CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So let's now do our legal agenda. And our legal agenda for June 16, it's the review of an offer and compromise in lieu of the hearing dated June 16, 2022, for Case Number 22-251-00017 Empire Lounge, License Number 110702. And the offer in compromise is as follows.

All right. The District of Columbia jointly with the licensee responded -- submits this offer in compromise to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board as authorized by 23 DCMR Section 1611.5 for approval by the Board.

The parties understand that if the Board approves the offer in compromise, appeal and judicial review are waived under 23 DCMR Section 1611.6, and the case will conclude. If the board does not approve the OIC, the matter shall proceed to a show cause hearing.

The above captioned matter involves the summer suspension of the respondent's liquor license based on an investigation that an imminent danger to the health and safety of the public exists. Therefore this OIC will not be

classified as a primary tier or secondary violation. The respondent has been advised that there is no obligation to accept the OIC.

Respondent has been advised for notice of the service of -- the notice of status hearing and show cause hearing. The show cause hearing respondent may be represented by legal counsel, have subpoenas issued to require the production of witnesses and evidence, produce witnesses and evidence, cross-examine witnesses and apply to the court for a qualified interpreter.

The OIC terms are as follows. Number one, security plan. Prior to the Board lifting the suspension, the respondent shall submit a security plan to ABRA. The security plan shall be reviewed and accepted by the Board operate the security plan should be reviewed and accepted by the board prior to the lifting the suspension of the applicant's -- of the establishment's alcoholic beverage license.

The security plan shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations, Title 25 of D.C. Code, including D.C. Code Section 2511325-402 and 25-43, and incorporate the matter set forth below.

Number two, security personnel. On any night that the establishment is open, respondent shall maintain at a minimum two onduty security personnel from 10:00 p.m. until closing.

The security plan shall detail the minimum number of security personnel that will be on duty each day and their specific duty hours. The security plan should detail the placement of security personnel within the establishment and shall include an explanation of the rational regarding that placement.

Number three, weapons abatement screenings. Respondent must not allow patrons to bring weapons into the establishment at any time. Security personnel will screen patrons through the use of physical searches, also known as pat downs, and a magnetometer, one, or a similar device designed to detect weapons.

All security personnel must be trained and be able to perform these weapons abatement screenings when respondent is required to leave security personnel on-site as outlined in paragraph 2. They must check all patrons who enter the establishment and must not allow any

patron to reenter the establishment without conducting additional weapons screenings.

Number four, confiscation of weapons.

Respondent shall document in the incident log the type and number of weapons and the date on which any weapons are recovered from patrons.

Respondent shall surrender confiscated weapons to the Metropolitan Police department, MPD.

Respondent shall document the date and time of the consultation with MPD and shall include the officer's name and badge number.

Number five, recording incidents.

Respondent shall maintain a log to record incidents of violence or injury at the establishment. The log shall include, where possible, the names and contact information of victims, witnesses, and assailants involved.

The incident log shall be maintained on a standard form, include names of staff involved, and signed by the establishment supervising authority.

Incidents shall be recorded, where possible, within 24 hours. The incident log shall not be discarded for at least five years from the date of the occurrence, and shall be

made available to MPD or ABRA investigators upon 1 2 request. 3 Number 6, security plan training. All 4 security personnel shall be trained on the terms 5 of the security plan to include weapons abatement, screening of patrons, and the use of 6 7 the magnetometer, one. That is a term of the 8 offer in compromise. I therefore make a motion 9 that ABC Board accepts this offer in compromise. Is there a second? 10 11 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I second. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has seconded the motion. I'll now have a roll call 13 14 vote on the motion. Mr. Short? 15 Mr. Short, I agree. MEMBER SHORT: 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen? 17 MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen, I agree. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis? 19 MEMBER GRANDIS: Edward Grandis, I 20 agree. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson, 22 The matter passes for 0, 0. 23 wanted to let the public know for this matter, 24 the establishment remains closed however the provisions of the OIC has to be complied with

prior to the board lifting its order to close the 1 2 facility. 3 All right, we now move to our licensing agenda. The first matter on our 4 5 licensing agenda is a review documentation 6 required for issuance of licenses. This is for 7 Metro Bar, license number 117857. I make a motion that refers this motion back to licensing. 8 9 Is there a second? 10 MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen, I second. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen 12 seconds the motion. We'll now have a roll call 13 vote on the motion. Mr. Short? 14 MR. SHORT: Mr. Short, I agree. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Cato -- I'm 16 sorry, Ms. Hansen? 17 Jeni Hansen, I agree. MEMBER HANSEN: 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis? 19 MEMBER GRANDIS: Edward Grandis, I 20 agree. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson, 22 The matter passes 4, 0, 0. We're now at the end of our calendar, at the end of our 23 24 legal agenda, and we're not at the end of our 25 licensing agenda, and we are now adjourned for

the day. Thank you very much, have a great day. Thank you. Oh, I ask all board members to return to executive session for further action. Thank you very much, have a great day. (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 3:52 p.m.)
