The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met via WebEx videoconference, Chairperson Donovan W. Anderson presiding.

1 P-R-O-C-E-E-D-I-N-G-S 2 10:51 a.m. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case on our calendar is case number 20-CC-00079, 4 5 Georgetown Wine & Spirits, license number 85209. Ms. Andrews, can you please elevate the rights of 6 7 the parties in this case please? 8 MS. ANDREWS: Sure, stand by. Mr. 9 Kapoor, your rights have been elevated. 10 MR. KAPOOR: Hello, this is --11 (Simultaneous speaking.)

MS. ANDREWS: Mr. Ortiz, your rights have been elevated.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can everyone be on mute until I have instructed you to speak?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON:

MS. ANDREWS:

That's all Mr. Chair.

Thank you Ms.

Andrews. Mr. Kapoor, if you do have a camera, can you please turn your camera on if you have a camera? Yes, I can see Mr. Kapoor Esquire. Is the other Mr. Kapoor, does he, or she have a camera that they want to elevate? Yes, I'm sorry. All right, fine, good morning everyone. Let's start with introductions, I'll start with the government's, please say and spell your name

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for the records. 1 2 MR. ORTIZ: Good morning Mr. 3 Chairperson, and all other board members. Stephen Ortiz on behalf of the District of 4 5 Columbia. That's Stephen, S-T-E-P-H-E-N Ortiz, O-R-T-I-Z. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning 8 Mr. Ortiz. Mr. Kapoor Esquire, can you please 9 state and spell your name for the record please? 10 MR. KAPOOR: Yes. Vron John Kapoor 11 Esquire. It's V-R-O-N J-O-H-N K-A-P-O-O-R for 12 the (Inaudible.) 13 (Simultaneous speaking.) 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is 15 your relation -- I'm sorry sir, go ahead. 16 MR. KAPOOR: Sorry, I'm the attorney 17 for Georgetown Wine & Spirits for this hearing. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning. 19 Who is your client who is here today sir? 20 you tell us, and then they can introduce 21 themselves? 22 MR. KAPOOR: Yes, he is the owner of 23 Georgetown Wine & Spirits. One second, I'll get 24 him on here. Okay, yes, you can state your name

for them.

1 MR. KAPOOR: My name is Jaginder 2 Kapoor, I'm the owner, spelled J-A-G-I-N-D-E-R, 3 and last name K-A-P-O-O-R, Jaginder Kapoor. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning 4 5 Mr. Kapoor, good morning. All right, if (Unintelligible.) 6 there. 7 MR. VALADIER: Excuse me sir, here as 8 well. My computer doesn't carry Webex, so I am 9 Pascal Valadier, the manager. Pascal is P-A-S-C-10 A-L, and the last name Valadier is V-A-L-A-D-I-E-11 R. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, both 13 Mr. Kapoors, it appears that you're in the same 14 location, so I need someone to mute their phone, 15 because we're hearing, because you're in the same 16 location we're going to get a feedback. 17 someone, both of the phone lines cannot be open 18 at the same time, okay? So one person, at all 19 times, one of the microphones needs to be muted, 20 or just use one line, because we're going to get 21 a feedback, okay? 22 MR. KAPOOR: Click on it, there you 23 go, okay don't click again. 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Mr. 25 Ortiz, are there any preliminary matters in this

case?

MR. ORTIZ: There are no preliminary matters at this time. The parties did not have an offer in compromise to present to the board.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank you. This matter then is scheduled for Show Cause Hearing on August 4th, 2021 at 1:30 p.m. August 4th, 2021 at 1:30 p.m. What I'm asking both parties is that seven days before the hearing, both parties are supposed to exchange documents, and witnesses that they will be utilizing at the hearing. The documents should be exchanged between both counsel, and the agency should also be provided a copy of the document.

So, seven days before the hearing, I expect all documents, and witnesses that will be relied upon at the hearing to be disclosed, so when we have the hearing we will have documents, if we're going to go to hearing, we'll have the documents, and we'll know who the witnesses are that are going to testify at the hearing, is that clear to everyone?

MR. KAPOOR: Yes. Mr. Anderson, if I can ask Mr. Ortiz if we can get an offer in compromise right now?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 1 If you guys 2 want to go off record, and discuss, and come 3 back, you can do that. If you want, I can recall 4 this case if you want me to, and then you guys 5 can go off, have a conversation, and I will move I know Mr. Ortiz you are the attorney for 6 7 the day. Let me ask you a question Mr. Ortiz, 8 are you doing Universal Liquors? 9 MR. ORTIZ: Yes, I'm going to be. 10 Well, I'm the status attorney, so I have the 11 Universal Liquors, and then we also have another 12 case, I think it's Angolo Ristorante. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, we have 14 a short break, do you want me to go off record 15 for 10 minutes for you guys to discuss, and come 16 back, do you want me to do that? 17 MR. KAPOOR: I could do that, if Mr. 18 Ortiz is willing to do that as well. 19 MR. ORTIZ: We could do that Mr. 20 Chairperson, or if you wanted to continue the two 21 other cases, and then recall this matter after a 22 15 minute break, whatever you think would be 23 best.

Okay, this is what I will do.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, let

me see.

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move on with the calendar, and Mr. Kapoor, Mr.

Ortiz will contact you, and what I'm going to do
is that once I finish the calendar, I'm going to
do some other agenda items, and you can, through
the chat, contact Ms. Andrews, and let her know
that you have an agreement, and then I will
recall the case, okay? Does that work?

MR. KAPOOR: Yes Mr. Anderson, thank
you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, so let me move on with the calendar. I have, I think I have either one or two more cases I believe I have with Mr. Ortiz, and you two, do you have contact information for both sides? Do you both have your contact information?

MR. ORTIZ: Yes, I have Mr. Kapoor's email address, and I believe Mr. Kapoor has my phone number (Inaudible.)

(Simultaneous speaking.)

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, fine, so then you can (Inaudible.) and then let us know that you, if there's an agreement, then I'll recall the case, and we will make the decision, all right? Thank you Mr. Kapoor for your willingness to discuss an offer in compromise,

1 okay?

MR. KAPOOR: Yes. Mr. Ortiz, when, or how can I contact you? Should I contact you, or you will contact me when you're done with these cases?

MR. ORTIZ: I will send you an email as soon as the hearings are completed.

MR. KAPOOR: Thank you Mr. Ortiz.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: all right, thank you. All right, the next case in our calendar is case number -- so Mr. Kapoor, you can sign off, but keep the logon information, and once you and Mr. Ortiz have spoken, then you can let our IT person know that you're ready to come back, and then she'll elevate your rights again, okay?

MR. KAPOOR: Okay, thank you. Who is the IT person?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Andrews, through the chat, you'll see through -- I'm sorry, go ahead Ms. Andrews.

MS. ANDREWS: Mr. Kapoor, you can stay signed in, I'm going to just change your rights to an attendee so that you can make a phone call, or send an email if you want to. But once you

sign in again, and your case is recalled, I'll 1 2 see your name, and let you know when your rights 3 have been elevated, okay? MR. KAPOOR: Okay, thank you. 4 You're welcome. 5 MS. ANDREWS: (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter 6 7 went off the record at 11:01 a.m. and resumed at 8 1:36 p.m.) 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: At this 10 juncture I will be recalling a case from our 11 morning calendar. The case I'm recalling is Case 12 Number 20-CC-00079, Georgetown Wine and Spirits 13 License Number 85209. Ms. Andrews, can you please 14 elevate the rights of the parties in this case 15 please? 16 MS. ANDREWS: Sure, stand by. Mr. 17 Ortiz has been elevated. Mr. Kapoor's rights have been elevated. That's all Mr. Chair. 18 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. All 20 right, good afternoon everyone, I'm recalling 21 this case, Case Number 20-CC-00079. Can I have 22 the parties again introduce themselves for the 23 record starting with the government please? 24 MR. ORTIZ: Good afternoon Mr. 25 Chairperson, Stephen Ortiz on behalf of the

District of Columbia, that's S-T-E-P-H-E-N O-R-T-1 2 I-Z. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you Mr. 4 And Mr. Kapoor, can you please identify Ortiz. 5 yourself for the record again please sir? volume is off sir, I can't hear you. 6 7 MR. KAPOOR: Can you hear me now? 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes I can. 9 MR. KAPOOR: Sorry about that. 10 this is Vron John Kapoor, the attorney for 11 Georgetown Wine and Spirits for this hearing. 12 That's V-R-O-N J-O-H-N K-A-P-O-O-R. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you sir. 14 All right, Mr. Ortiz, are there any preliminary 15 matters in this case? 16 MR. ORTIZ: Yes, the parties would 17 like to present an offer in compromise for the board's consideration. 18 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes sir, what 20 is that? 21 All right, as to charge MR. ORTIZ: 22 one, sale to a minor, the offer in compromise 23 will be that the establishment shall pay 2000 24 dollars within 60 days, or its license shall be

suspended indefinitely until this fine is paid.

And the license shall be suspended for five days, with all five days stayed for one year pending completion of alcohol awareness training for all employees who serve or sell alcoholic beverages within 90 days from the date of the board's order.

As for charge two, failed to take reasonable steps necessary to ascertain legal drinking age, that charge is dismissed. As for charge three, no ABC manager, the term of the OIC will be that the establishment shall receive a written warning.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you Mr. Ortiz. Mr. Kapoor, it's my understanding that there's an offer in compromise, and the offer in compromise is that for charge one there is a fine of 2000 dollars payable within 60 days, if the fine is not payable in 60 days, the license will be suspended until the fine has been paid. Along with the 2000 dollar fine, the license will be suspended for five days, and all five days will be stayed for one year.

That all employees who sell, or serve alcohol will undergo training within the next 90 days, that charge two will be dismissed. And for

charge three a written warning will be issued 1 2 sir, is this your client's understanding of the 3 offer in compromise? MR. KAPOOR: Yes Mr. Chairperson. 4 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is your client aware that by accepting an offer in compromise 6 7 that they're giving up their right to a hearing? 8 MR. KAPOOR: Yes Mr. Chairperson. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is your client 10 also aware that by accepting an offer in 11 compromise that they're giving up their right to 12 appeal this matter? 13 MR. KAPOOR: Yes Mr. Chairperson. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, 15 Are there any questions by any board thank you. 16 members? 17 MR. KAPOOR: The statement expressed 18 we don't have to close the store. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, 20 hearing none, I make a motion that the offer in 21 compromise be accepted for charge one, a fine of 22 2000 dollars paid within 60 days, if the fine is 23 not paid within 60 days, the license will be 24 suspended until the fine has been paid. That the 25 establishment will be suspended for five days,

1	all five days will be stayed for one year. That
2	all employees who sell, or serve alcohol will
3	undergo training within the next 90 days from the
4	date of the acceptance of the OIC.
5	That charge two will be dismissed, and
6	a written warning will be issued for charge
7	three. Is there a second?
8	MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I second.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has
10	seconded the motion, I will now have a roll call
11	vote on the motion that's been properly seconded
12	by Mr. Short. Mr. Short?
13	MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I agree.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato?
15	MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato, I agree.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Crockett?
17	MEMBER CROCKETT: Rafi Crockett, I
18	agree.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen?
20	MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen, I agree.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis?
22	MEMBER GRANDIS: Edward Grandis, I
23	agree.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And Mr.
25	Anderson, I agree, the matter passes six zero,

zero. So, the offer in compromise has been accepted, I want to thank the parties for working this matter out to the benefit of the residents of the District of Columbia. Mr.

Kapoor, I just want to state to you that the board takes sale to a minor very seriously, and I see that your client actually checked the ID.

I'm not sure which is worse, checking the ID, or not checking the ID sir.

I'm hoping that when the employees go through training, they will realize that if you're not 21 years old, that your ID is different, it's a different shape, and it clearly says on the ID that the person is not 21. And when the agency does its compliance check, the people actually look their age. They don't look, if it says that this is a 16 year old person who came to the establishment, this person looked 16, and your client needs to do a better job of checking IDs, and not just ask for the ID, and not looking at the age.

Even if you don't know how to subtract, or divide, it clearly states on the ID that a person is not 21, and it's a different shape ID. So, I hope that sir, as five days

1 suspended, and I will let you know that prior to 2 the year, the agency more likely again will do a 3 compliance check with your establishment. within the year, if you get caught again, you 4 will be suspended for five days. 5 So, I hope that all the employees, 6 7 when they really check the ID, that it's not a perfunctory check, that you really look at it, 8 9 and look at the ID based on how it's shaped, that it clearly identifies that this person is not 21 10 11 sir. All right? But anyway, I want to thank the 12 parties for working this matter out, have a great 13 day, thank you. 14 MR. ORTIZ: Thank you Mr. Chairperson, 15 and all board members for accommodating us with 16 your afternoon schedule, much appreciated. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I appreciate 18 the parties working this out, have a great day, 19 thank you very much. 20 MR. ORTIZ: You're welcome. 21 (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter 22 went off the record at 1:44 p.m.) 23 24 25
