MS. FLETCHER: I'm going to call Butter Me Up. It's Case Number 21-PRO-00065, BMU 14, LLC, 1409 T Street NW, License Number ABRA118304. This is a Retailer Class CR new application. The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet, real property values, residential parking, and vehicular and pedestrian safety, over-concentration, and the licensee's record of compliance with the DC Official Code. Who is present on behalf of the applicant?

MR. BIANCO: Good morning, Ms.
Fletcher. Richard Bianco for the applicant. MS. FLETCHER: Good morning, Mr.

Bianco. Is anyone with you today?
MR. BIANCO: No.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
Present on behalf of the Shaw-Dupont Citizens Alliance?

MR. FERRIS: Yes, Ms. Fletcher, that would be Elwyn Ferris.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. And there's also a Group of 43. Who is present
on behalf of the Group of 43 ?
MR. FERRIS: Once again, Ms. Fletcher, I would be one of the two designated representatives.

MR. BARBOUR: And this is Dwight Barbour. I'm the other one.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Barbour. So Mr. Ferris, you and Mr. Barbour at the designated representatives for the Group of 43?

MR. FERRIS: That is correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Anyone else present from that Group today?

MR. FERRIS: I guess will go through the names, Ms. Fletcher, of the people that I see.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
MR. FERRIS: Okay. Well, of course, Mr. Estrada, Ramon Estrada is here with me.

MR. ESTRADA: Good morning.
MS. FLETCHER: Good morning.
MR. FERRIS: Then I see Ms. Phyllis Klein and Ms. --

MS. FLETCHER: Which -- Mr. Ferris, did you say Klein?

MR. FERRIS: Yes.

MS. KLEIN: Hi, Ms. Fletcher. Good morning.

MS. FLETCHER: Hi. Oh, hi. Oh, good morning.
(Simultaneous speaking)
MS. KLEIN: -- and Juan Meyer.
MS. FLETCHER: Yes, thank you.
MR. FERRIS: Continuing, I see Guy Podgornik.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you
MR. PODGORNIK: Present.
MR. FERRIS: Aileen Johnson.
MS. JOHNSON: Present.
MR. FERRIS: Chuck Young. On the petition, he's Charles Young.

MS. FLETCHER: Did you say Charles Young?

MR. FERRIS: Yes.
MR. YOUNG: Yes, present. Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: Charles Young. Mr. Young, can you spell your name for the record, please?

MR. YOUNG: Sure. The last name is Young, Y-O-U-N-G, Charles, C-H-A-R-L-E-S.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.

MR. YOUNG: Thank you. There are couple of telephone numbers. I'm not sure who those individuals are. If they could identify themselves if they are signatories on the Butter Me Up.

MS. FLETCHER: So I see two telephone numbers and then -- actually, I see three telephone numbers ending in 44.

MR. FERRIS: Oh.
MS. BEZILLA: One of those is mine. Thank you.

MR. BARBOUR: And the other one is Dwight Barbour.

MS. BEZILLA: Yes. I am Elizabeth Bezilla.

MR. FERRIS: Elizabeth Bezilla (audio interference) on the Butter Me Up petition.

MS. FLETCHER: Somebody needs to mute their phone. I just don't know who it is. I'm hearing some background noise somewhere. Elizabeth, what's your last name again?

MS. BEZILLA: Is Bezilla, B as in boy-E-Z-I-L-L-A.

MS. FLETCHER: Oh, yes. I've got your name. Thank you. And there was some --

MS. BEZILLA: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: - there was another person, Charles Young, Elizabeth Bezilla, and there's one other person whose number ends in 44.

MS. BEZILLA: That might be Dwight Barbour.

MS. FLETCHER: I got Mr. Barbour. Mr. Barbour, are you a part of Butter Me Up? Oh, yes, you're the designated representative. Never mind.

MR. BARBOUR: $I$ am and $I$ also have an abutting property as well.

MS. BEZILLA: Same --
MS. FLETCHER: Yes. I'm going to --
MS. BEZILLA: -- same with Elizabeth.
MS. FLETCHER: -- get down to that just in a minute. Thank you. Is that everyone from the Group of $43 ?$

MR. FERRIS: I'm sorry. Can you hear me, Ms. Fletcher?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. FERRIS: Okay. I'm sorry (audio interference) is Brian Racilla who is also a signatory on the Butter Me Up.

MR. RACILLA: And I'm --

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. I just
(simultaneously speaking) --
MR. RACILLA: -- still present.
MS. FLETCHER: -- him. Okay. All right.

MR. FERRIS: And as far as $I$ can tell, that would be my guess as to who was present on the Butter Me Up.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. I counted 10 people present on behalf of Butter Me Up.

MR. LEELA: Good morning, madam. My name is Varun S. -- the Butter Me Up -- Varun S. Leela.

MS. FLETCHER: Oh, thank you.
MR. LEELA: 1413 T Street, 205 is my apartment number.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
MR. PAIS: I am also here on behalf of -. I'm also here for that. I'm from 1413 T Street, 205 as well.

MS. FLETCHER: Oh, you -- yes, you are

MR. PAIS: Varun Pais.
MS. FLETCHER: -- part of another
group. You're part of a separate group. You're part of a Group of 3, which I'm going to get to in a moment. Right now I'm just --

MR. PAIS: Oh --
MS. FLETCHER: -- looking at the Group of 43 .

MR. PAIS: -- okay -- okay, ma'am, okay.

MS. FLETCHER: But thank you. I'm aware that, you know, that you're a part of the protest though.

MR. FERRIS: Ms. Fletcher?
MS. FLETCHER: Did somebody say
something?
MR. FERRIS: Ms. Fletcher?
MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. FERRIS: I'm sorry, but I believe you said you had 10. I don't seem to have 10 names. Could you go over those 10 names with me?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes. I have -- this is for Better Me Up -- I have Ramon Estrada. I have Ms. Klein and Mr. Juan Meyer. I have Guy, Aileen Johnson, Charles Young, Elizabeth Bezilla, Dwight Barbour, Elwyn Ferris, Brian Racilla. And I'm actually excluding Mr. Leela from that list
because he's a part of a separate group so I may have nine instead of ten.

MR. FERRIS: Actually --
(Simultaneous speaking)
MR. FERRIS: -- yes, I have the 10 as well. Thank you.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. You're welcome, which means that the Group of 43 has full standing as protestants. We have some other protestants in this matter.

MR. FERRIS: Excuse me once again, Ms. Fletcher.

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. FERRIS: Did we do SDCA as a protestant on Butter Me Up?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes, the Shaw-Dupont, yes.

MR. FERRIS: Okay. Thank you very much.

MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome. And we also have the Dupont Circle Citizens Association. Who's present on behalf of the Association, of the Dupont Circle Citizens Association?

MS. KLEIN: I see Kenlee Ray, but I see there's a little triangle in the corner of
her name that suggests there's low bandwidth. So I don't know if she can speak, but you'll see her name, Kenlee Ray.

MS. FLETCHER: So that was Ms. Klein speaking, yes?

MS. KLEIN: Yes. I recognize Kenlee Ray. She's the rep. I wonder if $I$ can -- I can try to reach her and let her know that her voice isn't coming through, and maybe she can call in.

MS. FLETCHER: Where do you see her on the screen?

MS. KLEIN: I see a square with just her name, Kenlee Ray.

MS. FLETCHER: Oh, I see it.
MS. KLEIN: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: That's sufficient.
MS. KLEIN: Okay. Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: I'll take that. So Ms. Ray -- Kenlee Ray is present but maybe she's having some technical difficulties. But I do see her present. Thank you.

And present on behalf of ANC 2B?
COMMISSIONER MULHALL: This is Commissioner Kyle Mulhall for ANC 2B.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Now we move --

I'm going to go to the Group of 3 next. So for the Group of 3, Mr. Leela, if you would state your name again. You signed your protest as a part of a Group of 3. If you would state your name again?

MR. LEELA: Yes, ma'am.
MS. FLETCHER: Would you just state it one more time?

MR. LEELA: My name is Varun Leela, madam. And --

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. LEELA: -- I am the same, T 1413 and 205 apartment number.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. Is anyone else present from your group today?

MR. PAIS: I am, Varun Pais.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. And if you could state your name for the record, please?

MR. PAIS: Varum Pais.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. Is anyone else present from the Group of 3? Thank you. Mr. Leela and Mr. Pais, you filed your protest as a part of a --

MR. KUMAR: This is Sajith Kumar. I'm sorry. I was talking. I was on mute. My video
was on. Sorry.
MS. FLETCHER: Oh, that's okay.
MR. KUMAR: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: You're a part of the Group of $\mathbf{3 ?}$

MR. KUMAR: That's right, madam.
MS. FLETCHER: Could you spell your name for the record, please?

MR. KUMAR: S-A-J-I-T-H, last name is Kumar, K-U-M-A-R. And actually last name is Chandrahasan Sajith Kumar Chandrahasen.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Kumar is separate. Okay. I have it spelled. Okay. Thank you.

MR. KUMAR: Yes, ma'am. It's Sajith Kumar Chandrahasan. That's right.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. So you three gentlemen filed your protest as a Group of 3.

MR. KUMAR: That's right.
MS. FLETCHER: In order to have standing as a protestant as a Group of 3, you would have to reside in a moratorium zone. The establishment is not located in a moratorium zone. The establishment is located at 1409 T

Street NW, which is not a moratorium zone. The only other way that you be -- could be considered protestants is if you filed as abutting property owners. So you're at 1413 T Street NW, yes? MR. KUMAR: Yes. It is next door to this Butter Me Up restaurant. It will be the most, you know, difficult for us, because this is -- my bedroom is right there.

MS. FLETCHER: In order to be considered as abutting property owners, you would have to state that claim in your protest letter. You didn't state in your protest letter that you were claiming to be abutting. I just happen to be aware that the building that you live in abuts but you didn't claim to be abutting. Therefore, I can't consider you as abutting property owners, because you didn't claim it prior to today. So the protest filed by Mr. Leela, Mr. Pais, and Mr. Chandrahasan is dismissed for those reasons. But you will have an opportunity to ask the Board to reconsider that decision and to grant you standing as a protestant. But you're not granted standing as a protestant today, because you're not part of a Group of 5, and you did not claim to be abutting property owners in your protest
letter.
What that means is that you'll receive a Board order dismissing your protest, and in that Board order, the Board gives you 10 days to seek reinstatement, to seek standing as a protestant. Just you'll have a chance to explain to the Board why you should be considered protestants in this matter.

MR. KUMAR: Okay. Thank you, ma'am.
MS. FLETCHER: We -- you're welcome. We have a few other protestants claiming to be abutting. I'm going to start with Dwight Barbour. Mr. Barbour, you reside in 1413 T Street NW, yes?

MR. BARBOUR: Correct.
MS. FLETCHER: And I can tell from the DC geographic information system that your building abuts the establishment, your building does. We have to determine whether or not your

MR. BARBOUR: And I a wall that I share with them.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Who's speaking?
MR. BARBOUR: This is Dwight Barbour.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So Mr. Barbour,
so I know that your building abuts. We have to determine if your unit abuts.

MR. BARBOUR: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Does your unit --
MR. BARBOUR: My unit is C4.
MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. BARBOUR: And I share a wall with the property.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So you share a wall.

MR. BARBOUR: Yes. And I also represent Joanne Kent today as well, and she also shares a wall.

MS. FLETCHER: You represent who, Mr. Barbour?

MR. BARBOUR: Joanne Kent.
MS. FLETCHER: You're representing Joanne Kent today?

MR. BARBOUR: That is correct and she also shares a wall with them --

MS. FLETCHER: So what's her unit number.

MR. BARBOUR: -- so she's involved.
MS. FLETCHER: What's her unit number?
MS. FLETCHER: Oh, I don't know that
off hand.
MS. BEZILLA: Unit 104.
MR. BARBOUR: Okay, it's 104.
MS. FLETCHER: So let me just a second. So only one person can speak at a time, and you've got to identify yourself for the court reporter, especially where there's only a telephone number because he can't see your name. So Mr. Barbour, I know you were speaking. Just a second. But somebody said something. I just don't know who it was. But any --

MS. BEZILLA: My apologies, Elizabeth Bezilla.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Ms. Bezilla, what did you say?

MS. BEZILLA: It's Unit Number 104.
MS. FLETCHER: Oh, you're saying that

MS. BEZILLA: Joanne --
MS. FLETCHER: -- Joanne Kent's -you're saying that Joanne Kent's Unit Number is 104?

MS. BEZILLA: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Just a second. Mr. Barbour, in terms of your unit, C4, what wall
will you share with the establishment?
MR. BARBOUR: The wall on the west side of their building.

MS. FLETCHER: But your --
MR. BARBOUR: I'm on the north -- I'm on the south end of the building. Elizabeth is in the middle, and on the north is Joanne at 104.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So you share a wall -- just where is your -- you share a wall on which side?

MR. BARBOUR: I'm on the front of the building, so I'm on the south side.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, one second.
MR. BARBOUR: Okay.
MS. FLETCHER: You're representing Ms.
Kent today. Ms. Kent is not present today?
MR. BARBOUR: That is correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. You're --
MR. BARBOUR: She sent in her
paperwork last week.
MS. FLETCHER: -- you're representing Ms. Kent today, and you said that --

MR. BARBOUR: Correct.
MS. FLETCHER: -- her unit -- you said that her unit, 104, also abuts?

MR. BARBOUR: Yes. She's on the north end. She's on the north side, north end of the wall that we share.

MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Barbour, are you --
MR. BARBOUR: Yes, ma'am.
MS. FLETCHER: -- also representing Julian Sannes today?

MR. BARBOUR: No. I don't recognize that name. Oh, wait, yes, I am. I'm sorry. That's her business partner. Yes. I'm sorry. Yes.

MS. FLETCHER: Do you have -- just a second --

MR. BARBOUR: They submitted the proper paperwork well before the 48 hours.

MS. FLETCHER: I know.
MR. BARBOUR: And I got (audio interference). Okay.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So you're also representing Julian Sannes. I'm just going to spell that, S-A-N-N-E-S. We had that on the record, but $I$ just wanted to spell it because it's spelled in an unusual way. And so Ms. Bezilla, Ms. Kent, and Sannes have a wall that they share with the establishment on the north
side?
MR. BARBOUR: Yes. Bezilla is in between us, so I'm on the south side. Then it's Elizabeth, and then on the north side is Joanne Kent's unit.

MS. FLETCHER: Let me just to back to clarify something here. Mr. Barbour, you said that your C4 shares a wall on the front south side?

MR. BARBOUR: Correct, southeast.
MS. KLEIN: Their -- Ms. LaVerne, their east wall --

MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Klein, what did you say?

MS. KLEIN: -- their east wall shares the west wall of the establishment.

MS. FLETCHER: And whose wall is that?
MS. KLEIN: The 1413 T Street wall, all the units just mentioned share -- their east wall shares the west wall of the Butter Me Up establishment.

MR. BARBOUR: That's right.
MS. FLETCHER: And Ms. Bezilla, you mentioned that you're in Unit 101 and you share a wall as well?

MS. BEZILLA: Yes. My bedroom -- my bed actually -- my headboard is the party wall separating our building and Butter Me Up.

MR. BARBOUR: This is Dwight Barbour. And my bedroom wall also touches their wall, that same wall.

MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Bianco?
MR. BIANCO: Yes, Ms. Fletcher.
MS. FLETCHER: Do you have any objection or comments to the explanation provided by the protestants in terms of how -- where their properties abut --

MR. BIANCO: I would like to move to dismiss based on our condo class, but I'm not going to address the issue here. I think it's more appropriate for a written motion. As to the Kent and Sannes protest, neither are here. I don't have a designation of representative either in the protest letter; or if one was subsequently filed, $I$ don't have it. Since it's not a group of five or more, they shouldn't have standing if they didn't show up.

MR. BARBOUR: Well --
MS. FLETCHER: So Mr. Bianco, we've been accepting protests when a designated
representative shows up for another party event when that person is not present as long as somebody shows up. Well, we're right about what you're saying.

MR. BIANCO: Where's the designation is my question $I$ suppose.

MS. FLETCHER: There -- we got it today.

MR. BIANCO: Okay. That's --
MS. FLETCHER: We didn't need one before today.

MR. BIANCO: No. That's perfectly fine. I just haven't seen it which is the reason for my objection. So I take -- certainly take your representation but again, reserve rights to move to dismiss.

MS. FLETCHER: I'm sorry, what did you say, Mr. Bianco.

MR. BIANCO: I certainly accept your representation, but $I$ reserve my rights to file a subsequent motion to dismiss.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. Ms. Bezilla, did you hear that?

MS. BEZILLA: No. I'm not sure what he was talking about.

MS. FLETCHER: I'll explain. You're representing Ms. Kent and Ms. Sannes?

MR. BARBOUR: No.
MS. BEZILLA: I am not.
MR. BARBOUR: It's Dwight Barbour.
MS. FLETCHER: I'm sorry, Mr. Barbour. I'm very sorry. Excuse me. I'm sorry.

MR. BARBOUR: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Just a second.
MS. BEZILLA: No worry.
MS. FLETCHER: One second. Give me one minute. One second.
(Pause.)
MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Barbour, you're representing --

MR. BARBOUR: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: -- Ms. Kent and Ms.
Sannes?
MR. BARBOUR: That is correct.
MS. FLETCHER: What -- so did you have any question about what Mr. Bianco said?

MR. BARBOUR: Well, I think -- well, he didn't receive the letter that we did inviting us to this that said that you could designate a representative on a -- a designee I think was the
phrase they used as long as the paperwork was submitted 24 hours in advance. And so Joanne and her business partner sent that in, and we got -I got another invitation to attend this Webex event from somebody at ABRA there. So we just followed the rules and that's what they said we could do.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So just Mr. Bianco was saying that he did not see a letter from Joanne Kent or Julian Sannes designating you as their representative, but he's willing to accept that today but reserving his right to object to it later. Am I right, Mr. Bianco? MR. BIANCO: That's correct.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So we'll just kind of --

MR. BARBOUR: Okay.
MS. FLETCHER: -- move forward with you as the designated representative for now for Ms. Kent and Ms. Sannes.

MR. BARBOUR: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: Welcome. So let me recap her. So in the matter of Butter Me Up, we have as protestants the Shaw-Dupont Citizens Alliance represented by Elwyn Ferris; the Group
of 43 represented by Elwyn Ferris and Dwight Barbour; the Dupont Circle Citizens Association represented by Kenlee Ray; ANC 2B represented by Kyle Mulhall; as abutting property owners, we have Dwight Barbour, Elizabeth Bezilla, Joanne Kent, and Julian Sannes; and we've dismissed, or I've dismissed the Group of 3 for the reasons already stated.

We need to set a date for mediation, a status hearing, and a protest hearing. I'll give you the date for the status and protest hearing. The status hearing is set for October 6, 2021 at 10:30. The protest hearing is set for November 3rd. I don't have a time to give to you today for the protest hearing, but it is set for November 3rd, and I'll provide you with the time following the roll call hearing.

We need to set a date for mediation. I'll give you the next available day. The next available day is Wednesday, September 22, or we could do Tuesday, the 21st, actually any time after 11:30. So do you want to take a look at September 21st first, or does anybody -- well, no, none of you have hearings here on the 21st as far as $I$ know.

MS. KLEIN: Ms. --
MR. BARBOUR: LaVerne, what time on the 22nd, please?

MS. FLETCHER: The 22nd would be anytime between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

MS. KLEIN: And would remind us, is that a -- what type of hearing is that?

MS. FLETCHER: That would be -- I'm setting up the mediation now.

MS. KLEIN: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: Yes. So Mr. Bianco, would the 22nd work for you, Wednesday?

MR. BIANCO: Given the cast of hundreds that we're dealing with scheduling on, I can make either day at any time work, and everyone else can sort of work it out.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Well, then in that case, let me start with Mr. Ferris. Mr. Ferris?

MR. FERRIS: Yes, Ms. Fletcher.
MS. FLETCHER: Are you available on the 21st or the 22nd?

MR. FERRIS: I would be available both days but do you have a specific time in mind?

MS. FLETCHER: Well, for the 21st, we
could do it at 11:30. On the 22 nd , we can do it anytime between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00.

MR. FERRIS: All right. On the 22nd, like noon or 1:00 would be preferred.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
MR. FERRIS: And -- but I would also be available on the 21st. I believe you said 11:30?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. FERRIS: Yes. I'm available for either one of those, whichever is most convenient for the other parties, the other groups.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Well, okay, Mr. Ferris, that takes care of the Group of 43 as well.

MR. FERRIS: Correct. What about the -- did somebody say something? What about -MS. KLEIN: DCCA, because Kenlee's voice can't be heard, she's put into the chat that she's available on the 21st after 1:30 and also available on the 22nd.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Let's move to the 22nd then. So we're going to move to the 22nd. So Ms. Ray is available on the 22n at 1:00?

MS. RAY: Yes. Can you hear me?
MS. FLETCHER: What about Kyle
Mulhall, are you still there?
COMMISSIONER MULHALL: I am.
MS. FLETCHER: Oh, there you are.
COMMISSIONER MULHALL: I can do
anytime on the 21st. I can do the 22nd but it would -- preferably in the morning but at least before 1:00.

MR. FERRIS: Mr. Ferris, would 11:00 work for you on the 22nd? If not, we can move to another day. I'm just trying to see what could happen on the 22nd.

MR. FERRIS: I could. Can you hear me?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. FERRIS: Okay.
MS. FLETCHER: You want to move to the 23rd?

MR. FERRIS: Yes. That would -- if that's convenient for everybody, the -- let's move to the 23rd.

MS. FLETCHER: At 1:00?
MR. FERRIS: Sounds great.
COMMISSIONER MULHALL: This is Kyle

Mulhall. Unfortunately, $I$ can't do the 23rd. I could do the 24th?

MS. FLETCHER: I can do the 24th. Can -- I'm still starting at the top of the list. Mr. Ferris, can you do the 24th at 1:00?

MR. FERRIS: I certainly can.
MS. KLEIN: It looks like that works for Kenlee Ray as well for DCCA.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So 1:00 works for -- on the 24th, Friday, works for Shaw Dupont Citizens Alliance. It works for the Group of 43. It works for Kenlee Ray?

MS. KLEIN: That's DCCA, the Dupont Circle Citizens Association.

MS. FLETCHER: Dupont Citizens Association. It works for Mr. Mulhall. Does it work for Mr. Barbour?

MR. BARBOUR: Yes, it certainly does. Thank you very much, LaVerne.

MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome. What about Ms. Bezilla, does it work for you?

MS. BEZILLA: Yes, it does.
MS. FLETCHER: And so Ms. Bezilla, can you inform -- well, I'll inform Ms. Kent and Ms. Sannes of the mediation. I'm going to send them
an invitation for the same time.
MS. BEZILLA: Okay, yes.
MS. FLETCHER: And Ms. Bezilla, may I -- if by some chance, you're going to represent them in mediation, you'll need to -- you'll need that designated representative form.

MS. BEZILLA: Okay. Dwight Barbour is representing them.

MS. FLETCHER: I mean they should submit --

MR. BARBOUR: This is Dwight Barbour --
MS. FLETCHER: -- they should submit that anyway. It is not in the record.

MR. BARBOUR: LaVerne, they have already submitted --

MS. FLETCHER: They should submit --
MR. BARBOUR: -- that and we've received confirmation of that already, so I think we're ready to go. But if there's anything --

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
MR. BARBOUR: -- else, let me know.
Thank you so much.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
Perfect. You're welcome. That's everybody. Did I miss anybody? That's all the groups that are
available at 1:00 on Friday, September 24th. I think that's everybody. So --

MR. BARBOUR: Perfect.
MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Bianco, that's good for you, right?

MR. BIANCO: Yes. That's perfectly fine. I can make that work. I would have one -I suppose we can call it a request. Since we have a large number of protestants, I would ask for the Group of 43 to send its -- of course send its designated representatives, but $I$ just don't want to have an unworkable number of individuals in the mediation, like even if only 10 show up, I think it would be potentially problematic. So I suppose that's an ask of the Group and not something that I would -- that I could have required. But I would just like to keep it as focused as possible and not have to deal with 40 or 50 people.

MS. FLETCHER: Well, mediation definitely works best when there's just the designated representative or, you know, just -you know, or a couple people. A Group of 43 or anywhere near that number would make it pretty difficult logistically. But -- so Mr. Ferris
heard your request.
MR. FERRIS: Yes. Again, I'm not sure, can you hear me?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. FERRIS: I notice you're (audio interference) with -- yes, Mr. Bianco and Ms. Fletcher. Yes. We understand that it can be cumbersome having too many people at any of these mediation sessions, so I think the Group has decided that, you know, just Mr. Barbour and myself representing their interest is the best way to go. We fully concur with what Mr. Bianco has said and it'll just likely be Mr. Barbour and myself.

MS. FLETCHER: That would be perfect, Mr. Ferris. Well, I'd like to thank everybody for coming. I look forward to seeing everybody on the 24th at 1:00, and I'll send out the invitations sometime today.

MS. KLEIN: Thank you, Ms. Fletcher.
MS. FLETCHER: You're very welcome.
Your welcome. Nice to see everybody.
(Whereupon, at 11:01 a.m., the roll call hearing in the above-entitled matter was concluded.)
