CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, the next case on our calendar is case number 21-PRO-00047, A&S Grocery, license number 101367. Ms. Andrews, can you please elevate the rights of the parties. I believe it should be the Licensee and the ANC.

MS. ANDREWS: Sure, stand by. This is for A&S Grocery?

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, A&S Grocery, yes.

MS. ANDREWS: (Pause.) Mr. Robinson, your rights have been elevated. (Pause.) Mr. Max Richman, your rights have been elevated. (Pause.) Mr. Holmes, your rights have been elevated. elevated. (Pause.) That's all I have, Mr. Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank you. For all the parties, if you have a camera, can you please turn your camera on, please? (Pause.) All right, so let's have all the parties identify themselves. Let's start with the representative of the Licensee.

(Pause.) Mr. Robinson? (Pause.) Mr. Robinson,

16	MR. ROBINSON: Okay, I've hit that.

18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We're not
19	seeing you, but that's fine.
20	MR. ROBINSON: Okay.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you please
22	identify yourself (Simultaneous speaking.)
23	MR. ROBINSON: Now, now I'm there.
24	(Simultaneous speaking.) Wendell RobinsonI'm
25	sorry. Wendell Robinson, I'm attorney for A&S.

3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So
4	let's go with your representative, is your client
5	joining you this morning, sir?
6	MR. ROBINSON: I'm not sure, Your
7	Honor. I told him to try to join, but I don't
8	know if he had difficulty joining the hearing
9	thing.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What's the
11	name of your client?
12	MR. ROBINSON: Thomas Woldu W-O-L-D-U.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Andrews,
14	did you see a Thomas Woldu or Mr. Woldu, if you
15	are on line, can you please identify through the
16	chat and we will elevate your rights.
17	All right. Let's have the other
18	parties identify themselves. Let's go with the
19	ANC, Mr. Holmes, please spell and state your
20	name, please?
21	MR. HOLMES: Good morning, Antawan
22	Holmes, Chair of ANC 7C. A-N-T-A-W-A-N H-O-L-M-
23	E-S.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And Mr. Max
25	Richman, please. Spell and state your name.

MR. RICHMAN: Good morning. My name is Max Richman that's spelled out M-A-X, last name Richman R-I-C-H-M-A-N.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right,

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, good morning. Mr. Richman, it is my understanding that the civic association presented a settlement agreement to the Agency and so therefore you do not have to appear this morning, sir, because at least your protest will be settled by the Board once the Board has signed off on the settlement agreement, so you do not need to be here today, but thank you for your appearance -

MR. RICHMAN: Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Anyway. And are there any preliminary matters that need to be discussed between the Licensee and the ANC?

MR. ROBINSON: No, Your Honor.

Wendell Robinson. As you indicated, we sent a copy of the executed agreement to Ms. Fletcher and Mr. Holmes and Mr. Richman, so I'm just not sure how quickly the Board will get it.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Oh, I'm sorry, did Mr. Holmes, Mr. Holmes, did you sign off on the settlement agreement or do you plan to sign

off on the settlement agreement, sir?

MR. HOLMES: The settlement agreement,
I believe, the Deanwood Citizens association has
party status directly to this case, so the
settlement agreement is between them and the
Applicant.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm aware of that, sir. I am asking you, sir, if you have--I know that you have status, they have status, so I'm asking you, have you seen the settlement agreement? Are you going to sign off on the settlement agreement or do you believe that you're going to move forward with the hearing? Or are you going to do a separate settlement agreement? I was just asking a question, sir.

MR. HOLMES: Okay. Sure, excellent. What we plan on doing is, we are going to continue to have a discussion with the Applicant about ours, so we're going to go to the next hearing.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Hold on. (Pause.) I'm sorry, okay. (Pause.)

All right, I skipped over a case on the calendar so someone was just reminding me that I skipped over a case. All right, okay so this is A&S, I'm

sorry.

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MR. ROBINSON: A&S Grocery.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yeah, this is A&S Grocery. All right this matter then is scheduled for a Show Cause Hearing, for a Protest Hearing, I'm sorry, on September 30th, 2021 at 10:00 a.m.

MR. ROBINSON: Your Honor.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So September -of course if this matter goes to a Protest Hearing we will have the hearing, but the Board always supports settlement agreements because one of the reasons the Board supports settlement agreements because this is your community, you live in your community, you can determine what it is that you are willing to live with within the confines of your community. I don't believe that any of the Board members live in the confines of where this establishment is concerned, so that's one of the reasons why the Board supports settlement agreements, but if the parties aren't able to settle this matter then we'll have a Protest Hearing.

All right. So any other preliminary matter that needs to be brought to the attention

of the Board?

MR. ROBINSON: Not from A&S, Mr.

3 Chairman.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Holmes?

MR. HOLMES: None.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right,

thank you. (Simultaneous speaking.)

MR. ROBINSON: Thank you, sir.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank you. All right now that we have scheduled this matter for a Protest Hearing, there are a few things I would like to instruct you about because the Board's practices under the Public Emergency have changed.

As you know, the Board's hearings are conducted virtually so it is more important than ever that Protest Hearings are focused and address only those issues that are being protested. Following this hearing, you will receive an e-mail from Assistant General Counsel April Randall that will include a copy of the protest information form and a copy of an exhibit form as well as specific instructions for the hearing. You are required to complete and submit the protest information form and the

exhibit form at least seven days before the date of the hearing. If we do not receive a copy of your forms seven days before the hearing, your application or your protest may be subject to dismissal. These documents not only need to be submitted to ABRALegal@dc.gov but to the opposing parties as well.

Please know that these documents greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process and keeping the parties on point during the hearing. Each side is limited to no more than five witnesses and you will only have 60 minutes to present your case. This includes all direct and cross examination of witnesses. The Board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to those issues that are being protested, nor will the Board tolerate repetitive testimony. Are there any questions?

MR. ROBINSON: Not from A&S Groceries, thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

MR. ROBINSON: Mr. Chairman.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Holmes?

MR. HOLMES: None, thank you.
