CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: As chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board for the District of Columbia, and in accordance with DC Code Section 2571 et seq. of the Open Meetings Act, OMA, I'm welcoming you to the regularly scheduled meeting of the Alcoholic Beverage Cannabis Board.

This meeting is being conducted pursuant to guidance made available by the District of Columbia's Office of Open Government regarding electronic meetings held by public bodies. Electronic meetings by the ABC Board are authorized pursuant to Section 2577(a) of the D.C. Code.

Pursuant to the OMA requirements, notice of today's meeting was provided 48 hours in advance of the meeting on ABCA's website and on the District's Central Meeting Calendar.

The notice included the time, date, agenda, and call-in or login information for public participation. This electronic meeting is being hosted by a WebEx account provided by the District of Columbia Government. Please address

I would like to 4 5 introduce the other members of the ABC Board who are also participating electronically. Please 6 7 respond when I announce your name. 8 Mr. James Short. 9 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. James Short present. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Bobby Cato. 11 MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato present. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Jeni Hansen. 12 13 MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen present. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Edward 14 15 Grandis. MEMBER GRANDIS: Edward Grandis 16 17 present. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. The board has five members in attendance for conduct 19 20 today, and that constitutes a quorum. 21 Before we get underway with today's 2.2 hearing calendar, I need to make a few 23 instructions very clear so that the conduct of 2.4 these hearings is understood by everyone.

There are six cases scheduled for

this morning's calendar. Once your case is called, I will take a moment for our IT specialist to elevate the rights for each party to enable their camera and microphone. Then, and only then, will you have the ability to enable your equipment.

If your case is not being heard, you will remain mute and your camera will be disabled. At the conclusion of each case, the parties will have the option to leave. If the party chooses to stay, all cameras and microphones for the concluded case will be disabled.

Should you have any questions or require technical assistance during the hearing, please submit them using the question and answer feature.

Our first litigant case today, and let us move to a Protest Hearing status, calendar is Case # 23-PRO-00031.

Our first case is Play DC Restaurant & Lounge, License #112274. Good morning, Mr.
Orellana. Can you please elevate the right of the parties in this case, please.

MR. ORELLANA: Good morning, Chairman.

18	much. Ms. Sidawy, good morning. Can you please				
19	spell and state your name for the record, and who				
20	do you represent this morning?				
21	MS. SIDAWY: Leila Sidawy, L-E-I-L-A S-				
22	I-D-A-W-Y, and I represent the group of neighbors				
23	for ANC 2G that have filed complaints against				
24	this establishment.				
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, see, you're				

1 representing one of the protestants. Do you 2 represent ANC, or do you represent a group? Which 3 one? I'm trying to find out. 4 MS. SIDAWY: A group. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Thank you. 6 Now I saw an email. Who is Mr. Douglas, of 2G? 7 MS. SIDAWY: I can speak on his behalf. 8 This time conflicted with a work engagement with him at the White House and he was unable to 9 attend. He notified DD in advance and said that I 10 11 could represent both him and the group in this 12 meeting, and DD confirmed. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's what I'm 14 asking. What group was he is he a different group 15 or is he part of your group? 16 MS. SIDAWY: He is an abutting property 17 owner. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. So you're 19 also representing, this morning you're 20 representing the protesting group and also the 21 S. Douglas Branch, who is the abutting property 2.2 owners, is that correct? 23 MS. SIDAWY: That is correct. Thank you 2.4 for clarifying. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Thank

you. Mr. Kline, are there any preliminary matters this morning, sir?

MR. KLINE: No, there are not. The parties continue to work together, and we're hopeful that we'll reach an agreement but we do not have one at this point.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Sidawy, are there any preliminary matters from your side?

MS. SIDAWY: As Mr. Kline mentioned,
Doug and I are working offline with him and with
the establishment on issues around noise, waste,
trash, and rats.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Thank you for the representation. This matter is scheduled for a protest hearing on June 28, 2023, at 1:30 p.m.

Now that we have scheduled this matter for a protest hearing, there are a few things I would like to instruct you, the Applicants and the Protestants, about the protest hearing's focus addressing only those issues that have been protested. The board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to this case.

You should have received by electronic

or regular mail a letter explaining the protest process, a copy of the protest information form, and a copy of the exhibit form. If you do not have these documents, please contact our legal office following the hearing.

It is imperative that you review the rules closely, and adhere to them before your protest hearing. You are also required to complete and submit a protest information form and exhibit form seven days before the date of the hearing.

These two forms and accompanying documents need to be submitted to ABCA's legal division, and to all opposing parties in this measure.

If we do not receive a copy of your PIF, your application, or your protest, whichever side you're representing may be subject to dismissal.

Likewise, if we do not receive a copy of your exhibit form and the exhibits themselves, your exhibits may be excluded from the record.

Upon finding that the opposing party has been purchased or no good cause for failure to submit has been shown, likewise.

Witnesses other than a party may also be subject to exclusion if not identified on the PIF. Accordingly, these forms are very important. They greatly assist in supporting and the protesters should facilitate in the process in keeping required at some point in the hearing.

They likewise provide notice to the opposing parties to enable them to better prepare for these hearings.

Also, as you are aware, all our hearings are now conducted virtually. You will have one I'm sorry. Are you on this case, sir?

MR. PADRO: This is Alexander Padro, from ANC 2G. Yes, I am representing the Commission on this case.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Oh, I apologize.

Can you please identify yourself for the record?

MR. PADRO: Yes, Mr. Chairman. I am Alexander M. Padro. I am chair of the Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2G. I am substituting for Commissioner Lopez, who was our previous designee for this protest. Mr. Lopez has resigned his office, and we've provided a letter to ABCA with the commission's vote appointing me as a representative.

1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Yes, 2 sir, I apologize that I did not recognize you 3 earlier. I went through the descriptions, but do you have any preliminary matters that the agency 4 5 needs to be aware of? MR. PADRO: The commission has no 6 7 preliminary matters. Thank you, sir. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Sidawy, I 8 9 see you have your hand raised. Do you have a 10 question or concern, ma'am? 11 MS. SIDAWY: I do. You mentioned forms 12 that need to be completed. I have not received 13 these forms. How will they be sent to me, as well 14 as the very helpful instructions that you've been 15 reading? I would like a written copy of those 16 too, so I can make sure that I adhere to all the 17 requirements. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am. Our 19 legal office will provide you those documents, 20 and the instructions that I am reading. Our legal 21 office will provide that to you to ensure to you 2.2 and all the parties connected, that you have 23 them. 2.4 MS. SIDAWY: Thank you, Mr. Anderson. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: One thing I just

1 want to remind the party at, there are three 2 protestants in this case. If this matter goes to 3 a hearing, since all our hearings are now 4 virtual, all appearances, you have one hour to 5 present your case. Because there are three protestants in 6 7 this case, the protestants would have to divide, 8 pursuant to Section 1612.8, the board is 9 requesting that the protestants designate one 10 individual to represent the protest groups at 11 this hearing, if this matter goes to a hearing. 12 Okay? 13 And just, Ms. Sidawy, one of the, 14 since the ANC is involved in this case, if a 15 settlement agreement is reached between the ANC 16 and the Applicant, your protest will fall. 17 However, the abutting property owner, 18 his protest would move forward if he's not part 19 of the settlement agreement. 20 Yes, ma'am. You have another question? 21 All right. Any questions by anyone before we 2.2 close this hearing? ? MR. KLINE: None from the Applicant. 23 2.4 Thank you. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. We
