CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.

As Chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board for the District of Columbia and in accordance with D.C. This meeting is being conducted pursuant to guidance made available by the District of Columbia's Office of Open Government regarding electronic meetings held by public bodies. Electronic meetings by the ABC Board are authorized pursuant to Section 25778 of the D.C. Code.

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My name is Donovan Anderson and I'm Chairperson of the Board. I would like to introduce the other members of the ABCA Board who are also participating electronically. Please respond when I announce your name. Mr. James Short.

MEMBER SHORT: Mr. James Short, present.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Bobby Cato.

MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato, present.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Jeni Hansen.

MEMBER HANSEN: Jeni Hansen, present.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Edward

Grandis.

MEMBER GRANDIS: Edward Grandis,

17 present.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board has five members in attendance for conduct of business today and that constitutes a quorum.

Before we get underway with today's hearing calendar, I need to make the instructions very clear so that the conduct of these hearings is understood by everyone. There are eight cases on this morning's calendar.

Once the case is called, I will take a moment for IT specialist to elevate the rights of each party to enable their camera and microphone. Then and only then when you have the ability to enable your equipment. If your case has not been heard, you will remain mute and your camera will be disabled. At the conclusion of each case, the parties will have the option to leave. If the party chooses to stay, all cameras and microphones for the conclusion of their case will be disabled. Should you have any questions or require technical assistance during the hearing, please submit them using the question and answer feature.

Our first order of business today, so let's move to our protest status hearing calendar. The first case is Case No. 23-PRO-00049, Krave Restaurant and Lounge, License No. 124428. Good morning, Mr. Orellana. Can you please elevate the rights of the parties in this case?

MR. ORELLANA: Good morning. Joseph Caruso, your access has been elevated. Meg Roggensack, your access has been elevated. And that appears to be all, Chairman.

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CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You don't see
the owner?

MR. ORELLANA: I do not see Zachary

MR. ORELLANA: I do not see Zachary Coles. I have reached out in the chat. I'll reach out again.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

MR. ORELLANA: I am not seeing any

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CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So I'm going to recall Case No. 23-PRO-00049, Krave Restaurant and Lounge, License No. 124428.

Now Mr. Orellana, can you please elevate the rights of the parties in this case please?

MR. ORELLANA: Sure. Joseph Caruso, your access has been elevated. Meg Roggensack, your access has been elevated. Lloyd Bramble, your access has been elevated. Jeff Carneal, your access has been elevated. And that appears to be all, Chairman.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who's the owner?

MR. BRAMBLE: I do, Lloyd Bramble.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. I'm sorry, can everyone please turn the camera on if they have one? Do you have a camera, Mr. Bramble, Ms. Roggensack? Thank you, sir. Ms. Roggensack, do you have a camera you can turn on, ma'am? I'm not hearing from her. Okay. All right, fine. Good morning.

All right. Good morning, everyone.

9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what is your			
10	participation as far as this discussion is

12	MR. BRAMBLE: I'm a co-owner.			
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, thank you.			
14	Ms. Roggensack, can you please spell and state			
15	your name for the record please and your			
16	affiliation?			
17	MS. ROGGENSACK: Yes, thank you. Can			
18	you hear me?			
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am. I			
20	can hear you.			
21	MS. ROGGENSACK: And can you see me?			
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am. I			
23	can also see you.

ROGGENSACK: Good morning. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Carneal, can 8 you spell and identify yourself for the record 9 please? MR. CARNEAL: Sure. Jeff Carneal, J-E-10 11 F-F, last name C-A-R-N-E-A-L. I live at 2011 R 12 Street. I'm a neighbor. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, let 14 me see. Mr. Caruso, can you please identify 15 yourself for the record? 16 MR. CARUSO: Yes. It's Joseph Caruso, 17 J-O-S-E-P-H C-A-R-U-S-O representing the Dupont 18 Circle Citizens Association. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now who's 20 protesting this license? Is it DCAA the -- the 21 ANC, is there -- is there a group of five or 2.2 more? Or (audio interference) neighbor? I'm just 23 trying to find (audio interference). I'm sorry? 2.4 How many parties are protesting? Mr. Carneal, are 25 you -- do you belong to a group? I'm sorry. At

1 the roll call hearing, who was given status to 2 protest this license application? 3 MR. CARNEAL: Yes, I'm part of a group of neighbors known as the "Group of Five". 4 5 They're a counter set. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 6 7 Okay, so you belong to a Group of -- all right. So it's DCCA and ANC in the Group of Five (audio 8 9 interference). Okay, fine. (Audio interference). 10 11

All right. Mr. Bramble, are there any preliminary matters in this case? And preliminary matters are (audio interference). I note that you guys had mediation. It didn't appear that the matter was settled at mediation. I'm not trying to get factual in this regard, I'm just trying to see if there are any procedural concerns that you have.

MR. BRAMBLE: We are not, no.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. As far as the ANC is concerned, any procedural type of matters? I mean just generally, where are we?

MS. ROGGENSACK: No, Chair. The only procedural thing that we are awaiting

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1 still pending. 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. What about the DCAA? 3 4 MR. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is this a case 10 11 -- is this a case that potentially could be 12 found? MR. CARNEAL: Well, obviously I think 13 14 all parties would like that, but it seems like 15 we're pretty far apart. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I quess what I'm 17 just trying -- I try not to get into -- in these 18 type of matters, I try not to get into the substance of the matter. But I guess what I was 19 20 trying to find out is that -- is are the parties 21 totally against granting a license or are the 2.2 parties inclined to have a license with 23 conditions, just generally? MS. ROGGENSACK: Sir, the major 2.4 25 sticking point here is the use of promoters and

4	benefitted greatly (audio interference) all of us

11	MS. ROGGENSACK: Sir, that is correct.

14	misunderstandings, the Applicant continued to			
15	operate operate under weekend (audio			
16	interference) and agreed as a condition for a			
17	stipulated license were not observed in the			
18	period of time in which that would have been			
19	relevant.			
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.			
21	(Audio interference)			
22	MR. BRAMBLE: All right. Mr. Anderson,			
23	I'm not			
24	(Simultaneous speaking.)			
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, Mr.			

1 Bramble. Hold on, Mr. Bramble. I'm not -- I'm 2 trying not to get deep into substantive 3 substance. So I'm just trying to ask 4 procedurally, so you can talk, but I'm trying not 5 to get into substance. MR. BRAMBLE: Sorry, this is -- I just 6 7 needed to let you know I have to get off camera 8 for a little bit. I need to head toward a meeting 9 for work. And so I need to get off here. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, that's fine 11 as long as you're -- I've seen you and now we've 12 talking, so you're fine. 13 MR. BRAMBLE: Got you. Okay, thank you. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 15 Thank you for the recommendations that the 16 parties have put together. This matter is 17 scheduled then for a protest hearing on July 18 26th, 2023 at 1:30 p.m. And were the parties 19 stating that there are some concerns with this 20 date? I'm trying to find out from ANC, the 21 protest hearing is -- the protest hearing is 2.2 scheduled July 26th. Is there an issue with that 23 date? Mr. Caruso? 2.4 MS. ROGGENSACK: We can't speak. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry? Mr.

1	Caruso?
2	MR. CARUSO: There's no concern on my
3	part. I think the ANC or the Group of Five's
4	attorney can't make it on that date, but I don't
5	see them anymore. There they are.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Ms.
7	Roggensack, tell me what is going on with that
8	date please.
9	MS. ROGGENSACK: (Audio interference.)
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I can't hear
11	you. I'm sorry.
12	MS. ROGGENSACK: (Audio interference.)
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I cannot hear
14	you, ma'am. Your signal is now poor. I don't know
15	what's going on.
16	MS. ROGGENSACK: It's not (audio
17	interference). There we go. Has my microphone
18	been on mute (audio interference)?
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You're breaking
20	up, so it's your signal is poor. Hello?
21	MS. ROGGENSACK: Hello?
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I cannot hear
23	you, ma'am.
24	MS. ROGGENSACK: My microphone is not
25	working.

1	(Simultaneous speaking.)
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The issue is not
3	it's not that your microphone is not working,
4	ma'am. It's that your signal is poor. So I'm
5	hearing you, but because of your poor you're
6	in a poor location, that's why I'm not hearing
7	you.
8	MS. ROGGENSACK: (Audio interference.)
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry. I
10	cannot hear you, ma'am.
11	MS. ROGGENSACK: (Audio interference.)
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: When we started
13	this hearing, I could hear you perfectly, but
14	something happened as the hearing progressed, so
15	I cannot hear you.
16	MR. CARUSO: Maybe type something in
17	the comments, Meg.
18	MS. ROGGENSACK: (Audio interference.)
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: If you're having
20	a problem, ma'am, with the computer, you can call
21	in. The information is in the chat of how you can
22	call it. It's not a matter of being unmuted,
23	ma'am. It's that you're in a your signal is
24	poor. So that's why I can't hear you.
25	MEMBER GRANDIS: Mr. Chairman, she just

shared a date, I believe. If you look in the chat, I think she offered a date.

Okay. I saw a -- I thought what was -- I thought what was expressed was that there was an issue with the date. All right, but that's fine. It's my understanding that the parties had agreed -- it's my understanding that parties had agreed during mediation to have this protest hearing on July 25th at 1:30 p.m. Okay, that's fine.

Any questions by anyone? So now that we've scheduled this matter for a protest hearing, there are a few things that I would like to instruct parties that a protest hearing is focused and addresses only those issues that are being protested. The Board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to this case. You should have received by electronic or regular mail, a letter explaining the protest process, a copy of the protest information form and a copy of an exhibit form.

If you do not have these documents, please contact our legal office following the hearing. It is imperative that you review the rules closely and adhere to them before and

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during the protest hearing. You're also required to complete and submit the protest information form and the exhibit form seven days before the date of the hearing. These two forms and accompanying documents need to be submitted to ABRA's Legal Division and to all opposing parties in this matter. If we do not receive a copy of your PIP, your application, and your protest, whichever side you're representing may be subject to dismissal.

Likewise, if we do not receive a copy of the exhibit form and the exhibits themselves, your exhibits may be excluded from the record, opening a finding that the opposing party had them purchased or a no good cause for failure to submit has been shown. Likewise, witnesses other than the party may also be subject to exclusion if not identified on the PIP. Accordingly, these forms are very important. They greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process, and keeping the parties on point during the hearing. They likewise provide notices to the opposing parties and enable them to better prepare for the hearing.

As you are all aware, all hearings are

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now conducted virtually. You will have one hour to present your case and you will only be allowed to call five witnesses. If you require more time to present or you require more than five witnesses, please file a motion with the Board requesting additional time or additional witnesses.

there's more than one protest group, pursuant to 1612.8, the Board is requesting that the Protestants designated one individual to represent the groups protesting the application. All right, so we need to designate who will be representing the parts of the protest because there's three groups here. If you need more witnesses than the five, then you need to make a motion to the Board to require -- if you need more time and more witnesses, but you need to do that in writing to the Board prior to the hearing. All right?

We greatly thank you for your cooperation. If you have any questions today or any time before the hearing, please do not hesitate to contact ABRA's Legal Division. I don't know if you guys have any further

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mediations are scheduled or if the parties are able to settle this matter, but if not, we will see you in approximately two weeks for a protest hearing.
