CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning. We are on the record.

Good morning, everyone. As chairperson of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the District of Columbia, and in accordance with DC Code Section 2571SC of the Open Meetings Act, OMA, I am welcoming you to the regular scheduled meeting of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.

This meeting is being conducted pursuant to guidance made available by the District of Columbia's Office of Open Government regarding electronic meetings held by public bodies. Electronic meetings by the ABC Board are authorized pursuant to Section 2577A of the DC Code.

Pursuant to the OMA requirements notice of today's meeting was provided 48 hours in advance of the meeting on ABRA's website, and on the District Central Meeting calendar. The notice includes the time, date, agenda, and call in or log in information for public participation.

This electronic meeting is being hosted by WebEx

My name is Donovan Anderson, I am 4 Chairman of the Board. I will introduce the 5 other members of the ABC Board who are also 6 7 participating electronically. Please respond 8 when I announce your name. Mr. James Short. 9 MEMBER SHORT: Mr. James Short, 10 present. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Bobby Cato. 12 MEMBER CATO: Bobby Cato, present. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, 13 Ms. Rafi Crockett. 14 Mr. Cato. 15 MEMBER CROCKETT: Rafi Crockett, 16 present. 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Edward Grandis. 18 19 (No audible response, but present) 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The Board has 21 five members in attendance for the conduct of 22 business today, and that constitutes a quorum. 23 Before we get underway with today's hearing 24 calendar I need to make a few instructions very 25 clear so that the conduct of these hearings is

honored by everyone. There are eight cases scheduled for this morning's calendar. Once the case is called I will take a moment for IT specialist to elevate the rights for each party to enable their camera and microphone. Then, and only then, will you have the ability to enable your equipment. If your case has not been heard you will remain mute, and your camera will be disabled.

Should you have - if your case has not been heard you will remain - I'm sorry. At the conclusion of each case the parties will have the option to leave. If the party chooses to stay, all cameras and microphones for the completed case will be disabled. Should you have any questions or require technical assistance during this hearing, please submit them using the question and answer feature.

Our first matter for this morning is a protest hearing status, Case Number 22-PRO-00071, Via Umbria, License Number 100387. Mr. Orellana, Good morning, could you please elevate the rights of the parties in this case, please.

MR. ORELLANA: Good morning, Manalle Mahmoud, your access has been elevated, Rick

| 19 | 2E03, and also the chair of ANC 2E. Richard, R- |
| 20 | I-C-H-A-R-D, Murphy, M-U-R-P-H-Y. |
| 21 | CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Good morning, |
| 22 | Mr. Murphy. Do we have someone here from the |
| 23 | Group of five or more? |
| 24 | MS. BUNNELL: This is Judith Bunnell, |
| 25 | J-U-D-I-T-H, B-U-N-N-E-L-L, and I am here from |

the Group of Five residents. 1 2 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Orellana, 3 can you please look for Karen Cruse? I think 4 that she - her rights need to be elevated. 5 All right, so can we - do we have someone from the abutting property owner? 6 Do we 7 have the abutting property owner? 8 MS. BUNNELL: Sir, the abutting 9 property owner, Susan Rutledge designated me 10 yesterday to be a spokesperson for her. This is 11 Judith Bunnell again, one of the residents. 12 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Ms. Mahmoud, 13 normally we ask that - we will ask the abutting 14 property owner to provide that to us in writing. 15 MS. BUNNELL: I believe she did that 16 via email yesterday. I saw an email go 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Were you aware of that Ms. Mahmoud? 18 MS. MAHMOUD: Yes, I was cc'ed on that 19 20 email, and that was fine. 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, that's 22 All right, so, I'm sorry, who was the 23 abutting property owner again, Ms. Bunnell? 24 MS. BUNNELL: It is Susan, S-U-S-A-N, 25 Rutledge, R-U-T-L-E-D-G-E.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, and the agency did receive that written authorization, so thank you. Ms. Cruse, can you please spell and state your name for the record, please?

MS. CRUSE: Karen, K-A-R-E-N, Cruse, C-R-U-S-E, and I represent the Citizens Association of Georgetown.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. All right, Ms. Mahmoud, I need you to give us - let us know where we are. It is my understanding that this license is in safekeeping.

MS. MAHMOUD: Correct.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right, so we normally - we do not move forward with a protest hearing unless it is renewal for a license that is in safekeeping, so can you give us - tell us what is going on, and what is it that the licensee wants to do?

MS. MAHMOUD: Correct, Mr. Chair. As you know, this license was approved into safekeeping last week, and since plans for reopening is completely up in the air, we actually just suggest that the Board stay this protest until such time that the license is

removed from safekeeping.

Now, if this - I just want to - before moving on I would like to advise the parties that if the license remains in safekeeping, and if we stay these proceedings, at such time if the license is removed from safekeeping we will still have to have a - we have to go through this process to renew the license, so if this matter stayed there will be no - the community will still have an opportunity once the license is removed from safekeeping to protest the license if they so choose to, okay? Any questions by anyone? I am going to ask input from the parties, the ANC, do you have an objection if the Board was to grant this request to stay the proceeding because of the status?

MR. MURPHY: Mr. Chairman, ANC 2E, understanding that the protest would remain in suspended animation while the proceeding is stayed, ANC 2E has no objection to the request by the applicant - by the licensee rather.

CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right.

Thank you, Mr. Murphy. Ms. Bunnell.
