Ms. Fashbaugh, can you please elevate the rights of the licensee and the 6 7 protestant in this case, please. 8 MS. FASHBAUGH: Please standby. 9 Stephen O'Brien, your rights have been elevated. 10 Rina Paz, your rights have been elevated. 11 Christine Evans, your rights have been elevated. 12 Donna Barbisch, your rights have been elevated. 13 Cheryl Bernard, your rights have been elevated. 14 That is all, Mr. Chair. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Ms. 16 Fashbaugh. 17 MS. BERNARD: May I ask a question? 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who is 19 speaking, please? 20 MS. BERNARD: This is Cheryl Bernard, 21 and I'm actually here with a group because we 22 wanted to be sure that we would successfully have 23 connectivity, so I'm here with four others from 24 my group.

4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
5	Ms. Barbisch. Is there anyone else with you from
6	the ANC this morning?
7	MS. BARBISCH: No, sir, that's just

9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, who is the

12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Please spell	
13	your name, Ms. Walker.

16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: One of the	
17	reasons why I ask everyone to spell their name is	
18	that we have a court reporter, just to make sure	
19	that the record accurately reflects who you are.	
20	Who else do we have, please?	
21	MS. COUTURIER: Hi, my name is Chantal	
22	Couturier, and I'm an owner at Watergate West,	
23	and I'm part of the group.	
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: How do you	
25	spell your name, please, ma'am?	

1	MS. COUTURIER: Last name is C-O-U-T-
2	U-R-I-E-R.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And your first
4	name, please, ma'am.
5	MS. COUTURIER: C-H-A-N-T-A-L.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,
7	ma'am.
8	MS. COUTURIER: Good morning.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is there anyone
10	else?
11	MS. EVANS: Yes.
12	MS. BERNARD: There are others, but
13	they are on their own. They are on their own
14	laptop.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Go
16	ahead, please.
17	MS. EVANS: Christine Evans, C-H-R-I-
18	S-T-I-N-E, last name Evans, E-V-A-N-S. I'm also
19	part of the group and a resident in the Watergate
20	West building.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.
22	MS. EVANS: Thank you. Good morning.
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who else do we
24	have, anyone else?
25	MS. PAZ: Rina Paz, that's R-I-N-A P

I"m a resident and owner at 1 as in Peter, A-Z. 2 Watergate West. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, 4 Is that everyone? Ms. Paz. 5 It might be technically MS. BERNARD: everyone because I think a few of us weren't able 6 7 to log on from their devices, but I think we're 8 okay since we have a sufficient number. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, not 10 everyone had to be here this morning because you 11 were granted stand in at the roll call. 12 long as you were here, Ms. Bernard, then we're 13 fine. If this matter goes to a hearing and if 14 all the other parties want to testify, then they 15 can show up at that time, but since you're 16 granted stand in at the roll call hearing, all that was required this morning was for you to be 17 18 present. All right. Thank you. 19 Mr. O'Brien, are there any preliminary 20 matters in this case, please? 21 MR. O'BRIEN: Not from the applicant's 22 side. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Barbisch, 24 are there preliminary matters from your side, 25 please?

MS. BARBISCH: No, sir. Thank you very much.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. And Ms. Bernard, are there preliminary matters on your side, please?

MS. BERNARD: No.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. This matter is scheduled for a protest hearing on July 27, 2022 at 1:30 p.m. So, this matter is scheduled for a protest hearing on July 27, 2022 at 1:30 p.m. And I just want to point out to you, Ms. Bernard, just as a matter of law, if settlement agreement is reached between the applicant and the ANC, whether or not you are a part of the settlement agreement or not your protest will fall. I just want to let you know that just as a matter of law. So, if the applicant was able to reach a settlement with the ANC and if you're not a part of that settlement agreement your protest will fall, and the Board does not have the legal ability to make you part of an agreement. It's just an FYI. I raise this because sometimes we've had cases where there are settlement agreements reached between the ANC and the licensee or the applicant and the protestants

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are coming to the Board to ask Board either that they want to move forward with the hearing or they're asking the Board to force the parties to make them a part of the settlement agreement, but I just want to say that to you that as an FYI.

Mr. O'Brien is a learned counsel, so I know that whatever discussions that will occur that he'll make you a part of whatever discussion that occur and if the matter is going to be scheduled, but I just want to point that out to you. Okay, ma'am?

MS. BERNARD: We're confident that the ANC will not throw us under the bus, so we feel represented.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, I'm not saying the ANC will throw you under the bus. I'm just pointing out what the law states just to make sure that you are aware as an FYI. And I'm not asking the ANC to throw you under the bus, I am just pointing out to you because I know there are a lot of protestants on your side. Okay? That's all.

Are the parties familiar with the protest proceeding instructions or do I need to read the instructions?

MS. BERNARD: We're familiar.

MS. BARBISCH: We're familiar.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board supports settlement agreement, so I do hope if the parties are able to settle this matter that we support that because at the end of the day, this is an application to renew the license that if the parties are able to reach agreement then the building occupants will be happy, the licensee will be happy. If this matter goes to a protest hearing, one side might be happy, and the other side might not be happy. The Board prefers that everyone live happily ever after moving forward. So, we do support settlement agreements if this matter can be settled. But if the matter cannot be settled, we will see you on July 27, 2022 at 1:30 p.m. for this protest hearing. Good luck with your discussions, and if the matter cannot be settled we'll see you at the protest hearing. Have a great day. Thank you very much. (Whereupon the above-entitled matter
