection, there was no ABC manager 12 or owner present in the establishment.

And when someone did finally present themselves as an ABC manager, it turned out that their license had expired months prior to the inspection.

17 The show cause notice issued in this 18 matter concerns the charges that the Licensee 19 failed to have the establishment's owner or an 20 ABC Board approved manager present on the 21 premises during the establishment's hours of sale 22 in violation of D.C. Code Sections 25-701(a)(1)(I), and 23 DCMR, Section 707.1. 23 24 As the Petitioner today, we bear the 25 burden of proof. We must show that either

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Respondent did fail to have an ABC manager or 1 2 owner present during the licensed hours of sale 3 for the establishment by a substantial evidence 4 in the record. 5 We accept that burden, and we will be able to meet it through the testimony of our 6 7 witness, ABRA Investigator George Garcia. 8 Investigator Garcia --9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yeah, I'm 10 sorry. You're not -- is that -- is that your 11 opening statement, sir? 12 MR. CENCI: No, I'm not concluded 13 Chairperson Anderson. I thought you were saying 14 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I apologize. 16 Go ahead, sir. I apologize. 17 Investigator Garcia will MR. CENCI: 18 testify that on Wednesday, July 7, 2021 he, an 19 Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration 20 Investigator, went to the establishment to 21 conduct a regulatory inspection. 22 He will tell you that at approximately 23 1:27 p.m., he entered the establishment and asked 24 to speak with an owner or ABC manager. You'll 25 learn that an employee of the establishment

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3 He reviewed the hours of sale for the establishment, which he will tell you were 9:00 4 5 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Wednesdays. He will also testify that as he was leaving the establishment, 6 he was approached by an individual who said that 7 8 he was the ABC manager for the establishment and 9 was just returning from somewhere else. 10 But, when Investigator Garcia checked 11 this individual's ABC manager's license, he saw 12 that the license had expired on November 20, 13 2020, more than seven months prior to the 14 inspection date. 15 At the end of this hearing, it will be

16 clear that the Licensee failed to keep an ABC 17 manager or owner present during the licensed 18 hours of sale, in clear violation of D.C. Code 19 Section 25-701(a)(1)(I), and 23 DCMR, Section 20 707.1.

The willful failure to uphold their responsibilities must come with consequences. That is why at the end of today's hearing, I will ask that you find in favor of the District of Columbia, and apply a penalty consistent with

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D.C. Code Section 25-830. Thank you. 1 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. 3 Ma'am, do you wish to make an opening statement 4 at this juncture? 5 Or do you wish to make an opening statement when you present your case? It's your 6 7 option. 8 MS. DAMIAN: Yes. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I can't hear 10 you, ma'am. When do you -- I can't hear you. 11 MS. DAMIAN: So, this is a statement 12 at the end. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. **All** 14 right, fine. Thank you. All right, sir, your 15 Call -- you have a witness you wish to case. 16 call? 17 MR. CENCI: Yes. At this time the 18 District of Columbia calls ABRA Investigator 19 George Garcia. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Garcia, can 21 you raise your right hand, please? 22 Do you swear or affirm to tell the 23 truth and nothing but the truth? 24 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: I do. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right,

1	thank you. Your witness, sir.
2	WHEREUPON,
3	GEORGE GARCIA
4	was called for examination by Counsel for the
5	Government, having been first duly sworn, assumed
6	the witness stand, was examined and testified as
7	follows:
8	DIRECT EXAMINATION
9	BY MR. CENCI:
10	Q Good afternoon Investigator, could you
11	please state and spell your first and last name
12	for the record?
13	A George G-E-O-R-G-E, Garcia G-A-R-C-I-
14	Α.
15	Q Where are you currently employed?
16	A At the Alcoholic Beverage Regulation
17	Administration.
18	Q What's your position with ABRA?
19	A I'm an investigator.
20	Q How long have you been an
21	investigator?
22	A Three years.
23	Q What are some of your duties and
24	responsibilities as an investigator for ABRA?
25	A We conduct inspections and

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1 investigations of ABC licensed establishments within the District of Columbia. 2 3 Q Investigator, are you familiar with the establishment located at 2301 M Street, 4 5 Northwest, Washington, D.C. 20037, Bread and 6 Chocolate? 7 I am. Α How are you familiar with this 8 Q 9 establishment? I visited the establishment to conduct 10 Α 11 a regulatory inspection. 12 Did you inspect this establishment on Q 13 July 7, 2021? I did. 14 Α 15 When did you arrive at the 0 16 establishment for the inspection? 17 At approximately 1:27 p.m. Α 18 How did the inspection begin? 0 19 Α I identified myself as an ABRA 20 investigator to a male employee. And advised 21 them that I needed to speak to an ABC manager or 22 owner of the establishment. 23 After you told the employee that you Q 24 needed to speak to an owner or an ABC manager, 25 what did that employee of the establishment tell

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A He advised me that the ABC manager had stepped out for a moment and should be returning shortly.

Q What did it mean to you when you learned that the ABC manager had stepped out of the establishment?

8 A Automatically it would be a red flag, 9 just letting me note that the establishment is 10 either selling, consuming, or having alcohol 11 while an ABC manager is not present.

12 Q Did the employee tell you that an 13 owner was present in the establishment instead of 14 an ABC manager?

15

He did not.

Α

16 Q So, what did you do after you learned 17 that there was no owner or ABC manager present in 18 Bread and Chocolate that day?

A I continued to conduct the regulatory
inspections to see if there were any other
violations at the establishment.

Q After you concluded your
investigation, before you left the establishment
that day, did you encounter anyone who claimed to
be an ABC manager for the establishment?

I concluded my regulatory inspection. 1 Α 2 And after maybe about five minutes after getting 3 to my vehicle, I was approached by an employee while I was in my vehicle, claiming to be the ABC 4 manager of the establishment. 5 Did you review any sort of 6 0 7 documentation to confirm their claim that they 8 were the ABC manager? Yes, I did. 9 Α I reviewed his ABC 10 manager license he provided to me, and observed 11 that the ABC manager's license expired in 2020, 12 of November. 13 0 What did it mean to you when you saw 14 that this person's ABC manager's license had 15 expired? That the establishment was still not 16 Α 17 in compliance. 18 0 Given that this person's ABC manager's 19 license had expired in November 2020, would it 20 have affected your -- would it have affected your 21 investigation if that person were present when 22 you had arrived at the establishment? 23 Α Because technically, the person No. 24 was still not an ABC manager due to their ABC 25 manager's license being expired.

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And I just want to be clear for the 1 0 2 record, Investigator Garcia, who was this 3 individual who presented himself as an ABC manager? 4 5 His name was Atsou Amegee. Α CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: How do you 6 7 spell that name, sir? Can you just spell that 8 for the record and pronounce that? 9 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: Atsou A-T-S-O-U, 10 Amegee A-M-E-G-E-E. 11 MR. CENCI: Investigator Garcia, after 12 you completed your inspection of Break and Chocolate on July 7, 2021, did you complete a 13 14 case report? 15 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: I did. 16 MR. CENCI: And would you recognize a 17 copy of that report if I were to show it to you 18 today? 19 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: I would. 20 MR. CENCI: All right, Chairperson 21 Anderson, I would like to request that I be 22 permitted to share my screen so that I can share 23 the case report for this investigation. 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Ms. 25 Fashbaugh, can you please allow him to share his

1 screen, please? MS. FASHBAUGH: This has been 2 3 accomplished. 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Go 5 ahead, sir. 6 MR. CENCI: I don't believe that I can 7 share my screen still. My button is still dark. INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: 8 I can. 9 MR. CENCI: Oh, I can see it now. **All** 10 right. Investigator Garcia, can you see what I 11 am sharing on my screen? 12 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: Yes. BY MR. CENCI: 13 14 Do I need to zoom in or zoom out at Q 15 all for you to be able to read it? 16 Α No. 17 All right. I'm going to just scroll Q through the entirety of the document to make sure 18 19 that it's complete. Will you please review it as 20 I scroll through. 21 Now I'm returning to the top. 22 Α Um-hum. 23 All right, Investigator Garcia, do you Q 24 recognize this document? 25 Α Yes.

What is it? 1 Q 2 Α It's the Investigative Case Report 3 that I completed. 4 Q Is it part of your job as an 5 investigator to draft case reports like this one? 6 Α Yes. 7 MR. CENCI: Mr. Chairperson, the District would like to confirm for the record, 8 9 that Government Exhibit 1, the July 7, 2021 Case Report for Bread and Chocolate, is already in 10 11 evidence pursuant to 23 DCMR, Section 1713.10. 12 (Whereupon, the abovereferred to document was 13 marked as Government Exhibit 14 15 No. 1 for identification.) 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, it is. 17 Thank you. MR. CENCI: All right. Thank you 18 19 Chairperson Anderson. Investigator Garcia, I would like to 20 21 direct your attention to what's been marked in 22 this report as Exhibit 2. Do you see what I have 23 presented on the screen? 24 **INVESTIGATOR GARCIA:** Yes. 25 (Whereupon, the above-

1	referred to document was
2	marked as Government Exhibit
3	No. 2 for identification.)
4	MR. CENCI: What is this document?
5	INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: It's a
6	Regulatory Inspection.
7	BY MR. CENCI:
8	Q Does this document list the hours of
9	sale for alcohol for this establishment?
10	A It does.
11	Q What were the hours of sales for
12	Wednesday, the day that you conducted the
13	inspection of Bread and Chocolate?
14	A For Wednesday, the hours were 7:00
15	a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
16	MR. CENCI: Thank you, Investigator.
17	I'm now going to direct your attention towards
18	what's been previously marked as Exhibit 3 of
19	this document.
20	What is this document?
21	(Whereupon, the above-
22	referred to document was
23	marked as Government Exhibit
24	No. 3 for identification.)
25	INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: That's the

establishment's ABC license. 1 BY MR. CENCI: 2 3 Q Does this document also list the hours of sale for alcohol for the establishment? 4 5 It does. Α What were the hours of sale for 6 0 7 Wednesday, the day that you conducted your inspection? 8 9 Α Again, 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. MR. CENCI: Thank you, Investigator. 10 11 I'm now going to direct your attention to what's 12 been previously marked as Exhibit 11 in the case 13 report. What is this document Investigator? 14 15 (Whereupon, the abovereferred to document was 16 17 marked as Government Exhibit No. 11 for identification.) 18 19 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: That's the ABC 20 manager's license of the employee that he 21 presented to me. 22 BY MR. CENCI: 23 Investigator, what day did this ABC Q 24 manager's license expire? 25 Α November 20, 2020.

To your knowledge, was this ABC 1 Q 2 manager's license current on the day you 3 conducted your inspection? 4 Α It was not. 5 All right. Thank you. I will stop Q sharing my screen now. 6 7 Investigator Garcia, throughout your whole inspection of Break and Chocolate on July 8 7, 2021, did you ever encounter an owner of the 9 establishment? 10 11 I did not. Α 12 And throughout your whole inspection Q 13 of Bread and Chocolate on July 7, 2021 did you 14 ever encounter an active ABC manager of the 15 establishment? I did not. 16 Α 17 Thank you Investigator, I MR. CENCI: 18 have no further questions at this time. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Damian, do 20 you have any questions of the Investigator? Ι 21 can't hear you, ma'am. 22 CROSS EXAMINATION 23 No, I don't. MS. DAMIAN: 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Thank 25 Do any of the Board Members have any you.

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questions of the Investigator? 1 2 (No response) 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Garcia, 4 just a quick question. 5 **INVESTIGATOR GARCIA:** Okay. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What type of 6 7 establishment is Bread and Chocolate? 8 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: It is a 9 restaurant. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you know 11 whether or not --12 (Simultaneous speaking) 13 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: A D restaurant. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, a --15 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: A D as in -- I'm 16 sorry? 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Excuse me, sir. 18 Go ahead. 19 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: It's a D 20 restaurant. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What does that 22 mean, sir? 23 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: It means that 24 the establishment can only sell beer and wine. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, did the --

during the time of your visit, was there anyone 1 consuming alcohol in the establishment? 2 3 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: I do not recall. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you know 4 whether or not alcohol was visible? 5 Do you recall if the space has a bar? 6 7 INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: I do not recall. 8 But, I do not believe that the establishment has 9 a bar. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Was there any 11 visible alcohol within the area -- within the 12 restaurant during the time of your visit? INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: I don't recall. 13 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Ms. 15 Damian, do you have any questions off of the --16 off the -- I'm sorry, do any other Board Members 17 have any other questions? 18 (No response) 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Ms. 20 Damian, do you have any questions of the witness 21 based on the questions that I asked? 22 MS. DAMIAN: On that day, with 23 yourself come, I call --24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ma'am. Ma'am, 25 I'm asking you if you have, not a statement, but

a question for him? 1 I don't. 2 MS. DAMIAN: No. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 4 Thank you. Mr. Cenci, do you have a question --5 do you have a -- any redirect of the witness? REDIRECT EXAMINATION 6 7 MR. CENCI: Yes, I do Chairperson 8 Anderson. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead. Investigator Garcia, you 10 MR. CENCI: 11 were able to conduct an inspection of Break and 12 Chocolate on July 7, 2021, were you not? INVESTIGATOR GARCIA: 13 Yes. BY MR. CENCI: 14 15 While you were at the establishment, 0 do you recall seeing any member of staff refusing 16 17 to sell alcohol to a patron? 18 Α No. 19 Q Do you recall any signage posted in the establishment that indicted that alcohol was 20 21 not being served? 22 Α No. 23 Do you recall seeing any staff locking Q 24 up or storing alcohol? 25 Α No.

MR. CENCI: Thank you Investigator, I 1 2 have no further questions. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Do 4 you have another witness, sir? 5 MR. CENCI: The District has no additional witnesses and at this time rests its 6 7 case in chief. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, that's 9 fine. Thank you. Ms. Damian, do you -- do you 10 have any witnesses that you plan to call? 11 Or is it just you yourself? Are you 12 going to make a statement the venue was 13 justified, is that your position? 14 MS. DAMIAN: Sir, I will make a 15 statement. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you raise 17 your right hand please, ma'am? 18 Do you swear or affirm that the --19 ma'am, I need you to raise your right hand. Do 20 you swear or affirm to tell the truth and nothing 21 but the truth? 22 MS. DAMIAN: Yes. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Go 24 ahead, ma'am. 25 WHEREUPON

1	MIHAILINA DAMIAN
2	was called for examination by Respondent, having
3	been first duly sworn, assumed the witness stand,
4	was examined and testified as follows:
5	DIRECT EXAMINATION
6	MS. DAMIAN: My first, you know, I'm
7	new in this. So, we had an employer that was the
8	manager, but he left a couple of days ago.
9	And our other manager's license was
10	expired. But, because of the COVID situation,
11	all the expire all the license was postdated.
12	So, I guess this is the the reason
13	he didn't renew his license. And also, for ABRA
14	it's we don't have a manager in two weeks,
15	then we we don't have the right to sell the
16	alcohol.
17	So, for that day, we didn't sell no
18	alcohol. And I give the send the report to
19	the to the board on that day. We didn't sell
20	no alcohol.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you have any
22	other do you have anything else you wanted to
23	say, ma'am?
24	MS. DAMIAN: Say that again?
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is that the
•	

extent of your statement? 1 2 MS. DAMIAN: Yes. Yes. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cenci, do 4 you have any questions of her? 5 CROSS EXAMINATION MR. CENCI: Yes, I do, briefly, 6 7 Chairperson Anderson. 8 Ms. Damian, you are an owner of Bread 9 and Chocolate, right? 10 MS. DAMIAN: Correct. 11 BY MR. CENCI: 12 You're aware of the responsibilities Q 13 that come with owning a business that serves alcohol? 14 15 Α Yes. Um-hum. You assert that your establishment 16 0 17 didn't sell alcohol on July 7, 2021. Is that 18 right? 19 Α (No response) 20 0 Is that right? 21 Right. Α 22 So, you weren't present at the Q 23 establishment on July 7, 2021, were you? 24 No, I was not present. Α 25 So, you did not see if the staff had 0

1 locked up the alcohol that day? 2 Α No. 3 Q You did not hear any member of staff refuse to sell alcohol to any patrons? 4 5 I did not. Α You don't know if any signage was 6 0 7 posted to indicate that alcohol was not being serviced? 8 9 Α No. You don't know if the staff took any 10 0 11 steps to ensure that alcohol wasn't being served 12 to patrons? 13 Α (no response) 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I can't hear 15 you, ma'am. 16 MS. DAMIAN: Correct. 17 MR. CENCI: You don't know if the 18 staff took any steps to ensure that alcohol 19 wasn't being consumed in the establishment? 20 MS. DAMIAN: Correct. But, our manager and during this now was -- and sell no --21 22 (inaudible) 23 BY MR. CENCI: 24 Ms. Damian, I want to bring you back Q 25 to my question. I'm not asking about what the

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1 manager was supposed to do. 2 I'm asking what you know. And you 3 don't know if the staff took any steps to ensure 4 that alcohol was not being consumed in the 5 establishment that day? Correct. 6 Α 7 And you don't know if the staff took Q 8 any steps to ensure that alcohol wasn't being 9 sold. 10 Α No. No. 11 MR. CENCI: All right. Thank you, Ms. 12 Damian. I have no further questions. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any questions 14 by the Board Members? 15 (No response) 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Damian, you 17 said that you sent a statement to ABRA. What do you mean, you said -- what statement and when did 18 19 you send a statement to ABRA that no lack of a --20 no alcohol was being sold that day? 21 So, I sent the MS. DAMIAN: 22 (inaudible) --23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I can't hear 24 you ma'am. You're breaking up. I don't know --25 you're breaking up.

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1	MS. DAMIAN: I send it to Mr. Collin
2	as well. That the the report for the day, end
3	of the day report that the we haven't sell any
4	alcohol.
5	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, did you
6	disclose this you know that when you have a
7	hearing you can disclose documents and witnesses.
8	Did you disclose this document to the
9	Government and to us seven days before the
10	hearing? Did you do that ma'am?
11	MS. DAMIAN: No, I have not.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, how so
13	how do we know that that the document exists?
14	MS. DAMIAN: I just sent it yesterday.
15	So, I don't
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now ma'am,
17	you're saying that because of COVID, that the
18	licenses were extended. Is that what what
19	where does that come from?
20	If you're aware that the manager's
21	license had expired in November of the I think
22	it says it had expired November 2020.
23	(Simultaneous speaking)
24	MS. DAMIAN: Well the
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And this was

July 7, 2021. Where are you saying that all of 1 the licenses were ex -- were extended? 2 3 Who told you that? 4 MS. DAMIAN: Let me share with the 5 other license. So, they -- they say that they signed because of COVID. So, we rely on that. 6 7 But, I guess it was our mistake. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, you never -9 - you never tried to -- is it correct to state 10 that you didn't try to renew the license prior to 11 the expiration. Is that correct? 12 MS. DAMIAN: No. We tried. But, the 13 manager had COVID and then other things came. 14 so. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, do you know when this license was renewed? 16 17 I believe immediately MS. DAMIAN: 18 after that, he renewed it right after. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, does this 20 manager whose license was expired, is he 21 currently employed with --22 MS. DAMIAN: Yes, he is. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And does he 23 24 currently have a license, a valid license? 25 MS. DAMIAN: Yes, he does.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. 1 Any 2 other questions by any other Board Members? 3 (No response) CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cenci, do 4 5 you have any questions that you wish to ask Ms. Damian? 6 7 MR. CENCI: No, Chairperson Anderson. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes? Yes or no 9 questions? 10 MR. CENCI: No. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No? Okay. 12 Ma'am, do you -- do you have anything else you 13 want to say? Do you rest? 14 MS. DAMIAN: No, I don't. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cenci, do 16 you wish to make a closing statement, sir? 17 MR. CENCI: Yes, Chairperson Anderson. 18 Members of the Board, this case is about the 19 establishment's willful failure to uphold the 20 responsibilities that come with an ABC license. 21 Today the District has proven by a 22 substantial evidence that the Licensee failed to 23 have an owner or ABC manager present during the 24 hours of sale for the establishment when alcohol 25 was accessible to the public for sale, service

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and consumption.

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2	We heard from Investigator Garcia that
3	on Wednesday, July 7, 2021, he went to the
4	establishment to conduct a regulatory inspection.
5	He told you that at about 1:27 p.m., he spoke to
6	an employee of the establishment who told him
7	that there was no owner and no ABC manager
8	present in the establishment.
9	He told you that he checked the hours
10	of sale for the establishment and saw they were
11	7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. on Wednesdays, which
12	certainly encompasses the time that he was
13	present at the establishment, 1:27.
14	He went on to state that an individual
15	did eventually present himself as the ABC manager
16	for the establishment, but his ABC manager
17	license was expired, and had been for seven
18	months.
19	Ms. Damian also testified today, and
20	she claimed that she should not be held
21	responsible for this failure to follow the law,
22	because the establishment did not sell alcohol on
23	the day of the inspection.
24	But we need to follow what the law
25	says, not what Ms. Damian wants it to say. And

what D.C. Code, Section 25-701(a)(1)(ii)(c) says, 1 2 in relation to when an owner or ABC manager is 3 not required to be present at the establishment, it says they are not required when quote, 4 5 alcoholic beverages are secure and not accessible to the public for sale, service, or consumption, 6 7 unquote. In 23 DCMR, Section 707.1 reads that 8 9 in the ab -- quote, in the absence of a licensee, 10 a board approved manager shall be present at the 11 licensed premises during the hours that alcoholic 12 beverages are permitted to be sold, served, or 13 consumed on the licensed premises, unquote. The evidence has been consistent from 14 15 both sides today that an ABC manager was not 16 present at the establishment when Inspector 17 Garcia arrived. Ms. Damian said herself that she 18 19 agrees, the license for the ABC manager on duty 20 that day had expired. That they were unable to 21 get it renewed because of COVID-based delays. 22 But, this wasn't simply a license that 23 had expired a week ago, two weeks ago, even one 24 month ago. It was seven months expired. 25 And she wants you to believe that

that's okay, because regardless of the status of 1 the alcohol ABC license for the manager, the 2 3 establishment didn't sell alcohol. But then that doesn't beg the question 4 of, if alcohol was sold, it begs the question 5 that alcohol was available to be sold. 6 And we heard no testimony that the 7 8 establishment locked up the alcohol in the 9 establishment while the ABC manager was absent. No testimony that employees of the establishment 10 11 informed patrons that alcohol was not available 12 for sale. 13 No testimony that the establishment 14 posted any sort of indication that alcohol was 15 not being served that day. No testimony at all that credits the Licensees' events. 16 17 They should not be permitted to skirt 18 the law based on a self-serving assertion that no 19 customers ordered alcohol on the day of the 20 inspection. We have no guarantee that had 21 someone ordered alcohol that they wouldn't have 22 just gone ahead and served it. 23 Now, the District recognizes that it 24 bore the burden of proof today. And what was 25 that proof?

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1	According to 23 DCMR, Section 1711.6		
2	in this and all other show cause hearings, the		
3	District bears the burden of proving by		
4	substantial evidence in the record that the		
5	Licensee in fact violated the law.		
6	Substantial evidence is not a high		
7	burden, Members of the Board. It's not beyond a		
8	reasonable doubt. It's not even a preponderance		
9	of the evidence.		
10	Substantial evidence means that the		
11	degree of relevant evidence which a reasonable		
12	person considering the record as a whole, might		
13	accept as adequate to support a conclusion, even		
14	though other reasonable persons might disagree.		
15	The District has certainly met that		
16	burden today through the testimony of		
17	Investigator Garcia, the investigative report in		
18	evidence, and even further supported of the		
19	Licensee on the record.		
20	The evidence today has supported one		
21	outcome and one outcome alone. The District has		
22	met its burden to prove by substantial evidence		
23	that the Respondent failed to have an owner or		
24	ABC manager present in the establishment when		
25	alcohol was accessible for sale, service, and		

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consumption.

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2	And thus proving the charge in the		
3	notice to show cause. Licensee cannot avoid		
4	responsibility by attempting to exploit a		
5	technicality that is ultimately not actually in		
6	their favor.		
7	It is for that reason that we ask you		
8	to find in favor of the District of Columbia and		
9	apply a penalty consistent with D.C. Code Section		
10	25-830. Thank you.		
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.		
12	Thank you. Ms. Damian, in closing what is it		
13	that you want the Agency to do the Board to		
14	do, ma'am?		
15	MS. DAMIAN: I want the other		
16	inspector when they came the second time to drop		
17	the paper, they say in case we don't have an ABRA		
18	license, then we we have the right to just		
19	post a note and say we are not selling alcohol.		
20	So, we weren't aware of that. But, I		
21	guess we didn't do it. So, like I know everyone		
22	been through a lot during this COVID.		
23	So, it's up to you if you want to		
24	waive the penalty or		
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's it		

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1	ma'am?			
2	MS. DAMIAN: Yes.			
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.			
4	Thank you. All right, the record is now closed.			
5	And so let me read this instruction.			
6	As Chairperson of the Alcoholic			
7	Beverage Control Board for the District of			
8	Columbia in accordance with D.C. Official Code			
9	Section 2574(B) of the open meetings act, I move			
10	that the ABC Board hold a closed meeting for the			
11	purpose of seeking legal advice from our counsel			
12	on Case Number 21-CMP-00031, Bread and Chocolate.			
13	Pursuant to D.C. Official Code Section			
14	2574(B)(4) of the open meetings act, and			
15	deliberating upon Case Number 21-CMP-00031, Bread			
16	and Chocolate for the reasons cited in D.C.			
17	Official Code Section 2574(B)(13) of the open			
18	meeting act.			
19	Is there a second?			
20	MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I second.			
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has			
22	seconded the motion. I will now take a roll call			
23	vote on the motion before us now that it has been			
24	second.			
25	Mr. Short?			

1 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I agree. 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato? MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato, I agree. 3 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Crockett? 5 MEMBER CROCKETT: Rafi Crockett, I 6 agree. 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen? 8 MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen, I agree. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And Mr. 10 Anderson, I agree. The matter passes five to 11 zero. 12 As it appears that the motion has 13 passed, I hereby give notice that the ABC Board 14 will recess these proceedings to hold a closed 15 meeting in the ABC Board conference room pursuant 16 to Section 2574(B) of the open meeting act. 17 What we will now -- ma'am, we will issue -- the Board will issue a decision within 18 19 90 days. 20 Thank you for being here today, you 21 and Mr. Cenci. And have a good day. We'll issue 22 a decision in 90 days. Okay? Hold on a minute. I think we lost 23 24 I just want to make sure that -- Ms. her. 25 Damian, I just want to make -- I saw that we had

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1 lost you for a minute. But for the official record that --2 3 well, the case is over. I think you're having some technical difficulty. 4 5 So, the case is over. The Board will 6 issue a decision in 90 days. Thank you very 7 Have a great day. much. 8 MS. DAMIAN: Thank you. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Uh-huh. The case is over, ma'am. We'll issue a decision in 10 11 Thank you very much. 90 days. 12 You heard me, ma'am? 13 MS. DAMIAN: Yes, I did. Thank you. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. **All** 15 right, bye-bye. 16 MS. DAMIAN: Bye. 17 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 2:33 p.m.) 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25
