3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case on
4	our calendar is Case Number 25-PRO-00077, DC Garden
5	Hill, License Number 128404.
6	Mr. Orellana, can you please elevate the
7	rights of the parties in this case?
8	MR. ORELLANA: Sure thing. Mark
9	Lumpkins, access elevated. And, Darrel Rippeteau,
10	access elevated. That is all, Chair.
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
12	(Pause.)
13	MR. LUMPKINS: Yes, hello, Mark Lumpkins
14	here.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on a minute,
16	hold on one minute, please. Do you have a camera
17	you can turn on, sir?
18	Can the parties if you have a camera, can
19	you please come on camera?
20	MR. LUMPKINS: Yes, one moment, one
21	moment.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
23	(Pause.)
24	MR. RIPPETEAU: Well, we're unable to turn
25	on the camera.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, all
2	right, okay, that's fine. If this matter goes to,
3	if this matter however goes to a hearing, I'm asking
4	that the parties ensure that since our hearings are
5	virtual, I'm hoping that the parties are able to
6	go on camera so I can see who it is that's being.
7	All right, who is the licensee, the
8	applicant in this case?
9	MR. LUMPKINS: All right, I'm here.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you the
11	applicant, sir?
12	MR. LUMPKINS: Yes.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ah yes, you are,
14	yes.
15	MR. LUMPKINS: Yes, sir.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I remember. And
17	can you please spell and state your name for the
18	record, sir?
19	MR. LUMPKINS: My name is Mark Lumpkins,
20	that's Mark, M-A-R-K, Lumpkins, L-U-M-P-K-I-N-S.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, good
22	morning, sir.
23	And, the protestant, can you please
24	identify yourself for the record?
25	MR. RIPPETEAU: Darrel Rippeteau, and my

1	wife Judy Rippeteau. We're both here and we live
2	next door.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you please
4	spell your name for the record?
5	MR. RIPPETEAU: Darrel is D-A-R-E-L,
6	Rippeteau is R-I-P-P-E-T-E-A-U.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you.
8	MS. RIPPETEAU: And, my name is Judith
9	Rippeteau, J-U-D-I-T-H R-I-P-P-E-T-E-A-U.
10	MR. RIPPETEAU: In the past, we've been
11	able to do the video.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, yes,
13	sir, and I do recall seeing you on video before so
14	we'll figure out if this matter goes to a hearing,
15	I'm hoping that you'll be able to figure it out to
16	get on camera. Okay.
17	MR. RIPPETEAU: Is it one of the devices,
18	sir, at the bottom? Is it start video or?
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.
20	MR. ORELLANA: Yes, start video.
21	MS. RIPPETEAU: Integrate?
22	MR. RIPPETEAU: Let's do it again.
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, well
24	it's not mandatory. It's not mandatory for you to
25	be on camera today but I'm just saying if we, if

1	this matter goes to a protest hearing, then we'll
2	try to see what is, or our IT specialist will.
3	MR. ORELLANA: Yes, I messaged you
4	directly just in case if you have any issues, let
5	me know.
6	MR. RIPPETEAU: I see a picture of us on
7	our own TV screen, on our own computer, but I do
8	not see that you see it.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No, we're unable
LO	to see you, sir.
L1	MR. RIPPETEAU: We clicked on show with
L2	others and camera. It's showing that we're on it,
L3	but it's
L4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, I'm
L5	still, I'm waiting a little bit. I'm still waiting
L6	to get
L7	MR. RIPPETEAU: Sorry for this delay.
L8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, that's fine.
L9	No, it's not your delay, sir. All right, are there
20	any preliminary matters in this case? Mr.
21	Lumpkins, are there any preliminary matters you need
22	to bring to the attention of the Board?
23	MR. LUMPKINS: Yes, sir. If I will, so
24	I appreciate you taking the time this morning
25	(Simultaneous speaking.)

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr
2	MR. LUMPKINS: I'm sorry?
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, hold on
4	one minute please. This is just if you're having
5	any preliminary issues.
6	So this is not, you don't need to
7	MR. LUMPKINS: Well, I just go ahead.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Hold on, hold on.
9	I'm just, I'm trying to state to you the difference
10	in this hearing and other hearings that I've had
11	with you.
12	So, basically you have applied for a
13	license and the Rippeteaus have protested it. And
14	so, you're going to go through the process in a sense
15	that you're going to go the process to have a protest
16	hearing.
17	And so, what this process is just a status.
18	MR. LUMPKINS: Sure.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I don't take
20	arguments so if you have like any specific problems
21	in getting in contact, or something is going wrong,
22	that's what I ask for here.
23	But not for explanation for you to explain
24	to me what is going on with the license. It's just
25	that do you have like any procedural type of problem

1	in moving through this process.
2	So, that's what this purpose of this
3	hearing is for, sir.
4	MR. LUMPKINS: Yes, and I completely
5	understand. I was just going to just ask you for
6	a motion to dismiss this case. That's all.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.
8	MR. LUMPKINS: Dismiss this protest.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, and so
LO	if you want to dismiss the protest, then you have
L1	to do something in writing.
L2	You have to file something in writing to
L3	tell us why is it that the Rippeteaus as abutting
L4	property owners, that they have not provided the
L5	Board with the appropriateness standard to protest
L6	your license application.
L7	So, I would ask you could put something
L8	in writing, send it to us, send it to the Rippeteaus,
L9	and we will review it and then the Board will make
20	a determination on your motion.
21	MR. LUMPKINS: Sure.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, because I
23	think that you can make the motion but then they
24	will have an opportunity, they're going to need an
25	opportunity to respond.

1	And so, if it was, if they had made the
2	motion to dismiss your application, it's the same
3	standard. I would ask that they provide it in
4	writing.
5	So by providing it in writing, you'll
6	provide a copy to the Board. You provide a copy
7	to the Rippeteaus, and the Board will give them an
8	opportunity to respond in writing to your motion.
9	And if they don't respond, or whatever
10	response is given, then we will review and make a
11	determination whether or not we're going to grant
12	your motion, or deny your motion.
13	MR. LUMPKINS: Understood.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Mr.
15	and Mrs. Rippeteau, do you have an procedural
16	questions that you'll need to bring to the attention
17	of the Board?
18	MR. RIPPETEAU: Yes, sir. We understood
19	that this was a meeting to, a status hearing meeting
20	today.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.
22	MR. RIPPETEAU: And, that we are, we have
23	the right to appear on Wednesday, October 1 at 1:30,
24	to formally protest.
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, sir,

1	you will have the protest hearing. So the protest
2	hearing is scheduled for October 1.
3	Have you guys had the mediation as yet?
4	MR. LUMPKINS: Yes.
5	MR. RIPPETEAU: We did, yes.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And, it was not
7	successful?
8	MR. RIPPETEAU: It was not, I guess. I
9	mean
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, meaning that
11	the parties didn't agree.
12	MS. RIPPETEAU: Right.
13	MR. LUMPKINS: Well, I'm going to say
14	this. Mr. Anderson, I'm going to say this. That
15	Mrs. Fletcher said that this matter is not with ABCA.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, so I
17	have not, I don't know what the issue is. And so,
18	but Ms. Fletcher did not dismiss them as a protestor,
19	is that correct?
20	MR. LUMPKINS: Yes.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, so I
22	don't know what the issues that are being raised
23	by the Rippeteaus, and I don't know whether or not
24	it is a protestable issue.
25	So what I would ask for you to do sir, is

1	that you can raise that in writing to us.
2	MR. LUMPKINS: Sure.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You can raise that
4	in writing to us if you know what the issue is, and
5	you can state, yes, I can now see you both.
6	MS. RIPPETEAU: Thank you.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, you can
8	MR. RIPPETEAU: Amazing technological
9	leap by us. Amazing.
LO	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, that's
L1	fine.
L2	So Mr. Lumpkins, so you can put that in
L3	writing and we can, the Board, yes, as I stated
L4	before, yes.
L5	As I stated, file your motion and we will
L6	address it in writing. And if, and the Board will
L7	make a determination as to whether or not we're going
L8	to dismiss, whether or not we're going to dismiss
L9	the protest.
20	I don't know what the, I don't know the,
21	my assumption is that because we are here today,
22	that as abutting property owners, the agency granted
23	them standing for us to move forward.
24	And so, I guess at the hearing, that's when
25	I will know what the issues are. And you, sir, can

1	also even if the Board, say for example if you're
2	right and issue a motion, if you draft a motion and
3	ask us to dismiss it and even if the Board denies
4	it, you can still raise that motion at the hearing.
5	You can renew the motion at the hearing
6	once the testimony has been presented, okay?
7	MR. LUMPKINS: Yes.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Because
9	MR. LUMPKINS: So one more question. So
LO	even at this status hearing, I can't ask for a motion
L1	to be, for the case, for this protest to be
L2	dismissed?
L3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You'll
L4	(Simultaneous speaking.)
L5	MR. LUMPKINS: Even at this motion?
L6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: get a motion but
L7	I'm asking you sir, to put it in writing.
L8	MR. LUMPKINS: Sure.
L9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Because I don't
20	know, you can raise the motion and I think you're
21	going to raise some legal issues, and I'm not in
22	a position to address the legal issues you're going
23	to raise in your motion.
24	So that's why I'm saying that I need you
25	to write it in. So yes, you have raised the motion

1	but I'm asking you to put it in writing.
2	MR. LUMPKINS: Okay.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Because then we
4	can do the proper research to respond with the legal
5	reasoning, whether or not we agree or disagree with
6	your motion.
7	MR. LUMPKINS: Okay.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So that's what I'm
9	saying. So I'm not denying your request. I'm just
LO	saying please put it in writing.
L1	MR. LUMPKINS: Okay.
L2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. All
L3	right, Mr. and Mrs. Rippeteau, do you have any
L4	procedural matters you need to bring to the
L5	attention of the Board?
L6	MR. RIPPETEAU: Yes, sir, we'd just like
L7	to confirm we understand that we need to prepare
L8	a form that lists our protests
L9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The witnesses, and
20	the documents you're going to rely upon, and the
21	witnesses you're going to rely upon.
22	And you need to provide that document to
23	ABCA legal, and to Mr. Lumpkins, seven days before
24	the date of the hearing.
25	MR. RIPPETEAU: Seven days before. And

1	we'll get that via Ms. Fletcher?
2	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Not from Ms.
3	Fletcher. Did you receive an email from Ms.
4	Goodwin, to tell you about the hearing today?
5	MR. RIPPETEAU: Yes.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Reach out to Ms.
7	Goodwin and tell Ms. Goodwin, ask her to provide
8	you a copy of the PIP.
9	MR. RIPPETEAU: Thank you, sir.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So, and Mr.
11	Lumpkins, that's the same for you, too. Seven days
12	before the hearing, you are required to provide us
13	a copy, you have to do a PIP.
14	MR. LUMPKINS: Okay.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, sir? So
16	that document must list if you're going to call any
17	other witnesses besides yourself.
18	If you're going to rely on documents and
19	witnesses, those documents and witnesses must be
20	disclosed seven days before the hearing, through
21	the form of the PIP.
22	You can call Ms. Goodwin, who provided you
23	information about this hearing today, and ask her
24	to provide you with that document.
25	But both parties, if you don't know how

1	to do the document, you can reach out to our office.
2	Our office will provide, will provide you the
3	guidance how to file these documents.
4	I don't want when we have this hearing for
5	either party to say that I did not know what to do
6	because no one told me.
7	So I'm letting you know if you don't know
8	how to do it, reach out to our legal office and we
9	will provide you with the guidance how to complete
10	these documents.
11	And you have to ensure that these documents
12	are provided to the opposing party, and to ABCA
13	legal, seven days before the hearing.
14	MS. RIPPETEAU: Sir, is that calendar
15	days?
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Seven calendar
17	days before the hearing.
18	MS. RIPPETEAU: Okay, and who would
19	(Simultaneous speaking.)
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: This hearing, so
21	this hearing is scheduled for October 1 at 1:30,
22	so, which is Wednesday, let's see, Wednesday,
23	October 1.
24	So, it must be provided by September 24,
25	which is seven days before.

1	MR. LUMPKINS: And, this is in addition
2	to the motion document, right?
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The motion is
4	separate and apart, sir.
5	MR. LUMPKINS: Right, all right.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So the motion, you
7	can do the motion tomorrow. Or you can do your PIP
8	tomorrow, too.
9	But I'm just saying though, these, this
10	document if you don't, you can reach out to our legal
11	office who has provided you guidance and
12	instructions of how to do, for this hearing today.
13	Have them provide you the PIP document.
14	And this document is to, it must be provided to
15	us seven days prior to the hearing, okay?
16	MR. LUMPKINS: Understood.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And when we have
18	the hearing, each side you'll have 90 minutes to
19	present your case, and you can call five witnesses.
20	MS. RIPPETEAU: And sir?
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, sir? Yes,
22	ma'am?
23	MS. RIPPETEAU: I have a question.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am?
25	MS. RIPPETEAU: I just lost it. Give me

1	a minute, please.
2	(Pause.)
3	MR. RIPPETEAU: I have a brief question,
4	sir. Is it Ms. Goodwin next that we can contact
5	for guidance?
6	MS. RIPPETEAU: That was my guidance.
7	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I believe so, but
8	you can reach out to her and she can provide you
9	with the answer. She's in our legal office so if
10	she can't provide you with the response that you
11	need
12	MR. RIPPETEAU: And she
13	(Simultaneous speaking.)
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: she'll find
15	someone in the legal office who can provide you the
16	response that you require.
17	MS. RIPPETEAU: Thank you.
18	MR. RIPPETEAU: Thanks, very much.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any other
20	questions, Mr. Lumpkins?
21	MR. LUMPKINS: No, sir.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, well
23	good luck. As I said to the parties, although you
24	had mediation it was not settled.
25	You guys can continue talking and you can,

1	if you believe the matter can be settled, then it
2	can be settled as I said, all right.
3	But if not, I'll see you on October 1 and
4	Mr. Lumpkins, you can file your motion at any point
5	to why is it you believe that they do not have the
6	proper standing to move forward with a protest
7	hearing, okay?
8	MR. LUMPKINS: Absolutely. Thank you.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, thank
10	you then.
11	MR. RIPPETEAU: Thank you very much.
12	MS. RIPPETEAU: Thank you.
13	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, have a
14	great day, bye.
