The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met via WebEx videoconference, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson presiding.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Thank you very much. I am going to change the order on our calendar. So the next case I'm going to call, I'm just switching the first in the two cases, but the next case I'm going to call is a fact -- we're having a series of fact finding hearings.

So the first fact finding that I'm going call is Electric Cool-Aid. That's the first case that I'm going to call, Electric Cool-Aid, License Number 112294.

Ms. Andrews, can you please elevate the rights of the parties for Electric Cool-Aid?

MS. ANDREWS: Sure, stand by.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.

MS. ANDREWS: Mr. Schwartz, your rights have been elevated. Ms. Nigro, your rights have been elevated, Nigro. Mr. Jones, your rights have been elevated. That's all, Mr. Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Thank you very much. Good morning, everyone.

I'd like everyone to just introduce themselves

	for the record. I'll start with the Licensee.		
2	Can you please introduce yourself for the record		
3	and spell your name also too, please.		
4	MR. SCHWARTZ: Good morning, ladies		
5	and gentlemen. My name is Benjamin Schwartz, S-		
6	C-H-W-A-R-T-Z. I am the owner and general		
7	manager of Electric Cool-Aid.		
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.		
9	Then Ms., I'm sorry, I didn't get your name,		
10	ma'am?		
11	MS. NIGRO: My name is Rachelle Nigro,		
12	I-G-R-O. I am the chair of Advisory		
13	Neighborhood Commission 6E.		
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,		
15	Ms. Nigro.		
16	MS. NIGRO: Hi.		
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And Mr. Jones?		
18	MR. JONES: Good morning to the Board.		
19	I'm Investigator Earl Jones, E-A-R-L, last name,		
20	J-O-N-E-S.		
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.		
22	Good morning, Mr. Jones.		
23	This is a fact finding hearing that		
24	we're having. And one of the reasons why we're		
25	having a fact finding hearing, a request was made		

to the Board on behalf of Electric Cool-Aid regarding a change in hours and also for entertainment endorsement.

And one of the reasons why the Board requested this fact finding hearing, I believe it was in 2000 -- it was two years ago, at least, in 2019, that Electric Cool-Aid had applied for a license. It's a new venue. They replied for, requested a license. They asked for some specific hours. They had also asked for an entertainment endorsement.

The license was being protested. And one of the reasons why the -- at least what was being told to the Board, the granting of the license had been protested by the ANC because this was an outdoor venue, and so the ANC protested the hours that were being requested and also the granting of an entertainment endorsement.

The Board, in trying to come up to a, come to a solution that would be a middle ground to try to address some of the community concerns, we did grant the license. However, the Board did limit the hours of operation. And secondly, the Board denied the request for the entertainment

endorsement.

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Subsequently, so that was in 2019, the establishment is now open. And now a request is, we now have another request from the Licensee requesting the initial full hours that they had asked for before and that they had asked for. And now they are also asking for an entertainment endorsement.

It's my understanding that the Board, I'm sorry, that the ANC stated that, and sent it in a letter to the Board, they had stated that they did not have a problem with, say, extended hours. However, as far as entertainment was concerned, that they would ask the Board to grant an entertainment endorsement limiting the entertainment to trivia.

So that's my understanding of where we And so what I'm going to do today is that are. I'm going to ask you, Mr. Schwartz, to just again tell the Board what it is that you are requesting. Well, you know, I will -- yes, what I'm going to do, just tell us what it is you're requesting.

> MR. SCHWARTZ: Sure.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And then once you tell us what you're requesting, then I'm going to call Mr. Jones to have him testify about what it is that he found as a result of the request. And then I'll get some input from the ANC.

I just want to let everyone know this is a fact finding hearing. No one is under oath. So you are not required to answer any questions, because you're not under oath. This is just a fact finding hearing. The Board is trying to gather information to see whether or not we should grant or deny this request.

And I say one of the reasons why we'd only issue this license, this license is not even two years old when the Board had issued a Board order. So what in this changed in the short period of time for the Board to radically change its decision?

So we can start off with you, Mr.

Schwartz, and let us know, just again, tell us about your business model. I remember when this case was presented, it's an open-air venue. I think a lot of us, at least I can only speak for myself, I was somewhat confused about your business, the type of business that you're

operating.

And since this is a business that's completely out, it takes place outdoors, so you can just, once again, tell us what your business structure is. How long have you been in operation? And I know that the period, or part of it, you've been operating through COVID, which is a different set of facts to your situation, But just bring us up to date, please.

MR. SCHWARTZ: Sure, absolutely. I want to thank the Board for having me here today to answer some questions for you.

So we are applying extend our hours.

Our current hours are from 11:00 a.m. to 10:30

from Monday through Thursday. We're looking to
extend that to midnight as the closing and ending
operating hours Monday through Thursday. On

Friday and Saturday, our current hours are until
midnight. We are trying to extend that until
2:00 a.m.

We are also seeking an entertainment endorsement to do trivia nights, to have a DJ there, an MC, you know, to MC if we'd like to host private events, and things of that nature.

How our business works is we are on

the corner of 6th and Rhode Island NW. We are an all outdoor venue that sells frozen drinks, and other things in cans, and snacks. We have food trucks that we work with. We currently have a roster of about 10 to 12 food vendors that will vary depending on the day. And we run their menu through our POS.

So how the operations work is, it is all outdoor, people come in. I'm sure some of you have seen how lots of things have worked in COVID. People will sit down, and there will be a QR Code. And we have a number of staff on the floor, but people order through the QR code, both for the food truck and for the bar. And we will run the food and drink directly to them.

While this was not part of our initial plan and model pre-COVID, we've decided it is a pretty efficient way to run this type of establishment. So we will actually be continuing operations largely the same as we are right now.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. So you're only selling food because of COVID, is that correct? Because I'm just, so you're - Yes, do you serve food? I'm just asking.

MR. SCHWARTZ: We do not serve food.

We work with food vendors. And that will continue. It's just better for everyone to have the food vendors there. So we will continue to have food vendors without the COVID restrictions.

It will be kind of nice for these food vendors to be able to leave before, you know, closing hours. Because as of right now, the food vendor, the food truck is there for the entirety of our open hours. So the only thing that would change with that is that they may leave a little earlier.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So when did the business open?

MR. SCHWARTZ: It opening the beginning of July of 2020. And I believe when, you had mentioned when we first applied for this there was some hesitancy from, well, while there's support from the community at large, there was some hesitancy from some neighbors abutting to our alley.

I think we've demonstrated over the course of the year what kind of neighbors we are. I myself live about half a block away from the establishment itself. So I'm part of the neighborhood.

And I believe, I mean, there were a number of concerns considering the - there are some establishments in this single-member district that have not exactly been ideal neighbors. And I think there was some hesitancy to believe that we were going to follow down that same path.

And we have shown to everyone in the community that is not the case. And we have gotten, specifically with this request to amend the hours, the people, the neighbors, specifically actually the ones that testified in the hearing, we had the ANC reach out to them. They are 100 percent in support of extending the hours and adding the entertainment endorsement.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I realize that what - I know that, because of COVID, we have had some truncated hours. So what have been your hours of operation since June of 2000, of

MR. SCHWARTZ: I mean, it hasn't really truncated our hours at all except for when the limit was 10:00 p.m. Then we obviously closed at 10:00 p.m. But we have been operating to the full length of our - COVID has not affected our hours at all.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 1 So what were 2 your hours? What are your current hours of 3 operation? 4 MR. SCHWARTZ: From Monday through 5 Thursday from 4:00 p.m. to 10:30, Friday from 6 3:00 p.m. to midnight, Saturday from noon until 7 midnight, Sunday from noon until around 10 8 o'clock. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So currently 10 Friday is the only night that you are open until 11 midnight. Is that correct? 12 MR. SCHWARTZ: Saturday as well, Saturday we are open until --13 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Oh, I'm sorry. 15 Friday and Saturday you're open until midnight, 16 okay. 17 MR. SCHWARTZ: Correct. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, I'm 19 going to change the order again. I apologize. 20 Ms. Nigro, on behalf of the ANC, you tell us 21 where you are, ma'am? 22 MS. NIGRO: So are in support of the changes. We had a meeting. There was a vote of 23 24 five for the changes and one for not. And there 25 were no abstentions. So as a Commission, we are

supportive of the changes in the entertainment, and the trivia night.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: There is some misunderstanding between, well, you're saying that as far as entertainment is concerned, you are asking for, you support trivia night.

MS. NIGRO: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Schwartz is saying that they're asking for a DJ. So that's not, it appears that you're saying that I support entertainment, but it has to be, it's only limited to trivia. And, at least from what I'm hearing from Mr. Schwartz, he's asking for a larger, he's asked for more entertainment. He's just not asking for trivia. He's asking for more.

MS. NIGRO: So the only thing that, you know, I have my little letter, that we supported was to allow the Applicant to have live trivia night events.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right. So you don't support, so you're not supporting --

MS. NIGRO: I wouldn't, you know, I don't want to, speaking for the Commission, I wouldn't say we wouldn't. But that's not what we

motioned for.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And I guess I'm trying to get some clarification from the ANC.

Because remember, when the license was issued -
MS. NIGRO: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- the ANC was against us providing entertainment endorsement. So the Board did not. So here it is that we're now being asked for entertainment endorsement. And I'm not sure -- I'm just trying to get clarification whether or not the ANC agrees with entertainment. Or is the ANC saying that, yes, we can have entertainment, however, it's only limited to trivia?

MS. NIGRO: So you tell me, Mr. Chair, when you issue these rulings, do you just make it that specific, that an Applicant can only do one thing, like, they can only have trivia night? Is that correct? Is that what you're telling him?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No. We issue and entertainment endorsement. And so once that entertainment endorsement is issued, he can have a DJ, he can have a band, he can do whatever it is that is with an entertainment endorsement.

The Board normally does not issue -

now, if there's a settlement agreement, the parties can jointly agree what type of entertainment that they require. But the Board would not necessarily issue an entertainment endorsement to say it is only limited to trivia.

Because that's too - so the parties

Because that's too - so the parties would have to tell the Board, the parties would have to say to the Board that, okay, this is what we agreed to. And the Board will then either give yes or no. But the Board would not issue an entertainment endorsement to say that it's only limited to trivia unless that is what both parties jointly asked for.

MS. NIGRO: So Mr. -

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Sorry?

MR. SCHWARTZ: Ms. Nigro, I think I have a compromise for us. I think that the big concern with the ANC and everyone was live music. I am very much okay with the stipulation that we do not have live music at the venue if you want.

MS. NIGRO: So when your DJ, you'd just -

MR. SCHWARTZ: Not a DJ, but an MC. Well, I say DJ, because DJ falls into, you know, a pretty broad category. If there's an event,

and there is someone with a laptop that is
controlling music, that is considered a DJ for
ABC purposes.

MS. NIGRO: So, Mr. Chair, I do not
have the settlement agreement with me. So I
don't know -

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry,
there is no settlement agreement. There's a
Board order. And the Board order says -- well,
there was no settlement from the ANC. So there
was a Board order. The Board order says no
entertainment, period.

MS. NIGRO: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, so this is a change that has been requested. So in order for them to have the trivia or whatever type of entertainment, somebody to play a piano, someone to sing, then they would have to have an entertainment endorsement.

MS. NIGRO: But let me just, for clarification, we could then, we could do a settlement agreement with Electric Cool-Aid being very specific about the type of entertainment?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That is something -

MS. NIGRO: Because you're saying, okay, because you're saying if you do this today, this ruling today with this hearing, not that I don't believe you, Mr. Schwartz, but technically they could have then a band, or a DJ, or whatever?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'll let you know. We're going to take this matter under advisement. So I'm not going to issue a decision today. We're just gathering information.

But in the interim, if the parties decide that the request was made, if the parties decide that, okay, they want a settlement, they want to sign a settlement agreement as far as entertainment is concerned, and in a settlement agreement that they state what is their understanding of entertainment, they can submit that to the Board.

The Board will review it, and the Board will say yes we can grant it, or no we can't grant it because of some legal issues, and we will advise you on that.

But the Board, without having a joint agreement, the Board is not going to say we're going to issue an entertainment endorsement

limited to trivia. The Board's not going to do that. That's too specific.

MS. NIGRO: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But you can, at the end of this hearing, both parties can reach out to April Randall. If you don't have her information, I -

MS. NIGRO: I have April's information.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, fine. So you can reach out to Ms. Randall. And she can talk to both parties about, if you want to go into a settlement agreement, what that would entail and what it is that other ANCs have done or what is - because my part of it is that, from a legal perspective, whether or not we can say to someone you can only have go-go, or you can only have classical music. The Board is not in a position to set community standards by telling the community you can only have a specific type of entertainment.

The parties can come to the Board and say this is what we want to do. Because therefore it's something that they have negotiated. So that's between the parties. But

that's a general - and I'm not saying the Board is not going to grant the entertainment endorsement. I'm not saying the Board is going to deny it. I'm just saying that this is just part of what we will discuss.

But the only thing I'll say, the Board will not issue an entertainment endorsement limited to trivia. That's the only thing I'm, that's the only definitive statement you will hear from the Board today regarding this.

MS. NIGRO: Okay, Mr. Chair. And I thank you for that clarification, because that provided me some education today. And I think, on behalf of the Commission, I would feel comfortable continuing a discussion with Mr. Schwartz so that we have clarification about the type of entertainment, just for the comfort level of the community and for the Commission.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, I understand. I'm sorry, so you're saying as far as the ANC is concerned, the extended hours, Sunday through Thursday to 12:00 a.m. and Friday and Saturday to 2:00 a.m., that the ANC does not object to that. Is that correct?

MS. NIGRO: No, we're okay with the

hours. What did you say, not object or object?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You have
answered. I said that the ANC does not have any
objection to that. That's what I said.

MS. NIGRO: Okay. No objection.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right,
thank you.

Mr. Jones, good morning. I saw that you did some visits to this establishment, sir. Good morning. Can you just tell us when is it you're able to visit the establishment and what it is that you were able, just what it is that you're able to observe, sir?

MR. JONES: Good morning, again, to the Board and to the panel. I was able to visit the, I visited the establishment on a number of occasions, however they were closed during the hours that I had gone. But I finally was able to meet with Ms. Angela DelBrocco, who is one of the managing members, on May 7th at approximately 9:20 p.m. That was on a Friday.

I spoke with her and advised her that
I wanted to conduct a regulatory inspection as
well as, you know, letting her know of my reason
for the visit, which was to discuss the issues of

the Board and things that would come up concerning this hearing.

At that point, she had started to let me know that she was fully aware of certain restrictions on the license right now. She knew that they could not have, Electric Cool-Aid was not able to have entertainment at this point in time. She knew that the hours were restrictive and that they had been adhering to all of ABRA's regulations as well as the Mayor's Orders.

She stated that there are food trucks that are, I guess food truck vendors that are partners with Electric Cool-Aid. They provide and prepare all the food. All of the bills go through the POS system. Patrons are seated at picnic tables under a large tent. What I counted was probably up to 18, 19 picnic tables, something to that degree.

But patrons were all spread out over the venue. They were probably more than six feet apart. There was no indoor eating, dining area. The only indoor area appeared to be an area where there were staff members who were taking orders, drink orders, and there were staff that were going to pick up the orders from that area. So

there was no enclosed area for dining. 1 2 Patrons were wearing masks upon 3 getting in, entering. And once they got to their table and received service, and food, they then 4 5 took off their masks. There was music that was being played, 6 7 however it was at a very low level. She and I 8 could clearly have conversation throughout any 9 part of the venue without being disturbed by the And she showed me the iPad that the music 10 music. 11 is being played through, so there was no DJ. 12 She advised that they do close at 13 10:30 during the week when it had been up until 14 10 o'clock, until the times had changed, and 12 15 o'clock during the weekends. Other than that, I had conducted a 16 17 regulatory inspection. All their government 18 licenses were up to date and current. And I had 19 no violations at that point in time. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, 21 thank you, Mr. Jones. 2.2 Do any Board members have any 23 questions of any party, any questions any Board

(No audible response.)

members have of any party?

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CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Schwartz, 1 2 let me just, just let me ask a question. 3 this is an establishment that doesn't have an 4 indoors, where's the bathroom? Do you have a 5 bathroom? MR. SCHWARTZ: We do have a bathroom. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm told it's 8 not an indoor facility. 9 MR. SCHWARTZ: There is a bathroom. 10 We do not, while we do have buckets on the table 11 for trash, they are for trash only. So how that 12 setup works, we have a bar structure, a 13 semi-enclosed bar structure. In back of the semi-enclosed bar structure is a small 25-foot 14 15 footprint of the building with the addition in it and an office underneath. 16 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 18 Now, you know, when I was told, I'm like, okay, is there a bathroom? That's just for my 19 20 edification. It has nothing to, it has no 21 bearing on whatever decision that the Board will 22 or won't issue. I was just curious. 23 MR. SCHWARTZ: Sure. 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So how has 25 business been during COVID?

MR. SCHWARTZ: Business is not as great as we wanted but close to sustainable. Its part of the reason why we're asking for extending the hours, is that on the week nights is kind of -- it could be the difference between us being able to, you know, pay off all our debt in a timely manner or kind of string it out a little longer.

So, I mean, on a Saturday, we will be pretty busy all day. But most days of the week it is, while it's very nice out, we'll have a few people there. It's going well, but not gangbusters.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So who are normally, I mean, who are your patrons? Is it the neighborhood people, or people driving -

MR. SCHWARTZ: It is mostly neighborhood people. We've found that almost everyone is walking to the establishment. There are a few people that will come via, you know, via Uber. But it's largely people in the neighborhood.

There is a, I mean, we are in a commercial corridor adjacent to a number of residential corridors. So we have, you know,

people coming from Logan Circle over, from 1 2 Bloomingdale over, and from Ledroit down, if you 3 come to it. And I'd say that's the majority of 4 our clientele. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, thank One last question for the ANC. You said 6 7 that the vote was, I think, five to one. 8 MS. NIGRO: Correct. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What we the opinion of the ANC Commissioner that this 10 11 establishment is located? Was that person's vote 12 - I know the representative. I'm just curious 13 if there was one person. Was it the single member district ANC that covers this 14 15 establishment, or was it just a different Commissioner who was in the ANC? 16 17 MS. NIGRO: It was a different 18 Commissioner. Commissioner Lopez is the single 19 member district commissioner for this 20 establishment, and he is in support. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, 22 Do you have any other representation you thanks. 23 wish to make today? 24 MR. SCHWARTZ: No. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any other No?

representation you need to make, Mr. Jones?

MR. JONES: No, sir.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And Mr.
Schwartz, you have the final word. Any
representation, any further representation you
want to make before we conclude this case?

MR. SCHWARTZ: No. Just again, I want to thank the Board for having this today, letting me answer as many questions as I could.

I think we are extremely appreciative of the support that we've gotten from the community at large so far. And we would like to continue that in the offer, extend our hours to give our neighborhood and our community a place to go as the night goes on and as restrictions lift.

I believe during our ABC Committee
hearing with the ANC, and with our single member
district Commissioner, we did not, just to go off
of what Commissioner Nigro had said, we did not
clarify exactly what, that there would be any
restrictions to the entertainment endorsement.

The ABC Committee did vote to support the entertainment endorsement as is. While we did have a conversation off the record with Ms.

Nigro, I guess it's on the record, about what our intentions are to use that entertainment endorsement, it was always our understanding that all entertainment endorsements were all or nothing. And, yes, I believe that concludes any information I have.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
Thank you, Mr. Schwartz.

The Board will take this matter under advisement, but I'll let the party know that the parties can, you can reach out to, both sides can reach out to Ms. Randall if you want to. If you want to agree to a settlement agreement, you can discuss settlement agreement with the hours and entertainment.

And you can provide that to the Board.

And the Board will review it and make a

determination. Or the Board will make a

determination outside of that on the proposal

that's made. But I'm just saying you are welcome

at any point to a settlement agreement. That's

something that you welcome at any point to.

So I'm not telling folks that they need to do this. The Board will make a decision. If you don't want the Board to make a decision,

then you can forestall the Board from making a 1 2 decision by saying, oh, by the way, I've already 3 made the decision. We have a settlement 4 agreement. This is what we agreed to. And the 5 Board will always defer to what the neighborhood recommends, requires. 6 7 Absolutely. Just to be MR. SCHWARTZ: 8 clear to Ms. Nigro, and the Board, it is my 9 understanding that the ANC letter of support is for an entertainment endorsement and the hours. 10 11 Is that not correct? 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No. The ANC, 13 that's why I asked the question. Because I read 14 This says that entertainment endorsement for 15 That's why, it was very specific. trivia. 16 (Simultaneous speaking.) 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's why I 18 had asked the question. So it wasn't --19 MR. SCHWARTZ: Interesting. 20 MS. NIGRO: So may I say something, 21 Mr. Chair? And, you know, on behalf of the 22 Commission -- because we want to work with you, Mr. Schwartz. You know that. 23 24 MR. SCHWARTZ: Yes. 25 MS. NIGRO: So, yes, totally.

think with just further clarification and with Commissioner Lopez, and we're all on the same page, and all that, I don't foresee a problem at all.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

MS. NIGRO: And maybe if there is not settlement agreement, you know, we're all into our settlement agreement, so maybe that needs to happen.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But I said the Board will take this matter under advisement. And the Board always supports Licensees and the neighborhood speaking, that they come to an agreement that works for them, and for us not to make a decision, okay. I like the easy way out, okay. I like the easy way out, make the decisions.

You guys make the hard decisions, and we will say, okay, fine. So if it doesn't work out, you don't come back and say that ABC Board sits downtown. They don't live in my neighborhood. They tell me what I need to do, and I don't like it, okay. That's why. So I try to take the easy way out. You tell us what is it you want.

MR. SCHWARTZ: Understood. I thought we were there. Could you just kind of enlighten me on the timeline for when the Board would make a decision --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.

MR. SCHWARTZ: -- absent a settlement agreement?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board doesn't have a timeline. We'll make a decision. If the parties reach out to the Board through Ms. Randall and say, oh, by the way, we're discussing a settlement agreement, can you give us 30 days to bring you a settlement agreement, or something like that, I mean, we will take our instruction from you.

So if you reach out to the Board, and you tell the Board that we're discussing settlement, can you hold on to a decision for whatever period of time, and we'll provide you a settlement or - hold on, hold on. Yes. So it's up to you.

So if you tell us that we're going to meet and we're going to discuss, and can you hold on a minute, please, then we'll do that. If not, we'll make our decision. But we're not going to

make a decision tomorrow. I'll let you know 1 2 that. 3 (Laughter.) 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So there's no 5 decision issued tomorrow. MR. SCHWARTZ: 6 Okay. 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But you do have 8 some time, okay? 9 MR. SCHWARTZ: Understood. MS. NIGRO: Mr. Chair? 10 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am? 12 MS. NIGRO: We'll be able to get 13 together very quickly with Mr. Schwartz and 14 Commissioner Lopez to work this out. I know this 15 won't be a long process on our side. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. And 17 that's one of the reasons why we had this. scheduled this matter for a fact finding hearing. 18 19 This is one of the reasons why we scheduled, and 20 we invited the ANC, so everyone knows what's 21 going on so we can have input. So therefore, 22 whatever decision we make, the decision has been 23 made with the input of the community, okay. 24 MR. SCHWARTZ: Understood. I do have 25 one final question.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.

MR. SCHWARTZ: The change of hours application and the entertainment endorsement application were separate, separate items on the agenda. Will they be viewed separately, or will they be viewed together?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board will make a decision separately on each, so they're not tied together. So you're asking for a change of hours, and you're asking for an entertainment endorsement. And so whatever decision that the Board makes, the Board will make a decision whether or not we approve.

Well, this is the process. We will say to the licensing that they can process the change of hours or they can process or not process the entertainment endorsement. And so that's how it is.

MR. SCHWARTZ: Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But as I've stated before, and one thing all parties can do, you can always go to the, as in this particular case, when you requested, we got a letter from the ANC. And the ANC said that, and I believe that if there was no caveat on what the ANC

stated, it would be smoother. I'm not saying
that we would have changed the decision because - I'll say to it you, my concern is that we only
issued this license two years ago.

MR. SCHWARTZ: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And because it was two years ago, and I know that the ANC was very adamant about not having the entertainment endorsement, and also not having the extended hours, so the Board came up with a compromise by shortening the hours. We did not grant the entertainment endorsement because, as you said, this is an open open air venue and it's attached to a residence. So that --

MR. SCHWARTZ: Pardon me. It is not attached to a residence.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry?

MR. SCHWARTZ: It is not attached to any residence.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, all right. Well, it's an open air venue, and there are residences close to the venue. And every venue that's an open air, it's difficult to, generally, it's difficult to control noise because it's an open air.

Now, if it's a closed venue, then it's different, because you can always close the doors, close the windows, and then the neighbors will not hear it in their homes. But with it being an open air venue, it is difficult for you to control noise. Because noise can travel.

And we might say that this is conversational level. But someone else who is in their residence and who has especially, whose hearing is better than ours, will say I can hear this. I can't go to sleep at night, because I'm hearing music or whatever it is that's going on.

So that's one of the reasons why it's just more challenging when you're asking for an entertainment endorsement for a venue that's outdoors. So that is why that's a little bit more difficult.

But if the parties come to the Board and say that's what it is, we have agreed, then I've always, it has always been, and since I've been Chair of this Board, it has always been my posture that we support settlement agreements. Because at least settlement agreements, because at least the neighbors can get together, the neighbors and the Licensee can get together to

1 say this is what we can live with. 2 MR. SCHWARTZ: Understood. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So thank you very much for your appearance today. 4 5 And I said before, the Board will take this 6 matter under advisement. And if the parties so 7 desire, they are welcome to reach out to Ms. Randall and let the Board know what it is that 8 9 they want to do. But we'll make a decision, but it's 10 11 not going to be tomorrow, okay, just to let you 12 know. All right. So thank you very much and 13 have a great day. 14 MS. NIGRO: Thank you. 15 MR. SCHWARTZ: Thank you. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 17 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 11:38 a.m.) 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25
