The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board met via Video Teleconference, LaVerne Fletcher, Board's Agent, presiding.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. I am calling Case Number 20-PRO-00028, Pho Viet Restaurant, Inc., trading as Pho Viet, USA, 333 H Street, NE, License Number ABRA-116771.

This is a Retailer Class CR, New Application. The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet, real property values, residential parking, and vehicular and pedestrian safety.

I'm going to take a few moments to elevate the rights for each party to this case to enable you to, to enable your camera and your microphone. So hold on for just a second.

The parties in this matter have been elevated. Mr. Lee? Mr. Lee? Mr. Lee?

Mr. Eckenwiler, are you there?
MR. ECKENWILER: I'm here. Can you hear me, Ms. Fletcher?

MS. FLETCHER: I sure can. I don't know why I can't hear Mr. Lee right now.

MR. ECKENWILER: Based on his video, it looks like he may have stepped away from the computer.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Well, I know he's here. I will just go ahead and proceed to the extent that $I$ can. I'll give him a couple more minutes. He's been here for a while, I guess he stepped away for a moment. But he's been here quite a while. I'll give him a minute.

Mr. Lee?
Let me make sure there's something I don't need to do on my end. I've got this little thing here. Is he muted?

So, Mr. Lee, I actually can't hear you. Just a second.

MR. ECKENWILER: He's unmuted now.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay, Mr. Lee? Why can't I hear Mr. Lee?

Okay, so $I$ can't hear you, Mr. Lee. I don't know why. I'm going to go ahead and grant standing to ANC 6C as a protestant. So Mr. Eckenwiler, Mr. Eckenwiler?

MR. ECKENWILER: Yes, Ms. Fletcher.
MS. FLETCHER: So I'm granting standing to ANC 6C as a protestant. We're not going to set a date for a status hearing or a protest hearing today, because those dates aren't available for the Board yet.

But we're going to go ahead and set a date for mediation. And I'll give you the next available date. I don't know why I can't communicate with Mr. Lee at this point. But I will send him an email regarding the date that you choose to see if that's okay for him.

The next available day for mediation is October 15.

MR. ECKENWILER: So, Ms. Fletcher?
MS. FLETCHER: Yes, sir.
MR. ECKENWILER: That's sort of okay for me. Let me just explain. I have been called for federal jury duty service from October 9th through the 23rd inclusive.

MS. FLETCHER: Mm-hmm.
MR. ECKENWILER: And I don't believe they are actually holding trials right now. So I think the odds of my being otherwise occupied that day are low.

But it's, of course, possible that things will change. And the difficulty is you don't, for federal petty jury service, $I$ have to call in the evening before. So $I$ would not know until after 5:00 p.m. the day before.

So I'm happy to set the 15th, if
people are okay with a last minute change. If that's going to be too cumbersome for you or for Mr. Lee, then we should just set it for a date after the 23rd, unfortunately.

MS. FLETCHER: Well, that's okay.
Well, let me ask you this. When is the beginning of your service, the court service?

MR. ECKENWILER: The first day that it starts is October 9th.

MS. FLETCHER: October 9th?
MR. ECKENWILER: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Oh, okay. Okay. Well then what I'll do, I'll go ahead and set it for the 15th, and we'll just wait and see.

MR. ECKENWILER: Okay. And, I'm sorry, what time did you say for that?

MS. FLETCHER: The times are, excuse me one second.

Okay, Mr. Eckenwiler, Mr. Lee said that he's calling in since $I$ couldn't hear him. So let me connect then by phone.

MR. ECKENWILER: Okay, that's fine. I'll hold.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Excuse me one second, Mr. Eckenwiler.

So on the 15th, Mr. Eckenwiler, we could make it $9: 00,10: 00,11: 00,1: 00$ or $2: 00$, pretty much any time up until 2:00 in the afternoon that's available for you.

Mr. Lee was on the line. He's not on the line now, probably had something to do with me, but he's no longer there. So just what's a good time for you on the 15th?

MR. ECKENWILER: So again, subject to my getting called for trial jury duty, any of those times is fine. It I may, I'd like to suggest not 9:00 a.m. just so there's a little bit of a buffer in case $I$ do need to postpone it.

I think 10:00 or 11:00 would probably be more convenient just because that way, you know, you and Mr. Lee would have an opportunity in the morning to see, you know, if I've gotten a change in my status.

MS. FLETCHER: Yes. Well, let's make it 11:00.

MR. ECKENWILER: Okay. Let's do 11:00 a.m. That would work for me, but of course, and I understand, you know, Mr. Lee is not on the call right now. But if we need to adjust to another date, I'm fine with that. But as I say,
the difficulty is simply that through October 23rd, you know, I would have that same asterisk on my schedule.

MS. FLETCHER: Right. Okay. Well, I'll communicate that to Mr. Lee. Mr. Lee has been here for a while. Sorry we couldn't connect to Mr. Lee. But I will let him know the mediation has tentatively been set for October 15 at 11:00, depending on you availability related to your court service.

MR. ECKENWILER: Okay. And I'll be in contact with him in the interim to see whether or not we can get this matter disposed of before then.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. And you know what happens next, so if you can work it out, we'll cancel the mediation.

MR. ECKENWILER: Understood.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you.
MR. ECKENWILER: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay, bye-bye. Logging out.
