The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met via WebEx videoconference, LaVerne Fletcher, Board's Agent, presiding.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, good morning everybody. My name is Laverne Fletcher. I'll be conducting the roll call hearing as the Board's agent.

I'd like to thank everybody for participating in ABRA's roll call hearings via the WebEx platform, made possible by the DC Office of Open Government.

We only have one case on the calendar today. This is the matter of Empire Lounge. The case number is 22-PRO-00026, Empire DC LLC, 1909 9th Street, NW, Unit 2A, License Number ABRA-110702.

This is a Retailer Class CT, substantial change for an expansion to the first floor without a change in occupancy.

The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order and quiet, residential parking, and vehicular and pedestrian safety, and real property values. Is anyone present on behalf of the applicant?

MR. BIANCO: Yes, Ms. Fletcher. This is Richard Bianco. I represent the applicant in

1	this case. Also, we have a representative from
2	the establishment, Mr. Des Nigussie is here as
3	well.
4	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you very
5	much. Mr. Bianco, would you spell your name for
6	the record, please?
7	MR. BIANCO: Absolutely.
8	R-I-C-H-A-R-D, last name is Bianco, B-I-A-N-C-O.
9	MS. FLETCHER: And, Mr. Nigussie,
10	would you do the same? Okay, Mr. Nigussie, I see
11	you. Can you hear me? I think you're muted.
12	MR. BIANCO: Ms. Fletcher, let me make
13	this suggestion. I can spell Mr. Nigussie's
14	name. I don't think he's going to be speaking
15	this morning. But to make sure it's clear for
16	the record, it is
17	MS. FLETCHER: You know what,
18	Mr. Bianco? You can spell it for me. I've
19	written it down, it appears on the screen. But
20	let me see what you have.
21	MR. BIANCO: Sure. D-E-S-S-A-L-E-G-N
22	N-I-G-U-S-S-I-E.
23	MS. FLETCHER: That's what I've got,
24	thank you.
25	MR. BIANCO: Great.

MS. FLETCHER: So, I've made a note that Mr. Nigussie is present. And who is present on behalf of the Westminster Neighborhood Association? Is anyone present on behalf of the Westminster Neighborhood Association?

So, Mr. Bianco, just so you know, I got a call from one of the Westminster

Neighborhood Association representatives, Pierson Stoecklein, this morning.

He had not received a copy of the invitation to appear, which is correct because it was sent to the President of the association, and so we didn't have an email address for Mr. Stoecklein. But I sent him the link before we got started, so I'll give him a minute to show up.

MR. BIANCO: Very well.

MS. FLETCHER: And I'll spell Pierson Stoecklein's name for the record. His first name is spelled P-I-E-R-S-O-N. The last name is spelled S-T-O-E-C-K-L-E-I-N.

So, I'm going to check my emails right now to see if he's having any trouble getting in.

I literally just sent him the link before we got started. But one second.

1	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, did
2	Mr. Stoecklein appear yet? I don't think so.
3	Just give him a couple more minutes. I just
4	forwarded him the link again.
5	Mr. Bianco and Mr. Nigussie, I'm going
6	to go ahead and give you the dates for the
7	upcoming proceedings, and hopefully he can log in
8	by the time I'm done with that.
9	MR. BIANCO: Okay.
10	MS. FLETCHER: The status hearing is
11	scheduled for June 8th at 10:30 a.m. June 8th at
12	10:30. The protest hearing is scheduled for
13	July 20, 2022, at 1:30.
14	MR. BIANCO: Do we have a mediation
15	date yet, Ms. Fletcher?
16	MS. FLETCHER: I'll run some by you.
17	MR. BIANCO: Okay.
18	MS. FLETCHER: Let's see. Let's see
19	here. I will give you the next available day,
20	which is Wednesday, May 11. Or we could actually
21	do Monday, May 9, at 11:30, if that's good for
22	you. Otherwise, we can move to Wednesday,
23	May 11, any time of day.
24	MR. BIANCO: I see.
25	MR. NIGUSSIE: Monday what time?

1	MS. FLETCHER: What did you say,
2	Mr. Nigussie?
3	MR. NIGUSSIE: Monday what time?
4	MS. FLETCHER: Oh, Monday at
5	11:30 a.m.
6	MR. BIANCO: That actually works for
7	me. So, that's fine.
8	MS. FLETCHER: Monday at 11:30. So,
9	Mr. Bianco, what I'd like to do is not dismiss
10	the Westminster Neighborhood Association. They
11	haven't logged in, but I know they intend to
12	come. I don't know if he's having any trouble,
13	but I just sent him the link just before we got
14	started.
15	So, I don't want to dismiss him. What
16	I'd like to do is to grant conditional standing
17	to the Westminster Neighborhood Association. Oh,
18	I think I see somebody that I didn't see before.
19	Who is Kassem? Is that the court reporter?
20	So, I see the name of Keayon Kassem.
21	Who is that?
22	MR. NIGUSSIE: That's my friend.
23	(inaudible).
24	MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Nigussie, did you
25	gay that g a friend of yourg?

1	MR. NIGUSSIE: Yes.
2	MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Because he's
3	present and I've mentioned his name, I'm going to
4	have to spell it for the court reporter. One
5	second. Mr. Kassem, can you hear me?
6	I'm going to go ahead and spell his
7	name. I can see him on the screen, even though
8	apparently he's on mute.
9	Mr. Kassem's name is spelled I'm
10	assuming it's a gentleman, Mr. Nigussie?
11	MR. NIGUSSIE: Yeah.
12	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, his first name is
13	spelled K-E-A-Y-O-N. His last name is spelled
14	K-A-S-S-E-M. Okay, so Mr. Bianco, Mr. Stoecklein
15	is not here still.
16	MR. BIANCO: Correct.
17	MS. FLETCHER: What I would actually
18	like to do, unless you are opposed, is to go
19	ahead and grant the association standing. I
20	don't know why they're not here, but he did call.
21	So, I'm just assuming he's trying to get it.
22	But I'm okay doing whatever you would
23	be comfortable with.
24	MR. BIANCO: Sure. So, my request
25	would be for dismissal of the protest. It's

1 10:15. I realize he's trying to reach out, but 2 he's not here. And I would like to make that 3 position is noted for the record. 4 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So, what I will 5 do in light of that, Mr. Bianco, I will dismiss 6 the protest. He's not present, that is the 7 process. I did note that he did call prior to 8 9 the roll call hearing, and that he intended to be 10 here, but he is not here. And so, I'm going to 11 dismiss the protest and -- one second. 12 Before I do that, I'd like to do one 13 other thing. I'm trying to not dismiss because 14

he's not here, but I'm going to do everything I can to give him a chance to appear.

I don't see a telephone number, or I would give him a call. Let's see. Mr. Bianco, do you mind giving me a moment to give him a call?

Go through your MR. BIANCO: No. process, Ms. Fletcher. I'm happy to accommodate.

> MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you.

MS. FLETCHER: (On the phone.) Mr. Johnson. Hi, this is Laverne Fletcher with ABRA. I'm calling because the roll call hearing

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is actually in progress. And I did get a call from Mr. Stoecklein. I sent him a link to the hearing, but he hasn't appeared yet.

I sent it -- yeah, I sent it to him a couple of times. I can send it to him again. Do you mind, in case, have your link handy?

The one that I have is pstoeckl@gmail.com. Yeah, I don't know, but if you have yours, you can forward it to him and he can log in. I'll wait and see if you're able to do it. I already sent it to you. I sent it on April 26th.

Okay, well I sent it. But, you know, it's technology. Things happen. But I did send it to you and I sent it to him this morning. So, I just wanted to reach out. And you said he tried to contact you because he's trying to get in?

I know. I know. So, I'm actually --hold on one second. And just so you know, the applicant is patiently allowing me to try to get this invite to you. Yeah, I'm talking email.

Mm-hmm.

Well, yeah, so what I'm going to do -- so that call-in number is also in your

invitation. Yeah, just a second. So, what I'm going to do is this. I'm going to consider you to be present because I'm talking to you. If you had called in, we would be doing the same thing.

And so, I'm going to consider you to be present. I've made a note that Mr. Stoecklein had difficulty getting in. Thank you for answering this call this morning, Mr. Johnson.

So, I will now not have to dismiss your protest.

Okay, take care. Bye-bye. So, Mr. Bianco?

MR. BIANCO: Yes.

MS. FLETCHER: So, you heard the whole conversation. Or, at least on my side. So, because I was able to talk to Mr. Johnson on the phone, I'll go ahead and grant standing to the protestant.

He was asking me if I could give a phone number for Mr. Stoecklein to call in, but it's sufficient that he was on the line. He's the President of the association.

And so, I'm going to grant standing to the Westminster Neighborhood Association, in light of the fact that I spoke with Mr. Johnson and there is the option to call in as well, although I called him. He's still on the phone.

1	And, Mr. Bianco, I'm going to send
2	Mr. Johnson an email with these dates. I just
3	decided not to keep you on the line any longer.
4	And I will go ahead and conclude this roll call,
5	Mr. Bianco, unless you have anything else you'd
6	like to say before we close.
7	MR. BIANCO: Nothing further,
8	Ms. Fletcher. Thank you very much.
9	MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Well, thank you
10	everybody. And I'll see you soon in mediation.
11	MR. BIANCO: Thank you very much.
12	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. The
13	roll call is concluded. Bye everybody.
