CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. The next case on our calendar is Case number 23-PRO00021, Mayden, License number 106450. Mr.

Orellana, can you please elevate the protestant in this case, please.

MR. ORELLANA: Santiago Lakatos, your access has been elevated. That appears to be all, Chairman.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
MR. ROME: Good morning. Scott Rome once again on behalf of the licensee.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning. Mr. Lakatos, can you please spell and state your name for the record, and identify yourself, please? I cannot hear you, Mr. Lakatos. Mr. Orellana, can you please elevate Ms. Ringuette, please?

MR. LAKATOS: Mr. Chairman, are you able to hear me now?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. I can hear you, sir. Go ahead.

MR. LAKATOS: Sorry. Thank you. Apologies for bearing with me. Santiago Lakatos,

S-A-N-T-I-A-G-O, L-A-K-A-T-O-S, representing the ANC in this matter.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning. Ms. Ringette, can you please spell and state your name for the record, and your affiliation.

MS. RINGUETTE: Hi again. It's Michelle Ringuette, R-I-N-G-U-E-T-T-E. Nice to see you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And your, what's your affiliation with this case, ma'am? MS. RINGUETTE: I am a neighboring party.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, you are, what you mean by neighboring party? You are --

MS. RINGUETTE: I am representing the protest group. And I'm a neighbor. I'm at 1324 Florida Avenue, Northwest.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So, you're representing the group of five or more? Is that what you're saying?

MS. RINGUETTE: Yes.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. Now, there is a Janet Harouch. I'm sorry. Who are you, ma'am, please?

MS. HAROUCH: Yes. I'm representing Meridian Hill Neighborhood Association.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I need you to say and spell your name, please.

MS. HAROUCH: Yes. It's Janet, J-A-N-E-T, last name H-A-R-O-U-C-H.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, ma'am. And so, Mr. Rome just, this matter has been protested by the ANC, a group of five or more, and the civic association. Is that correct?

MS. HAROUCH: Meridian Hill
Neighborhood Association, correct.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, the neighborhood, so you all. All right. The PIF was provided to all three groups at the roll call hearing?

MS. HAROUCH: Correct.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
Thank you. All right, Mr. Rome, are there any preliminary matters you need to bring to the attention of the Board?

MR. ROME: No. Other than that the parties are working together to reach a settlement agreement.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Perfect. Mr. Lakatos, any preliminary matters you want to bring to the attention of the Board?

MR. LAKATOS: Same as Mr. Rome. The parties are working together to try to get a settlement agreement.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Ringuette.
MS. RINGUETTE: We have ongoing negotiations on this. And we just want to reiterate that we would like Mayden to withdraw the application, to terminate the settlement agreement, and just continue to propose new amendments to the neighborhood.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Harouch.
MS. HAROUCH: Yes. The parties are working towards a settlement. I think our mediation hearing was promising.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All right, yes. All right. All right. Okay. This matter is scheduled for a protest hearing on May 17th, 2023 at 1:30 p.m.

And I, just as a matter of course, I just want to, Ms. Ringuette, you, you're representing a group of five or more. Is that correct?

MS. RINGUETTE: Yes.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
Just as an FYI, the operation of law, if there's a settlement agreement that's signed between the licensee and the ANC, then your group falls. But Ms. Harouch, your group still remains, because as a civic association you have separate standing to - -

MS. HAROUCH: Correct.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right. So I, just as a matter of law $I$ just want to let, eyes on. I'm sorry. Let me turn this thing off. I have no idea why this things keeps on coming on. Give me a minute, please. I apologize.

All right. Okay. So, as I said before, so this matter is scheduled for a protest hearing on May 3rd, 2023 at, I'm sorry, May 17th, 2023 at 1:30 p.m.

I just read the protest in the -- All right. So, I just want to remind the parties. You should have received a PIF. And you're required to file the PIF seven days before the hearing.

And these documents must be filed. They shouldn't, they have to be exchanged with
the opposing parties, and also to ABRA Legal.
Failure by the parties to provide us a PIF seven days before the hearing, unless good cause is shown, the Board is empowered to prevent you from moving forward.

What's more important to this case, pursuant to Section 1612.8 the Board is, if this matter goes through a protest hearing the Board is requesting that the three protestants, the three protestant groups, that you designate a representative to represent all three groups.

So, we're not going to have three separate hearings, cases for the protest group. We're going to, we're requesting pursuant to Section 1612.8 that the protestants designate one person to represent all three groups.

If this matter goes to a hearing you have one hour to present your case. And you are all, and since while the hearings are virtual, and you will only have the ability to call five witnesses.

If there, since there are more than five protestants in this case if the parties believe that they require more than one hour to present their case, or if they believe that
they're going to require more than five witnesses, then please make a, file a motion with the Board asking for additional time and for additional witnesses if you believe that.

But, and the Board will review it and make a determination whether or not we will grant that change. Any questions by any, any questions by either side? No? Yes, ma'am. Go ahead. MS. RINGUETTE: Sorry. One quick question. I'm hearing impaired. And I'm trying to follow along in the captions. Will this information be provided in writing to us after today's session, so that we can review it? Just so we make sure we do it correctly.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am. I, what I would ask you to do, ma'am, is to, the transcript will, the transcript of this hearing will be I think, be available in about seven days. So, you can also request a copy of the transcript.

I would also ask that you can reach out to our legal office. And we can provide you the written instructions if you have not received that, of what I just stated. Okay, ma'am? All right. Ms. Harouch.

MS. HAROUCH: Yes.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I see you have your hand up.

MS. HAROUCH: Yes, Mr. Anderson. All three parties raised procedural grounds to dismiss the protest. And I was wondering at what point the Board might consider that issue.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Did you file motions to the Board, procedural motions to the Board? I did ask that. I'm not aware. You could have raised that. You could argue. Well, what I'll ask what, to be done, is that you file a formal motion with the Board. Has that been done as yet?

MS. HAROUCH: No, it has not as -- I don't believe the ANC has. We have not. And I don't believe the party of five has either. We were kind of told by ABRA Legal that that wouldn't be considered.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, ma'am. You can send something to us in writing. I'm not just assuming that you're a lawyer. But you can send something in writing to the Agency. Procedurally raise the motion why you believe whatever you're asking for.

MS. HAROUCH: Okay.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Make sure that you serve the other side, the licensee, with a copy of that motion that you're going to file with the Board.

MS. HAROUCH: Okay. Will do.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, once you file it in writing, and we will, the Board will review it. And we will issue a decision prior to the hearing --

MS. HAROUCH: Okay.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- on your motion.

MS. HAROUCH: Okay. That's fair. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Any other questions by anyone else? All right. Good luck in your mediation. As a, in your discussion that this matter's going to be settled.

But as I said before this matter is scheduled for May 17th. And so, if you have a motion to file, please file the motion as soon as possible, so we can review it and make a determination whether or not the, there, what's in there is good cause to grant or deny the
motion that you're filing. Okay.
MS. RINGUETTE: We have a --
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any questions?
Any other questions by anyone before I adjourn this matter?

MS. RINGUETTE: Expediting --
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
Thank you very much. Have a great day.
MR. ROME: Thanks, all of you.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
Thank you.
