3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case on
4	our calendar is a fact finding. This is for an
5	event called Something in the Water, the event
6	dated June 17th through 19th, 2022.
7	Ms. Fashbaugh, can you please elevate
8	the rights of the parties in this case, please.
9	MS. FASHBAUGH: Shawn Townsend, your
10	rights have been elevated.
11	That is all, Mr. Chair.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
13	MR. TOWNSEND: Good morning. Can you
14	hear me?
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. Good
16	morning, Mr. Townsend.
17	Can you please spell and state your
18	name for the record and your affiliation with the
19	entity, please, sir.
20	MR. TOWNSEND: Shawn Townsend, S-H-A-W-
21	N T-O-W-N-S-E-N-D. And I am here on behalf of
22	Redrock Entertainment Services as well Best
23	Beverage Catering.
24	And, Mr. Chair, there are some other
25	members of the organization that are trying to

	log on for this hearing. Could we try to?
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. What
3	are their names and I'll ask Ms. Fashbaugh to
4	look for them.
5	MR. TOWNSEND: Okay. It's Sparr
6	Garcia, Zach Holt, Jen Hersch, and there should
7	be a Marcus Skeen and Traveon Smith.
8	And I believe we have everyone except
9	Marcus. I'm not sure.
10	MS. FASHBAUGH: Chairperson, the only
11	other person in the room is no other people
12	are in the room.
13	MR. TOWNSEND: That's, that's fine, Mr.
14	Chair. We can move forward if you like.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Good
16	morning, Mr. Townsend.
17	Can you please spell and state your
18	name for the record?
19	And what I'll ask you to do, why don't
20	you call the other participants. And once you
21	call their names, then they can identify
22	themselves, please.
23	MR. TOWNSEND: Got it. Okay.
24	Shawn Townsend, S-H-A-W-N, last name
25	T-O-W-N-S-E-N-D. And I'm here as a consultant

	with Redrock Entertainment Services and Best			
2	Beverage Catering.			
3	And I'll toss it to Sparr to introduce			
4	herself. And spell your name for the record,			
5	please.			
6	MS. GARCIA ROSE: Of course. Good			
7	morning, everyone.			
8	My name is Sparr Garcia Rose with Best			
9	Beverage Catering. And it is S-P-A-R-R, Garcia,			
10	G-A-R-C-I-A, and Rose, R-O-S-E.			
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What's your			
12	affiliation, ma'am?			
13	MS. GARCIA ROSE: I work with Best			
14	Beverage Catering. We're the food and beverage			
15	concessionaire hired by Redrock Entertainment.			
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay.			
17	MR. TOWNSEND: Zach.			
18	MR. HOLT: Good morning, everybody. My			
19	name is Zach Holt, Z-A-C-H H-O-L-T. And I also			
20	work with Best Beverage Catering.			
21	MR. TOWNSEND: Thank you.			
22	Jenifer.			
23	MS. HERSCH: Good morning, everyone.			
24	My name is Jenifer Hersch, spelled J-E-N-I-F-E-R,			
25	last name Hersch, ER excuse me, H-E-R-S-C-H.			

	And I am the lestival director on behalf of
2	Redrock Entertainment.
3	MR. TOWNSEND: And Traveon.
4	MR. SMITH: Good morning, all. I'm
5	Traveon Smith. I own and operate LGC Security.
6	We will be the local security contractor for the
7	festival, and also the security contractor and
8	consultant.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you have a
10	camera to turn on, Mr. Smith?
11	MR. SMITH: My apologies. I'm actually
12	in the airport. I can turn it on. But that was
13	the only reason I didn't have the camera on.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, that's,
15	that's fine, sir
16	Anyone else, Mr. Townsend?
17	MR. TOWNSEND: That's it, sir. Thank
18	you.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Mr.
20	Townsend, it is my understanding that Applicant
21	Redrock Entertainment, LLC, represented by
22	yourself, is hosting a festival in public space
23	behind the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum.
24	The Applicant's application indicates
25	an expected crowd of 52,500 persons over the

course of three days. And the festival will feature outdoor music, art, and other cultural events.

Can you give us, just give us an overview, sir, of this event?

MR. TOWNSEND: Yes, I will. And I will toss it to Jen to fill in any holes that I may have missed.

But as you stated, Mr. Chair, this is a 3-day festival titled Something in the Water that originally had initiated in Virginia Beach. And this is the first year that it will be hosted in the nation's capital, on Independence Avenue between 3rd Street and 9th Street.

We have submitted a site plan that identifies that there will be three different stages of the festival footprint, as well as a few bars that are located. And I know Jen exactly will be able to give more insight to exactly where and how the bars will be set up.

This is a 3-day festival that will begin on Friday through Saturday, Sunday as well.

And I will stop there and toss it to Jen to kind of give a more high-level overview of the festival and Redrock Entertainment.

MS. HERSCH: Thanks, Shawn. That was a great tee-up.

Good morning, everyone. Thank you, Mr. Chair, for hearing from us today.

As Shawn stated, this is, this fest -excuse me, this festival is entitled Something in
the Water. It is solely-owned by Mr. Pharrell
Williams.

He's the artist who originated this program in Virginia Beach, his hometown, but has since decided that he wanted to take it to another very close location dear to his heart.

D.C. is a destination that he, as growing up, had attended quite a bit. And he wanted to take it, as Shawn said, to the nation's capital.

So, we are hosting a 3-day music festival, Friday the 17th, Saturday the 18th, Sunday the 19th with -- and the purpose of the festival is for all, as you will know, Pharrell Williams has met incredible other, other artists along his career path, and would like to bring them all together for a weekend of celebration. And he thought the, not only the best location would be D.C., but also to do it on an impactful weekend of Juneteenth weekend.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 1 2 tell us about what activities are, are available 3 to the attendees? MR. TOWNSEND: So, Mr. --4 5 MS. HERSCH: Go ahead, Shawn. MR. TOWNSEND: So, Mr. Chair, there 6 7 will be a number of acts that will be performing 8 across the three stages. 9 Additionally, we have engaged with several local food vendors and retail vendors 10 11 here in the DMV region to provide offerings that 12 include full food and retail. And the alcohol service, the food and 13 14 alcohol service is being managed and operated by 15 BBC. And Jen and Zach can kind of go into more 16 details of, of that portion of the festival 17 operation. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. Just 19 elaborate more the availability, availability of 20 food and beverage, lease. 21 MS. GARCIA ROSE: Mr. Chair, Jenifer 22 and I can speak to that. 23 Jenifer, do you have a thought? MS. HERSCH: Yes, Sparr, that would be 24 25 Thank you. great.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry. 1 This 2 is what I would ask each person to do, just 3 identify yourself before speaking, please, because we have a court reporter and so at least 4 5 we can attribute correctly to who's speaking. And I think Ms. Hersch has 6 7 disappeared, at least from my screen. MS. GARCIA ROSE: I can handle that 8 9 explanation. 10 This is Sparr with Best Beverage 11 Catering. 12 So, we will have a total of 34 local 13 food vendors onsite that will be vending for 14 concession and sales to the general public. 15 We will have a total of five locations 16 for alcohol dispensing. 17 And we will also have roamers 18 throughout. 19 We will operate those internally by 20 our staff that are duly trained, certified. 21 In addition to that, we will have I.D. 22 check at the entrances of the main festival. 23 we will have 30 I.D. checkers, three managers per 24 location for that. We'll be doing wristbanding

of those patrons that are 21-plus. And that

wristband will change colors each day. 1 2 We will be serving a variety of 3 alcoholic beverages to those guests that are 21. Non-alcoholic beverages will also be allowed and 4 also for sale for all, all patrons to purchase. 5 There will also additionally be free 6 7 water refill locations that are next to the food 8 and beverage locations. 9 And then, I mean, if you would I can 10 go through our menu. I'm not sure how in-depth 11 you would like the information for this. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, you can 13 provide us generally. 14 MS. GARCIA ROSE: So, we'll have 15 packaged, packaged beer and seltzer, not to 16 exceed 16 ounce. And will be doing poured 17 cocktails in 9- and 12-ounce cups. 18 And then we will, additionally, have 19 water in 16-ounce, and Red Bull in a 10-ounce 20 can. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, Mr. 22 Townsend, is there any coordination with the 23 federal government, the Smithsonian Institute, or 24 D.C. Government, or is this event entirely

private?

MR. TOWNSEND: Yes, sir, there has been coordination with every acronym in Washington, D.C., whether it's federal or local. We have been engaged through, through the Mayor's Special Events Task Group to ensure that we are providing all of the information necessary to those agencies, as well as applying for the necessary permits to, to move forward with this festival.

Full disclosure, though, that special event permit is still pending. We, however, we feel very confident that we will be issued a special event permit for this event.

For the sake of time, we, we all on this call in this hearing know that the mayor and Pharrell announced this festival at the end of April, which has given all of us a shorter runway that normal, normally we would have to put on to go through the approval process of the licensing and permitting.

So, you know, all of the agencies, whether it's local or federal, we have been engaged practically daily from the time that this festival was announced to, to get through the navigating of licensing and permitting.

So, it's a combination of both, Mr.

Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I want to ask you a question.

So, is this, will this permit, will this event be -- will it take place exclusively on District's land or federal land?

MR. TOWNSEND: Great question. I think that that, that's been one of the areas where we've had to, to navigate through.

The footprint of the festival is in the actual street, which is D.C. property. The sidewalk is, is owned by the feds. And the footprint of the festival will not be, it will not extend to, to he sidewalks. So, it will just be in the streets.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You stated before that the event was presented before the Mayor's Special Events Task Force. But, so you're saying that it has not been approved -- it has not been approved as yet, but it's your expectation that, that it will be approved.

Is that correct?

MR. TOWNSEND: Yes, sir.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, I know that you were hired as a consultant to, to apply for

this license. So, can you tell us, tell us about 1 2 the Applicant's prior experience. So, all right, so, you are hired as a 3 consultant by Redrock, I believe? 4 MR. TOWNSEND: By both entities, sir. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: By both. 6 7 So, tell us, so, the local entity 8 actually that is applying for the event, just 9 tell us about some of their experiences running similar events? 10 11 MR. TOWNSEND: So, Redrock 12 Entertainment is a production company that -- a 13 global production company that has experience in, 14 in hosting and creating, you know, events such as 15 Something in the Water all over the globe. 16 And Best Beverage Catering, BBC, is, 17 is the same. They provide food and beverage 18 services nationally for events like this as well. 19 So, both entities, sir, are very 20 familiar with hosting large scale events that 21 include, you know, providing alcohol and food 22 beverage services. 23 So, I'll stop there. And Jen or 24 Sparr, if you have anything to add, feel free to 25 do so.

1	MS. HERSCH: Thank you, Shawn. This is
2	Jenifer Hersch speaking again.
3	Shawn is correct. Redrock
4	Entertainment, we are a subsidiary of Live
5	National Entertainment, a global music promoter.
6	And for over 25 years our company has been
7	hosting large scale live events, in addition to
8	live, large scale music festivals around the
9	globe.
10	And BBC, Best Beverage Catering is our
11	preferred partner on all of these projects.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank
13	you.
14	Mr. T I'm sorry, go ahead.
15	MR. TOWNSEND: Sorry, Mr. Chair. I
16	just wanted to make sure that we, we cover the
17	security piece as well. I know
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm getting
19	there. If I don't ask these questions, you know,
20	Mr. Townsend, that Mr. Short will be asking them.
21	MR. TOWNSEND: I know Mr. Short is
22	ready.
23	MR. TOWNSEND: But, so but I, yeah, but
24	I'm, I'm getting there.
25	So, all right, so tell us. You said

it's a 3-day event. So, tell us the hours for each day.

MR. TOWNSEND: So, hours of operations applied for for each day is, on the 17th, 2:00 p.m. to 11:30 p.m.; on Saturday the 18th, 2:00 p.m. to 11:30; as well as Sunday, 12:30 to 11:00.

Hours of operate -- hours of sales will end 30 minutes prior to end time on each day.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, tell us about, so will this, since the event will be held entirely on, you said, in the streets, so will this be fenced in? So, tell us a little bit about the setup. And I'm also going to talk about the admission and the exit points, please.

MR. TOWNSEND: The entire footprint of the festival will be fenced off with three points of egress.

Now, keep in mind with that, Mr.

Short, we have been working with the Fire

Marshall's Office to determine emergency

evacuation areas within the footprint of the

festival. So, although we will not be utilizing

the sidewalk, because it's federal property, we

have, we have all come to a consensus in

determining that a large portion of the festival footprint will be -- can be used as emergency evacuation point of egress, if need be.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, tell us about the entrance, the entrance point. You said there are three, there will be three. So, how is it that folks will enter and exit out of these three main, main points that you have mentioned?

MR. TOWNSEND: So, I'll toss it to Jen and Sparr to talk more about the entrance piece.

MS. HERSCH: Hello again, this is Jenifer Hersch.

Our entrances are going to be secured entrances on 4th Street and 7th Street. There will be levels of security that folks, ticket buyers, those who pre-registered will have already received their wristbands. They will come to our entrance. They'll go through some security screening. And then they'll be scanned into the festival via three entrances between 4th and 7th Streets.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, you stated that you're expecting 52,000 people. Is it 52,000 over the three days? Is that what? Is it over the three days or is it 52,000 a day?

MS. HERSCH: We have estimated, just 1 2 based on our footprint, that that would be our 3 maximum capacity across the footprint per day, 4 sir. 5 Right now I think we are hoping to have that many attendees. It may just be a 6 7 little south of that. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, so tell us 9 about how many staff. You have 53,000 people, tell me about the staff and the security that's 10 11 for this event? 12 MS. HERSCH: I'll give you just overall 13 head count for staff. Mr. Traveon Smith can give 14 you a head count for security. 15 But production and operational staff, 16 we are probably looking in the neighborhood of 17 having about 250 to 275 employees. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, I guess, Mr. 19 Smith. Mr. Smith, can you tell us a little bit 20 about, can you give us some background, sir, in 21 how many staff you will be providing for this 22 event? 23 MR. SMITH: Yes. Apologies for the 24 muffle. I have a mask on. 25 So, yes, we pretty much -- the

capacity, like you said, is scheduled to about 52,000 but may trend a little bit lower. But we staff the event up to the max, which is pretty much one guard per 250 people, which is, like, the industry standard.

So, we're scheduled to staff about 550 guards per day for this event.

And with that, we have all of the different posts scheduled. And we have 30 different mags at each entrance throughout the entire festival, and we have the different lanes for each one.

Each one will have metal detectors and also bag checkers that will be set for each entry. Anyone that comes onto the property, as well as the artist entrance areas, they will have metal detectors and security entourage. Any artist or anyone else coming into those areas as well.

Anyone that comes within the fence line will be subject to search and make sure that they have come in through that search.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Smith, can you tell us a little bit about your company, sir, your, and your experience?

MR. SMITH: Yes. So, I'm Traveon

Smith. I'm the owner and operator. I'm actually
a D.C. native.

I have been doing security in this area for over 20 years. We are also the security contractor that handled Broccoli City Festival, which is the second largest now festival in this area, which we just did, which handles between 25 to 35K.

We were also, we also brought down about 100 guards to the initial Something in the Water Festival back in 2019.

We handled the security, all of the events for MGM National Harbor, National Theater, Events D.C. Everything that Events D.C. handles, we handle all of their events from D.C. Armory, anything on the RFK lot. And we also handle all of the Commanders games.

We subcontract with CSC to handle their entry as far as all of the Commanders coming into the stadium. We have three gates. And then we also do University of Maryland football as well, as far all of their weapons that they process.

MR. TOWNSEND: And I will just add, Mr.

Chair, that LGC is a CBE licensed company as well as licensed by Security Office's Management Branch of MPD.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you for that, Mr. Townsend.

Just, so tell us just generally now, how will you ensure that underaged will not, people who are underage will not be served?

Whoever can answer that question.

MS. GARCIA ROSE: This is Sparr. Sparr of Redrock Beverage.

So, we will be doing physical I.D. checks of all patrons and wristbanding, as I stated earlier.

And then once patrons are at the bar, at the point of sale, if there is any cause for concern with their wristband, that it looks tampered, or if they believe them to be under the age of 21 they will re-identify at that time.

You know, I'd also like to state that we, our, our staff is, we bring local but we also bring well-trained staff. So, they are trained in the current state of licenses. And then they will also be on the lookout for anyone that may appear over-intoxicated from the food and

1	beverage standpoint.		
2	That is our, our plan of action.		
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry. Go		
4	ahead.		
5	MS. GARCIA ROSE: I was just stating		
6	that is how we would handle service.		
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank		
8	you.		
9	Now, this is a fenced-in, as you		
10	stated, it's going to be completely fenced in.		
11	Is that correct?		
12	MR. TOWNSEND: Yes, sir.		
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So,		
14	if alcohol is served, will alcohol be served at		
15	any specific point, or will alcohol be served		
16	throughout the venue?		
17	MS. GARCIA ROSE: This is Sparr again.		
18	So, we will have five specific		
19	dispensing points that are physical structures.		
20	And then there will also be roamers		
21	that will also be handling the sale of alcohol.		
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What are		
23	roamers, please?		
24	MR. TOWNSEND: So, Mr. Chair, just I		
25	asked the same question when Sparr initially told		

me roamers. But it is equivalent to the staff at Capital One Arena or Nats Stadium that walk around selling beer and wine, selling alcohol to patrons.

It is the responsibility of the roamers, similar to how they do at Nats Stadium, and Monument, and Capital One Arena to ensure that the patron that they are selling alcohol to is banded with a wristband that they would have received upon entry to the festival.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.

And so, what, all right, and this is

-- so I know a little bit, I know that this is a

music festival so there's going to be music. So,
what steps are, are being taken to control noise
excesses?

And I know this is a downtown area.

Although we all know there is hardly anywhere in

D.C. that residents, residents are not present.

So, what steps are?

I know that you have stated that the event is scheduled to be over at 11:30. And I guess it's Friday, Saturday, and Sunday night, I believe. So, and I guess Monday's a holiday.

But, anyway, how, what steps are, what

steps, if any, are being taken to mitigate noise? 1 2 MR. TOWNSEND: Jenifer, you want to 3 take a stab at that one? MS. HERSCH: Sure. This is Jenifer 4 Hersch again from Redrock Entertainment. 5 So, as Shawn has referenced, we have 6 7 been working with all, all of the agencies in 8 understanding the ordinances, noise ordinances 9 that we have to abide by. 10 And then also, by setting our hours 11 with a later afternoon start and early evening 12 within the noise ordinance hours of 11:30 and 13 11:00 p.m. on Sunday is what we are doing to 14 control sound that wouldn't be too upsetting to a 15 neighborhood. MR. TOWNSEND: Mr. Chair, we've also 16 17 over the past week engaged with ANC 6D. And we 18 intend on meeting with their community, 19 presenting at their ANC commission meeting on 20 Monday as well to go through the festival and 21 talk about, address any issues that the community 22 may have in the vicinity of the festival 23 footprint. 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr. 25 Townsend.

I don't have any other questions. 1 2 questions by any board members? 3 MEMBER SHORT: Yes, sir. Mr. Short would like to have a question. 4 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr. Short. 6 7 MEMBER SHORT: Thank you. 8 Mr. Townsend, how are you today? 9 MR. TOWNSEND: Good, sir. Good to see 10 you. 11 MEMBER SHORT: Great. 12 After hearing all of the points that 13 our chairman brought up, he hit pretty much 14 every, everything that -- I'm hearing the 15 chairman brought up most of the points I would 16 have asked. 17 And thank you, Mr. Chairman. 18 And the only question I would ask is 19 are there any drawings or renderings of the site 20 that would -- as you know, Mr. Townsend, our 21 investigators will probably be assigned to go 22 there so they can pre-plan how they would assist 23 you. 24 MR. TOWNSEND: Yes, sir. We, we 25 submitted a site plan with this application that

outlines the locations of the bars. And we're happy to ensure that not only the board but the investigators that will be there on site will have a copy of the most recent updated site plan as its been revised at the time of the festival.

I'll be there all three days around the clock, so I'll be, I'll be ensuring, I'll make sure that the investigators have a good point of contact between Sparr and myself if there are any issues.

BBC will also, in addition to the 550 security guards, will have -- I know she mentioned this, but I just want to provide more clarity to that, that there will be an additional 30 I.D. checkers and staff roaming around to ensure that, one, not only that folks who are getting wristbands are 21, but, two, a second line of enforcement to the roamers that will be walking around selling alcohol.

We're just trying to ensure that we do everything that we can to not only keep people safe but ensure that folks are drink -- who are drinking, consuming alcoholic beverages are of age.

MEMBER SHORT: I do thank you for your

And I am satisfied. 1 answers. 2 Thank you very much, Mr. Townsend, for 3 your presentation and all the persons there with 4 Redrock. 5 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. That's all I have at this time. 6 7 MR. TOWNSEND: Thank you, Mr. Short. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr. 9 Short. 10 Any other questions by any other board 11 members? 12 Yes, Ms. Hansen. 13 MEMBER HANSEN: Can one of you clarify 14 the number of security personnel who will be on 15 staff, and will they be private or is this in conjunction with some of the other agencies in 16 17 D.C.? 18 MR. TOWNSEND: So, there will be 550 19 security guards that will be provided by LGC, 20 which is a private security company. 21 And I will add that within the past 22 two weeks we, there have been a number of walk-23 throughs of this festival footprint with both 24 District Government officials as well as federal. 25 And on one of our last walks Traveon and

Commander Bagshaw and other members of the Special Operations Division of MPD had conversations about security.

And from what I understand, Traveon, you can expand on this, but MPD was satisfied with the security plan that was presented to them by LGC.

MR. SMITH: Yes. To also follow up on that, yes, we, we also talked to Commander Bagshaw. We did clarify our weapon abatement process.

But then I would also like to reiterate that our director of event operations, Officer Washington, is a 30-year, retired MPD officer.

And then our event manager is a 20year, retired military Marine.

So, with that, Commander Bagshaw knows exactly who my leads for the team is. And that relationship is already there. So, we're, we're working in depth to make sure that we're all on the same page.

As well as we do know the city very well. And we know the expectations of what's needed to make sure that this is a very safe,

1 secure event. 2 MEMBER HANSEN: Thank you. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Ms. Hansen. 4 5 Any other questions by any other board members? 6 7 MEMBER GRANDIS: Mr. Chairman. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. 9 Grandis. 10 MEMBER GRANDIS: Thank you. 11 Hello, Mr. Townsend. 12 MR. TOWNSEND: Good to see you, sir. 13 MEMBER GRANDIS: We appreciate the 14 presentation that you and your cohorts have 15 presented today. And it's very helpful to us to 16 know that you already are inter-working with MPD as closely as you are, and with the Mayor's Task 17 18 That's very comforting to help us have a Force. 19 whole rounded picture of this present -- of this 20 event. 21 Could you, I know also that there's 22 information about cleanup. But just for the 23 record of this hearing could you help us 24 understand the cleanup that's going to be needed

with 58,000 people plus attending?

MR. TOWNSEND: Good question. 1 We just had a call about this 2 3 yesterday. And we will be hiring DPW street sweepers to, to provide cleanup service for the 4 5 festival. And I know that there's an additional 6 7 subcontracting company that will be providing 8 cleanup service as well. 9 Jenifer, do you want to add anything I think I covered it. 10 to that? 11 MS. HERSCH: Yeah, Shawn, you covered 12 that well. Thank you, sir. MEMBER GRANDIS: Just an add-on to that 13 14 question, because -- and these are very 15 sophisticated individuals that are before us 16 today, and they have a lot of experience with, 17 with this type of event -- so, does anyone in the 18 company, not volunteer, stay long enough to see 19 that the cleanup, as they have been asked to do, 20 is successful, or will they all have left town? MS. HERSCH: This is Jenifer Hersch 21 22 again. 23 Absolutely, we ensure. My, one of our 24 mottos is is that we leave a home the way that we

found it. So, my team, my extended operational

team will stay. I think likely right now we are scheduled to stay until Wednesday and Thursday post the festival to ensure that exactly, that the streets of D.C. are found -- are left the way we found it.

MEMBER GRANDIS: Thank you for that.

Mr. Townsend, I'm sure that this organization is as concerned about compliance check of I.D.s. Having had events in Virginia Beach, and it's a little different culture than Washington, making sure that there is full compliance with I.D.s.

So, in that regard -- and you know this -- the agency has booklets that show what the legal I.D.s are allowed, because there may be some differences between Virginia/Virginia Beach and D.C. on what is allowed and what is not permissible.

Would you be able to get some of these booklets to this organization so that they can ensure that there will be compliance?

MR. TOWNSEND: Absolutely, sir.

MEMBER GRANDIS: Thank you very much.

And I appreciate the good presentation today. Thank you very much.

MR. TOWNSEND: Thank you. 1 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any other 3 questions from any other board members? (No response.) 4 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Townsend, any final event, any final -- any final 6 7 statements, representations you want to make to 8 the board? 9 MR. TOWNSEND: I'd just like to thank the board and the agency for allowing us to 10 11 present today and working with us on this. 12 Like I've said to other agencies, we, 13 you know, we've had a short runway of time on 14 planning this, this festival. And we know this 15 is something that the mayor and Pharrell both And it's just some things that, you know, 16 17 behind the scenes that we have to navigate 18 through in order to make you happy. 19 So, once again, thank you. And I know Mr. Grandis has a question 20 21 about trash cleanup after the festival. And I'll 22 just say that, you know, Something in the Water of Redrock, BBC, Pharrell and his team are very 23 24 committed to, you know, being involved in the

community here in the DMV region. And, you know,

hopefully, you know, this will not be the last of Something in the Water D.C. So, there will be a lot to clean up after, after Sunday, throughout the year. So, thank you for that question. And that all. Jenifer, do you have anything, or

Sparr?

MS. HERSCH: No, Shawn. I think you iterated the comment that I wanted to say.

Our intention is to have a goodstanding, long-term relationship with the city, as we would like to continue to host this event. So, it is our intent to follow all the regulations and make sure that everyone is happy with the event that we produce in the city.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's it? Well, thank you, Mr. Townsend and your team, for your presentation today.

Of course, the agency, the board will take this matter under advisement. And we will await the final documentation that needs to be provided to the agency for us to issue a permit pursuant to those events, those documents that are provided to the agency prior to the event.

So, so like I said, we'll take this

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matter under advisement. And thank you for your presentation today. And I hope that you will stay in contact with the agency to provide whatever documentation that is required from licensing for them to complete their process. All right. Thank you very much. Have a great day. MR. TOWNSEND: Thank you. (Whereupon, at 11:40 a.m., the hearing was concluded.)
