3 MS. FLETCHER: The next case on the
4 calendar is Edgewood International Wine and
5 Spirits, Case Number 24-PRO-00105, Alazar, Inc.,
6 2303 4th Street NE, License Number ABRA-095032.
7 This is a Retailer Class A liquor store for a
8 license renewal. The protest issues are adverse
9 impact on peace, order and quite, and residential
10 parking and vehicular and pedestrian safety. My
11 name is LaVerne Fletcher conducting the roll call
12 hearing as the Board's agent. Is anyone present
13 on behalf of Edgewood International Wine and
14 Spirits.

15 MR. BARNES: Johnny Barnes, counsel for
16 the licensees. I think Patricia Williams is also
17 here. She is an ANC Commissioner in the area who
18 did not vote. This is the commissioners who
19 filed the protest. I think both licensees are
20 either on the phone or by video.

21 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr. Barnes.
22 Would you spell your name for the record, please?

23 MR. BARNES: Yes. Johnny is J-O-H-N-N-
24 Y, Barnes is B-A-R-N-E-S.

25 MS. FLETCHER: Is your client here

1 today, Ms. Fisssha?

2 MR. BARNES: She should be on.

3 MS. FISSHA: Yes, I am here.

4 MS. FLETCHER: I'm sorry, what was
5 that?

6 MS. FISSHA: Yes, I am here. Yes, I am
7 here.

8 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Would you please
9 state your name and spell it for the record?

10 MS. FISSHA: Lula Fisssha, L-U-L-A. My
11 last name F-I-S-S-H-A.

12 MS. FLETCHER: F-I-S-S-H-A?

13 MS. FISSHA: Correct.

14 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. We
15 also have -- is Meskerem Balkew present?

16 MS. BALKEW: Yes.

17 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Meskerem
18 Balkew. I am really messing up your name here, -
19 -

20 MS. BALKEW: That is okay.

21 MS. FLETCHER: -- but Meskerem Balkew
22 is the Amharic interpreter provided for Ms.
23 Fisssha.

24 MS. FISSHA: Yes. Yes.

25 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. I just wanted

1 you, Ms. Fisssha, to know that your interpreter is
2 present.

3 MS. FISSHA: Sure.

4 MS. FLETCHER: Have you understood
5 everything that has been said so far?

6 MS. FISSHA: Yes, but my lawyer can
7 speak for me.

8 MS. FLETCHER: Well, your lawyer
9 requested an Amharic interpreter to interpret for
10 you, so that is why Ms. Balkew is present.

11 MS. FISSHA: Okay.

12 MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Balkew, would you
13 spell your name for the court reporter, please?

14 MS. BALKEW: Meskerem, E-S-K-E-R-E-M
15 first name, last name B-A-L-K-E-W. I am Amharic
16 interpreter.

17 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
18 So, Ms. Fisssha, you recognize that Ms. Balkew is
19 here to interpret for you?

20 MS. FISSHA: Yes.

21 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Do you have any
22 questions so far about anything that has been
23 said?

24 MS. FISSHA: I can speak Amharic, yes.

25 MS. BALKEW: No, I do not have any

1 questions for now.

2 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Is anyone
3 present on behalf of ANC 2F?

4 MS. WILLIAMS: Commissioner Patricia L.
5 Williams, Commissioner for 5F03.

6 MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Williams, I am going
7 to ask you to spell your name, and then Ms.
8 Balkew I will ask you to translate. Patricia
9 Williams, would you spell your name for the
10 record, please?

11 MS. WILLIAMS: Patricia Williams, P-A-
12 T-R-I-C-I-A, Williams, W-I-L-L-I-A-M-S.

13 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
14 Ms. Hancock?

15 MR. GALVAN: Hi, Ms. Fletcher. My name
16 is Mark Galvan. I am also the commissioner for
17 5F04, and I am here representing the 5F
18 Commission on behalf of the resolution we passed
19 on September 16th.

20 MS. FLETCHER: Well, thank you, Mr.
21 Galvan. Yes, I have that in my record that you
22 would be appearing today. Thank you very much.

23 MR. GALVAN: Yes, and my name I will
24 spell it for you, M-A-R-K, last name is Galvan,
25 G-A-L-V-A-N. I also have our Chair, Commissioner

1 Anderson, who is also here.

2 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Commissioner
3 Anderson, would you state your name and spell it
4 for the record, please?

5 MS. ANDERSON: Hi, my name is
6 Commissioner Jennifer Anderson. My name is
7 spelled J-E-N-N-I-F-E-R, last name Anderson, A-N-
8 D-E-R-S-O-N.

9 MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Balkew, do you need
10 me to summarize what happened already, or -- were
11 you able to --

12 MS. BALKEW: My understanding of the
13 people who --

14 MS. FLETCHER: The -- are you speaking
15 to me, Ms. Balkew?

16 MS. BALKEW: Yes.

17 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, I'm sorry, can you
18 say that one more time, please?

19 MS. BALKEW: So the person who
20 introduced themselves are representing the
21 protestor.

22 MS. FLETCHER: Yes, these are the
23 protestors from Advisory Neighborhood Commission
24 2F, like Frank, Advisory Neighborhood Commission
25 2F, like Frank.

1 MR. GALVAN: Ms. Fletcher, apologies,
2 but we are with the 5F Commission, not with the
3 2F Commission.

4 MS. FLETCHER: Oh, you are with the --
5 okay, thank you.

6 MR. GALVAN: Yes, all of us are
7 commissioners, so Commissioner Williams, myself,
8 and --

9 MS. FLETCHER: That is right, you are
10 with 5F.

11 MR. GALVAN: 5F, correct.

12 MS. FLETCHER: I actually see that.
13 Thank you. The light in here is a little dim for
14 some reason today. I see that, it is 5F. So,
15 Ms. Balkew, the individual who just introduced
16 themselves are from ANC 5F. I can give you their
17 names again if you like.

18 MS. BALKEW: I already have their
19 names.

20 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. I will let you
21 interpret.

22 MS. FISSHA: I know.

23 MS. FLETCHER: Should I keep going?

24 MS. BALKEW: Yes, please.

25 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. There is

1 also a group of individuals. Is anyone present
2 on behalf of the group -- excuse me one second.
3 Ms. FISSHA, can you mute yourself? You are a
4 little noisy. I mean, every now and then I hear
5 noise in your background. It is a little
6 disruptive. Can you mute yourself, please,
7 unless you are speaking?

8 MS. FISSHA: Can you mute?

9 MS. FLETCHER: Come again.

10 MS. FISSHA: I did it.

11 MS. FLETCHER: You are not muted, but
12 that is okay. You do not have to be muted as
13 long as we cannot hear what is happening in the
14 background. Is anyone present on behalf of the
15 group of 15?

16 MS. COUGHLIN: Yes, Melissa Coughlin,
17 E-L-I-S-S-A, C-O-U-G-H-L-I-N.

18 MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Balkew, do you want
19 to interpret that?

20 MS. FISSHA: Okay.

21 MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Coughlin, are there
22 any other members from your group present today?

23 MS. COUGHLIN: Yes, we have a couple
24 that need to leave at 10:30, so, yes.

25 MS. FLETCHER: You are just about done.

1 MS. COUGHLIN: Yes.

2 MS. FLETCHER: If they will just state
3 their name we will be --

4 MS. COUGHLIN: Thank you.

5 MS. FLETCHER: -- done in a minute. So
6 if you can just state your name and spell it for
7 the record, please.

8 MR. HOWARD: Yes, good morning. John
9 Howard, first name J-O-H-N, last name H-O-W-A-R-
10 D.

11 MS. FLETCHER: Thank You. Can you
12 repeat your name one more time, please?

13 MR. HOWARD: Sure, J-O-H-N.

14 MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Howard, I have your
15 name I am speaking to the other person.

16 MR. HOWARD: Oh, sorry.

17 MS. FLETCHER: Someone just said their
18 name but I did not get it.

19 MS. ABURTO: Maria Aburto, A-R-I-A, A-
20 B-U-R-T-O.

21 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much.

22 MS. FISSHA: Okay.

23 MS. HANCOCK: Heather Hancock, H-E-A-T-
24 H-E-R, H-A-N-C-O-C-K.

25 MS. FISSHA: Okay.

1 MS. FLETCHER: Anyone else?

2 MS. KELLY: Chelsey Kelly, C-H-E-L-S-E-
3 Y, K-E-L-L-Y.

4 MS. FISSHA: Okay.

5 MS. FLETCHER: Anyone else?

6 MR. PATTERSON: Greg Patterson, G-R-E-
7 G, P-A-T-T-E-R-S-O-N.

8 MS. FLETCHER: What is the first name
9 again?

10 MR. PATTERSON: Greg, G-R-E-G.

11 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Mr.
12 Patterson.

13 MS. FISSHA: Okay.

14 MS. FLETCHER: Anyone else from the
15 group?

16 MS. STRASMORE: Sharada Strasmore, S-H-
17 A-R-A-D-A, Strasmore, S-T-R-A-S-M-O-R-E.

18 MS. FISSHA: Okay.

19 MS. FLETCHER: Can you spell your first
20 name one more time, Ms. Strasmore?

21 MS. STRASMORE: Yes, absolutely. S-H-
22 A-R-A-D-A.

23 MS. FLETCHER: Oh, D like dog A.

24 MS. STRASMORE: Yes, exactly. Thank
25 you.

1 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
2 Anyone else?

3 MR. FIETZEK: Julian Fietzek. I will
4 spell that. J-U-L-I-A-N, F-I-E-T-Z-E-K.

5 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Anyone else
6 from the group?

7 MS. BALKEW: Would you mind spelling
8 your last name, sir?

9 MR. FIETZEK: Of course. F-I-E-T-Z-E-
10 K.

11 MS. FISSHA: Okay.

12 MS. FLETCHER: Anyone else from the
13 group?

14 MS. ANDERSON: Ms. Fletcher, just a
15 point of clarity on the ANC Commissioner's --

16 MS. FLETCHER: I'm sorry, who is
17 speaking? For the court reporter who is
18 speaking?

19 MS. ANDERSON: Oh, yes, absolutely. My
20 name is Chair Jennifer Anderson. I am the Chair
21 of the Commission ANC 5F. I just wanted to have
22 a point of clarity that in the protest -- the
23 resolution that was passed registering our
24 protest Commissioner Galvan was named as kind of
25 the representative for ANC 5F, but the other

1 Commissioners are here present to kind of add
2 additional contacts, just for a point of clarity.

3 MS. FLETCHER: Yes, and so I have
4 Commissioner Galvan as the designated
5 representative for this case.

6 MS. ANDERSON: Yes, that is correct.

7 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. I am
8 going to count the number of individuals present.

9 MS. WILLIAMS: Ms. Fletcher.

10 MS. FLETCHER: Yes. Who is speaking,
11 please?

12 MS. WILLIAMS: Commissioner Williams.

13 MS. FLETCHER: Yes.

14 MS. WILLIAMS: I am here in support of,
15 so I am not a part of that five that is
16 protesting.

17 MS. FLETCHER: Are you a commissioner?

18 MS. WILLIAMS: Yes, ma'am.

19 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Okay, I
20 understand. Thank you.

21 MS. WILLIAMS: I am trying to get that
22 straight as well.

23 MS. FLETCHER: Yes, I noted you --

24 MS. WILLIAMS: I am not protesting.

25 MS. FLETCHER: Exactly, I just noted

1 that you are present. I understand that Mr.
2 Galvan is the designated representative in this
3 case.

4 MS. WILLIAMS: Thank you.

5 MS. FLETCHER: You are very welcome.
6 Thank you. Ms. Balkew you are moving around the
7 screen that is why I sort of lose track of you
8 every now and then. Now you are over here.

9 MS. BALKEW: I have been over here all
10 the time.

11 MS. FLETCHER: On my screen you were
12 over there.

13 MS. BALKEW: Oh, okay.

14 MS. FLETCHER: Okay.

15 MS. BALKEW: I see.

16 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, so I count eight
17 present, but because more than five of you are
18 present today, Ms. Coughlin, your group does have
19 standing as a protestant. I need to give you a
20 date for a status hearing, a protest hearing, and
21 a mediation. The date for the status hearing is
22 November 6, 2024 at 10:30 a.m. for the status
23 hearing. Protest hearing is set for December
24 11th at 1:30.

25 MS. FISSHA: Okay.

1 MS. FLETCHER: I will give you the next
2 available date for mediation.

3 MS. FISSHA: Okay.

4 MS. FLETCHER: The next available day
5 for mediation is Tuesday, October 29th anytime
6 between 10:30 and 1:30. Is that a good date for
7 the ANC?

8 MS. BALKEW: Would you mind repeating
9 the hours?

10 MS. FLETCHER: Yes, I will repeat the
11 hours. The hours are anytime between 10:30 and
12 1:30.

13 MS. FISSHA: It is okay, 10:30.

14 MS. FLETCHER: Excuse me. Just a
15 second. I am going to clear something up for the
16 court reporter. So, Ms. Fisssha, what did you
17 just say?

18 MS. FISSHA: 10:30.

19 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, so --

20 MS. FISSHA: 10:30.

21 MS. FLETCHER: 10:30 is good for you?

22 MS. FISSHA: Yes, ma'am.

23 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Is 10:30
24 good for you, Mr. Galvan?

25 MR. GALVAN: Yes, on October 29th, yes,

1 that is fine. Thank you.

2 MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Coughlin, what about
3 you?

4 MS. COUGHLIN: Yes, that is fine.

5 (Pause.)

6 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, everybody is back.
7 Okay. Mr. Barnes, can you hear me?

8 MR. BARNES: Yes, Madam Host. I am
9 competing with this drilling noise outdoors so I
10 am limiting my conversation, but all three dates
11 and all three times work for me.

12 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. Then
13 we will schedule mediation for Tuesday, October
14 29 at 10:30 a.m., and I will send out the WebEx
15 invites.

16 MS. ANDERSON: Thank you very much.

17 MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much.

18 MR. GALVAN: Thank you very much.

19 MR. BARNES: Madam Host, would Mr.
20 Galvan mind sharing his telephone number with me,
21 or he can call me. I sent a copy of my notice of
22 appearance to him with my phone number. Either
23 way works.

24 MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Balkew, would you
25 interpret that for Ms. Fissaha? Mr. Galvan?

1 MR. GALVAN: Yes, yes. My phone number
2 is public on the ANC 5F website, which is
3 anc5F.com. You can find it there. Thank you.

4 MS. BARNES: Thank you, Mr. Galvan.

5 MR. GALVAN: Thank you.

6 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Anything else
7 from anyone? Okay, well thank you for coming,
8 and I will see you on October 29 at 10:30. Thank
9 you everybody. See you soon. Ms. Balkew?

10 MS. BALKEW: Yes, ma'am?

11 MS. FLETCHER: The hearing in this
12 matter is concluded, and thank you very much for
13 being here this morning I appreciate it.

14 MS. BALKEW: Thank you. It is my
15 pleasure.

16 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Take care.

17 MS. BALKEW: Bye. Have a good day.

18 MS. FLETCHER: You too. Thank you.

19 The roll call hearing in this matter is
20 concluded.
