CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, everyone. As Chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the District of Columbia, in accordance with D.C. Code Section 2-576 of the Open Meetings Act, I am welcoming you to the regular scheduled meeting of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. This meeting is being conducted pursuant to guidance made available by the District of Columbia's Office of Open Government regarding electronic meetings held by a public bodies during the public emergency.

Pursuant to this guidance, notice of today's meeting was provided 48 hours in advance of the meeting on ABRA's website and on the District's Central Meeting Calendar. The notice included the time, date, agenda, and call-in or log-in information for public participation. 21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board has		
22	six members in attendance for the conduct of		
23	business today, and that constitutes a quorum.		
24	Before we get underway with today's hearing		
25	calendar, I need to make a few instructions very		

clear so that the Board -- the conduct of these hearings is understood by everyone. There are two cases scheduled for this morning's calendar.

Once your case is called, I will take a moment for IT specialists to elevate the rights for each party to enable their camera and microphone. Then and only then will you have the ability to enable your equipment. If your case has not been heard, you will remain mute and your camera will be disabled.

At the conclusion of each case, the parties will have the option to leave. If the party choose to stay, all cameras and microphones for the concluded case will be disabled. Our first order of business today is a protest hearing status, Case No. 21-PRO-00064, Park Market, License No. 94178. Ms. Andrews, can you please elevate the rights of the parties in this case, please? Thank you.

MS. ANDREWS: Sure. Stand by. Mr. Malmo, your rights have been elevated. Mr.

Jackson, your rights have been elevated. 1 2 Ms. Kahassai, your rights have been elevated. 3 That's all, Mr. Chair. 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. For 5 the folks who have a camera, can you please turn your camera on, please, if you have a camera? 6 7 And I see names. I don't see anyone at the 8 So if you are able to, please. moment. Thank 9 Mr. Malmo, do you have a camera? you. 10 Mr. Malmo? Mr. Malmo, are you there, sir? 11 12 MR. MALMO: I'm here. 13 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Malmo, are 14 you there? 15 MR. MALMO: I'm sorry. I don't have 16 a camera. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, 18 fine. I just want to make sure so I can hear 19 you. That's fine. All right. Let's start with 20 the -- good morning, everyone. Thank you for 21 being here --22 MR. MALMO: Yes. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- for the 24 protest hearing. 25 I'm present. MR. MALMO:

16	I don't see him available.		
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who's that?		
18	There's someone in a liquor store.		
19	MR. KAHASSAI: Yes.		
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is that the		
21	owner?		
22	MR. KAHASSAI: Yes.		
23	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Can		
24	you please state and spell your name for the		
25	record, please?		

MR. KAHASSAI: First name, Gebre, G-E-1 2 Last name, K-A-H-A-S-S-A-I. B-R-E. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: How do you pronounce that, sir? 4 5 MR. KAHASSAI: Gebre Kahassai. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, 6 7 Mr. Kahassai. One, I will ask you one thing, 8 sir. Can you please put your telephone down, 9 whatever you're using? Just put it down for it 10 to be stable because you're moving it's kind of -11 - so just put it -- rest it in one space so it 12 does not move. All right. Mr. Malmo, can you please 13 14 state -- I'm sorry. Mr. Malmo, can you spell and 15 state your name for the record, please? 16 Mr. Malmo? 17 Mr. Malmo? 18 Mr. Malmo? 19 I believe Mr. Malmo is having some technical difficulties. I see his name on the 20 21 I heard he did introduce himself screen. 22 earlier, but I'm not quite sure what is going on 23 with Mr. Malmo. Is there anything you can do to 24 assist, Ms. Andrews? 25 MS. ANDREWS: I can have him log back

out and log in. But it seems like he's having 1 2 connectivity issues. His WiFi isn't (audio 3 interference). 4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Are 5 you there, Mr. Malmo? Maybe Mr. Malmo rather that he can just be a call-in. I think he's 6 7 gone. So I guess he'll probably try to 8 reconnect. 9 Sir, is it possible for you to just 10 put the phone down, sir? Is it possible? I'm 11 speaking to the owner. Is it possible for you 12 just to put your phone -- just -- yeah, just keep 13 it in one place. I mean, I'm getting dizzy 14 because it's moving. Mr. Malmo, are you there? 15 MR. MALMO: Yes, I'm present. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you please 17 spell and state your name for the record, please? 18 MR. MALMO: Jerry, J-E-R-R-Y, Malmo, 19 M-A-L-M-O. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And who are 21 you, sir? 22 MR. MALMO: I'm one of the 23 protestants. 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You're the 25 protestant for what, sir? What -- can you tell -

- can you identify the group that you represent, sir?

MR. MALMO: A number of residents of Capitol -- or the Columbia Heights neighborhood.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you a group of -- are you a group, sir? You were given standing as what, sir? As a group or a specific association, what organization do you -- are you representing a group of 5, a group of 20? That's what I'm trying for you to put on the record, sir.

MR. MALMO: Represent a group of 8 residents.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, sir.

Thank you very much. This is being recorded and being transcribed. So we'll have a transcript.

So that's all I'm trying to do is for you to clearly introduce yourself and identify yourself for the record, sir. That's why I'm going through of this here. All right. Are there any preliminary matters that needs to be brought to the attention of the Board, Mr. Jackson?

MR. JACKSON: Well, we had -- good morning, Mr. Chairman. We had mediation, and I don't think that we're going to resolve the

matters concerning the requests of the protestants because the applicant believes or feels that some of the requests are unreasonable.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, we can always keep hope alive, Mr. Jackson. We can always keep hope alive that the parties can come to some agreement. So we'll just say let's keep hope alive that the parties can continue talking and maybe something will happen. Mr. Malmo, from your perspective -- and I'm not asking details. I'm just saying, are there any procedural issues that we need to bring to the attention of the Board?

MR. MALMO: Mr. Chairman, no, I don't believe there are any procedural issues.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Thank you very much, Mr. Malmo. Mr. Jackson has stated before that he doesn't think that this matter can be resolved. But I'm not -- the Board supports resolution of matters outside of the hearing because as I've always stated to individuals, this is your neighborhood.

Probably none of the Board members
live within close to this establishment. I'm not
sure. And so therefore, if the parties are able

to resolve it, at least we know that they will leave at the end of the day that both sides are happy because they are able to resolve it.

If the parties are unable to resolve this matter, this matter then is scheduled a protest hearing on October 20th, 2021 at 3:30 p.m. So as I stated before, the Board supports settlement. The Board supports both sides meeting and try to resolve it.

But if it cannot be resolved, we'll have a protest hearing on October 20th, 2021 at 3:30 p.m. All right. Now that we scheduled this matter for a protest hearing, there are few things I would like to instruct you to do because the Board's practice under the public emergency has changed.

As you know, the Board's hearings are conducted virtually. So it's more important than ever that the protest hearings are focused and addresses only those issues that are being protested. Following this hearing, you'll receive an email from the General Counsel's office that will include a copy of the protest information form, PIF, and a copy of an exhibit form as well as specific instructions for the

hearing.

You're also required to complete and submit the protest information form, PIF, and the exhibit form at least seven days before the date of the hearing. If we do not receive a copy of your forms seven days before the hearing, your application or your protest may be subject to dismissal. These documents not only need to be submitted to abra.legal@dc.gov, but to the opposing party as well. Please know that these documents greatly support in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process, and keeping the parties on point during the hearing.

Each side is limited to no more than five witnesses, and you will only have 60 minutes to present your case. This includes all direct and cross examination of witnesses. The Board does not intend to hear testimony on matters that are not relevant to those issues that are being protested, nor will the Board tolerate repetitive testimony. Are there any questions?

MR. JACKSON: No, not right now, no.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Malmo?

MR. MALMO: No, no questions.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. We

thank you greatly for your cooperation. If you have any questions at any time leading up to the hearing, please do not hesitate to contact our General Counsel's office. Or you can also contact martha.jenkins@dc.gov. She is our General Counsel if you have questions.

As I stated before, the Board supports the parties meeting to continue talking to resolve this matter. But if the parties aren't able to resolve this matter, we will see you on October 20th at 3:30 p.m. for a protest hearing. Thank you very much for your appearance here this morning, and have a great day. Thank you.

And also, Mr. Jackson, just in case that we have a protest hearing, please let your client know that I need his view to be stable. So put the phone down because if you're walking around with the phone, it's somewhat -- especially when you're doing this online, it's somewhat destabilizing. So just please talk to your client about being sure that you're in a stable placement for the call.

Mr. Malmo, and you don't have to have a video. So that's fine. But as long as you have stable internet because this is going to be

-- if we have a protest hearing, it's going to be a long hearing.

in an area where your WiFi -- either WiFi or cellular data that it is stable so you will always be with us. Okay, sir? Although I would love to see the parties that I'm talking to, but if you do not have a camera, that is fine. But just make sure that you have stable WiFi, you have stable internet for the hearing. Okay?

MR. MALMO: Okay. That's fine. I'm at the mercy of Comcast Xfinity. So I can only use what I have.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I appreciate that, Mr. Malmo. But I'm just saying to you that I need you and your parties to actively participate in this process. And because it's going to be -- protest hearings, historically, they're long.

So no matter what we do -- so I'm just letting you know that in order to make sure that this process is beneficial to you and that you and the protestants can participate in this process fully just to make sure that whatever that you have a good connection for date of the
