3	CHAIR ANDERSON: All right. The last				
4	hearing for our morning is a fact-finding				
5	hearing, and this is for a temporary license				
6	application for Miracle Theater.				
7	And now we can have Ms. Lana Mahmoud.				
8	MR. ORELLANA: Has been elevated.				
9	That is all, Chairman.				
10	CHAIR ANDERSON: Thank you. Good				
11	morning, Ms. Mahmoud. Can you please identify				
12	yourself for the record, in this, for the right				
13	case now, ma'am?				
14	MS. MAHMOUD: Good morning once again.				
15	Lana Mahmoud, spelled L-A-N-A, last name M-A-H-M-				
16	O-U-D.				
17	CHAIR ANDERSON: All right. Good				
18	morning, ma'am.				
19	MS. MAHMOUD: Good morning.				
20	CHAIR ANDERSON: This is a fact-				
21	finding hearing, and one of the reasons why we				
22	have a fact-finding hearing is that the Board				
23	you have requested a significant amount of one-				
24	day hearing I'm sorry, a one-day temporary				
25	license for the Miracle Theater and for the Sixth				

& I Synagogue. And so, this is a series of requests that you have requested over the years, and some Board members are wondering, since you have been requesting these significant amount of one-day licenses, why is it that you have not applied for a permanent license?

And so -- so, let's start off, since this is a fact-finding hearing: who are you, and your business model, and tell us why is it that every so often you have been applying for temporary one-day license from our agency, ma'am?

MS. MAHMOUD: Absolutely, no problem.

So, again, my name is Lana, I'm the Director of

Operations for Union Stage, located in

Washington, D.C. We also operate doing business
as Union Stage Presents.

So, we are a concert space and private event space located at The Wharf in Southwest, and we currently have a events contract with Miracle Theater, located in Southeast, and Capital Turnaround, also located in Southeast.

What we do is we present concerts at these spaces. We don't own these spaces; we don't have a liquor license for those spaces; they don't have liquor license for those spaces.

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So, what we do, as, you know, a concert venue and as a booking company -- essentially, a promoter for public events -- we put on concerts in these spaces per their request, to bring in business for their venues.

In addition to that, because we have a liquor license for Union Stage, they've requested that we provide the alcohol for their events, since they're not permitted to have a liquor license because they're owned under a church.

So, we present concerts there. And so, for each concert date that we have from the very beginning years and years ago, once we started this, we were asked to get temporary licenses -- it's how we were told to do it by ABRA many years ago.

But we would love a permanent solution. I've reached out many, many times to ABRA with no response regarding, you know, getting a catering license or just understanding what our options are.

CHAIR ANDERSON: Well, let me ask you a question. So, what is it that -- when these events occurs at these two locations, what is it

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that you provide?

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MS. MAHMOUD: Sure. So, it depends on the venue. So, for Miracle Theater, we provide beer and wine only. And at Capital Turnaround, and one of our other -- the other venues that we present at, we provide beer, wine, and sometimes, based on the show, canned cocktails. So, I quess, spirits.

CHAIR ANDERSON: Spirits. So you don't provide food for any of these events, is that correct?

MS. MAHMOUD: No, sir. We tried to get a vending license to provide snacks and just miscellaneous easy items that we could bring, but, again, we reached out several times to different D.C. providers with no avail. So.

CHAIR ANDERSON: Now, if you applied to D.C. for a caterers license, then you'd have to provide food. Is that something that you're - would you be able to provide food to any of these venues, if you were to apply for a caterers license?

MS. MAHMOUD: Unfortunately not. I believe that was the stop with the catering license. We don't have a full-service kitchen

located at Union Stage, which is our primary location, and the liquor license that we apply for these temporary permits under. We only have a prep kitchen there. So we do make, you know, pizzas and wings and things like that, but they are done and very small, simple convection ovens.

We don't have the scaling and the kitchen size to vend food for these events. We have worked with other companies that do provide food in the past. So, for example, we worked with a restaurant in D.C. that had a catering license and they provided food for some events.

Unfortunately, they were no longer to be able -- they were not able to continue these services because of the scale of the events.

CHAIR ANDERSON: All right. So, tell us about -- now, how does patrons pay to participate in these events?

MS. MAHMOUD: Sure. So, all attendees for all of our public shows that we host at these off-site venues -- that's what we refer to when we're talking about anything outside of the four walls, and what these licenses are for -- they purchase tickets.

So, they're purchasing general

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admission tickets, or sometimes a VIP ticket.

None of those include beverages, but beverages are available for purchase once they enter the building.

CHAIR ANDERSON: And how long have you been doing this?

MS. MAHMOUD: We've been doing these events for, I would say, at least three years, if not four. I've been in this position for probably five years now, so a little after I started in this position.

CHAIR ANDERSON: And normally you have 500 attendees at these events, so tell us about the security that's provided and who provides the security.

MS. MAHMOUD: Sure. So, the attendance really varies, just as some of you, I mean, I'm sure have experienced, if you've been to a concert -- sometimes it's 50 people, sometimes it's 500. But we have our own security personnel, they're W-2 employees that are hired through our company, and they provide security personnel.

CHAIR ANDERSON: What type of training is provided to the security and who provides the

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training?

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MS. MAHMOUD: Absolutely. So, we have a Head of Security that provides a first aid and CPR training. He actually just very recently completed, I believe it was the -- I forget the acronym for it but it is a training that prevents sexual violence, and educating people on sexual violence.

So, that was a training he completed and he is now a certified trainer, and is passing that trainer along to his employees.

We're also having him and our other
Head of Security -- so, anyone who would have to
be kind of in charge of other security personnel
-- completing a TIPS training, as well.

CHAIR ANDERSON: All right, thank you.

Any questions by any Board members?

Go ahead, Mr. Short.

MEMBER SHORT: Good morning, Ms. --

MS. MAHMOUD: Good morning, Mr. Short.

MEMBER SHORT: I've been on the Board for a period of time and I had no idea that we were giving licenses for one-days to a company that you -- you and your company. And that you had no real license to sell alcohol in

1 Washington, D.C., other than -- what's the name 2 of the company, again, you? 3 MS. MAHMOUD: So -- I apologize. So, we do have a liquor license, because we own a 4 5 business at The Wharf in D.C., under -- the legal entity is BBDC, LLC, doing business as Union 6 7 Stage. 8 So, we do have a liquor license --I understand that. 9 MEMBER SHORT: 10 MS. MAHMOUD: Yes, sir. 11 MEMBER SHORT: I do think that there 12 is a workaround through our code where you could 13 use that license, but I think that the way that 14 you are using it now is inappropriate. 15 MS. MAHMOUD: Okay. 16 (Simultaneous speaking.) 17 MEMBER SHORT: I'd like to get, if you 18 would agree to it, to come into our office, sit 19 down with our licensing specialist, and find out 20 how you can continue to do this. I have voted 21 on many occasions for the one-day licenses, 2.2 knowing what I know about Miracle Theater and 23 knowing what I know about the church at Sixth & I 2.4 Street.

So, I would not, as a Board member,

want to see you discontinued. However, I, as a Board member, want it to be done according to the code, and in a way that I would feel comfortable -- and this Board can feel comfortable -- in granting further licenses to you.

I would say this to you today, at this hearing -- and thank you for coming in and agreeing to meet with us -- that, if I hear from our Licensing Division that you've come in and amended, or are working on amending, the way that you're doing business through your company, then I will continue granting the one-days.

But, up until this point, I don't think that I could vote, at this particular juncture, to continue. And I'm only one Board member, so I'll just say this -- I would say to you, when can you come in? Or when could you go down to our office and work with our licensing division?

MS. MAHMOUD: No problem. Yeah, I mean, as soon as possible. Once again, we've been we've -- we always want to do things right by ABRA, first and foremost, just to be clear.

We originally -- just to give you a little bit of background, we're originally from

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Virginia, we opened this business, Union Stage, in D.C. in 2017. We started these offset events in 2019. So, it's been a learning curve.

When we first visited ABRA, this is how we were told to do it. If that is not correct or you believe that it's inappropriate, I am more than happy to come by in person. What's the best way to schedule that meeting for me to come by in person, sir?

MEMBER SHORT: I think that you need to give our office a call. And if you could go to our website, all the information you would need about getting in contact with our office, you can get through our website.

But, also, I would like to ask you about some of the questions that were asked you about security.

MS. MAHMOUD: Yes, sir.

MEMBER SHORT: Are you aware that the District government, Metropolitan Police Department, the Council, if not recently, they're working on making sure that any people that work in security, especially where alcohol is served, get the appropriate training.

And I understand -- I heard you talk

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about sexual violence and a few other things, but that's a far distance from dealing with crowds of 700-800 people drinking alcohol, in the locations that we're talking about.

There is some specialized training that your security people could get, and I think it's free, from MPD. So, I'd like for you to -- just, if you would, contact MPD, and have your security person's contact MPD, and provide that information to the Board or to the Licensing. I think that would help and go a long way, that you're working with us and we'll continue to work with you.

MS. MAHMOUD: Absolutely. Yeah, I took note of that, so we'll definitely reach out to MPD and see what trainings that they offer.

Just because -- yeah, absolutely, we want everyone trained as well as possible to avoid any issues, of course.

MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Well, we can't make you do anything today because this is a fact-finding hearing, but I'm glad that you've agreed to do these things. And I wish that, once you get in contact with our licensing folks, they will let us know at our next Board meeting how to

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1	proceed with any further one-day licenses, or
2	temporary licenses, under your name.
3	MS. MAHMOUD: Okay, understood. So,
4	the next step, I will go ahead and contact the
5	licensing office to set up a meeting and then
6	we'll go from there.
7	MEMBER SHORT: Okay, and also MPD,
8	correct?
9	MS. MAHMOUD: Yes, sir. That's
10	correct.
11	MEMBER SHORT: All right, thank you.
12	That's all I have, Mr. Chair.
13	And thank you very much for your
14	testimony today.
15	MS. MAHMOUD: Yes, sir. No problem.
16	MEMBER SHORT: That's all I have, Mr.
17	Chair.
18	CHAIR ANDERSON: Any other questions
19	thank you, Mr. Short. Any other questions by
20	any other Board members?
21	(No response.)
22	CHAIR ANDERSON: All right, Ms.
23	Mahmoud. Let me clarify the record, you're not
24	doing anything wrong, okay, as far as the Board
25	is concerned, okay? I think that you have been

requesting a series of one-day licenses and the Board has been approving these one-day licenses.

And so, because we see these One-Day licenses, we normally will call the person to find out what their business model is, and to see whether or not is this the appropriate license that is being utilized for you.

So, I don't want you to leave today to say that you're doing anything wrong by applying for one-day licenses. You have not -- I'm not aware that -- I do not know if we have monitored any of your events, but at least I'm not aware currently of any violations, to say that you have done anything improperly, once we have granted these one-day temporary licenses.

But one of the things that I -- based on your conversation with Mr. Short -- that I'll ask that you either, contact Ms. Karen Jackson or Mr. Sean Gordy, who are in our Licensing Division.

MS. MAHMOUD: Okay.

CHAIR ANDERSON: To just talk to them about your business model, and they can provide you information whether or not you are able to -- what type of license can be utilized.

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You stated that you currently have a license in D.C.

MS. MAHMOUD: Absolutely.

CHAIR ANDERSON: And if you have a license in D.C., one of the options -- and I don't know if this would be appropriate for you -- is that you could request a one-day substantial change of your current license. So you could use your current license to take it to these other establishments to use. So that's also an option that -- but I don't know if that -- I'm not sure if that's appropriate.

So, we will discuss the current application that you have in front of us and, at least as the Chair -- and this is, again, I only have one vote -- I don't necessarily have a problem. But one of the things that I said before, I will ask you to once again reach out to Mr. Sean Gordy, for Mr. Gordy to provide you some directions on the type of licenses that you can utilize.

And the one thing that I will say that this Board will do -- I mean, we will follow up with Mr. Gordy and see what recommendations that he has provided to you about moving forward. And

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1 I think the events that -- what you have in front 2 of us, I think you have an event for April 19, 3 20, and 22, I think those are the ones that are currently -- those are the only applications that 4 5 you have in front of us. Is that correct? MS. MAHMOUD: That are currently 6 7 pending, yes, sir. 8 CHAIR ANDERSON: Yes. MS. MAHMOUD: I did receive -- and I 9 I did receive a copy of 10 apologize to interrupt. 11 the approved licenses, I believe. So, I have a license, I have the file in front of me from the 12 13 licensing office that shows we do have the 14 licenses approved already for the 19th, the 20th, 15 and the 22nd. 16 (Simultaneous speaking.) CHAIR ANDERSON: Well, if we had 17 18 approved that, then, if those were approved, I'm 19 not sure, but as moving forward --20 MS. MAHMOUD: Yes, sir. CHAIR ANDERSON: 21 For moving forward, 2.2 then, for any other requests from you, then we 23 need to get further information from licensing to 2.4 see whether or not this is a proper type of

license you should continue applying for, moving

1	forward. Okay?
2	MS. MAHMOUD: Understood. I'll reach
3	out to MPD and then I will reach out to Licensing
4	to speak to Ms. Jackson or Mr. Gordy.
5	CHAIR ANDERSON: Thank you very much,
6	ma'am.
7	MS. MAHMOUD: You're very welcome.
8	CHAIR ANDERSON: All right, thank you.
9	MS. MAHMOUD: Thanks for your time.
