3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case in
4	our calendar is Case Number 23-CC-00012, Sammy's
5	Liquors, License Number 108-0822.
6	Good morning again, Mr. Orellana. Can
7	you please elevate the rights of the government,
8	the Licensee, and whatever witnesses that the
9	parties might have in this case?
10	MR. ORELLANA: Sure. Maks Shyyan, your
11	access has been elevated. Alicia Hogenmiller.
12	Your access has been elevated. Investigator Mark
13	Ruiz, your access has been elevated. And that
14	appears to be all, Chairman.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, let
16	me see. All right. Good morning, everyone. Ms.
17	Hogenmiller. Good morning. You have not appeared
18	before me before, so good morning. Can you please
19	spell and state your name for the record?
20	MS. HOGENMILLER: Good morning.
21	Chairperson. Assistant Attorney General Alicia
22	Hogenmiller. On behalf of the District.
23	A-L-Y-C-I-A H-O-G-E-N-M-I-L-L-E-R.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Morning, ma'am.
25	And, Mr. Shyyan, can you please spell and state
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1 your name for the record and your relationship to 2 this case?

3	MR. SHYYAN: My name is Maksym Shyyam.
4	M-A-K-S-Y-M. Last name Shyyan, S-H-Y-Y-A-N, and I
5	am the managing partner of Sammy's Liquors, LLC.
6	And if I may, we should have an, I apologize if I
7	didn't introduce this name before, Ms. Janice
8	Lewis should be in the waiting room as well. If
9	we could elevate her rights. She is the employee,
10	and she is the actual person that was involved in
11	the incident.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. She
13	has been elevated.
14	MR. SHYYAN: Thank you.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, so,
16	Ms. Lewis, are you there? Mr. Orellana, can you
17	please make sure that, Ms. Lewis, can you please
18	spell and state your name for the record?
19	MS. LEWIS: Yes. My name is Janice
20	Lewis. That's J-A-N-I-S. Last name, L-E-W-I-S.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Thank
22	you, ma'am. You're not on camera, but if you're
23	going to testify later on in this case, I would
24	appreciate if you were able to turn your camera
25	on if you have that ability, but that's not

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1 something that I need right now. But if this 2 matter goes to a hearing, and if you're going to 3 testify, I prefer that I can see the person who's 4 testifying, so we'll approach that later on. 5 Mr. Ruiz, can you please spell and state your name for the record? 6 7 MR. RUIZ: Mark Ruiz. M-A-R-K R-U-I-Z. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hogenmiller, 8 9 are there preliminary mans in this case? MS. HOGENMILLER: Yes. The District 10 11 would object to Ms. Lewis testifying because she was not disclosed to the District as a potential 12 13 witness one week before the hearing. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Shyyan, do 15 you plan to call Ms. Lewis as the witness? 16 MR. SHYYAN: To be honest with you, the 17 goal for Ms. Lewis being here, as I mentioned 18 earlier, she was involved in the incident of 19 selling to a minor, and we just wanted to hear 20 her comments on it. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: But there is an 2.2 objection raised. And the objection that was 23 raised is that you were advised at the Show Cause 24 hearing status that if you're going to rely on 25 documents and any witnesses, you need to have

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disclosed those documents and witnesses seven days before the hearing. So why did you not disclose this witness to the government? Did you do a PIP? Did you disclose your documents and witnesses to the government seven days before the hearing?

7 MR. SHYYAN: Yes. So my apologies maybe 8 was mentioned on the call, I think it was 9 September 20, the status hearing that I have to disclose. To be honest with you, I don't recall 10 11 that. But Ms. Janis Lewis is not a new person. If 12 I may provide one comment that her testimony of 13 what transpired on the day of the offense of 14 written testimony signed by Ms. Lewis was 15 provided to Ms. Hogenmiller via email during the 16 negotiating period.

Again, I don't know if this violates me not disclosing her name, but I think Ms. Hogenmiller is well aware of who Ms. Lewis is because her testimony was submitted to them via email.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. I'm going to not make a ruling at this juncture, Ms. Hogenmiller. I know that the way these cases go is that the government will go first. And once

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1 the government has presented this case, then the 2 licensee will have an opportunity to present its 3 case by calling witnesses. If Mr. Shyvan decides to call her as 4 5 a witness, then you can raise your motion at that time and the Board will ask for further 6 7 arguments, and then we will make a decision. 8 Okay? MS. HOGENMILLER: Yes, Chairperson. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So 10 11 this is a Show Cause hearing, and this is a 12 procedure for Show Cause hearing. The government 13 goes first. The government will have an 14 opportunity to make an opening statement. 15 After the government makes its opening 16 statement, you, Mr. Shyyan, will have an 17 opportunity to make an opening statement. You, 18 however, can reserve your right to make an 19 opening statement after the government has 20 presented its case. 21 So the government will call a witness. 2.2 You have an opportunity to cross-examine the 23 government's witness. After you have had an 2.4 opportunity to cross-examine the government's 25 witness, then the Board will cross-examine the

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1 government's witness. I'm sorry. The Board will 2 ask questions of the government's witness. 3 After the Board has had an opportunity to ask questions of the government witness, you 4 5 will then get a second opportunity to ask questions of the Board, of the government's 6 7 witness based on the questions that were asked by the Board. 8 9 So you can only ask questions based on the questions that were asked by the Board. If 10 11 the Board did not ask any questions, then you 12 will not have an opportunity to ask any 13 questions. Ms. Hoggenmiller will have an 14 opportunity after that because it's her witness, 15 to redirect. If she hasn't redirect questions of 16 her witness, then she can do that. 17 After the government has presented its 18 case and rested, then you will have an 19 opportunity to present your case, and you can 20 present your case by calling witnesses. And then 21 if you decide to call a witness, if you decide to 2.2 call Ms. Lewis, and if the government objects to 23 that, the Board will listen to arguments, and then the Board will make a role in whether or not 24 this individual will be allowed to testify. Okay? 25

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1 Any questions by anyone before we start? 2 MS. HOGENMILLER: None from the 3 government. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Thank 4 5 you. All right, Ms. Hogenmiller, do you wish to 6 make an opening statement? 7 MS. HOGENMILLER: Yes. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, ma'am. 9 MS. HOGENMILLER: May it please the Board, this case is about Sammy's Liquor selling 10 11 alcohol to a minor and failing to take reasonably 12 necessary steps to ascertain the minor's age 13 before the sale. ABCA investigator Mark Ruiz will testify that on July 8, 2023, he arrived at 14 15 Sammy's Liquors with an undercover minor for a 16 compliance check. The undercover minor was born in March 17 18 2007, making her 16 years old. Investigator Ruiz (Audio cut off) 19 20 ... will light beer and then head to the 21 register. Once at the register, the cashier 2.2 looked at the undercover minor's ID 23 (Audio cut off) 24 ... and then rang up the beer for the undercover minor to purchase. 25

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1	The government charged Sammy's Liquors
2	with two violations. First, sale to a person
3	under 21 years of age, in violation of DC Code
4	section 25-781.
5	Second, failure to take steps
б	reasonably necessary to ascertain whether any
7	person buying alcohol is of legal drinking age,
8	in violation of DC Code 25-783.
9	At the end of the hearing, the
10	government will have proven its case by
11	substantial evidence and request that the Board
12	find in its favor and apply a penalty consistent
13	with DC Code section 25-830. Thank you.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Do
15	you wish to make an opening statement at this
16	juncture, sir, or do you reserve until you
17	present your case?
18	MR. SHYYAN: If you're referring to me,
19	I guess only one thing to point out. There are
20	two allegations, and I think the second one
21	shouldn't apply. I think it's called take
22	reasonable steps to ensure legal drinking age.
23	And by the opening statement, Ms. Hogenmiller
24	confirmed that Ms. Lewis actually made her best
25	attempt to assess the legal drinking age. It's
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1 just, I'll let her speak, what happened, exactly. 2 But the second point, I think, is inapplicable 3 here. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: 4 Mr. Shyvan, the 5 burden is on the government to prove its case. And so the government goes first with the charges 6 7 in this case. The government then has to present sufficient evidence for this Board to make a 8 determination. 9 10 In your presentation, sir, you can 11 make those arguments if you do not believe that 12 the government has met its burden on both 13 charges. So those are arguments that once you 14 present your case and in closing, and you can 15 make arguments whether or not you believe the 16 government has met its burden, that your establishment committed the infractions that they 17 18 were charged with, sir. Okay? 19 MR. SHYYAN: Thank you. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So that was 21 basically your opening statement, or do you have 2.2 further to say before you present your case? And 23 again, you present your case after the government 2.4 has presented its case. MR. SHYYAN Yeah. That will be all. 25

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1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Thank you.	
2	All right, Ms. Hogenmiller, do you have a witness	
3	you wish to call?	
4	MS. HOGENMILLER: Yes, the District	
5	would like to call Investigator Mark Ruiz.	
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Ruiz, can	
7	you raise your right hand, please? Do you swear	
8	or affirm to tell the truth and nothing but	
9	truth? Your witness, ma'am.	
10	MS. HOGENMILLER: Thank you. Could you	
11	please state your name for the record?	
12	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. Mark Ruiz.	
13	M-A-R-K R-U-I-Z.	
14	MS. HOGENMILLER: Where are you	
15	currently employed?	
16	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: The Alcoholic	
17	Beverage and Cannabis Administration.	
18	MS. HOGENMILLER: And if I refer to the	
19	Alcohol Beverage Cannabis Administration as ABCA,	
20	would you know what I'm referring to?	
21	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes.	
22	MS. HOGENMILLER: What is your position	
23	at ABCA?	
24	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Investigator.	
25	MS. HOGENMILLER: How long have you	

1 been an investigator? 2 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: It's a little over 3 four and a half years. MS. HOGENMILLER: What are your duties 4 and responsibilities as an investigator? 5 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: To conduct 6 7 inspections and investigations of licensed ABC 8 establishments. 9 MS. HOGENMILLER: Now, turning to the case for today. Are you familiar with the 10 11 establishment located at 2725 Bladensburg Road, Northeast Washington, DC, Sammy's Liquors? 12 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. 13 14 MS. HOGENMILLER: How are you familiar with this establishment? 15 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: We conducted a 16 compliance check at this location. 17 18 MS. HOGENMILLER: When did you conduct this compliance check? 19 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Saturday, July 8, 20 21 2023. MS. HOGENMILLER: What does it mean to 2.2 23 conduct a compliance check? 24 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: To utilize an 25 undercover minor to enter the establishment in

1 the attempt to purchase alcohol. 2 MS. HOGENMILLER: When you conduct your compliance check on July 8, 2023, what time was 3 it? 4 5 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: 6:28 p.m. 6 MS. HOGENMILLER: What happened when 7 you conducted that compliance check on July 8, 8 2023. INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: So minor was 9 directed to enter the establishment, which she 10 11 did prior to myself, I followed her into the 12 store. The minor went over, selected the alcohol 13 from the display, and then went to the cashier to 14 present for payment, where cashier looked at the 15 ID, continued the transaction, and the minor 16 ultimately left with the alcohol, at which time I followed and exited the store as well. 17 18 MS. HOGENMILLER: And what was the 19 minor able to purchase at the establishment? INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: A 24-ounce can of 20 21 Bud Light beer. MS. HOGENMILLER: When the undercover 2.2 23 minor was in the establishment, where were you? INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: I was located 24 25 within approximately, I guess I would say, the

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1	center of the store area, where I could see her,
2	as well as the front end.
3	MS. HOGENMILLER: Were you able to
4	observe the minor purchase the beer?
5	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes.
6	MS. HOGENMILLER: What is the
7	undercover minor's date of birth?
8	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: March 26, 2007.
9	MS. HOGENMILLER: On the date of the
10	incident, how old was she?
11	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: 16 years old.
12	MS. HOGENMILLER: After you conducted
13	your compliance check, was there a regulatory
14	inspection of the establishment?
15	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes.
16	MS. HOGENMILLER: Were there any other
17	violations found?
18	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: No other violations
19	were found.
20	MS. HOGENMILLER: Did you complete a
21	case report regarding your compliance check of
22	Sammy's Liquors on July 8, 2023?
23	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: I did.
24	MS. HOGENMILLER: Would you recognize
25	a copy of this report if I were to show it to

1 you? 2 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And Mr. 4 Orellana, can you please give Ms. Hogenmiller an 5 ability to share her screen? 6 MS. HOGENMILLER: Thank you. Are you 7 able to see my screen? 8 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. MS. HOGENMILLER: And let me know if at 9 any time you would like me to zoom in onto the 10 11 page. Do you recognize this document? INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. This is the 12 13 incident report I wrote. 14 MS. HOGENMILLER: And before I go 15 through the incident report, Mr. Chairperson, the 16 District would like to confirm for the record that the government exhibit, I'm going to call it 17 18 Exhibit A. The case report. The July 8, 2023 case 19 report for Sammy's Liquors is already in evidence 20 pursuant to 23 DCMR 1713.10. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, ma'am, 2.2 you're correct. It is part of the Board's 23 administrative records. That is already in the 24 record. Thank you. 25 MS. HOGENMILLER: Thank you.

1 Investigator Ruiz, I want to direct you to the 2 second paragraph under the heading that says details. I'm going to zoom in. Looking at the 3 third sentence, it says the UC, UC standing for 4 5 undercover minor, who is 15 years old, was searched. 6 7 Here it notes that she was 15 years 8 old. But you previously testified she was 16. Why 9 is there a discrepancy in the reports? INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: There was a 10 11 miscalculation of the age when her photos were 12 taken. 13 MS. HOGENMILLER: Now, turning to those 14 photos, I'm going to direct you first to Exhibit 15 1. Do you recognize this photo as Exhibit 1? INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. 16 MS. HOGENMILLER: And then turning to 17 18 Exhibit 2. Do you recognize this photo as Exhibit 19 2? 20 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. 21 MS. HOGENMILLER: What is Exhibit 1 and 2.2 Exhibit 2? 23 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Exhibit 1 would be 24 the full body photo of the UC utilized at this 25 establishment. And this exhibit Number 2 would be

1 our head and shoulders shot. 2 MS. HOGENMILLER: When were these 3 photos taken? INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Those were taken on 4 5 the day of the compliance check, July 8, 2023. 6 MS. HOGENMILLER: Now, turning your 7 attention to Exhibit 3 of the case report. Do you recognize this photo? 8 9 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. 10 MS. HOGENMILLER: What is this photo? 11 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: This is a photo of the UC's identification used that day. 12 13 MS. HOGENMILLER: Is this the same ID 14 card that she used to purchase the beer? 15 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. MS. HOGENMILLER: And what is listed as 16 17 her birthday on this ID? 18 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: March 26, 2007. 19 MS. HOGENMILLER: Now turning your attention to Exhibit 4. Do you recognize this 20 21 photo? 2.2 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. 23 MS. HOGENMILLER: What is Exhibit 4? 2.4 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: This is a photo of 25 the 24-ounce can of Bud Light beer that the UC

1	purchased.
2	MS. HOGENMILLER: Turning to Exhibit 5.
3	What is Exhibit 5?
4	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Exhibit 5 is the
5	Evidence Transmittal Form detailing the evidence
6	chain of custody from the establishment to the
7	office.
8	MS. HOGENMILLER: And under item 1, it
9	says 24-ounce can, Bud Light. Is that the same as
10	the photo in Exhibit 4?
11	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes.
12	MS. HOGENMILLER: Turning your
13	attention now to Exhibit 6. What is Exhibit 6?
14	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: This is a Seattle
15	Minor Notification Form that was completed that
16	day, notifying the establishment of the sale.
17	MS. HOGENMILLER: Lastly, turning to
18	Exhibit 7. What is Exhibit 7 showing us?
19	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: That is a copy of
20	the Regulatory Inspection Form that was completed
21	that day as well.
22	MS. HOGENMILLER: Were there any other
23	violations found during this regulatory
24	inspection?
25	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: No.
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1	MS. HOGENMILLER: That concludes my
2	questions.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Shyyan, do
4	you have any questions of the Board's witness?
5	I'm sorry, of the government's witness, sir?
6	MR. SHYYAN: There no questions. The
7	only question, I don't know if it really matters
8	yet. That age miscalculation, 15 versus 16.
9	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are you asking
10	the question? If you have a question, you ask the
11	question of the witness or not of the witness.
12	MR. SHYYAN: No, I don't have any
13	questions here.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any questions of
15	the witness by the Board? Mr. Ruiz? Whether or
16	not the minor was 15 or 16, what's the legal age
17	to purchase alcohol in the District of Columbia?
18	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: 21.
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And is there a
20	difference? Have and were you present and is it
21	correct that you were present in the
22	establishment with the minor?
23	INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And is it
25	correct that I think the testimony that the minor

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1 was searched before to ensure that there was 2 nothing else on her possession. Is that correct? INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Correct. Just the 3 4 money and the ID. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: It's also 6 correct that you personally observe the 7 transaction that occurred in the establishment. INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Correct. 8 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay. Any other 10 questions by any Board members? Mr. Shyyan, any 11 questions off the witness based on the questions that I asked? 12 13 MR. SHYYAN No, Mr. Chair. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Mr. Short. 15 MEMBER SHORT: Forgive me, Mr. Chair. 16 Thank you. Investigator Ruiz, the copy of an ID 17 that the minor produced to purchase the can of 18 beer, can you describe how that's different than 19 a regular 21 year old or someone of age to buy 20 alcohol? 21 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: I think you're 2.2 referring to a state license, state ID. Where 23 they're usually vertical, horizontal this day. MEMBER SHORT: That is correct. 2.4 25 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: She used a United

1 States passport card identification, which, my 2 understanding, they don't do horizontal or vertical. She didn't use a state ID. It was a 3 4 government passport ID. 5 MEMBER SHORT: Federal Government 6 passport ID. 7 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. Correct. 8 MEMBER SHORT: And did you observe the 9 establishment checking the ID when you were 10 watching what was going on? 11 INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: Yes. 12 MEMBER SHORT: And they read it, and 13 they still sold the alcohol. Is that correct? INVESTIGATOR RUIZ: That's correct. 14 15 MEMBER SHORT: Thank you. That's all I 16 have, Mr. Chair. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You're welcome, 17 18 Mr. Short. Mr. Shyyan, any questions of the 19 witness based on the question that was asked by 20 Mr. Short? 21 MR. SHYYAN No, sir. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hoganmiller. 2.2 23 Any redirect? MS. HOGENMILLER: No redirect for me. 2.4 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Mr.

1 Ruiz, thank you very much for your testimony. 2 You're free to go. Ms. Hogenmiller, does the government have another witness to call? 3 MS. HOGENMILLER: No, we do not have 4 another witness. We rest our case. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Thank 6 7 you. Mr. Shyyan, do you wish to call a witness? 8 MR. SHYYAN I would love to call a 9 witness, Ms. Janis Lewis, who actually performed the transaction just to provide her comments on 10 11 what transpired that day. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hoganmiller, 13 do you have an objection? MS. HOGENMILLER: I would renew our 14 15 objection. Ms. Lewis' identity was known before 16 the hearing date, but not the establishment's 17 intent. 18 (Audio cut off) CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So how would the 19 20 government, since if you stated that you 21 (Audio cut off) 2.2 ... the identity of this individual, but you 23 weren't aware that she would have been called as 2.4 a witness. 25 So tell me, how did the government,

1 how would the government be harmed if this 2 individual was able to testify today? 3 MS. HOGENMILLER: Without the proper notice that's required by the Board, the 4 5 government is not able to prepare for the hearing knowing that Ms. Lewis was going to testify. 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Shyyan? 8 MR. SHYYAN: All I can say, to be 9 honest with you, this is my first hearing ever within this business regarding this matter. We 10 11 had prior violations, but this is the first 12 hearing, so and I should have mentioned it in my 13 opening statements, I guess the goal for today's 14 hearing is not say we're not quilty. The goal for 15 today's hearing is to provide Ms. Lewis's 16 perspective on what transpired. 17 And by that, the goal is to probably 18 to minimize the damage to the business. The reason being that we went back and forth a couple 19 20 of times with Ms. Hogenmiller during the 21 negotiating term, and we couldn't agree on one of 2.2 the points, and the goal, to be honest with you 23 for today's hearings, is to eliminate one of 2.4 those points being enforced on us. 25 So I think Ms. Lewis has a valid point

1 to bring up since she was involved in prior 2 similar incident back in 2020. So she just wanted to provide her comments on how she conducts 3 business working at Sammy's Liquors and how she 4 5 ensures checking every individual's ID if an individual looks of a young age. That was what we 6 7 wanted to get out of Ms. Lewis's testimony. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any other 8 9 comments, Ms. Hoganmiller? MS. HOGENMILLER: No. 10 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Shyyan, I'm 12 looking at the transcript from our hearing. So we 13 had our status hearing on September 30. And I 14 specifically informed you because I think the 15 parties were talking about settlement. 16 And I specifically said, and just one 17 thing I want to remind the parties, if this 18 matter goes to a Show Cause hearing on October 19 18, seven days prior to the hearing, the parties 20 are required to exchange documents and witnesses 21 that they are going to rely on the hearing. And 2.2 that was clear in the instruction that was given 23 to you on September 30. 24 So the government has objected to your 25 calling a witness. I mean, you can testify. I can

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1 swear you can testify, but I'm going to rule. I'm 2 going to make a motion that the Board deny you 3 the opportunity to call a witness. Is there a second? 4 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short seconds. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short has 6 7 seconded. The motion will have a roll call vote. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Short. 8 9 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I agree. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato?. 10 11 (No audible response) 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen? 13 MEMBER HANSEN: I agree. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis? 14 15 MEMBER GRANDIS: I agree. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I agree. The 17 matter passes 5-0-0. So therefore, sir, you can 18 testify. I can an swear you in, and you can state 19 whatever you've stated. Whatever you state, I can 20 swear you in, and then you can make whatever 21 representation you wish to make. 2.2 Can you raise your right hand, please? 23 You swear or affirm tell the truth and nothing 24 but the truth? 25 MR. SHYYAN: I do.

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1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, go	
2	ahead.	
3	MR. SHYYAN: I can only try to relate	
4	what was written in that incident report that Ms.	
5	Lewis signed, and it was submitted to Ms.	
6	Hoganmiller. As I mentioned earlier, we had a	
7	prior incident with Ms. Lewis selling to a minor,	
8	I think it was back in 2020.	
9	And since that incident, we got a	
10	warning for that incident. And since that	
11	incident, Ms. Lewis assures to check IDs with	
12	every individual who looks of a young age, and as	
13	stated in this case, by investigator Mark Ruiz,	
14	that Ms. Lewis took reasonable steps to assure a	
15	person's ID.	
16	A good point was brought up that it	
17	was not your standard everyday ID that you look	
18	at selling liquor or just simply seeing on a day	
19	to day basis, being it's not a driver's license,	
20	not a state issued ID. It's a passport ID card,	
21	and to be honest with you, that I haven't seen	
22	myself ever.	
23	Sometimes I worked at the store	
24	myself, behind the register, frankly, not often	
25	enough, but I've never seen an ID like this.	

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Again, it is a government-issued ID.

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And second point is Ms. Lewis, unfortunately, sometimes required glasses in order to read up close, especially small numbers like that, and on that day, she forgot her glasses at home. And being over 60 years old, you can understand that sometimes she would require glasses to see certain numbers.

9 So as it was explained by Ms. Lewis to 10 me, that she genuinely believed 2007 looked like 11 2001 to her. So basically, the last number seven 12 looked like number one. That's why she sold. She 13 thought that person was of legal drinking age and 14 therefore proceeded with the transaction. Those 15 were the only comments.

16 The only other comments, I said that Ms. Lewis has been with the store since we took 17 18 over the business back in 2017. She's an 19 exemplary employee with one unfortunate incident 20 back in 2020. And as I said, since that date, she 21 takes all necessary steps to assure every 2.2 customer's ID when she believes that customer 23 could be of underage age, if you will. 24 And all I can say that partially, I

probably take the blame on myself, because to be

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honest with you, I have to more frequently come to the store to ensure the operations run smoothly, with it being checking IDs or anything else for that matter.

5 But with everything what's going on 6 with my home country of Ukraine and my relatives, 7 I'm just preoccupied with that almost on a daily 8 basis. So that's why I'm not able to attend the 9 store every day. I come once, twice a week at 10 most these days. Unfortunately.

11 Yeah, those were the only comments. 12 And as I said, we're not arguing that we're not 13 guilty. The goal was to try to minimize the 14 damage and stay open, operating without any 15 suspension, because ever since the pandemic was 16 over, the business is not very profitable at all. 17 So for us to serve any sort of suspension as 18 offered by Ms. Hogenmiller would be pretty much 19 unsustainable. That's all I had to say. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hogenmiller, 21 Any questions of Mr. Shyyan?

MS. HOGENMILLER: A couple questions.
So Sammy's Liquors is a liquor store, correct?
MR. SHYYAN: Yes, it is.
MS. HOGENMILLER: And as a place that

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1 sells alcohol, you're obligated to follow the 2 ABCA laws and regulations? 3 MR. SHYYAN: Of course. I assume so. 4 MS. HOGENMILLER: What are the laws? It's not to sell to someone under 21 years old. 5 MR. SHYYAN: What are the laws? I'm 6 7 sorry? 8 MS. HOGENMILLER: Is not to sell to 9 anyone who's under 21. MR. SHYYAN: Yes. 21 is a legal 10 11 drinking age, and we're not allowed to sell liquor to any individual who is under 21. 12 MS. HOGENMILLER: Another is to check 13 14 the IDs of people who come into your store before 15 you sell alcohol to them. 16 MR. SHYYAN: Yes. MS. HOGENMILLER: And in checking that 17 18 ID, you need to check someone's date of birth? MR. SHYYAN: That is correct. 19 20 MS. HOGENMILLER: In looking at that 21 date of birth, you need to determine whether they 2.2 are 21 years or older? 23 MR. SHYYAN: That is correct. 24 MS. HOGENMILLER: And all these 25 obligations extend to your employees as well?

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1	MR. SHYYAN: Yes.
2	MS. HOGENMILLER: No further questions.
3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any questions by
4	the Board members? Mr. Shyyan, the question I
5	have for you is that you stated that this
6	employee was given a warning for selling to a
7	minor in 2020.
8	MR. SHYYAN: Yeah, I think it was 2020
9	or 2021, but around that time, yes.
10	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So what type of
11	training did you provide as an employee to ensure
12	that this doesn't occur again?
13	MR. SHYYAN: Oh, we discussed this on a
14	personal basis. We made sure that Ms. Lewis will
15	be taking all necessary steps to assure legal
16	drinking age.
17	And as I stated, I think this case
18	proves the point that, I think back then, in
19	2020, Ms. Lewis failed to check the ID of one of
20	the persons who looked, to be honest with you,
21	over 21 at that time. But we made sure that Ms.
22	Lewis checks IDs of every individual who even
23	slightly looks underage. And this case proves
24	that she tried to identify the legal drinking age
25	of the person.

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1	It's just as I said, it's an
2	unfortunate coincidence that she forgot her
3	classes that day, and 2007 looked like 2001. And
4	to be honest with you, I mean, we're all human
5	sometimes when you serve hundreds of transactions
6	per day, miscalculations happen, as proven by Mr.
7	Mark Ruiz miscalculating age of the person, 15
8	versus 16. So sometimes those things happen with
9	us, too.
10	In this particular case, it's not a
11	miscalculation. It's a simple slight under-
12	whelming performance, if I may call it that way.
13	That day that the number seven looked like one, I
14	guess that little tail top tail of the number
15	seven didn't appear to catch Ms. Lewis's
16	attention.
17	So 2007 looked like 2001, and 2001
18	makes that person legal drinking age. And that's
19	where she proceeded with the sale of beer.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: This was this
21	was a check that our agency does, sir. And
22	routinely you sell alcohol. How many days a week
23	are you open, sir?
24	MR. SHYYAN: Seven days a week.
25	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And what are

1 your hours of operations? 2 MR. SHYYAN: On Monday through Thursday, it's 10:00 a.m to 9:00 p.m., and then 3 over the weekend, Friday and Saturday till 10:00 4 5 p.m. And Sunday is a short day, 12 to 6. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you're open 6 7 seven days a week, for several hours a day? MR. SHYYAN: Yes. 8 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And ABRA came to 9 your establishment in 2020? In 2020, and you were 10 11 selling alcohol to a minor and ABRA came to your establishment in 2023, and you're selling alcohol 12 13 to a minor. So in the three years that ABRA did 14 not come to do a check, sir, how do we know that 15 your establishment is complying with the law? 16 If we came randomly to your occasion twice with an obvious minor, what's actually 15 17 18 or 16, it's irrelevant, because if Ms. Lewis says 19 that she's 16 and her ID says it's 15, Mr. Ruiz 20 would be giving you the benefit of the doubt to 21 say she looks older than 15 or whatever her age 2.2 is. 23 Sir, I guess my position to you if 2.4 we're not at your establishment every day, and if 25 in three years we've been to your establishment

Neal R. Gross and Co., Inc. Washington DC twice and at least from the record I hear and if twice you sold alcohol, to a minor.

3 What assurances are you providing to this agency that when we are not there for the 4 5 seven days a week that you're opened, for all of the days, all the hours that you are not selling 6 and especially you're stating that how business 7 is because of the pandemic that business is slow. 8 9 What assurances you're providing this agency that 10 you're complying with the law, sir?

11 MR. SHYYAN: Right. The only comment I 12 can provide that from what I recall, since 2020 13 through 2023, there could have been other, I don't know if it was ABCA checks or it was simply 14 15 customer underage customers trying to buy liquor, 16 but we had at least five occurrences where 17 underage people tried to purchase liquor at our 18 establishment.

And our employee caught that underage status of those individuals, and they brought it to my attention. We refused to sell liquor to those individuals, but then again, I don't know if they were ABCA checks or if they were just regular underage customers trying to buy liquor, but those occurrences have been brought up to my

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1 attention, and not only by Ms. Lewis, but by my 2 other cashiers as well. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Have you, sir, received any letter or any letter from ABCA to 4 inform you that we did a compliance check with a 5 minor and your establishment did not sell alcohol 6 7 to the minor? Have you received any notification 8 from ABCA that this occurred? SPA ANDERSON: No, I was not even aware 9 10 that ABCA is supposed to submit those type of 11 documents, but good to know. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So what this 13 says, sir 14 (Audio cut off) 15 ... check at your establishment and your establishment has not sold to? That we have 16 17 randomly done and I'm asking these questions 18 because you have basically stated that we committed the violation. You're making arguments 19 20 to say that what the penalty should be, and 21 that's why I'm asking these questions. 2.2 So therefore, what this says to me, 23 sir, is that the two times that we have randomly 24 done a compliance check at your establishment, 25 your establishment has sold an obvious minor

Neal R. Gross and Co., Inc. Washington DC alcohol. But again, I'm just asking since you have stated that your establishment has committed the violation, so you're appealing to us on the penalty phase.

I mean, that was what you stated here. 5 6 So, therefore, I'm not making a decision about 7 whether or not you're guilty or not because you have admitted that your establishment is guilty 8 9 of the violation that did occur, and so therefore, you're asking the Board to be lenient 10 11 in the punishment or whatever punishment that the 12 penalty state. All right?

MR. SHYYAN: Yes.

14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Any other 15 questions by any of the Board members? Any 16 questions, Mr. Shyyan? And I'm sorry, I keep 17 going after look at your name, Ms. Hoganmiller, 18 of Mr. Shyyan, based on the questions that were 19 asked by the Board.

20 MS. HOGENMILLER: No further questions. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do you have any 22 clarification that you want to provide to the 23 Board, Mr. Shyyan? I'm still going to give you an 24 opportunity to do a closing statement, but if you 25 had an attorney representing you, then it's like

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I'm giving the attorney an opportunity. So, say, for example, I put you in a box, and you didn't really have an opportunity to provide the explanation. So this is an opportunity if you want to explain whatever it is further, you had just answered to the questions I asked you, sir.

7 MR. SHYYAN: To be honest with you, I 8 don't think I have anything else to add besides 9 the point that, yes, we've reiterated 100 times 10 since the last occurrence in 2020 that we have to 11 check legal drinking age, and again, which we do. 12 It's just an unfortunate coincidence that 13 happened that day that 2007 looked like 2001.

14 And again, it doesn't relieve us from 15 the responsibility. I understand that. And by the 16 way, we consulted with an attorney regarding this case. We stated our opinion, we stated our 17 18 position, and attorney recommended that just to represent ourselves in this case since there 19 would be no need to. That was their 20 21 recommendation. Like, you don't even need me in 2.2 this case because you're not

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, Mr.
Shyyan. I mean, you're doing a good job in
representing yourself, sir. So I'm smiling

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1 because although you're doing pro se, you're doing a good job in representing the interest. 2 Whatever information was given to you by the 3 attorney, clearly you are following that advice 4 5 because you're doing a good job in representing 6 yourself, sir. So I'll hand that to you, okay? 7 All right. So, all right, so we're at the stage where Ms. Hogenmiller, do you wish to make a 8 9 closing in the sense that what is it that you want the Board to do? 10 11 MS. HOGENMILLER: Yes, a short closing. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, ma'am. 13 MS. HOGENMILLER: May it please the 14 Board, there is no factual dispute in this case. The establishment sold alcohol to a minor. The 15 16 qovernment has also proven its case by substantial evidence that the establishment has 17 18 failed to take reasonably necessary steps to 19 ascertain the minor's age before the sale. 20 You heard from investigator Ruiz. He 21 worked with an undercover minor to conduct a 2.2 compliance check on Sammy's Liquors. You saw a 23 copy of the undercover minor's ID, who was born 24 on March 26, 2007, making her 16 years old on 25 July 8 2023. Investigator Ruiz observed the

Neal R. Gross and Co., Inc. Washington DC undercover minor go into the store, saw her get a can of Bud Light, and then go to the counter to purchase the beer.

And when she was at the counter, the sales clerk checked her ID, and though she was under 21, sold her the beer. You also saw a picture of the Bud Light that was sold to the minor. And lastly, the establishment admitted that they sold alcohol to a minor.

The establishment tries to skirt its 10 11 violations, saying that the clerk was not wearing 12 her glasses at the time and mistook the date on the ID. That's not a defense. If the sales clerk 13 14 needs glasses to properly see a patron's date of 15 birth on the ID, then a reasonably necessary step 16 to ascertain a person's age is wearing her 17 qlasses.

The government has proven its two charges. First, that Sammy's Liquors sold alcohol to someone under 21 years old in violation of DC Code Section 25-781. Sammy's Liquors violated this Code section when it sold beer to a 15-yearold.

24 Second, Sammy's Liquors failed to take 25 reasonably necessary steps to ascertain whether

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1 any person buying alcohol is of legal drinking 2 age, in violation of DC Code Section 25-783. Sammy's Liquors violated this Code section 3 because its sales clerk failed to wear her 4 5 glasses, which she needed and then subsequently 6 failed to properly see the patron's age or 7 calculate her correct birth date before selling 8 her the beer. 9 Thus, the government requests that the Board find in its favor and apply a penalty that 10 11 is consistent with DC Code. Thank you. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, 13 ma'am. Mr. Shyyan, what is it that you want the 14 Board to do today? 15 MR. SHYYAN: I can only hope for the 16 minimal penalty that you can impose on our business. As I said, we don't mind. Yeah, if it's 17 18 a fine, it is what it is. We have to pay fine. 19 But if it's a license suspension and 20 we have to be closed for a prolonged period of 21 time, as I said, ever since the pandemic is over, 2.2 the business is not very profitable at all. So 23 it's not, unfortunately, a sustainable way for us to maintain our business. 2.4 25 The only other fact that I forgot to

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1 bring up ever since the 2020 incident --2 MS. HOGENMILLER: Objection. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I know you're a non-lawyer. You can't bring things up, but I'll 4 5 give you a little leeway. But you can't really 6 bring new things, new arguments in your closing. 7 MR. SHYYAN: Oh, it's not an argument. 8 It's just a comment. If you didn't bring it up 9 before, you can't bring it up. Your closing is just wrapping up the case to show what it is that 10 11 you proved, sir. Go ahead. 12 MR. SHYYAN: Okay, so, yes, as I said 13 earlier, we're not arguing that we broke the law 14 in this particular incident. My only argument is 15 that we did take all reasonable steps to assure 16 drinking age of an individual. 17 And that being the fact that Ms. Lewis 18 checked that individual's ID, it's just the fact 19 of misreading, mistaking 2007 for 2001 occurred 20 on that day. So I hope the Board makes the right 21 decision in this case. Thank you. 2.2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. This 23 matter is now closed. So I'll bring this, then, 24 this case to closure. All right. As Chairperson 25 of the Alcohol, Beverage and Cannabis Board for

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1	the District of Columbia in accordance with DC
2	Code Section 2575 of the Open Meeting Act, I move
3	that ABC Board hold a closed meeting for the
4	purpose of seeking legal advice from our council
5	on Case Number 23CC-00127, Sammy's Liquor,
6	pursuant to DC Official Code Section 2575B4A of
7	the Open Meetings Act and deliberating upon case
8	Number 23-CC-00127, Sammy's Liquors, for the
9	reason cited in DC Official Code Section 2575-B13
10	of the Open Meeting Act. Is there a second?
11	MEMBER HANSEN: Second.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hanson has
13	seconded. The motion will now roll call. Mr.
14	Short.
15	MEMBER SHORT: Mr. Short, I agree.
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Cato?
17	MEMBER CATO: I agree.
18	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Hansen?
19	MEMBER HANSEN: I agree.
20	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Grandis?
21	MEMBER GRANDIS: I agree.
22	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I agree.
23	As it appears in the motion has passed
24	5-0-0, I hereby give notice that the ABC Board
25	will reset this proceedings to hold a closed

1	meeting pursuant to Section 575 of the Open
2	Meetings Act. Thank you very much for your
3	presentation today. The Board will take the
4	arguments under advisement and will issue a
5	decision within 90 days. Have a great day. Thank
6	you very much. Thank you, everybody. Bye.
7	(Whereupon the above entitled matter
8	went off the record.)
