MS. FLETCHER: Good morning, everyone. Thank you for attending ABRA's roll call hearing being conduct via the WebEx platform. My name is LaVerne Fletcher conducting the roll call hearings as the Board's agent. There are two cases on the calendar today.

The first case is Tom's Watch Bar, Case No. 23-PRO-0046, TWB DC Chinatown, LLC, 781 7th Street NW, License No. ABRA 119403. This is a Retailer Class CR Substantial Change (entertainment endorsement inside only). The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet.

Is anyone present on behalf of the Applicant?

MR. KLINE: Yes. I am Andrew Kline from the Veritas Law Firm.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Kline. If you could spell your name for the record, please.

MR. KLINE: Of course. Andrew, A-N-D-R-E-W, Kline, K-L-I-N-E.

MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Kline, would you
spell Veritas?
MR. KLINE: Sure. V-E-R-I-T-A-S.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
Anyone present on behalf of the group of five?

MS. LARUE: Good morning. This is Michelle LaRue for Residences at Gallery Place Condominium, and we do have a group of five or more that are present.

MS. FLETCHER: Ms. LaRue, could you spell your name for the record, please?

MS. LARUE: Sure. Michelle, M-I-C-H-E-L-L-E. Last name is LaRue, L-A-R-U-E.

MS. FLETCHER: And you said there are some other individuals present from the group today?

MS. LARUE: Correct.
MS. FLETCHER: You can start by stating your name and spelling it for the record.

MS. LARUE: Okay. We have Mr. Howard Marks, H-O-W-A-R-D, last name M-A-R-K-S.

MS. FLETCHER: Ms. LaRue, if you would like, they can state their names and spell them if you prefer.

The next person. Anyone else?

MS. LANE: I'll go. This is Lillian Lane, L-I-L-L-I-A-N L-A-N-E.

Can you hear me?
MS. FLETCHER: Can I hear who? Ms. Lane? Is that you asking if I can hear you? MS. LANE: That was Michelle. MS. LARUE: Sorry. I'm having a hard time hearing you.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Just for the court reporter for clarity, Lillian Lane just introduced herself. She's part of the group of five being represented by Michelle LaRue. She spelled her name L-I-L-L-I-A-N L-A-N-E.

Right, Ms. Lane?
MS. LANE: Correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
Anyone else present from the group?
MS. WANCHISEN: I'll speak. Barbara Wanchisen, B-A-R-B-A-R-A W-A-N-C-H-I-S-E-N. MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Anybody else? MS. LARUE: Yes.

MR. PATRIARCA: Okay. Donato Patriarca, D-O-N-A-T-O P-A-T-R-I-A-R-C-A. And my wife Linda, L-I-N-D-A P-A-T-R-I-A-R-C-A.

MS. FLETCHER: And you both signed the protest letter?

MR. PATRIARCA: Yes.
MS. PATRIARCA: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
MS. PALANKIAN: I'll go next. Kaley Palanjian, K-A-L-E-Y P-A-L-A-N-J-I-A-N.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Ms. Palanjian.

Anyone else? Okay.
Ms. LaRue, I see your hand raised.
Were you going to say something?
Ms. LaRue was about to say that she was having some difficulty. I'm going to go ahead and say what --

MS. PALANJIAN: I think she was moving spaces to try and get a better signal so she may come back in a second.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
MS. PALANJIAN: It looked like she was walking around.

MS. FLETCHER: Well, I don't know if she can hear me or not but I'll say this for everyone's benefit. There are a couple things. The protest letter in this case refers to an
association on numerous occasions. I just want to clarify that associations do not have standing as protestants.

In the event that Ms. LaRue's intention was to file a protest on behalf of the association, an association does not have standing as a protestant. Let me give you the name of the association for the record. The name of the association is the Residences of Gallery Place Condominium Unit Owners Association.

I am dismissing the protest filed by the association because it appears that that is what was the intention of the protest letter. There were a number of individuals that also signed the protest letter so I'm going to --

I was going to ask Ms. LaRue if the intention was for these individuals to also file a protest. Is there any individual here that can clarify that the intention was for the protest to be filed on behalf of a group of individuals?

MR. MARKS: Yes, ma'am. I'm Howard Marks. I'm one of the five protestants. The petition was filed on behalf of the group of five. They are all persons on this call. Thank you.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. One section. Let me count the number of people present. There are six individuals present from your group today. Therefore, the group of individuals is going to standing as a protestant group.

I will send Ms. LaRue an email letting her know what transpired. I don't know if she can hear me or not. I see her name still but I don't know if she can hear me. We need to set a date for mediation, a status hearing, and a protest hearing. I'll give you the date for the status and protest hearing first.

The status hearing is scheduled for June 28 at 10:30 a.m. June 28 at 10:30. The protest hearing is set for August 9th. One second. August the 9 th at 1:30 p.m. I will give you the next available date for mediation.

MR. KLINE: Ms. Fletcher, before you do that, I want to raise this, and I'll probably have to work it out with Ms. LaRue offline, which is there is a pending renewal protest. There have been discussions about consolidating them. I'm just raising that. Ms. LaRue is apparently currently incommunicado with some technical
difficulties.
I'll get with her and, if appropriate, we'll file a consent motion to consolidate. I don't think it's efficient for these two matters to proceed independently but given that there is counsel and there are individual protestants on, I'll just wait and talk to her about that.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
MR. KLINE: We have had some meetings with respect to the renewal. I think we are making some progress. I would suggest that we not have the earliest mediation date, that we probably have a later mediation date so that we can continue to explore what we've been doing, and also make a determination as to whether the two cases will be consolidated.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, Mr. Kline. I will do that. Let's see. Am I hearing my own echo? I am hearing my own echo and I don't know why. Anyway.

MS. WANCHISEN: Excuse me. It looks like Michelle came back on a different logo there.

MS. FLETCHER: Who is -- anytime you speak, I'm sorry, you've got to say who you are.

Was that Ms. Wanchisen?
MS. WANCHISEN: I apologize. Barbara. Yeah, Barbara Wanchisen. So I see Michelle LaRue has shown up in a different quadrant, a different little thing.

MS. FLETCHER: Ms. LaRue, I see you twice now but can you hear me?

Mr. Kline, I'm aware of the case you're talking about. We had mediation related to the license renewal and the resolution of the license renewal was contingent upon the resolution of the substantial change. Is that right?

MR. KLINE: I mean, the issues are related and similar and it seems to me to make sense to treat them concurrently.

MS. FLETCHER: Well, then I will give you the date available for mediation as closest to the status hearing. Let's see. The status hearing is on June 28. What about June 20 for the mediation?

MS. LARUE: Can you hear me? This is Michelle.

MS. FLETCHER: I do. Michelle, I see you. There you are. I see you.

MS. LARUE: I'm having some technical difficulties this morning. I apologize.

MS. FLETCHER: Were you able to hear anything?

MS. LARUE: I lost you when I started introducing the group of five this morning.

MS. FLETCHER: Ms. LaRue, you and I are currently having echoes. Let's see.

MS. WANCHISEN: This is Barbara again.
Michelle, can you delete your initial $\log$ in because I think maybe it's causing the echo.

MS. LARUE: I don't know how to do that because now I'm on my phone.

MS. FLETCHER: I think we can proceed. If you can't, you can't.

MS. WANCHISEN: I think only Ms.
Fletcher as the host is able to remove people.
MS. FLETCHER: Not at this time I actually can't. Sometimes I can.

Ms. LaRue.
MS. LARUE: Yes, ma'am. I'm having a hard time removing myself from the meeting.

MS. FLETCHER: Were you able to hear me say that the group has been granted standing?

MS. LARUE: Oh, yes. Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: And that the associate is not.

MS. LARUE: What's not?
MS. FLETCHER: The associate. The protest said that the association wanted standing as a protestant. The Condo Association does not have status as a protestant but the group of five or more does.

MS. LARUE: Okay. Thank you.
MS. PATRIARCA: Excuse me. We can't understand a word that you just said.

MS. LARUE: Okay. Hold on a minute. Who is speaking?

MS. PATRIARCA: Linda Patriarca. You muted me again. Excuse me. Can you hear me?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MS. PATRIARCA: When you ladies are speaking there is a lot of echoes and we can't understand a word.

MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Patriarca, what were you saying?

MS. PATRIARCA: I said -- can you hear me now?

MS. FLETCHER: I can hear you now.

MS. PATRIARCA: Now it seems to be better but when you ladies were speaking, everything was a double echo and nothing was coming through clearly. It was unintelligible. I think now maybe the problem is solved. Let's try it.

MS. LARUE: Thank you, Kaley, for your message in the chat.

So, Ms. Patriarca, the group of individuals were granted standing as a protestant. You are part of the group of at least five.

MS. PATRIARCA: Yes.
MR. PATRIARCA: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: That group was granted standing as a protestant.

MS. PATRIARCA: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: Did you have any other questions, Ms. Patriarca?

MS. PATRIARCA: No, not now that I can hear clearly. Now that I can hear clearly, everything is okay.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. What I was about to do was to set a date for mediation but I'll repeat the date of the status and protest hearing
before I do that in case there was too much of an echo going on.

The status hearing is scheduled for June 28, 2023, at 10:30. The protest hearing is scheduled for August 9 at 1:30. I propose the date for mediation of June 20.

MS. LARUE: This is Michelle LaRue speaking. I'm actually out of town that week. I'm on vacation.

MS. FLETCHER: What about --
MS. LARUE: I can do the following week.

MS. FLETCHER: I don't know if you were able to hear, Ms. LaRue, but Mr. Kline suggested that we set the mediation out as far as possible to give you an opportunity to resolve the license renewal issue.

MS. LARUE: Okay. Can we do it the week after?

MS. FLETCHER: The week after will be beyond the status hearing and the Board would prefer that the mediation take place prior to that.

MS. LARUE: Oh.
MS. FLETCHER: But how about -- how
about Friday June 16? When are you out?
MS. LARUE: I'm out the 17th to the 24th so the 16th would work for me.

MS. FLETCHER: Well, that's a Friday the 16th. We could do it then if that works for everyone, Ms. LaRue and Mr. Kline.

MR. KLINE: I can do that. June 16th?
MS. FLETCHER: Yes, yes.
MS. LARUE: Thank you, Andrew.
MS. FLETCHER: What about --
MR. KLINE: I'm hoping we won't have to do it, Michelle.

MS. LARUE: Exactly. I agree.
MS. FLETCHER: Well, anytime between 10:30 and 1:00.

MS. LARUE: Anything works for me.
MS. FLETCHER: Any preference, Andrew?
MR. KLINE: How about 11:00?
MS. FLETCHER: 11:00? Mediation is set for June 16th at 11:00.

MS. LARUE: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: You are very welcome.
MR. KLINE: Michelle, I had flagged
that we may be filing a consent motion to consolidate this with the renewal but you and I
can talk about that offline and figure that out. MS. LARUE: Perfect. Okay, sounds good.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Well, I thank everybody for coming in for the roll call hearing and the matter of Tom's Watch Bar is concluded. (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 10:22 a.m.)
