3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And the last
4	event on our calendar is another bar crawl, this
5	is a pub crawl, I'm sorry, I don't know why I
6	keep on saying bar crawl. Another pub crawl,
7	this is Nightmare on M Street Lindy Promotions,
8	and so Mr. Orellana, can you please elevate the
9	rights of the parties, the applicants for Lindy
10	Promotions?
11	MR. ORELLANA: Miranda McLean, your
12	access has been elevated.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
14	MS. MCLEAN: Hello.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. McLean, do
16	you have a camera you can turn on, ma'am?
17	MS. MCLEAN: Yes, one second, I'm just
18	starting it now. Why is it not turning on? All
19	right, is it on?
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, can
21	you spell and state your name for the record,
22	ma'am?
23	MS. MCLEAN: Miranda, M-I-R-A-N-D-A
24	McLean, M-C-L-E-A-N.
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what

1	organization are you with?
2	MS. MCLEAN: Lindy Promotions.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Tell us a
4	little bit about Lindy Promotions, ma'am.
5	MS. MCLEAN: We've been actually doing
6	crawls with you guys for over 12 years now. We
7	do Halloween, Saint Pat's, and some small, you
8	know, holiday events like Santa Con, or just
9	random summer crawls, and stuff like that with
10	you guys, but we've been doing crawls with you
11	guys for awhile now.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you pull
13	your camera down a little bit?
14	MS. MCLEAN: Sorry.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, so
16	you are requesting a pub crawl for Saturday,
17	October 28th from 2:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. In
18	what specific area of town are you requesting
19	this pub crawl?
20	MS. MCLEAN: The same, Dupont Circle.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And how many
22	participants are you requesting, ma'am?
23	MS. MCLEAN: We, on our application
24	put 2000, but we've always been okay, and we've
25	always sold 1500 or less. So, we're fine with

1	the 1500, because we understand that, you know,
2	us and Project D.C. does the crawls the same day,
3	and, you know, we want to work on, you know,
4	overcrowding on a Saturday night, a holiday
5	weekend. So, we're okay with the 1500. We
6	actually have never gone over the 1500, even
7	though we put, you know, 2000 on the application.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I don't think
9	you should say that, ma'am so I think you should
LO	say to the best of my knowledge I don't believe
L1	that we have gone over, because I believe that
L2	Mr. Short will remind you of some
L3	(Simultaneous speaking.)
L4	MS. MCLEAN: I mean from the last
L5	hiccup, correct, you're right.
L6	(Laughter.)
L7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So,
L8	Mr. Board Member Short's knowledge will go back
L9	ten years.
20	MS. MCLEAN: Yeah, I was going to say,
21	yeah.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, just
23	describe for us this event, ma'am.
24	MS. MCLEAN: So, basically it's 2:00
25	to 10:00, registration will begin at 2:00. We

have a couple of registration locations, we have staff that checks in. We're hiring, even though the venues assure us they have security, we always hire security ourselves. We hire, I know cleaning is always a big deal every year.

So, just like the other company, we use Bayside, and which we actually ask Bayside to come in after all the venues are closed. So, Bayside is normally cleaning, and they always send us pictures between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. And then this year we are actually investing more on security when it comes to the crowd control.

And just checking, and overflow of the (audio interference) --

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I've lost you, ma'am.

MS. MCLEAN: Can you hear me now?
CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, go ahead.

MS. MCLEAN: Yeah, so we're actually -- I was saying that we're actually investing this year more on us, like you know, hiring more security to help with check in, help with crowd control at the venues in the street. Because I know in the past, you know, between the two

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organizations, plus the regular Saturday night life, day time can be, you know -- I know she said that, you know, day time normally starts at 10:00, it gets hectic, but with all these organizations, and stuff like that, and the bars reached out to us.

We're asking if we can have extra security this year, we're going to invest on extra security.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So what plans do you have in place to prevent underage drinking, and excessive drinking?

MS. MCLEAN: So, what's going to happen is at the checkpoints we're actually IDing before we wristband. So, instead of just getting a wristband, what we normally do is we just, you know, they have to -- security has to check the ID, and obviously if the ID is 21 and over, they get their wristband, if it's not they just -- they don't get a wristband, and they lose out on their ticket.

But our new site also is giving the option to enter birthdays, but like I said, we have security that will be checking at the checkpoints, IDs.

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CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I know you spoke about another organization who you normally have a pub crawls, so you're there during the same time. So, are you aware that the licensee can only participate in one pub crawl?

MS. MCLEAN: Correct, we just -- I just heard that just now, and we're actually going to go back to the drawing board with some of the venues, and we can provide an updated list if needed be. I just actually -- while I was listening on the other calls, actually texted my other partners to let them know that this is something we have to be very strict on so that, you know, we don't get in trouble and we're, you know asked out, the day of. And everybody agrees, so we're going to actually go, because he mentioned some of the ones that we normally work with every year. So, we're going to go back to the drawing board on the venue list.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any questions for any of the board members? Go ahead, Mr. Short.

MEMBER SHORT: Chairman, thank you.

Since this year it looks like we have three

different companies --

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(Simultaneous speaking.)

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CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I was asking Mr. Short but go ahead Mr. Grandis. I said Mr. Short.

MEMBER SHORT: Oh you said Mr. Short, I apologize. No, Mr. Short. No, I apologize. Your volume is low, Mr. Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr. Grandis.

MEMBER GRANDIS: Okay, Mr. Short, I am really sorry, I didn't hear him say that.

MEMBER SHORT: Apologies not necessary.

MEMBER GRANDIS: Ma'am, you know, this has sort of put me in sort of a spot where I don't think I've been since I've been on the board, that, you know, we have a situation where three different companies who have good reputations, have had history in Washington, want to have each of them have between 1500 and 2000 participants.

And you all being a business, you sort of know what is the lowest number you all can have to even make it feasible as a company to make the money you need to pay your staff, and all those things. So, what I said to the last applicant, it seems to me that you all perhaps

should at least have communication on trying to say we don't want to put the board in a situation of maybe selecting one or two, instead of three.

Maybe if we all work together, the board can consider that the total number is something that the board would feel we're safe, particularly it's a Saturday night. It's one thing for Halloween to be on a Wednesday night, you know, but Halloween is on Tuesday, and this is a Saturday night, and that's the big night when people go out, regardless of what night Halloween is on.

So, do you think there's any feasibility of trying to communicate? Because when I'm looking at the list of just the documents that we've been provided today, it seems like some of the licensees are on more than one sheet. So, like I said, we -- I think we want this to be a successful evening for all three companies.

If all three companies can come up with a number, and not be overlapping, and having our investigative staff finding out that no, wait a minute, I'm going out that night, and these two -- two of the companies have the same venue,

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which as our regs say cannot be. So, I'm asking you a long question.

But do you think there's any possibility that we cannot be put in the position of having to make that decision, and you all can help us?

MS. MCLEAN: Yeah, I mean like I said, I heard when Alex was on, and he named drop some of the venues that we worked, like I said, with every crawl for the last, you know, God knows when they've been open. And that's a conversation, like I said, I was texting my partner on the side, and I think it is a good conversation, and a good point that maybe we should all just discuss, like you know, come up with a game plan, and discuss.

So, it's a conversation that, you know, we all would have to have after I get off this call, and see how we can all work together, so it doesn't put you guys in that predicament. And like I said, neither of us are getting in trouble, because, you know, a bar can turn around and say yeah, I'm not on this crawl, and then day of they lie, and we find out they are on the crawl.

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So, it's just all talking, and finding
a way, a common ground in such a way.

MEMBER GRANDIS: Because what I find
interesting is that the companies that want to do
something on that Saturday night before Halloween

all want south of Dupont, and it's probably good reason, okay? But there's H Street, you know,

not saying I'm making those decisions.

But we are being put in the position of saying here are three very good companies that have good history with D.C., and how do we avoid picking one over the other? Help us with that.

So, thank you, that's my only question. So Mr.

Chairman, thank you for the time. And Mr. Short, I really didn't hear your name. Thank you.

there's Adams Morgan, there's U Street, and I'm

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, Mr. Short.

MEMBER SHORT: Well, you're shorter than I am anyway, so -- I think. Anyway, thank you, Mr. Grandis. My only question for you, young lady, is are you familiar with the pub crawl regulations?

MS. MCLEAN: Yeah, I've been doing it -- I'm actually the one that's been doing it for

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1 12 years now. I'm always doing the applications, 2 and I've been applying, so yes. 3 MEMBER SHORT: So, you know what year we got these regulations, right? What year did 4 5 the regulations come into? That I don't know off the 6 MS. MCLEAN: 7 top of my head, one second. 8 MEMBER SHORT: Okay, well I'll leave 9 that alone. But the bottom line is you do know 10 the regulations? 11 MS. MCLEAN: Correct. And that's --12 (Simultaneous speaking.) 13 MEMBER SHORT: And you know it's your 14 responsibility in regards to the city? 15 MS. MCLEAN: Why I'm saying that in 16 regards to -- correct. So, if you found out 17 MEMBER SHORT: 18 someone was selling tickets who was unauthorized 19 to, what would you do? 20 I would 100 percent reach MS. MCLEAN: 21 out to you guys, and MPD. We're actually, 2.2 unfortunately a victim of that numerous times. 23 Because we actually do have a team that sits 2.4 down, and like, you know do their search up. They 25 go on Eventbrite, and they search up to see that

1 there's nobody selling tickets, or fake tickets. 2 Because we did fall victim of people 3 in the past coming to our registration thinking they bought tickets to our crawl, and that wasn't 4 5 the case. So, we've been very on point with that, but like I said, I've actually had 6 7 reporting it in the past, probably two years 8 before COVID is when we got, for Saint Pat's that 9 actually happened to us. 10 So, we would definitely report it, and 11 we do have two -- like a team that does do that. 12 Where they literally sit down, and search 13 whatever, because we definitely don't want to get 14 in trouble, we've been in hot water in the past. 15 MEMBER SHORT: Okay, well thank you 16 very much, that's all I have, Mr. Chair. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr. 18 Any final comments to make before I bring 19 this portion of the hearing to an end? Hello? 20 You're not hearing me? 21 MS. MCLEAN: No, I don't have any more 2.2 questions. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, 2.4 thank you. Thank you for your presentation 25 I mean, unless Ms. Nelson, you have a today.

1 question that you want to ask? Go ahead, ma'am. 2 MS. NELSON: I would just like to make sure -- first of all, how are you today? 3 I'm good, how are you? 4 MS. MCLEAN: 5 MS. NELSON: Doing well, thank you. 6 I would just like to make sure that your staff 7 also assists with controlling the crowds that are standing in line, so that they're not blocking 8 9 the sidewalk from emergency personnel, and other 10 agencies working in that area. Do you plan to 11 have your staff to assist with crowding? 12 MS. MCLEAN: Correct, and that's why 13 I said we're also -- my staff and them are also 14 investing a lot of money into security, because 15 the venues -- the few venues we've been in 16 communication with asked us to up the security. So, we will have -- me, myself, I will be there. 17 18 Normally my partners are there, I will actually 19 be there myself. We have where we're going to 20 increase staff, and we're also investing, like I 21 said, in security -- more security. 2.2 MS. NELSON: Thank you. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank 2.4 you, Ms. McLean and Ms. Nelson, our ABRA 25 investigator. ABCA investigator, I apologize.

1 All right, thank you for your presentation today. 2 The board will take this matter in advisement, and this hearing is at an end. So, we'll let you 3 know what decision we have made, whether or not 4 5 we're going to approve the pub crawl, and for 6 what numbers. All right? 7 MS. MCLEAN: All right, no problem, 8 thank you guys, have a good day. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, That is the last matter on our 10 thank you, ma'am. 11 calendar for the day, and so I'm going to --12 (Simultaneous speaking.) 13 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Chair, before we close? 14 15 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Short? 16 MEMBER SHORT: Is there any way 17 possible, I'm just thinking, instead of having 18 one investigator check on three pub crawls in the 19 same area, and to keep down confusion about which 20 one of the -- which one of the venues is supposed 21 to have each one of the -- they're selling 2.2 tickets for that particular venue, if we had one 23 investigator per the three applicants. 2.4 Meaning that that investigator who was 25 assigned to the very first applicant would only

1 have to deal with that particular person, and 2 where they're selling their tickets, and where the long lines are for that particular venue, or 3 that particular licensee, and we have the second 4 5 one for the second applicant, and a third one. And having three ABRA investigators 6 7 working the three events I think would make it 8 easier. Because I can't see, with the number of 9 people if all three of these are permitted, that 10 one investigator can thoroughly do that. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The suggestion 12 13 (Simultaneous speaking.) 14 MEMBER SHORT: Your ideas? Or maybe I 15 should ask this question of the investigator? 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, Mr. Short, this is part of the board will raise --17 18 (Simultaneous speaking.) 19 MEMBER SHORT: I can barely hear you, Mr. Chair. 20 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The board will 2.2 address your concern with the agency director. 23 That's a decision that the board will have this 2.4 conversation with the agency director. 25 MEMBER SHORT: Thank you very much.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank you Ms. Nelson. All right, let me bring this day to an end. As Chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Board for the District of Columbia, and in accordance with Title 3, Chapter 4 and 5 Office of Open Government, I move that ABC Board hold a closed meeting on September 21st for the purpose of discussing and hearing reports concerning ongoing or planned -- I'm sorry, not September 21st. I'm sorry.

On September 20th, I move the ABC
Board hold a closed meeting on September 20th for
the purpose of discussing and hearing reports
concerning ongoing or planned investigations of
alleged criminal or civil misconduct, or
violations of law, or regulations, and seeking

in the D.C. Register on September 15th. Is there

MEMBER SHORT: 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato? 4 MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato, I agree. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis? 6 MEMBER GRANDIS: Edward Grandis, I 7 agree. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Anderson, 9 The matter passes four zero zero. I agree. 10 it appears the motion has passed. I hereby give 11 notice that ABC Board will hold this closed 12 meeting pursuant to the Open Meetings Act, notice 13 will also be posted on the ABC Board hearing room 14 board, placed on the electronic calendar on 15 ABCA's website, and published in the D.C. 16 Register in a timely manner effectively. 17 We are now adjourned for the day.
