The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met via WebEx videoconference, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson presiding.

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CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good afternoon, everyone. And welcome to today's afternoon session of the ABC Board. My name is Donovan Anderson. I'm Chairman of the Board.

Joining with me this afternoon are five of the Board Members, Mr. James Short, Mr. Bobby Cato, Ms. Rafi Crockett, Ms. Jeni Hansen, Mr. Edward Grandis. The Board has six members in attendance for the conduct of business and that constitutes a quorum.

Before we get underway with this afternoon's calendar, we have four cases on our calendar. And once your case is called I will take a moment for our IT specialist to elevate the rights for each party to enable their camera and equipment. Then and only then will you have the ability to enable your equipment.

If you have any questions or you need any technical assistance please use the question and answer feature to ask your question, please.

Our first case on this afternoon calendar, it's a one day Substantial Change Application from Barkada Wine Bar on License

number, I do not have -- yes, it's a Substantial 1 2 Change license. 3 And I don't have the license number 4 for, yes, I'm sorry. License number is 115719. 5 Ms. Fashbaugh, can you please elevate the rights of the parties in this case, please? 6 7 MS. FASHBAUGH: Nathan Fisher, your 8 rights have been elevated. That is all, Mr. 9 Chair. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Fisher. 11 MR. FISHER: Hello. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good afternoon, 13 Mr. Fisher. Can you please spell and state your 14 name for the record, please? 15 MR. FISHER: Nathan Fisher, N-A-T-H-A-16 N, F-I-S-H-E-R. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 18 Good afternoon, Mr. Fisher. 19 MR. FISHER: Good afternoon. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, Mr. 21 Fisher, this is a Substantial Change. It's my 22 understanding, well, not my understanding, you 23 filed a Substantial Change Application to allow 24 outdoor Pride events. 25 The Board, we had a protest hearing

where we issued by Board Order number 2021-181, that was issued on April 22nd, 2022 denying the Substantial Change for you to have entertainment.

Now, if I -- and -- the Board Order stated in particular term, Board Order 2022-181, it basically states that no amplified sound or music shall be heard outside the premise except for the nominal use of the establishment's doors for ingress, egress and ingress. And so therefore, we denied live entertainment on the premises or on the sidewalk caf,.

Now, the reason why the Board, as you recall, we did have a protest hearing. This license was protested by the ANC and the group of five or more. And so, neither the ANC nor the group of five or more wanted us to give you a license to, for this to occur.

And so, the question today, sir, what is it that has changed why you're asking for a Substantial Change request to have an event on, and I see this is to have a drag performance on June 28th, 2022.

MR. FISHER: Yes. So, with discussions with our neighbors and our ANC, we understood that if the ANC gave us approval for a

one time, that that would be okay.

And after talking to them, that Dan, our ANC Chair, gave us approval to do this one time Pride event at the end of the month.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, have you spoken to any of the protestants? I mean, and the reason why I'm asking, sir, I'm looking at the decision that was issued in April.

And I, from what I saw here, from factually we had concerns that, with concerns with that Mr. Alan Cannon. He lives in the condominium near your establishment.

And Mr. Cannon had stated that usually you do not create any disturbance. But on one occasion on June 29th, 2021, while in his home he heard a commotion related to an event held at the Barkada Wine Bar about 8:30 p.m.

Specifically, the establishment appeared to be hosting a bingo game, and had a device amplifying someone's voice. He said there was also a large crowd gathered around the entertainment sidewalk caf, that obstructed traffic. Inside his unit he could hear shouting coming from Barkada's sidewalk caf,.

So, this was an event that you had

June 29th, 2021. And now you're asking us to have an event on June 28th, 2022, which my assumption is it is similar to this event that Mr. Cannon had complaints about at, during the last, during the protest hearing.

So, what gives? What, how is it that, how can this Board amend its decision to allow you to have this event when your neighbors complained about a similar type of event that you had around the same period last year?

MR. FISHER: Sure. So after that particular event last year, and with the talks that we've had with both the ANC and our neighbors we now know what went wrong with that.

We know that advance notice to our neighbors, as our ANC Chair has asked us to do in order for him to approve this one term event is needed. And we have reached out.

Once, our understanding is once this is approved we will work with Dan to reach out to all of our neighbors. And we have all of the email addresses also to those protestants that this event was going to, that this event can happen.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But have you

though, have you approached any of these, especially the protestants who protested this event the last time? Have you specifically reached out to them to say, we plan, we're going to ask the ABC Board.

I know that I, you protested the application. The ABC Board denied our application to have entertainment. I'm aware that we had this event on May, we had this event last year, something similar last year.

And if we were to have this event again would you, can we have this event? And what, how could we improve it? Have you had this conversation with any of your neighbors, sir?

MR. FISHER: We have had this conversation with the ANC. And the ANC, and our understanding was we just needed the ANC's approval to get ABRA approval.

And the ANC during their discussions said they will give us approval, which they have, as long as we reach out to the neighbors and tell them that this is happening.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, is it, all right. So, let me, when you said the ANC, I know this is Mr. Dan Orlanski, who was one of the --

But is it this, did this, did the entire ANC support this event, or was it just him?

MR. FISHER: Dan gave us his written note approving it, that we forwarded to ABRA when we asked for this one time change.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The reason I'm trying to make a distinction, the reason I'm trying to make a distinction, I'm trying to find out if the, a single member district cannot speak -- a single, and I know that Mr. Orlanski, from the representation that you made, is the Chairperson of the ANC. I think I'm, I think he's the Chairperson.

One of the things that I'm trying to get a clarification from, is it that he's saying the entire -- I'm not, I know that the Agency has received the communication that you speak of.

And so maybe I'll ask the Agency to share that with me right now. Because I don't have it in front of me.

I'm trying to make a distinction whether or not it is the, is it Mr. Orlanski in his individual position as ANC for the area, or as the ANC Chair who supports this event? That's the difference I'm trying to make.

Because remember, this is April that we issued a decision, because the ANC and the protestants came and complained about an event that you had in June of last year.

And you're having the, you're, here it is again. You're having another event in June.

And that you're asking us to amend our order to give you permission to do that, sir.

MR. FISHER: I do not know what communications Dan might have had with the rest of the ANC. All I know is when we asked, a few days later he came back and said that, and sent us his approval.

I know one of, originally one of their hesitations of giving us the, a change,
Substantial Change for in general was this idea of having events all the time.

And one of the things that we talked about is having one or two events throughout the year, doing a one time change was something that the ANC would approve of. And thus, that's why we're going down this route.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: As I said, I'm not trying to, Mr. Fisher, I'm not trying to badger you. But remember, I'm reading the

decision. And one of your neighbors, Mr. Cannon, Mr. Cannon said that they usually, and I'm reading from the decision where Mr. Cannon said, Mr. Cannon indicated that Barkada usually does not create a disturbance.

However, June 29th, 2021, I specifically remember June 29th, 2021 when they just had a party. And this party that they had in June of 2021, whatever good will I had toward this establishment, I've lost it.

So, how is it that, what is it that, if the ABC Board was to grant this exception for this one time event, what is it that you plan to do, your, you plan to do to ensure that what happened on June 29th, 2021 would not occur?

MR. FISHER: Just like we promised with the ANC to get their approval for this, we are going, if this is approved the first thing we're going to do is reach out to all of our neighbors, let them know, give them a heads up.

We also know that any sound that was used at the event last year will not be used again this year. Most of the drag performance will be inside. And this will just be to let the drag queens go outside to, for anyone who is

sitting out there as well. 1 2 And so, all, every measure that we 3 have learned through the issues that the neighbors had from last year, we plan to 4 5 implement, and do it closely with them. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What's the 6 7 capacity of your sidewalk caf,, sir? 8 MR. FISHER: So, the sidewalk caf, is 9 only 18. So most of the people will be inside or 10 on the streetery. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, and you 12 have a streetery also? So, you have a sidewalk 13 caf, and a streetery? 14 MR. FISHER: Yes. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And I know that So, and I'm 16 streeteries are a creation of COVID. 17 not quite aware if DDOT has issued significant 18 regulations regarding streeteries. 19 So, what's the capacity currently of 20 your streetery? I'm just asking you because I'm 21 not, because we don't really, we haven't issued 22 any regulations yet. So, what's the capacity of 23 your streetery? 24 MR. FISHER: Right now we have five

tables of six on our streetery.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, six, so that's 30 people you can have on your streetery, plus 18 on your sidewalk caf,. That is 48 people.

Now, one of the things also, and I, and the reason I kept, I'm reading the decision where Mr. Cannon said, there was a large crowd gathered around the establishment's sidewalk caf, that obstructed traffic.

So, you're saying, what you just stated was that you're going to have the drag performance be outside.

MR. FISHER: So, it's more --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: How, that you, how did, how are you going to prevent overcrowded on the sidewalk caf,? And how is it that you're going to prevent obstruction of traffic?

MR. FISHER: So, we, no one, we do have staff members that make sure that no one will be in the sidewalk. This event would not, the drag queens will be performing both inside, and then will be able to, we just wanted to do this right.

So, they are able to go outside and collect, you know, their tips from people who are

sitting outside that may not be able to sit 1 2 inside. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, tell me 4 about this event, sir. 5 MR. FISHER: Our idea is to do a celebration for Pride called Wine Down Pride, at 6 7 the end of the month, and have between three or 8 four drag queens be able to perform. And have a 9 kind of celebration of the end of Pride Month. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And how is this 11 event advertised? 12 MR. FISHER: We have not advertised it 13 But we would either, we would hopefully sell tickets for the seats both inside and 14 15 outside. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And how many 17 tickets do you plan to sell, sir? It would be 48 for 18 MR. FISHER: 19 outside, the six tables, the five tables of six 20 in the streetery, the 18 for the sidewalk caf,, 21 and then about 20 for inside. 22 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, after 23 you've sold those tickets and I show up, I show 24 up there with my ten friends because, and I heard 25 about this wonderful drag performance that you're

going to have. So, I showed up with my ten friends because we want, what are you going to do?

MR. FISHER: We will not be able to sit them.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But won't I be, but if I, but I'm going to stand then? Okay, since I won't be seated am I not, why would I not then stand in the street to watch the performance? So, will there be performance inside, outside or, I'm trying to find out.

MR. FISHER: So, the outside part of a performance, we're trying to do a hybrid, so they can, you know, start their performance inside and then go outside so that they could get as many of the tips as they can.

The outside part of the performance would just be in front of our door where the sidewalk caf, is. And so, I can't imagine anyone would be able to even see if they were standing not in front of our door, or sitting down at one of our tables.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, all right.

Is there, where is, the streetery of course is in the street. So, where is your streetery in

1	comparison to your sidewalk caf,?
2	MR. FISHER: Perpendicular, or
3	parallel.
4	(Simultaneous speaking.)
5	MR. FISHER: Yes.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead. I'm
7	sorry.
8	MR. FISHER: And so our door, like our
9	door is, the sidewalk caf, is right to the left
10	of our door. And then parallel to that on the
11	street is our streetery.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, where is
13	the sidewalk?
14	MR. FISHER: The sidewalk is in
15	between that area.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thus, how do
17	you plan to police the sidewalk to ensure that if
18	I want to walk, if I want to traverse through the
19	sidewalk?
20	Because again, did you have the
21	streetery, last year when you had this event did
22	you have the streetery at that time? You had the
23	streetery?
24	MR. FISHER: Yes. Yes.
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, you had the

streetery last year.

MR. FISHER: And we had two staff members on both sides of the streetery to make sure that no one, because this is a seated event. So, no one is standing up and getting into the sidewalk.

And it's to make sure that the sidewalks are clear. So, if anyone was walking up and down the sidewalk and stopped to watch, we ask them to move. Because we want to make sure that the sidewalk is clear.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But what's the difference between, you said it's a seated event this year. So, what was it last year? Tell me about the event last year?

MR. FISHER: Last year was a seated event as well. We did the same thing. Our understanding though last, what happened last year was that people from U Street started coming in and watching.

And we did our best to tell them that they weren't allowed to be there. And that's, you know, when they, we told them they couldn't stand there, they left.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But, Mr.

Fisher, that didn't work. That did not work.

Because, and I'm not just picking, the reason why

I'm picking on Mr. Cannon, because I'm looking at

our decision, and Mr. Cannon complained about

that.

Mr. Cannon said, there was a large crowd gathered around the establishment sidewalk caf, that obstructed traffic.

MR. FISHER: I --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, I'm sorry.

MR. FISHER: I would like to say that traffic was never obstructed. No one was in the street. And if there was a large crowd within the streetery, that's probably what he saw, as there was 35 people, 30 people in the streetery.

But I, we made sure very, like very well that no one was in the street and no one was in the sidewalk. I didn't see anyone blocking the sidewalk.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The reason why
I'm saying that, sir, he testified under oath.
And in one, in denying the permanent license the
Board credited his testimony. So, the Board
credited his testimony that what was occurring
blocked the, blocked traffic.

So, I know you're saying that, so your denial unfortunately now, sir, it's not credited.

Because the Board credited the testimony of Mr.

Cannon under oath that this occurred.

And so therefore, I'm now taking this factually to say that factually they, to say that factually that there was a large crowd gathered around the establishment's sidewalk caf,, and that it obstructed traffic.

You stated that you had two employees last year who were supposed to assist with this. Clearly it did not work. So, if the Board was to even do this, would you commit, how many more staff members would you commit to hiring to ensure that this area is not obstructed?

MR. FISHER: Since then we have doubled our staff. And everyone on staff will be working that day. So, we will have at least four if not more in the, around the sidewalk, to make sure that the sidewalk is not obstructed.

(Simultaneous speaking.)

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But how would you, how do you go, how do you plan to prevent noise disturbances?

MR. FISHER: So, we, this year we will

not have a large speaker or any type of amplification outside except for a small bluetooth speaker that we're just going to place in the sidewalk caf,.

Because again, the sidewalk caf, is only where the, we will have the drag queens go when they are performing outside, not inside.

And we currently have, are working on, and half of it's already done, curtains around the streetery, so that any, those five tables in the streetery, there's some noise cancellation there.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, your plan, so you're saying that you'll install curtains in the streetery to -- What, anything else you plan to do, sir?

MR. FISHER: Those, if the, I know that we will, one of the promises we made with the ANC is that we will be in contact with our neighbors throughout that day as well.

And if they do have some complaints that it is getting too loud we will either, we will give our warnings to those outside. And if they do have complaints again we will stop the outside music.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, you stated that, so what else is going on on June, I'm sorry. What else is going on? What, if anything are you aware will be going on, on your street on June 28th?

MR. FISHER: Nothing that I know of.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, the reason
I brought that up, because you said that when you
had the event on June 29th last year that folks
on U Street came over.

So, was there anything going on on U
Street for the people on U Street to come over to
the establishment? That's what I'm trying to
find out. What was going on, if you recall, that
folks from U Street came over to your
establishment last year?

MR. FISHER: I know it was like one of the first weeks that everything started opening after COVID. So, I believe it was just a, you know, everyone was out and about because they were excited that all establishments were open.

I also know that there were some,
there was a event at the Lincoln Theater that
evening that is kind of catty corner down the
street, right next to Ben's Chili Bowl, that let

out at the same time. 1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You did not 2 3 say, it was a Pride event? MR. FISHER: The Lincoln Theater 4 5 event, I do not know if it was a Pride event or 6 just a concert. But I do know that when they let 7 out that, whenever the Lincoln Theater and the 8 show a lot of people do tend to go onto U Street. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, do you 10 have any idea if there is going to be an event 11 this, if there is an event scheduled for June 12 20th, 2022 at the Lincoln Theater? 13 (Simultaneous speaking.) 14 I am looking that up MR. FISHER: 15 right now. Their calendar does not show any 16 event happening that day. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any questions 18 by any of the Board Members. 19 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short has a 20 question. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr. 22 Short. 23 MEMBER SHORT: First I'd just like to 24 get something on the record. Normally this 25 Board, when an ANC Commission, we get a letter

that they had a meeting, and they, the whole ANC approves a Substantial Change. So, my question is, did the whole ANC give you a note? Or did just one person on the ANC that you know gave you a note that it's okay this time?

MR. FISHER: We, yes. We reached out to Dan asking for ANC approval. And after a couple of days he gave the note back, saying you have the approval as long as you reach out to the neighbors, and make sure that there is a dialog during that day with the neighbors, in case anything were to come up. What those conversations were between Dan and other ANC members, I'm not privy to.

MEMBER SHORT: Is it also your testimony that nothing's changed from last year about sidewalks, or about your eatery, or about the number of people that you are planning to have outside with the drag queens when they come out to the exterior?

What's changed from last year about the numbers of people you have? And you're going to have, you say four people? And I'd just like to make a comment for the record also. If MPD, the Metropolitan Police Department can't make

people clear the sidewalks, how will you enforce clearing the sidewalk?

MR. FISHER: So, last year with our staff members on either side we did a good job making sure that the sidewalk, especially in front of our establishment and the apartment building, were clear.

And as opposed to what happened last year, this is going to be less people. Because last year more people were in the streetery.

MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Well, I'll just be saying this, sir. I remember some film or video being introduced where someone across the street in an apartment filmed the street being blocked, and in front of your eatery being blocked. Do you remember that from the hearing last year?

MR. FISHER: I do not believe any film was introduced during that hearing.

MEMBER SHORT: Okay. All right.

Well, you might not remember. But the question

I'm asking you is, what has changed? And you

expect this Board, because you have a note from a

ANC Commissioner, a note, not a signed letter

from the ANC, saying that you can have this

event.

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And then all you have to do is notify the persons who complained last year, after you get permission from this Board. Why not get permission from those persons first, and then come to this Board? Why the reversal?

MR. FISHER: It was told by us, and our understanding that to get a one time change that all we had to do was get approval from the ANC.

MEMBER SHORT: An approval or a note?

MR. FISHER: Approval. That's what it was told by us.

MEMBER SHORT: Well, maybe you're not familiar with ANC's workings here in the District of Columbia. But normally before this Board, ever since I've been on the Board it takes a letter from the ANC by a meeting that they hold once a month, or whenever they have their meeting.

And that, the letter that comes from the ANC comes from that meeting. So, are you aware of any meeting that the ANC had to give you permission to do this?

MR. FISHER: I am not aware. All I

know is when we reached out to Dan asking for 1 approval, after two days he sent us the email 2 3 back that we shared with ABRA. MEMBER SHORT: Okay. And do you 4 5 remember last year's testimony that someone who 6 lives in the apartment next door to your building 7 says their bedroom is right on that front. And that they for that whole evening 8 9 could not use their bedroom because of the noise 10 that was coming from your establishment, and 11 people blocking the street. Are you, do you 12 remember that? Are you aware of that? 13 MR. FISHER: Yes. I'm aware of the 14 testimony that was given. And again, that's why 15 we are going to reach out to each and every one 16 of them. 17 I know this event is going to be from 18 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. It will be done by 9:00 19 p.m. And we are happy to engage with all of our 20 neighbors throughout the whole day of that event. 21 MEMBER SHORT: What was the hours last 22 year? 23 MR. FISHER: Last year it went to 24 10:00 p.m. 25 MEMBER SHORT: Went to 10:00. What

time did everybody eventually leave the street?

I'm talking more, when you close your event down what time did the citizens, or the people in the street, or whomever else, what time did those people leave from in front of your business, or in front of those apartments?

MR. FISHER: I would say by at least 10:15 p.m., as we do close at 10:00. And we wanted to clean up and get everyone out of there. At that point also, no one was sitting inside, because of the COVID restrictions.

MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Well, I just had that information about the ANC. I wanted that on the record. And I think you very much for your testimony. Mr. Chair, that's all I have at this time.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr. Short. I just want the record to reflect that as a part of their, as a part of his application, what was submitted, a letter.

An email was submitted from Dan
Orlanski, single member District 1D-02, where it
says, I have no issues with you having this
specific permit for the Pride event. Let me know
if you need anything from me. I think you can

just forward this email to ABRA and it should do.

As for the neighbors, I think as long as you give them advance notice, and let them know that it might be a little bit noisy, it shouldn't be a problem.

So, that's the email that was provided from the ANC to the owners of Barkada. And that was submitted. Now --

MEMBER SHORT: Just a question I have for you, Mr. Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Short.

MEMBER SHORT: Since you've been
Chairman has it been a policy that the ANC itself
has to sign a letter to us stating that they do
not have a problem? And then, instead of
notifying people after, everybody's notified
because the ANC has published their letter? So,
was anything published this time, other than a
letter coming from one person to you, or to, or
from the applicant?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short, one of the questions I'd asked, I remember the question that I asked before was whether or not it was a letter that came from the ANC, or it was a letter that came from the single member

district? That was the question that I asked.
And so, I went to look at the application. And
the application that was submitted, it was a
letter from Mr. Orlanski, ANC 1D-02. So, I'm
saying in the sense that the owner reached out to
the ANC. And the ANC responded. So, I'm not, so
I can't tell the owner whether or not it's,
whether or not the ANC is just a single member
district or the entire ANC. I'm just saying what
he provided to us with that. He reached out to
the ANC, and the ANC responded and said, well,
that's why the neighbors are concerned. I mean,
this event is scheduled for the 28th. The Board,
let me see. The Board doesn't meet again until,
and the Board does not meet again until the 29th.
So, whatever decision that we make, we'd have to
make a decision today. Because the Board does
not meet again until the 29th. Any other
questions by any other Board Members want to ask?
MEMBER GRANDIS: Yes, Mr. Chairman.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr.
Grandis.
MEMBER GRANDIS: Mr. Fisher, thank you
for your presentation and attendance today. And

I would like to state that I separate the

substantial change application and the results on that from the filing of a different application for a one time change for this event. So, I do not confuse the two. This is to me a separate It has nothing to do with that matter. matter. Now, what could be, what would be helpful, based on what you're hearing from the Chair and a Commissioner is that if there is a memo or letter that is on the ANC Chairperson's letterhead, that stated that the ANC supports this, and that was put into the record, I think that would resolve whether or not Dan was speaking for himself, or speaking for the ANC with the ANC knowledge and approval. So, are you able to provide the Agency and to this Board for this record? Because you have had that conversation with, the ANC will provide a letter based on the ANC's position, as opposed to Dan's position?

MR. FISHER: I'd be more than happy to reach out to Dan and ask for that.

MEMBER GRANDIS: But Dan's not the
Chair, is he? Am I confused? Who is the Chair?

MR. FISHER: All I know that
everything that we have dealt with, with the ANC

has been through Dan.

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MEMBER GRANDIS: Through Dan, the single member. Okay. I understand that. So, if you reach, what is your confidence on how quickly you could obtain? Because you've stated that the ANC supports this, correct?

MR. FISHER: From my, from the email that Dan sent to me, sent to us, yes.

MEMBER GRANDIS: But there is a, but rightfully, based on our regulations, what we have to follow, we cannot just go on one single member district's position.

And I hope you understand that we're not trying to be difficult on that point. We're trying to, you know, cross our Ts and dot our Is. So that whatever decision we make is done properly.

I will say that I don't understand what the reluctance is on anyone on this Board of agreeing to this. Because one, it's over at 9 o'clock. Two, I just heard you state that your venue actually closes by 10:00.

So, I don't understand why we cannot just go ahead and approve this request, predicated upon your agreement to get us a letter from the ANC before our decision can be effected.

Because we don't meet next week because of a holiday. And as the Chair correctly has stated, by the time we get to our next meeting it's the day after.

MR. FISHER: Right.

MEMBER GRANDIS: So, I think, I can't speak for the Board. But I believe that if you were able to help us dot our Is and cross our Ts that we will not view this as part of the Substantial Change Application, we will look at it wholly based on the one day, with the knowledge that there is an ANC letter that supports it. Is that helpful to you?

MR. FISHER: Yes. And if I could reach out to Dan and ask for that ANC letter, I'd be happy to do so.

MEMBER GRANDIS: Now, I'm only speaking for myself. So, that's not --

MR. FISHER: Yes.

MEMBER GRANDIS: -- a request from this Board. I'm not making the request. I just wanted to have you explain to us if you believe that you could do that if the Board decided. But I'm not saying that's our decision. And I, like I said, I think we all want this event to be

safe.

So, you've heard concerns about the street. And I'm sure that now that you've heard concerns about the street you will take care of that. And also, that people should know that when you all end this event they should disburse from the street.

MR. FISHER: Yes.

MEMBER GRANDIS: Other than that I look forward to seeing if we can work out this situation to be a positive result. So, thank you for your time. Mr. Chairman, thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr. Grandis. I just want the record to reflect, the reason we're having this hearing today is because a Substantial Change Application was filed last year regarding -- the Board issued a decision.

And that's when I started, I started this out.

On April 27th, 2022 the Board issued, we had a protest hearing. They had applied for Substantial Change to get an entertainment endorsement. Okay.

We had a protest hearing. The Board issued a decision on April 27th, 2022 denying a request. And the Board basically stated that no

amplified sound or music shall be heard outside of the premises except for the normal use of the establishment doors for egress and ingress.

And the request for live outdoor entertainment is denied. And no live entertainment shall be permitted in the sidewalk caf,. That was the decision the Board issued in April of 2022.

We're now in June of 2022. This licensee is requesting a one day Substantial Change for an event on June 28th, 2022. One of the, the particular, in reviewing our decision this establishment had an event on June 29th, 2021 that was, that the neighbors thought was so egregious.

Because remember, what I stated was that, at least what I attribute to Mr. Cannon, Mr. Cannon said, normally they're fine. Normally we don't have a problem with them. However, on June 29th, 2021 they had an event that so disturbed us.

And because this event so disturbed us that is why we're here today protesting for them not to ever do this again. And so, that was what we (audio interference) between April, when we

issued our decision in April of 2022 for us to allow them in June of 2022 to have this event.

I hear what you said, Mr. Grandis. I think it's an impossibility for him to provide us with a letter of support from the ANC. Because remember, I don't know if an ANC meeting will be held now and the 28th.

Because it has to be a public notice. So, the ANC just can't issue a letter. It has to be a public hearing, where they say we vote publicly and we approve this. So, I'm not sure if he's able to do that.

And, Mr., I'm sorry, Mr. Fisher has done the right thing. He reached out to, Mr. Orlanski is not the ANC Chair. He's the Vice Chair.

So, what Mr. Fisher has done, Mr. Fisher, he reached out to his single member district person to say, you know what, I'm having this event. Does the ANC have an issue with it?

And part of the process should have occurred is that once he reached out to his single member district commissioner, then that person would take it to the whole ANC. And that, and then we would have gotten a letter.

So, I'm not going to blame you, Mr.

Fisher. You did what you're supposed to do. The only, if I were to put any fault with you is that I would have, you should have come to us today to say that I have reached out to all the protestants, the people who actually, because they protested somewhat differently from the ANC.

Now, I think that, and I don't know what decision I'm going to make. But what would have been helpful is if you stated today, I reached out to all the protestants and informed that we were going to have this event, and this is what they say.

So, like, and so, that would have been -- so yes, you reached out to one side. And I'm going to say you reached out to the ANC, and the ANC said that they were okay. But there are also separate people who protested.

And so, if you had also come to me and said, I've reached out to the protestants, and I've assured them what we're going to have, then this would make it an easier decision for me to make. That's all I'm saying. I'm not made my decision yet.

But it will be easier, because then I

would have, then you would have stated to me I've reached out to the people who had some significant concerns with our event last year.

And I explained them to, I explained to them. I told them the changes I'm going to put this year.

And they have said to me, that's, based on the fact that you have, what you're presenting this year, I'm going to get out of my house to ensure that you have a good time.

So, I'm going to leave to make sure that no one's that disturbed and noisy. I will come back to my house at 10:00. Because I, that's all I was saying, okay. So that's where we are today.

So, I'm trying to see if, what we can do to hold. I'm not sure. Any other questions by any other Board Members? I'm trying to see if, are you able to make contact with the --

I'm going to say that you've done your part in contacting the ANC. Are you able to, and the people who protested your license last time, do you have their contact information?

MR. FISHER: Yes. And I just want to also state that on Dan's approval of this event that we have to reach out to them as well once it

is approved. And we promise that we will do that. And we have all of their information as well.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I, but I know that. I know that's what the ANC stated. But are you able to contact? Which would be easier? Are you able to contact the named protestants in your Substantial, in your claim last year? Are you able to contact those people, and to get feedback from them regarding this event?

MR. FISHER: Yes. We have all ten of their email addresses.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And when is it that you believe that you could give us -- I think this is much easier to do than the ANC.

Because I believe the ANC would have to have a public meeting.

And I don't know when, whether or not the ANC will have a meeting prior to the event.

So, I don't know if the ANC's meeting has occurred already. I don't know.

So, I'm not going to state to you that, get a letter from the ANC. Because the ANC just cannot give you a letter. They have to have a public meeting and have a public vote. So, I'm

not sure if that is.

But I believe though that it would be much easier for you to contact the protestants to get some feedback from the protestants to see what views they have on this event.

This, and I would be willing to hold the record open and, to see, I know that the Board will be on, will be off next week. But I would be willing to, and I don't know what the Board Members, how Board Members will vote.

But I would be willing to keep the record open to get the feedback from the protestants, to see whether or not, where they are. And that would, yes.

Because it's such, we issued our decision in April. And you're asking us to approve an event for June that the community had a problem with in June of 2021.

And you have not, at least partly you have not provided us, at least in my view though. And I'm not saying that I'm a no. But I'm not fully convinced today that the situation has changed where the community would say that we're okay with it.

That's just, that's a concern that I

have. Because I'm afraid, right now what I, where I am, and I'm just speaking alone, I'm speaking for myself. The community's going to say to the Board, they had an event last year. I came down to ABRA. I complained about it. And here it is again, they have -- and at least for your own benefit, sir, when you go for your renewal of your liquor license, and that's even giving the people more reason to protest your liquor license. Because it's like, they continue to do stuff.

Let me see. Hold on. They, you continue to have parties. And I thought that -- Was it you, so, any other, all right, any other questions by any other Board Members?

So, what, I mean, what I would say, if there's, I'll be willing to, I would be willing to have, to open, to keep the record open for a couple of days maybe. So, until Friday, to see if you can provide us any -- all right. This is what I will do, sir. And this is going to be -- we're having an emergency, the Board is having an emergency meeting tomorrow at 2:30 p.m. Okay. We're having an emergency meeting tomorrow at 2:30 p.m.

I will give you until 2:30 p.m. 1 2 tomorrow afternoon to provide us with some 3 feedback from the protestants. And then we can have a public vote tomorrow afternoon. 4 Because 5 we're going to have, we have a meeting tomorrow that's not on our schedule. And so, but, so we're 6 7 going to have a public meeting. So, I will leave 8 the record open until 2:00 tomorrow afternoon, 9 sir, for you to provide ABRA Legal with some 10 feedback that you have contacted the protestants, 11 and get their feedback. I'm not saying that if 12 all of them say no that we're going to -- But I 13 want to get some, I want to, the ANC has told you 14 you need to contact the protestants. I need you 15 to contact the protestants. And I will leave 16 this record open until 2:00 p.m. June 16th. 17 once we receive the feedback from the protestants from this license we'll make a decision. We'll 18 19 vote on this at our emergency meeting tomorrow. I 20 believe that's being fair to you. And that will 21 be consistent with what the ANC had informed you. 22 Okay?

MR. FISHER: That sounds good to me.

Do you know the, is it just the regular D.C.

Legal, or ABRA Legal email address I should send

Okay. Because I don't want --20 MR. FISHER: Sure. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I don't -- yes, 22 Mr. Short. Yes, sir. 23 MEMBER SHORT: Would that 24 communications from the protestants be in

writing? Or we just take someone's word for it?

Would that, would the protestants give something in writing to support they changed their minds since May?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I would, yes.

I would, I, yes. If the, I'll ask that he

provide them. I know it's a short timeline. But

your event is the, we're not having a meeting.

So, you can just ask the, when you contact them you can do it by email. You can call them, email them, and just have them send to us copy of their email to you, so the Board will have -- because I don't want this Board to, but for the community to come back to us to say, last year I told you that they were, that they had this event that so disturbed us that we protested it. And then you turn around and approve an event for the second year in a row, doing the same thing. Okay, sir.

So, what is ABRA's, let me -- all right. Okay. Rayna is from, and she's not in here. She's not Legal. She's at, she's part of the Licensing Division. So, I will, let me -- It's, is the email address abra.legal?

Let me see. Let me make sure that I get the email address for, let me get the email

address for Legal for you, sir. Of course I 1 2 should know. If I'm going to give out a public 3 4 address I want to make sure I have the right 5 email address that I'm giving here. So, let me, 6 just let me get the, so abra.legal@dc.gov. 7 all right. So, all right so you have basically 24 8 9 It's, I'm sorry, you have 24 hours to do hours. Because we're -- So fortunately we have an 10 that. 11 emergency meeting tomorrow. It's not on our 12 calendar. 13 That's why it's, so we're having an 14 emergency meeting at 2:30 p.m. tomorrow. So, you 15 have 24 hours to provide this information to 16 abra.legal@dc.gov. And the Board will use that 17 information to guide whatever decision that we 18 make moving forward today. Okay, sir. 19 MR. FISHER: Sounds good. Thank you. 20 I will reach out to them now. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you very 22 much. Have a great day. 23 MR. FISHER: Thank you. 24 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter 25 went off the record at 2:32 p.m.)
