3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case
4	on our calendar, this is a fact finding hearing,
5	Case Number 21-251-00014, Public Bar, License
6	Number 81238.
7	Ms. Andrews, can you please elevate
8	the rights of the parties in this case, please?
9	MS. ANDREWS: Sure. Standby. Mr.
10	O'Brien, your rights have been elevated.
11	Investigator Brashears, your rights have been
12	elevated.
13	Investigator Butler, your rights have
14	been elevated. Mr. Issa, your rights have been
15	elevated. That's all Mr. Chair.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. So,
17	on those parties, if you have a camera, can you
18	please if you're can you please turn your
19	cameras on, please?
20	Do you have a camera, Mr. Issa?
21	MR. ISSA: Yes. I should be on.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. Good
23	morning. Good morning everyone. This is a fact
24	finding hearing.
25	Let me have the parties introduce

themselves for the record. Let's start with you, 1 2 Mr. O'Brien. Please spell and state your name. 3 Mr. O'Brien, you're on mute. MR. O'BRIEN: 4 Thank you, Mr. Chair. 5 Stephen O'Brien for the Respondent, the Licensee. S-T-E-P-H-E-N O-B-R-I-E-N. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is the Licensee 8 on, Mr. O'Brien? Who is that? 9 MR. O'BRIEN: That would be Mr. Issa. 10 And we are also expecting Mr. Williams. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Issa, can 12 you please identify yourself for the record, 13 please? 14 MR. ISSA: Yes. John Issa, co-15 owner/operator of Public Bar. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you spell 17 and state your name, please sir? 18 MR. ISSA: J-O-H-N I-S-S-A, John 19 Issa. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr. 21 Issa. 22 MR. ISSA: Thank you. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Let's start 23 24 with the investigators. So, I'll start with 25 Supervisor Investigator Brashears.

1 You're on -- you're on mute, sir. 2 INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: Sorry about 3 that, sir. Supervisor Investigator Brashears. 4 That's M-A-R-K, last name is B-R-A-S-H-E-A-R-S. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Inv -- or Investigator Butler, can you please identify 6 7 yourself for the record, please? 8 INVESTIGATOR BUTLER: Investigator 9 Donnell Butler. That's D-O-N-N-E-L-L B-U-T-L-E-10 R. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 12 Thank you, Mr. Butler. Mr. O'Brien, what's the name of the other person, the other owner you're 13 14 expecting, sir? 15 MR. O'BRIEN: Chris -- Chris Williams. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Williams, 17 if you're online, can you please identify 18 yourself in the chat so your rights can be 19 elevated? And Mr. O'Brien, if this person's not 20 21 here, can we move forward or do we have to wait for him? 22 MR. O'BRIEN: I believe we can move 23 24 forward. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, Mr.

Williams, if you're if you're online, please
identify yourself in the chat so we can so we
can elevate your rights, sir.
All right,
MS. ANDREWS: Mr. Chair, he does not
appear to be online. But, I will keep a look out
for him.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
Thank you, Ms. Andrews. All right. This is a
fact finding hearing on Public Bar.
A summary of this case is then,
Supervisor Investigator Mark Brashears received a
hotline call from MPD concerning an assault that
had taken place at Public at the Public Bar.
The victim, an employee at the
establishment was assaulted by two unknown
patrons. The victim told MPD that a male patron
pushed her and hit her in the chest when she
tried to break up a verbal alteration.
Supervisor Investigator Brashears
responded to the to the establishment with
Investigator Jones.
They interviewed they interviewed
the participants in this matter. And it's also
my understanding that Investigator Butler also

reviewed this on security footage.

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2 So, as you are aware, Mr. O'Brien, 3 this is a fact finding hearing. The Board is 4 just trying to gather information regarding what 5 occurred.

6 As you are aware, the Board cannot 7 order, make any specific findings and facts and 8 conclusions of law at a fact finding hearing. We 9 do not -- we cannot order the establishment to 10 take any action.

11 The establishment however, can 12 volunteer to take measures. But, so I just want 13 to advise you.

14 And I'm aware that you are aware. 15 But, I just wanted to advise the parties that 16 this is just a -- that the Board, we're just 17 investigating to gather some more facts just to make a determination of whether or not we would 18 19 make a decision on whether further action will 20 occur, or whether or not we'll just, we'll take 21 no further action.

All right? So, what we'll do, is that we'll start off with Supervisor Investigator Brashears. And so he can inform us how -- how is it that he became aware of this matter.

1	INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: Yes, sir.
2	Basically on June 27 at approximately 2:10 a.m.,
3	I received an ABRA hotline call from MPD Officer
4	Roselle (phonetic).
5	He stated he was at the establishment
6	and an assault had occurred. And he was
7	requesting ABRA assistance.
8	So, I gathered Investigator Butler,
9	Lead Investigator Dantzler, and we responded to
10	the establishment at approximately 2:30 a.m.
11	Upon arriving, I conducted an
12	interview, brief interview with the MPD Officer.
13	He basically stated that an assault had occurred
14	on the roof deck.
15	I spoke with the ABC Manager who
16	stated that he did not personally witness the
17	event. But stated that an employee, the victim
18	in this case, was punched in the face.
19	He provided the video. Showed us the
20	video camera footage, the various camera angles.
21	I spoke with him at length about the security
22	plan, settlement agreement.
23	He stated they will follow. He agreed
24	to provide us the requested video footage within
25	48 hours.
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I also spoke with the head of 1 2 security. He basically stated that he did not 3 witness the event himself. Basically an all call went out on the 4 The establishment uses radios to 5 radio. communicate. 6 7 An all call went out for assistance on 8 the roof deck, to which he responded. He also 9 stated that the victim had been hit. With regard to further investigating 10 11 that I did, I reviewed the security plan, the 12 settlement agreement. 13 It appears that during the event the 14 establishment was operating during their licensed 15 They were operating within the settlement hours. 16 agreement. 17 They followed the security plan in 18 that they created an incident log. They held the 19 door when the event occurred. All of security 20 basically responded. 21 So, it appeared on the surface to me 22 that the establishment followed the appropriate 23 The -- the situation, unfortunately procedures. 24 the assailant escaped because at some point. 25 In addition to the victim being

assaulted, an unknown female sprayed what we 1 2 believed to be OC spray or pepper spray. In the confusion, people rubbing their 3 eyes and things going on, the assailant seems to 4 5 have gotten out of the establishment. And then Investigator Butler actually 6 7 reviewed the video footage, and I believe spoke with the victim. 8 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on one 10 moment. All right. Ms. Andrews, can you -- can 11 you elevate the rights of -- of hold on --12 MS. ANDREWS: Sure. Standby. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes. I think 14 Investigator Dantzler is --15 MS. ANDREWS: Investigator Dantzler, 16 your rights have been elevated. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Investigator 18 Dantzler, can you please spell and state your 19 name for the record, please? 20 INVESTIGATOR DANTZLER: Yes. Felicia 21 Dantzler, F- like Frank, E-L-I-C-I-A D- like 22 David, A-N-T- like time, Z- like zebra, L-E-R. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 23 24 Thank you. Investigator Butler, can you bring us 25 up to speed?

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1	What is it that you were able to find
2	out as a result of your investigation?
3	INVESTIGATOR BUTLER: Yes, good
4	morning. During that time, on June 27, I did,
5	when I arrived I interviewed the victim.
6	A female victim employee, stated that
7	she was working on the rooftop. And she observed
8	several patrons in a verbal altercation.
9	And when she tried to intervene and
10	break up that altercation, she was pushed, and
11	subsequently hit in the shoulder. At that time
12	she immediately ran out and noticed security, who
13	came in.
14	And at that time, she said that a
15	female pat another female patron had sprayed
16	pepper spray. And most of the patrons who were
17	on the roof then started to leave.
18	But, other than being punched and
19	pushed, she wasn't really hurt as bad.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, I'm sorry,
21	you reviewed the camera? Is that you reviewed
22	the video, is that correct?
23	INVESTIGATOR BUTLER: Yes.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, what is it
25	that what did your review of the video show,

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1	sir?
2	INVESTIGATOR BUTLER: Unfortunately,
3	when I reviewed the camera, it showed the
4	security running towards the roof deck. But, it
5	did not show the actual event that happened.
6	So, I was not able to see the physical
7	and the pushing and the patrons. It only showed
8	the patrons running or leaving the rooftop area.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, is it that
10	they, at least in your view, they did not have
11	adequate coverage of the rooftop?
12	Or did not provide you a camera angle
13	that would have covered the incident?
14	INVESTIGATOR BUTLER: Yeah. I believe
15	that the camera angle, they didn't have
16	appropriate sight on the incident that's up on
17	the rooftop.
18	It didn't it only showed like the,
19	maybe right to the entrance of the rooftop and no
20	further.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
22	Investigator Dantzler, is there anything that you
23	can add to what Supervisor Investigator Brashears
24	shared and Mr. Butler shared?
25	(No response)

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Dantzler?
2	INVESTIGATOR DANTZLER: Yes. Just to
3	just to say that I reviewed the video footage
4	only one time on the night of the incident.
5	And the victim, at first it appeared
6	to me that she was spitting on the assailant.
7	And I asked of her what was going asked of
8	her, was she spitting on the assailant.
9	And she stated that she was not. She
10	was actually yelling at him. Something to the
11	effect, you know, hit me. Go ahead and hit me.
12	And at that point is when he actually
13	punched her.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Thank
15	you. All right, are any of the investigators
16	presently asking Mr. O'Brien any questions?
17	Anything that you need to ask? Any of
18	the any of the investigators?
19	MR. O'BRIEN: Mr. Chair, I think we've
20	established that the victim of the assault was an
21	employee, a female employee.
22	I would ask the investigators, I know
23	this is not cross examination. But, I would ask
24	them this,
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, hold up.
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Hold up, hold up, hold up a minute, Mr. O'Brien. 1 2 I'm going to give you an opportun -- or an 3 opportunity. No, I was asking the investigators if 4 5 any of the three, if they wanted to add anything else. 6 7 Oh, I'm sorry. MR. O'BRIEN: 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And then I 9 wanted the Board -- yeah. 10 MR. O'BRIEN: I'm sorry. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any additions 12 by any of the investigators? You need to add 13 anything, clarification? 14 **INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS:** Yes, Yes. 15 Chairperson. When I spoke with the ABC Manager, 16 it appears we got the video footage that was 17 available for that floor. 18 And although as Investigator Butler 19 testified, you can see the victim at one point. 20 You can see some people pushing and leaving. 21 It appears we got the only camera 22 So, there maybe a situation on the roof angle. 23 deck where this perhaps happened in a blind spot 24 that the camera did not see. 25 But, it appears they provided what

1 they had.

2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr.
3	Brashears. Any questions of any questions by
4	any Board Members of any of the investigators?
5	MEMBER SHORT: Yes, Mr. Chair. I have
6	a question for Mr for Investigator Brashears.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Short.
8	Go ahead, please.
9	MEMBER SHORT: Investigator Brashears,
10	thank you for your report. Thank you for your
11	service.
12	Other than the camera angle, other
13	than the camera angle on the roof deck where the
14	assault alleged to have occurred, did you find
15	any other ABRA violations?
16	INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: I did not
17	observe any other ABRA violations. I looked and
18	saw basically I observed that the
19	establishment has 16 cameras throughout the
20	establishment, on the monitor.
21	I reviewed the settlement agreement
22	and the security plan with regard to what
23	occurred. And on the night of the incident, the
24	establishment had the appropriate number of
25	security personnel. They were located as

specified in the security plan. 1 There was a section in the security 2 3 plan that spoke of basically all the security personnel to respond to an incident. They did. 4 5 So, I did not observe any -- any violations with regard to those things. And I 6 7 know Investigator Butler conducted a brief 8 regulatory inspection. 9 And from what I understand, the 10 documents and things, as far as the ABC license, 11 certificate of occupancy, those things were all 12 in order. MEMBER SHORT: 13 Thank you very much. 14 And this question is for Investigator Dantzler. 15 INVESTIGATOR DANTZLER: Yes, sir? 16 MEMBER SHORT: Investigator Dantzler, 17 other than you seeing a face to face between the 18 alleged victim and the alleged assault, 19 assaulter, did you observe any violations other 20 than those that you mentioned? 21 INVESTIGATOR DANTZLER: No, sir. Ι 2.2 did not. 23 Thank you very much. MEMBER SHORT: 24 And Investigator Butler, did you --25 INVESTIGATOR BUTLER: Yes, sir?

1	MEMBER SHORT: Did you and did you
2	observe anything that should bring to the
3	attention of this Board while you were there and
4	investigating this incident?
5	INVESTIGATOR BUTLER: No. As
6	Supervisor Mark said, I mean, there were no
7	violations other than the fact that the
8	disturbance, you know, had happened on the
9	rooftop.
10	And the victim seemed to be, and
11	though shaken, but she was okay.
12	MEMBER SHORT: Okay. Do you think if
13	they got some angles, the camera angles changed
14	that maybe the next time this would be better
15	documented?
16	INVESTIGATOR BUTLER: Yes, sir. That
17	would be helpful, yes.
18	MEMBER SHORT: Thank you very much for
19	your testimony. Thank you for your report, all
20	three of you.
21	Thank you. That's all I have Mr.
22	Chair.
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr.
24	Short. Any other questions by any other Board
25	Members?

Yes, Mr. Chairman. 1 MEMBER GRANDIS: 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. 3 Grandis? MEMBER GRANDIS: I'd like to address 4 5 my first question to Mr. O'Brien. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Oh, hold on, 6 7 Mr. -- we haven't gotten there yet, Mr. -- you 8 just -- you can, you can address the 9 investigators. And then later on --10 11 (Simultaneous speaking) 12 MEMBER GRANDIS: Investigators, okay. 13 Thank you. Thank you. Any of the three 14 investigators can respond to this. 15 So, the security plan mentioned, if I 16 heard correctly the security plan mentioned 16 17 cameras? 18 INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: That is 19 correct, sir. 20 MEMBER GRANDIS: Okay. Thank you. 21 Did -- did it further indicate how many cameras 22 would be used to show the roof deck? Areas of the roof deck? 23 24 INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: There was a 25 diagram in the security plan with reference to

1 the cameras. And it appeared the camera location 2 was accurate. 3 MEMBER GRANDIS: So, -- so my understanding then hearing that is that while 4 5 they were in compliance with the security plan regarding the cameras that they mentioned, that 6 7 it's your -- it's the testimony of the inspectors 8 that perhaps there needs to be additional 9 cameras? Or the cameras that deal with the roof 10 11 deck need just to be turned? 12 INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: I can't -- I mean, you're correct, sir. From what I could 13 14 tell, the camera was placed appropriately as per 15 the security plan. As to whether it needs to be adjusted 16 17 or possibly more cameras, that could possibly be ascertained if we did a camera review at the 18 19 establishment. And I only 20 MEMBER GRANDIS: Yes. 21 raise this because it's my belief that cameras 22 can help absolve a licensee as well as show what 23 the incident actually was. 24 And it's just disappointing, well, we 25 need to make determinations if the cameras are

not in the right space or enough of them. Because I do believe these cameras can help
Because I do believe these cameras can help
absolve licensees and show that they were in
compliance.
That's basically all. I just think
that we don't have enough information on what was
happening on the roof deck.
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr.
Grandis. Any other questions by any other Board
Members?
(No response)
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hearing none,
Mr. O'Brien, how how is it that your client
intends to respond to the allegations that were
made in the report?
MR. O'BRIEN: Well, Mr. Chair, I think
we certainly are going to take a look at the
camera coverage on the roof. And determine if
cameras need to be reoriented or supplemented.
And I I thank Mr. Grandis for his
observation that that's usually to the benefit of
the establishment.
(Simultaneous speaking)
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, but
MR. O'BRIEN: Other than that

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1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, Mr.
2	O'Brien, go ahead.
3	MR. O'BRIEN: Okay. Other than that,
4	I don't I did not hear any suggestion by any
5	of the investigators that the establishment did
6	anything wrong here.
7	If we accept that incidents happen
8	from time to time, and can happen anywhere, if we
9	accept that then based on what occurred, I don't
10	I don't perceive any criticism of the conduct
11	of the establishment at this point.
12	I would like to just confirm a couple
13	of things if I could. It's my understanding, I
14	guess I'm asking the investigators, it's my
15	understanding that it was the establishment that
16	called MPD.
17	Are any of the investigators able to
18	confirm that?
19	INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: Yes, sir.
20	Basically the MPD Officer stated that someone
21	from the establishment, he was out front,
22	basically came outside, alerted him to the
23	situation, and he subsequently entered the
24	establishment.
25	MR. O'BRIEN: Thank you. We know that

there was an individual who assaulted the female 1 2 server. We also know that a female patron 3 employed what we believe to be pepper spray. Do we know if the -- if the male 4 5 assailant and the female pepper sprayer were in the same party? 6 7 INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: To my 8 understanding, sir, that was -- that was not 9 ascertained by MPD. 10 However, it was stated that the 11 individual that sprayed the pepper spra -- or 12 what we believed to be pepper spray, left her identification. 13 And that information was turned over 14 15 to MPD for follow up. 16 MR. O'BRIEN: Do we know if MPD has 17 followed up? 18 INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: I am not 19 aware of that at this time, sir. MR. O'BRIEN: Okay. Would it be fair 20 21 to summarize by saying that the establishment 22 cooperated fully with the investigation of this 23 matter? 24 INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: Yes, sir. 25 They provided the information we requ -- we

requested. They provided the video footage. 1 2 They answered our questions. 3 And I saw no -- I saw no issues with 4 the level of cooperation that they gave us. But, 5 you may want to query the other investigators as to what they observed. 6 7 MR. O'BRIEN: All right. Then if I 8 could ask Investigator Butler, did the 9 establishment afford you full cooperation? 10 INVESTIGATOR BUTLER: Yes. From my 11 observation and my investigation, they did 12 cooperate fully. 13 MR. O'BRIEN: Thank you. And Ms. 14 Dantzler? 15 INVESTIGATOR DANTZLER: Yes. The 16 establishment cooperated. 17 MR. O'BRIEN: All right. Thank you to 18 all the investigators. Mr. Chair, I really don't 19 have anything to add. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. 21 Mr. O'Brien, do you know how many Thank you. 22 cameras are currently on the roof? 23 MR. O'BRIEN: I'm going to defer to 24 Mr. Issa. 25 MR. ISSA: All right. I have three

1	cameras on the roof. And then one by the
2	emergency exit backdoor. So, four total.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And Mr.
4	O'Brien, would your client be open to have
5	have the ABRA investigator come through to view
6	the camera angles to see if there are any blind
7	spots that well, clearly there are some blind
8	spots.
9	And make some recommendation to the
10	establishment about how to address those blind
11	spots?
12	MR. O'BRIEN: Most certainly open to
13	that.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
15	Thank you. So, I would then Mr Supervisor
16	Investigator Brashears, it's my understanding
17	that I'm not and I'm not sure how it is,
18	but it appears that the establishment is open to
19	that.
20	So, probably through the channels, and
21	I would ask that the agency work with the
22	establishment to to on that issue, please.
23	INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: Yes, sir. We
24	can certainly follow up and make sure that gets
25	taken care of.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Great.
2	MR. O'BRIEN: Mr. Chair, I will
3	I'll furnish Investigator Brashears with John
4	Issa's con direct contact information for that
5	purpose.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
7	Thank you, Mr. O'Brien. Any other questions by
8	any Board Members or anyone? Anyone else, any
9	have any additional questions or concerns anyone
10	wants to raise?
11	MEMBER GRANDIS: Mr. Chairman?
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr.
13	Grandis?
14	MEMBER GRANDIS: I have a question
15	for, just general question for the inspectors, if
16	they know the answer.
17	It's sort of alarming to me that there
18	was a patron that used a substance like pepper
19	spray and caused such discomfort and perhaps
20	injury to people.
21	In D.C., is are we allowed to buy
22	pepper spray?
23	INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: I can't I
24	can't speak to the actual law with regard to the
25	pepper spray or OC spray.

1	That searches and things are
2	covered in the establishment's security plan.
3	But, the establishment does not routinely do
4	searches according to the security plan.
5	They occasionally do searches and pat
6	downs depending on the situation. And that is
7	it's it's unfortunate, but it's not uncommon
8	for a small bottle of pepper spray to be smuggled
9	in on a person's body.
10	I mean, it does happen. But, with
11	regard to the legality of the use of MDC, I
12	cannot speak to that, sir.
13	MEMBER GRANDIS: So, my question
14	okay, just as a follow up, you're saying you
15	use the words smuggle in.
16	Does that mean if there had been a pat
17	down, and I'm not suggesting there should have
18	been, but if security or the doorman found that
19	someone had a can of pepper spray, are they able
20	to take it?
21	Or tell them they can't enter with it?
22	I'm just trying to understand what what your
23	procedure would be.
24	INVESTIGATOR BRASHEARS: Well,
25	typically most security personnel, anything they

consider contraband, gun, knife, OC spray, 1 anything that's not allowed in, is usually taken 2 3 from the individual. And if it's in the nature of such a 4 5 weapon such as a gun or a knife, things like 6 that, MPD is usually involved. Typically 7 anything else is returned to the patron as they exit the establishment. 8 9 MEMBER GRANDIS: Okay. I raise this 10 concern, because I could imagine the panic that 11 could occur in a -- in a small space if somebody 12 used this. 13 I'd like to ask Mr. Issa a question. 14 Mr. Issa, I want to thank you for being here 15 today. I understand that some of your 16 17 security camera footage has visuals of this 18 female who had the pepper spray. Did I 19 understand that correctly? 20 MR. ISSA: Yes. It wasn't a verv 21 clear shot. And there was a lot of confusion as 22 -- after it had been sprayed. 23 People were just running out, covering 24 their face. Everyone was at -- we were trying to 25 get everyone to exit the rooftop.

1	So, there wasn't a clear shot of of
2	her face.
3	MEMBER GRANDIS: And the assailant,
4	did I raise the question about the assailant also
5	being on camera?
6	Was there any clear footage of that
7	individual?
8	MR. ISSA: Not not clear, no. Not
9	(inaudible) But, you could really make
10	(inaudible) and everyone was panicking and just
11	the roof.
12	MEMBER GRANDIS: Okay. Okay, I
13	understand. If you all had a good image of
14	either the assailant or this female, would you
15	all then prevent that person from entering the
16	establishment in the future?
17	MR. ISSA: Absolutely. One hundred
18	percent.
19	MEMBER GRANDIS: Okay. Thank you.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any other
21	questions, Mr. Grandis?
22	(No response)
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Any
24	final comments you want to make Mr. O'Brien,
25	before I bring this hearing to a closure?

1	MR. O'BRIEN: No, sir. I asked the
2	investigators whether they were aware if the male
3	assailant and the female pepper sprayer were in
4	the same party. We don't know the answer to
5	that.
6	What I was wondering, was whether the
7	pepper spray was deployed in order to enable the
8	assailant to escape in the confusion.
9	But that's that's a question that
10	I don't have the answer to. That's why I asked
11	about it.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right. All
13	right. Thank you, Mr. O'Brien. Thank you, Mr.
14	Issa. Thank you to the investi Supervisor
15	Investigator Brashears, Investigator Butler, and
16	Lead Investigator Dantzler.
17	The Board will take this matter under
18	advisement. Thank you very much for your
19	appearance today.
20	And as you stated, Mr. O'Brien, you
21	will provide Mr. Issa's contact information to
22	Mr. Brashears for the for the agency to follow
23	up to just look at the camera camera angles to
24	see what changes, if any, can be made to the view
25	on the rooftop.

1	And again, this is, you're
2	volunteering. Thus, the Board is not ordering
3	you to do this. So, it's just a volunteer action
4	that Mr. O'Brien has stated that the
5	establishment is open to doing.
6	So, I want to thank everyone for their
7	participation today. And this hearing has been
8	concluded. Thank you very much.
9	(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter
10	went off the record at 11:30 a.m.)
