1 P-R-O-C-E-E-D-T-N-G-S 2 (10:51 a.m.)3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And our last 4 case for the morning, we do have a show cause 5 hearing and it's Case Number 24-CIT-00206, the Ugly Mug Dining Saloon, License Number 71793. 6 7 Mr. Orellana, can you please elevate the 8 government and the licensee, and any other witnesses in this case? 9 10 MR. ORELLANA: Sure. Jose 11 Jean-Baptiste, your access has been elevated. 12 Investigator Jeremy Zollarcoffer, your access has 13 been elevated. That is all, Chair. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. And 15 Mr. Orellana, can you do me a favor, please? 16 Once again, can you reach out in the chat to see whether or not the licensee is here to 17 18 participate? 19 MR. ORELLANA: Sure thing. No update, 20 Chair. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, 2.2 thank you. All right, so let me have the parties 23 identify themselves for the record. Mr. 2.4 Jean-Baptiste, can you please spell and state

your name for the record?

1	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Good morning,	
2	Board members, Mr. Chairperson. This is Jose	
3	Jean-Baptiste. Name's spelled J-O-S-E	
4	J-E-A-N-B-A-P-T-I-S-T-E, assistant attorney	
5	general for the District.	
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,	
7	sir. And if this matter goes to a hearing, do	
8	you have a witness you wish to call?	
9	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: That is correct,	
10	Mr. Chairperson, I do have Investigator Jeremy	
11	Zollarcoffer.	
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning,	
13	Mr. Zollarcoffer. Can you please spell and state	
14	your name for the record?	
15	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: Good morning, Mr.	
16	Chair, Board members. My name's Jeremy	
17	Zollarcoffer. It's J-E-R-E-M-Y, last name	
18	Zollarcoffer, Z-O-L-L-A-R-C-O-F-F-E-R.	
19	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr.	
20	Jean-Baptiste, I see that the licensee is not	
21	here. Have you had any conversation with the	
22	licensee?	
23	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Yeah, Mr.	
24	Chairperson, we have tried to communicate an	
25	offer in compromise to the licensee. We did	

receive an email on October the 16 asking for an OIC, however, an OIC was re-communicated to the establishment I believe that same day.

However, I have not heard back from them, and I sent another message to the establishment I believe yesterday, and this morning I did not receive anything back from them.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. Is the government prepared to move forward ex parte?

MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: That's correct,

Mr. Chairperson.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code, Section 25447E,

the Board has authority to proceed ex parte where

the licensee waives the hearing or fails to

appear, unless the hearing is extended for good

and sufficient cause. The Board's record

reflects that the licensee was properly served.

Seeing no licensee here today and having no good

and sufficient cause to extend the hearing, the

Board will proceed with the show cause hearing.

Do you have an opening statement that you wish to

make, sir?

MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Yes, I have a

1 short opening statement, Mr. Chairperson. 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead. 3 MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Good morning, 4 Board members. We are here today because the 5 Ugly Mug, located at 723 8th Street, Southeast in 6 Washington, D.C. failed to timely file its 7 quarterly statement for the period of October 1, 8 2023 to December 31, 2023 in violation of D.C. Code 25-113E2A and 23-DCMR-1207.1. You'll hear 9 10 from Investigator Jeremy Zollarcoffer and an ABCA 11 compliance analyst provided a list of 12 establishments that failed to file quarterly 13 statements for the period of October 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023, and that the Ugly Mug was on 14 15 that list. 16 He will tell you that he visited the 17 Ugly Mug and informed the establishment of the 18 violation and issued it a citation with a fine of 19 \$750. Investigator Zollarcoffer's testimony will 20 clearly establish that the Ugly Mug failed to file its quarterly statement by the prescribed 21 2.2 deadline. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's it, sir? 2.4 (No audible response.) 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr.

8	please? Do you swear or affirm to tell the truth	
9	and nothing but the truth?	
10	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: Yes.	
11	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Your witness,	
12	sir.	
13	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Good morning, Mr.	
14	Investigator Zollarcoffer. Could you please	
15	spell your name for the record?	
16	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: It's Jeremy	
17	Zollarcoffer. J-E-R-E-M-Y	
18	Z-O-L-L-A-R-C-O-F-F-E-R.	
19	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Where are you	
20	currently employed?	
21	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: With the Alcoholic	
22	Beverage and Cannabis Administration.	
23	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And what is your	
24	position at if I say ABCA, do you know what	
25	that means?	

1	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: Yes.			
2	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And what is your			
3	position at ABCA?			
4	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: I'm one of the			
5	investigators.			
6	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And how long have			
7	you been an investigator?			
8	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: I'm coming up on			
9	six years.			
10	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: What are your			
11	duties and responsibilities as an investigator?			
12	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: Conduct			
13	inspections, investigations to licensed ABC			
14	4 establishments within the District of Columbia.			
15	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And are you			
16	familiar with an establishment named the Ugly			
17	Mug?			
18	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: Yes, I am.			
19	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: How are you			
20	familiar with this establishment?			
21	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: We visited the			
22	establishment a few times, most recently March 5,			
23	to advise them of a quarterly statement			
24	violation.			
25	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And did you create			

1	a case report for the investigation?
2	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: I did.
3	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: I'm going to
4	direct you to a document marked as Government
5	Exhibit 1 for identification.
6	(Whereupon, the above-referred to
7	document was marked as Government Exhibit No. 1
8	for identification.)
9	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: Okay.
10	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Mr. Chairperson,
11	do I have permission to share my screen?
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Orellana,
13	can you allow the attorney to share his screen?
14	Thank you.
15	MR. ORELLANA: Yeah.
16	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Investigator
17	Zollarcoffer, can you please take a moment and
18	review Exhibit 1? Do you recognize this
19	document?
20	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: It's the one that
21	I've written.
22	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And what is this
23	document?
24	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: That's a case
25	report written for a quarterly statement

1	violation to Ugly Mug for the fourth quarter	
2	2023, failure to file timely.	
3	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Okay, and I know	
4	you did state this before, but for the record,	
5	can you please let us know who created this	
6	report?	
7	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: I did.	
8	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And why do ABCA	
9	investigators create reports?	
10	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: To notify the Board	
11	of violations of licensed establishments.	
12	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And did you review	
13	this report during the approval process?	
14	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: Yes.	
15	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Is this a fair and	
16	accurate representation of the case report that	
17	you created during your investigation into the	
18	Ugly Mug?	
19	MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: Yes, it is.	
20	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And it's not	
21	necessary, Mr. Chairperson, of course, to move it	
22	into evidence due to 23 ECMR1713.10, as this	
23	report is part of the Board's record.	
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So noted.	
25	MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And Investigator	

1 Zollarcoffer, what was this investigation about? 2 MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: It was a visit to 3 the establishment to conduct an inspection, notify the establishment of failure to file in a 4 5 timely manner regarding the delinquent quarterly statements, notified, met with the agency 6 7 manager, conducted an inspection, and wrote a 8 monetary fine for the violation. 9 MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Thank you, I was 10 going to ask what occurred during the 11 investigation, however you did notate that, what 12 occurred. So when was the deadline for 13 establishments to file their quarterly statements 14 for the fourth quarter of 2023? 15 MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: This was for a 16 fourth quarter violation, so the deadline was 17 February 1, midnight, 2024, so a three-day grace 18 period following the last date of the quarter. 19 MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: And did the Ugly 20 Mug file the quarterly statement? 21 MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: They did file. Ι 2.2 spoke with the compliance analyst who provided a timestamp document that on February 15, 11:15, 23 2.4 that they filed, so past the deadline.

1 record, did you say that that date that they 2 filed was past the deadline for them to file the 3 quarterly statement? 4 MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: Yeah, they had 5 until the last day of January to file, they filed 6 on February 15. 7 MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Thank you. And 8 did the Ugly Mug ever pay the citation you 9 issued? 10 MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: No, it's still 11 They're contesting it apparently with pending. 12 the show cause that they're not here for. 13 they also -- just to note, they have two 14 additional open case reports for the same failure 15 to file quarterly statements, so it appears to be 16 repeatedly happening over there. 17 MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Thank you. Αt 18 this moment, the government has no further 19 questions for Investigator Zollarcoffer. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Close your 21 screen please, sir. Any questions by any Board 2.2 members? 23 (No audible response.) 2.4 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, 25 hearing none, Investigator Zollarcoffer, thank

1 you very much for your testimony, you are free to 2 qo, sir. 3 MR. ZOLLARCOFFER: Thank you very 4 much. 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Does the government wish to make a closing statement? 6 7 MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: Yes, I do have a 8 brief statement, Mr. Chairperson. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Go ahead, sir. 10 MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE: The government has 11 proven to the Board by preponderance of evidence 12 that the Uqly Muq failed to timely file its 13 quarterly statement for the October 1, 2023 into 14 December 31, 2023 period. You heard Investigator 15 Zollarcoffer testify that ABCA produced a list of 16 establishments who had failed to meet the filing 17 deadline, and that the Ugly Mug was included on 18 that list. 19 You also heard Investigator 20 Zollarcoffer testify that they never paid the 21

Zollarcoffer testify that they never paid the \$750 fine. The District has therefore proven the charge in the notice to show cause. And the District recommends that the Board apply a penalty consistent with D.C. Code 25-830. Thank you.
