MS. FLETCHER: We have one last case on the calendar for today. This case is Villa Yara. This is Case No. 22-PRO-00073. 2815 M Street NW. License No. ABRA-121278. This is a Retailer Class CR, a new application. The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet.

Is anyone present on behalf of the Applicant?

MR. SHIRAFKAN: Good morning, Ms. Fletcher. Coming to you live from hallways of the courthouse, Makan Shirafkan. I had to step out to get on this. Nice seeing everyone.

MS. FLETCHER: All right. Nice to you see you too. Mr. Shirafkan, can you spell your name for the record, please.

MR. SHIRAFKAN: Absolutely. Last name is S-H-I-R-A-F, as Frank, K-A-N, as Nancy. First name is Makan, M-A-K-A-N, as Nancy. And I would note that one of the owners, Majed Saadi, which is M-A-J-E-D, last name, S-A-A-D-I, is also present via web cam.

9	MS. FLETCHER: I saw him a moment ago.
10	I just wanted, he's not now. But I know that
11	you're representing the ANC in this matter, Ms.
12	Lohse, so that's fine. On behalf of the
13	Citizen's Association of Georgetown, please?
14	MS. CRUSE: Karen Cruse. K-A-R-E-N,
15	C-R-U-S-E.
16	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Ms. Cruse.
17	If you would spell your name for the record.
18	MS. CRUSE: K-A-R-E-N, C-R-U-S-E.
19	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. ANC 2E and
20	the Citizen's Association of Georgetown have
21	standing as protestants. Let me see here. I'm
22	going to give you the date for a status hearing
23	and a protest hearing and a date for mediation if
24	it's necessary.
25	MS. LOHSE: So we, Ms. Fletcher, we

all have agreed to a settlement. And we started to sign it. So you should be receiving that today or tomorrow.

MS. FLETCHER: Well, then I will, just because it's a requirement, I'm going to give you these dates. I'm sure they're going to be canceled. But I'm going to make a note of that, that the dates are not going to be necessary. And then we'll cancel the dates. You won't receive any notices for these dates. I'm just going to give them to you so you have them.

The date scheduled for the status hearing is October 5 at 10:30 a.m. The day for the protest hearing is November 2nd at 1:30. I'm not going to give you a day for mediation. I'm just going to hold that in abeyance to give you time to send in the settlement agreement and, if necessary, I'll schedule the date for mediation.

MR. SHIRAFKAN: Thank you very much.

And I wanted to thank everyone here for working together so fast and getting this done. So we appreciate it.

MS. CRUSE: I think the hold up on the signatures, and our president is out of town right at the moment, out of the country. But

we're trying to get it through, as Commissioner 1 2 Lohse said, within the next 48 hours. 3 MR. SHIRAFKAN: Thank you. 4 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Well, thank you, Nice to see everybody anyway. 5 Ms. Cruse. enjoy the rest of your day. 6 7 Take care. MR. SHIRAFKAN: And watch 8 out for traffic. Apparently today was everybody 9 going back, and I got surprised, so I was sitting in traffic. 10 11 MS. LOHSE: It was the first day of 12 school, and the parking lot got so overloaded, 13 there was like 60 cars stuck in the parking lot. 14 MS. FLETCHER: It was a mess. Glad we 15 all --16 MR.
