CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning.

We're in the record. Good morning, everyone. As

Chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage and

Cannabis Board for the District of Columbia and

to the regular scheduled meeting of the Alcoholic

Beverage Cannabis Board.

Mr. James 9 Short. 10 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. James Short, 11 present. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Bobby Cato. 13 MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato, present. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Jenny 14 15 Hansen. 16 Jenny Hansen, present. MEMBER HANSEN: 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Edward 18 Grandis. 19 MEMBER GRANDIS: Present. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board has five members in attendance for the conduct of 21 2.2 business today, and that constitutes a quorum. 23 Before we get underway with today's hearing calendar, I need to make a few 2.4 25 instructions very clear so that the conduct of

these hearings is understood by everyone.

There are three cases scheduled for this morning's calendar. Once your case is called, I will take a moment for IT specialists to elevate the rights for each party to enable their camera and microphone. Then, and only then, will you have the ability to enable your equipment. If your case has not been heard, you will remain mute and your camera will be disabled.

At the conclusion of each case, the parties will have the option to leave. If the party chooses to stay, all cameras and microphones for the concluded case will be disabled. Our first order of business today, we have a contested fact-finding hearing on Organic Wellness, License No. 117371.

Good morning, Mr. Orellana. Can you please elevate the rights of the parties in this case for Organic Wellness, please?

ORELLANA: 21 begin. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. 2.2 Good morning, everyone. I will have the parties 23 introduce themselves for the record, and I'll 2.4 start with you, Mr. Bailey. 25 MR. BAILEY: Okay. Mr. Chairman,

members of the Board, my name is Claude Bailey.

I represent Holistic Remedies and Organic

Wellness in this matter.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We're calling the cases separately, Mr. Bailey. So this case is specifically regarding Organic Wellness?

MR. BAILEY: Organic Wellness. Okay.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.

MR. BAILEY: Okay. Well, as it relates to Organic Wellness, I represent Organic Wellness, and here are the principals from Organic Wellness, Mr. Genderson, Mr. Josh Genderson, and Mr. Rick Genderson. And they would like the opportunity to kind of bring the Board up to date on where they are on this particular cultivation center and the license, because obviously there hasn't been any communication.

You all don't know, which is why we're having this hearing about what's going on. So I think Mr. Rick Anderson is going to make a presentation. It'll be via PowerPoint. So we would like permission to use the PowerPoint and share the screen to kind of lay it out for you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, that's

BAILEY: 4 both, and she's going to be the one, she's the 5 technical person who's going to put everything up on the screen for you. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, so 8 what I want everyone to do we have a court 9 reporter. I'm asking everyone, when you 10 introduce yourself, please spell your name for 11 the record. So spell your name, please, Mr. Bailey, for the record. 12 13 MR. BAILEY: Sure. Claude. 14 C-L-A-U-D-E. Last name Bailey. B-A-I-L-E-Y. 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning. 16 And Mr. Josh Genderson, can you identify yourself for the record? 17 18 MR. J. GENDERSON: Josh Genderson. 19 E-N-D-E-R-S-O-N. And I represent both companies. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, this is 20 21 strictly, again, regarding Organic Wellness. 2.2 We're doing it here now. We have a court 23 reporter, so we're going to have a transcript, so 2.4 I need to keep them separate. So you're here for 25 Organic Wellness?

24	MR. GORDY: Good morning. My name is				
25	Sean Gordy, licensing division manager for the				

Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration.

Last name spelled G-O-R-D-Y.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Peru, can

you identify yourself on the record, please?

MR. PERU: Morning, sir. Supervisory

Investigator Jason Peru in the enforcement division. J-A-S-O-N P-E-R-U.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Good morning again, everyone. As I stated, the contested fact-finding hearing because we're trying to ascertain what is going on with this license.

It's my understanding the letter dated January 25, 2023, ABCA's licensing manager indicated that an additional safekeeping period was approved until April 23, 2023 for Organic Wellness. The approval was based on the understanding that construction renovations are expected to be completed by May 1, 2023. A separate request to remove the license from safekeeping would be filed. An additional inspection by MPD and ABCA would be completed, conducted prior to reopening.

The record doesn't -- so we're just trying to find out what has occurred since May

1 1st, 2023, since we have had no information. 2 And so I just want -- are you still 3 there, Mr. Gordy? MR. GORDY: Yes. 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what I'm 5 going to do, normally in a fact-finding hearing 6 7 we do not swear witnesses in, but because this 8 is, under our rules and regulation, is a 9 contested fact-finding hearing, so therefore, I need to swear the witnesses in. 10 11 All right. So, Mr. Gordy, can you 12 raise your hand, please? You swear to tell the 13 truth and nothing but the truth? 14 You need to unmute yourself, sir. 15 MR. GORDY: T do. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 17 Thank you. Mr. Gordy, please identify yourself 18 on the record and your relationship with the 19 agency. 20 My name is Sean MR. GORDY: Sure. 21 I am the licensing manager for the 2.2 Alcoholic Beverage and Regulation. I'm sorry, 23 the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Administration. 2.4 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,

1 Mr. Gordy, as far as Organic Wellness is 2 concerned, what is it that you have within your record regarding the status of this license, sir? 3 MR. GORDY: Our records indicate that 4 5 initially in October of 2022, Organic Wellness reached out to the agency seeking guidance on 6 7 suspending operations at a facility that houses 8 Organic Wellness as well as Holistic Remedies. 9 To our understanding, there was a fire at that location which rendered both operations 10 11 inoperable, until which time they can renovate 12 and or move. Ultimately, a letter was submitted

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: (Audio interference.)

MR. GORDY: Organic Wellness. Right. Ultimately, a letter was submitted to the agency at our guidance to place a license into safekeeping, at which time we submitted it on the Board's agenda to request safekeeping for the licensee, which was ultimately approved.

And referencing the letter that you read from January, that approval was granted, and then ultimately, safekeeping was approved through the spring of 2023. Since then, we had not heard

from the entity as to the progress of its operations, and then also pursuant to removing the license from safekeeping with regard to next steps, and then reopening for business.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, the safekeeping request expired April 23rd, 2023. So, as far as the agency, what is the status of the license?

MR. GORDY: As far as the agency is concerned, the license is still in safekeeping.

We haven't sought any additional movement. We have sought the fact that we had not heard from the licensee, and so we were seeking what the status was of the license in terms of removing it from safekeeping and the progress of moving forward with reopening for operations. And the agency had not heard anything from the entity, after reaching out several times.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: (Audio interference) once you stop speaking, put your phone, mute your line, and then once you're about to speak, unmute yourself because of feedback.

So I guess I'm just trying to get some clarification. Can this license remain in safekeeping without any action? Or I guess it's

my understanding that the safekeeping request expired April 23rd. So what was supposed to have occurred after April 23rd regarding this license? That's what I'm trying to find.

MR. GORDY: Well, typically, what we do, Mr. Chair, is we will reach out to the licensee to seek an extension of safekeeping or cancellation of safekeeping or what have you. Because of the fact we had not heard anything as we reached out, we just stopped shy of moving to administratively cancel the license by virtue of the fact that we had not had a response from the licensee. Ordinarily we would move to place the item back on the Board's agenda as a cancellation item to actually cancel the license.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank you. I was told that Mr. Gordy has some time constraints. Mr. Bailey, do you have any questions that you wish to ask Mr. Gordy?

Because I believe he has some. You're on. Mr. Bailey, you're on mute, sir.

MR. BAILEY: At this point I think we just would like to kind of explain to the Board where we are with the hopes of maybe continuing the safekeeping process after you hear the facts

1 as they've been presented. 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, that's 3 fine. All right. So, Mr. Bailey, tell me, how is it that your client wishes to respond? 4 5 MR. BAILEY: I will let Mr. Genderson address that. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Which one, sir? MR. BAILEY: I will let Mr. Josh 8 9 Genderson address that question. 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, Mr. 11 Josh Genderson, can you provide, and I quess I'm 12 going to swear you into can you raise your right 13 hand, please, sir? You swear or affirm to tell 14 the truth and nothing but the truth? 15 MR. J. GENDERSON: T do. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, go 17 ahead, sir. 18 MR. J. GENDERSON: So I think maybe 19 the first question I'd have or miscommunication 20 that's taking place is we're unaware that anybody 21 reached out. And I do know we have not reached 2.2 out proactively. But Mr. Gordy, I don't know if 23 they reached out to us or if you know who, but that threw me for a little bit of a loop. 2.4

So outside of that, though, I can give

a little bit of a rundown. Per usual. Mr. Gordy got it right. We had a fire in January of 2019, and the fire rendered Holistic Remedies, which I know we're not talking about currently, but Holistic Remedies was on the first floor of the building, and that was rendered unusable.

The top floor we did keep in production for a couple of years until such time that we were able to start spending money redoing the downstairs.

Basically from 2019 in January, when we had the fire all the way through somewhere in 2021, probably around May 21, 2021, we were issued our permit. So we had a dispute about a GAR Green Zone issue with the DCRA that ended up getting sorted out. So it was a two year process to get permitting.

Post-permitting, we've spent somewhere to the tune of over \$3 million out of a total of \$4.1 that that the project is going to cost.

There's about 15% or less remaining in the presentation we have that we've sent out. It has pictures and sort of detailed update.

From the last time Mr. Gordy and Organic spoke, there hasn't been that much

movement reactivating the permitting process, and the contractors had taken a while, and frankly, we could have been probably more proactive, but it's been a difficult program for us to continue to spend money into.

One of the things we've sort of charted out is we, after spending money the first time and then the second time we had thought about bringing a partner in, we attached an LOI to the document we sent in, which would just make getting open quicker easier, and I guess I'll leave it at that.

I mean, the remaining work left, just to be clear, after the full gut job of the whole facility is getting the power up for the heavy-up from Pepco, which ABCA has been more than kind in offering to help with. And then just we need to put in a new elevator that meets the new code, and a couple pieces of interior work which have already been ordered and are on site, have to be installed.

We could get moving fairly quickly.

We haven't, just due to capital constraints and
the worry about where the program stands

currently, but we've been, we're all

1 Washingtonians. My grandfather started a liquor 2 business 75 years ago and we've really tried to 3 be good representatives of the city and provide 4 jobs. I hope that's noted in all of this and 5 6 any lack of communication was certainly an 7 oversight. And if someone did reach out, I 8 apologize. We on this call hadn't seen any 9 correspondence. MR. R. GENDERSON: Can I add to that? 10 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who's speaking, 12 Please identify yourself when you speak. 13 MR. R. GENDERSON: Okay. Rick 14 Genderson. And do you want to swear me in? 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Oh. Raise your 16 right hand, sir, please. Do you swear or affirm to tell the truth and nothing but the truth? 17 18 MR. R. GENDERSON: I do. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, sir. 20 MR. R. GENDERSON: So a lot of this is 21 our fault. We should have been more proactive. 2.2 There was somebody who was handling this within 23 our company and they dropped the ball. And I'm 2.4 sorry for that. 25 We should have been reaching out for

you, but I thought we were still in good stead and I thought she was handling it, but she didn't. So anyway, my apologies for that. I mean, I've dealt with ABCA for years and years because I own Schneider's of Capitol Hill and we try to be a good neighbor. And we've been in good stead for into.

We did run into, we didn't get as much insurance money as we thought we were going to get from this fire. We have subsidized it ourselves till we ran into a little money crunch. And I think we have solved that problem.

So, moving forward, I think we can get this up and running fairly quickly. And I ask that we don't get punished for this, even though a lot of this is our fault. But we've tried and we will get this up and running if you give us the time to do that.

MR. BAILEY: Mr. Chairman, if I could suggest

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, Mr. Bailey, please identify yourself.

MR. BAILEY: Yeah, this is Claude
Bailey. Mr. Chairman, if I could suggest that we
extend the safekeeping and we report back, say in

90 days, to kind of let you know where we are and the progress we've made. Because I think, from what I understand from my client, the remaining work is going to take 12 to 16 weeks. We have to get the permits renewed. So there are a lot of things we have to do, but we do plan to go forward. And I think now that we have and we submitted for the record a letter of intent for a partner who's going to agree to assist with finishing getting the building redone so that the cultivation center can resume its operations.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Generally, when we do safekeeping, safekeeping is done for six months. If the safekeeping was approved through April 23, the current status would be that we would have, if another request for safekeeping came through, then a safekeeping request would have been through October 31 or depending, I guess because we're now in June, in July it would be then March 31, 2024.

But I guess I'm asking for more -- for you to tell us what is it that, if the Board was supposed to -- if the Board -- and I think if we're going to do another safekeeping request, it probably would have to be through March 31,

because we're now in July and it's not apparent that anything is going to happen by October 31. And I believe that licensing, when they're approved in safekeeping request, I believe that it's now done through March 31, 2024.

So I guess what I'm saying, if the Board was to grant a safekeeping request through, and Mr. Gordy, am I correct that if we're granting safekeeping, it would be through March 31, 2024, is that correct?

MR. GORDY: Yes, sir, that's correct.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So if the Board was to grant -- and I'm sorry, is there, at least for the cannabis, the cannabis license, is there any cost for safekeeping? I'm asking you, Mr. Gordy.

MR. GORDY: No, not as yet.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, so the question I'm asking, if the Board was to agree to a safekeeping request pursuant to our six month schedule, and so therefore, we're talking about March 31, 2024, what is it that is going to occur between now, July 20, July 20, 2023, and March 31, 2024, for this license to come online?

Well, I think I'll speak

for my client, he can correct me. I think if we had till March 2024, we're confident that we would have the facility up and running prior to March 2024.

MR. J. GENDERSON: Definitely.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The concern that the agency has, as you are aware, we have a licensing period where all these unlicensed establishments will be able to apply for license in November.

And one of the concerns that we're hearing from the unlicensed facilities is that there is not sufficient inventory, that the capability doesn't exist in DC to produce, to grow the product. So therefore, they are uncomfortable in applying for license unless we can assure them that there is sufficient product to supply their needs.

MR. BAILEY: Well, Mr. Chairman, I think if you were to extend the safekeeping, we would be in a position to finish the facility and provide the product they need, that the unlicensed retailers need. Is that fair to say, Josh?

MR. J. GENDERSON: Yeah. So if I may,

Josh Genderson, that your point's noted. We've talked to Mr. Gordy about this and some of the other members of the Board, because we not only spent north of 6 or \$7 million the first time around and then post-fire, we've already spent almost four.

We have a facility that's, like I said, 85% grow ready. And so I do believe that through either one of these channels, whether we do end up partnering or not with this extension, I don't know that someone could build the capacity quicker. And we welcome everybody to come on site and see where we are, if that's helpful, and confirm everything that we've learned.

MR. BAILEY: There are pictures in our presentation that show you the state of the current state of the facility right now and how far it's built out.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Peru, you wanted to ask a question or make a comment, sir?

MR. PERU: I just had a couple of questions. Because I was at the facility before they officially closed out, closed the doors. I

have a couple of questions about reference .

1 Organic Wellness was on the second floor. 2 a location that I've conducted inspections at. think the last inspection I'm showing was 3 sometime in March of 4 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you raise 6 your right hand, please? 7 MR. PERU: Sure. Do you swear or 8 affirm to tell the truth and nothing but truth? 9 MR. PERU: T do. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead. 10 11 MR. PERU: So the last time I was there was March of 2022 for an inspection. 12 13 then I returned after that date when you guys had 14 taken all the product, removed all the product 15 from the second floor, right? 16 During this whole time, the first 17 floor, I watched it develop from a blank space 18 that was prior to construction. However, the 19 last time I was there, when you guys removed 20 product from the second floor, the first floor 21 was framed out and the layout design was pretty 2.2 much there. 23 You guys had put this big water tank in the back where the elevator shaft was, I 2.4

believe, and all these things were happening, and

it seemed to be it was moving in the right direction. But then you guys came with the idea and the thought that you're going to move the other license. Because at the end of the day, you're building out Holistic Remedies on the first floor. Organic Wellness was up and running on the second floor.

So then you guys decided, if I'm correct, correct me if I'm wrong, that you guys were going to do Organic Wellness in that whole entire building on Fenwick and then move Holistic to the new location that we'll talk about later.

So I guess my questions are, has the second floor where Organic was actually housed at, has that been started under construction?

Because the lab was up there in a small space.

Your grow rooms were up there, right. So I was kind of like, what's the status of that second floor? Because I haven't seen anything done to it when I was there last, actually, in the space.

That's part one of the question.

The second part of the question is, as we're talking about future growth, is there going to be, I know you guys did extractions on site, is that plan for the reopening to have

manufacturing as well on site as well?

MR. J. GENDERSON: Yeah, so I can answer that. Josh Genderson. So the second floor is essentially in the same condition, albeit with some improvements done. When we redid the first floor to conform and make it one facility, a Pepco heavy-up is required, and that's the reason we can't plant upstairs or get an inspection upstairs yet.

But yes, if you were to go see that, it would look like it did before, except a little bit revamped, if you will. Same layout, the solvent list lab that you're talking about still up there. Security and stuff still up there.

And then to answer your second question, I believe on the second floor, we already paid, we renewed that for all manners of extraction and cultivation.

MR. PERU: Okay. Just for clarification, so the second floor, nothing heavy has been done to it in reference to renovation, but the first floor, that is still being put back together?

MR. J. GENDERSON: Correct.

MR. PERU: Okay. All right, Mr.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. All right. Any questions by anyone? I guess a question that I want to ask, can you give us any specific dates? If the Board was to agree to extend the safekeeping through March 31, 2024, are you able to give us a timeline? When is it that this facility would be up and running? Because how long does it take to grow? Because it's your cultivation center.

So when would you be able to start growing the plants? How long is it that the plants will take to grow? I believe the law based, because you are one of the original licensees, in changing the law, I believe that you were also granted automatically a manufacturer license. And so therefore, when is it that you'd be able to start manufacturing the product?

MR. J. GENDERSON: Josh Anderson. I couldn't give you an exact date just because there's permitting and Pepco involved, but as Mr. Bailey said, from our project management team and the contractor, we've been told that it's roughly about twelve to 16 weeks, I think, to finish

1 everything. And then the cultivation cycle to 2 grow is nine weeks roughly, and then about nine weeks post-harvest. So call it somewhere around 3 18 weeks after we're completed, we'd be 4 5 processing and selling. 6 MR. R. GENDERSON: But the license, we 7 would pick the license up before then because we 8 would need to when we start to grow again. 9 think it's 12 to 15 weeks before we put plants back into the ground. 10 11 MR. J. GENDERSON: 12 to 16 once we 12 have the renewed permits. 13 MR. R. GENDERSON: Correct. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And where do you believe that you are with the status of the 15 16 permit? 17 MR. J. GENDERSON: We can get you that 18 information. I don't know exactly. I know that 19 they've been all over it given this hearing, but 20 we can come back and tell you exactly where we 21 are. 2.2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Now, I know 23 that you somewhat mentioned an LOI that you 2.4 submitted about a third party. How much of your 25 future plans depend on third-party-provided

financing or getting financing involved? And when will that occur?

MR. R. GENDERSON: I think I can answer that. We've recently secured a bank loan, a real bank loan, which is shocking for this industry. So we will have the funds very shortly to finish this buildout if the LOI doesn't come through, even though we're pretty confident that we'll take a partner in. But even if we don't take a partner in, we can do this without it. So we're in very good position right now to finish this.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, any questions by the Board members of any other parties? This is strictly regarding Organic Wellness. Yes, Mr. Grandis.

MEMBER GRANDIS: Thank you. I'm going to throw the question out because there's several different representatives, and the one who thinks they have the best information, please answer.

So I'm directing this to the group, so to speak.

First off, good morning, and thank you all for being here to help enlighten us about the status. The City, the District, is very supportive of expanding medical cannabis

1 opportunities in the City, so thank you for being 2 Are you all currently waiting on permits 3 that will allow you to continue doing any type of the buildout? 4 5 MR. J. GENDERSON: T think T'd 6 probably be the most knowledgeable to answer that 7 question, and I'm not sure whether we're waiting 8 whether I need to get back to you on that after I 9 talk to our project manager, just to be sure. 10 MEMBER GRANDIS: Okay. It would help 11 if you all had that information to help enlighten 12 us on timelines. That's just my opinion as a 13 member of the Board. Have you all had any stop 14 work orders from the district regarding any of 15 the work because you're waiting on permits? I'm not aware of 16 MR. J. GENDERSON: 17 any. 18 MEMBER GRANDIS: You're not aware of Who would be aware? 19 any? 20 MR. J. GENDERSON: Same person. And 21 agreed, you're right, they should have been on 2.2 this call. 23 MEMBER GRANDIS: There is someone who 2.4 could have enlightened us on that? 25 MR. J. GENDERSON: Yeah, I believe so. Let me see. We had a stop order in the very beginning of the construction process. I don't even remember what it was for.

MR. R. GENDERSON: Well, that was the GAR, but that was years ago. That was GAR, but we haven't had a stop order since then.

MEMBER GRANDIS: Okay, so none of the permits that you all need are reliant upon any current stop order. That's what I think I'm hearing you all say, correct?

MR. R. GENDERSON: Correct.

MEMBER GRANDIS: So in answering the chairman's question about timeline, there is no let me restate the question. May we ask what permits you're waiting on that are needed to finish this buildout?

MR. J. GENDERSON: Again, I'm not 100 percent sure. My understanding previously was it was just for a power heavy-up. But that's to the best of my knowledge; I don't know if they need to resume any electrical or anything after the heavy-up is done. It's the elevator and the heavy-up, and we couldn't do the elevator without the heavy-up.

MEMBER GRANDIS: That's helpful.

Thank you. Mr. Chairman, thank you very much.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Mr.

Grandis. Any other questions by any of the Board

member? Yes, Mr. Short.

MEMBER SHORT: To the panel, I would just like to ask, pretty much we're saying should the Board provide you, your request will continue safekeeping until March of 2024. If you're not completed at that time, what do you think the Board would do, and are you assured or can you give this Board some assurances of your completion before March 2024?

MR. J. GENDERSON: Yeah, I believe, barring some unknown circumstance or misunderstanding like this GAR thing, which took two years, barring anything like that, yes, I would be willing to say we would be done. That would be more than sufficient. And if we weren't, then you guys would likely do what you need to do.

MR. R. GENDERSON: The thing is, we can finish by then, and we will keep you in the loop every three or four weeks. I can call you, tell me whoever you want me to talk to. It's probably Mr. Bailey. And I'll be glad to keep

1 you in the loop of what our progress is. 2 MEMBER SHORT: Well, that makes me feel a little better, and I would simply say this 3 to you. Every two or three weeks, or at least 4 once a month, if you would reach out to our 5 investigator Peru, while our specialists in 6 7 licensing, Sean Gordy, Mr. Gordy, it would make 8 me feel a lot better to keep progress, because 9 there might be some help that the agency give 10 you. 11 But when you go silent, we hear 12 nothing from you, and then you come back and say, 13 well, something else went wrong, it kind of puts 14 us in a box. Because, again, the City needs you 15 up and running. Just say it like it is. 16 MR. R. GENDERSON: Right? You have 17 our word that we will never go silent. 18 MEMBER SHORT: Okay. We can do that. 6 MR. BAILEY: 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Peru, I'm 8 asking, is there anything that you want to see 9 within this period of time? I mean, that could be provided in this memo? 10

MR. PERU: Just to back up about the permitting, I did go to the DLCP's website to look at scout (phonetic). I don't see any stop work orders against the property, but I also do not see any current issued permits as well. The last permits are showing back from 2021 that I'm seeing in the system.

MR. BAILEY: Right.

MR. PERU: Everything else is kind of blank. So just as a heads up for the Board, that's what I'm seeing on the website.

MR. BAILEY: Well, if I can answer that, due to the lapse of time the permits have expired, we have to get the permits renewed.

MR. BAILEY: I can't answer that question. I think that's the question. We have to go back and let you know.

MR. PERU: Because I can reach out and find out. I can reach out to DLCP myself and get that answer. I just wonder if you had it for me. Okay. And reference to getting up and running, Mr. Chair, not until they're built out. We'll be able to get back in there and make sure that they're meeting the requirements again with a physical location, security, all that other stuff.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: As I said, my concern is that we received 58 applications from social equity applicants. We are about to, as I said, in November, we are also going to issue licenses where the unlicensed facility can apply.

And one of the concerns that has been brought to the agency is that, I am concerned about a plan for license, because if I'm going to sell products in DC, I have to purchase the product from DC cultivation facilities. And we do not think that there is enough product ability.

And so that is one of the reasons why I am being insistent that I need, if you have a license, then you need to use it, because if you refuse to use it, then the Board will cancel the license. Because I want the industry to know that we are doing everything possible to grow sufficient product so everyone is out there who sells, they can do this through legally and we can enforce to ensure that we have an appropriate product and we have one of the best markets in the country, and that's why we have this hearing today.

MR. BAILEY: Mr. Anderson, you have our word that we will be up and running. We can get up and running quicker than anybody, and you'll have product by, we'll be growing before that March deadline.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, Mr. Bailey, I expect that you'll provide the agency within 15 days a status, a response to the questions that were asked this morning and so that the parties, and then we'll make a determination after you've provided us. Please send it to ABCA Legal.

MR. BAILEY: Yes.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And then we
