MS. FLETCHER: Okay. The next case on the calendar is Eighteenth Street Lounge, Case No. 21-PRO-00079, YFE, Inc., 1230 9th Street, Northwest, License No. ABRA-118846. This is a Retailer Class CT New Application. The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet, residential parking, vehicular and pedestrian safety, real property values, overconcentration, and proximity to schools, recreation centers, day care centers, and public libraries. Is anyone present on behalf of ANC 2F?

MR. GUGGENMOS: Yes. Good morning, Ms. Fletcher. It's John Guggenmos present on behalf of ANC 2F.

MS. FLETCHER: Good morning Mr.
Guggenmos. Could you spell your name for the record, please?

MR. GUGGENMOS: Sure. It's John, J-0-H-N, Guggenmos, $G$ as in George, $U$ as in -whatever a $U$ word is -- $G$ as in George, $G$ as in George, $E$ as in Edward, $N$ as in Nancy, $M$ as in Mary, 0 as in Oscar, $S$ as in Sam. And how about
umbrella for a U.
MS. FLETCHER: Oh, yeah. That's a good one. Is anyone present on behalf of Blagden Alley Naylor Court Association?

MR. GOLDBERG: Yes. Yes, Ms. Fletcher.

MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Goldberg, is that you?

MR. GOLDBERG: Yes, Robert Goldberg, R-O-B-E-R-T, last name, G-O-L-D-B-E-R-G.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. Mr. Goldberg, I have a question for you.

MR. GOLDBERG: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: I read your protest letter. And in your letter, you state the requirements. You mentioned that you held duly convened meeting where you invited your body and the applicant with a seven-day notice concerning the meeting. You also mentioned that your association is located in the affected area.

MR. GOLDBERG: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: And there's one other thing you noted. Okay. So you got the duly held meeting. You gave the seven-day notice, and you're located in the affected area. The one
thing missing from your protest letter is whether or not you're incorporated in the District of Columbia.

MR. GOLDBERG: We are, yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Will you be able to provide us with your articles of incorporation?

MR. GOLDBERG: Absolutely.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. At this stage, I'm going to go ahead and grant standing to ANC 2F. And Mr. Goldberg, I'm going to grant conditional standing to your group until you provide all the articles of incorporation. And when you submit those, can you submit those to ABRA as well as send the copy to Ms. Fitch -Candace Fitch? You all can share your contact information beyond the roll call hearing. Ms. Fitch, do you by any chance have contact information for Blagden Alley?

MS. FITCH: I do. Mr. Goldberg and I have had communications, yes.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay, good. Then Mr. Goldberg, if you will provide Ms. Fitch with a copy of your articles of incorporation of proof that you incorporated?

MR. GOLDBERG: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: And also provide a copy to ABRA so that we can put it in the file.

MR. GOLDBERG: Absolutely.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. We also have a group of 6 individuals. Is Ms. Jelena Budjevac present?

MS. BUDJEVAC: Yes, I am.
MS. FLETCHER: Did I pronounce that almost correctly?

MS. BUDJEVAC: You did a great job.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
MS. BUDJEVAC: It's Jelena Budjevac. And you need me to spell it, it's --

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MS. BUDJEVAC: -- J as in John, E as in Edward, L as in Larry, $E$ as in Edward, $N$ as in Nancy, A as in apple. Last name is Budjevac, B as in boy, $U$ as in Utah, $D$ as in Denver, $J$ as in John, E as in Edward, V as in Victor, A as in apple, $C$ as in Charlie.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. Are any other individuals present from your group today?

MS. BUDJEVAC: Yes, they are. And

I'll let them announce themselves.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. I'm ready.
MS. POLICICCHIO: Hi, I'm here. My name is Megan Policicchio. It's Megan, M-E-G-AN. And the last name is Policicchio, P-O-L-I-C-I-C-C-H-I-O.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
MS. POLICICCHIO: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: Anyone else?
MS. AHMED: Hi, my name is Farah Ahmed.

MS. FLETCHER: Sorry, what is it again?

MS. AHMED: Farah Ahmed, and it's spelled $F$ as in Frank, A-R-A-H, last name Ahmed, A-H-M-E-D.

MS. FLETCHER: Anyone else?
MR. URBAN: My name is Richard Urban.
MS. FLETCHER: Richard, what's your last name again?

MR. URBAN: Urban, U-R-B-A-N, U like in Uganda, $R$ like in rush, $B$ like in boy, A like in apple, $N$ like in Nancy. First name, Richard.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Anyone else?

MR. ROZANTE: Florindo Rozante.
MS. FLETCHER: Can you spell that for the record, please?

MR. ROZANTE: F-L-O-R-I-N-D-O, last name Rozante, $\mathrm{R}-\mathrm{O}-\mathrm{Z}-\mathrm{A}-\mathrm{N}-\mathrm{T}-\mathrm{E}$.

MS. FLETCHER: Anyone else?
MR. SHAIKH: Amir Shaikh.
MS. FLETCHER: Spell it for the record.

MR. SHAIKH: A-M-I-R S-H-A-I-K-H.
MS. FLETCHER: Is there anyone else?
MR. MERCER: Ken Mercer.
MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Mercer, what's your first name?

MR. MERCER: It's Ken, Kilo, Echo, November. And Mercer --

MS. FLETCHER: You said M-E-R-C-E-R for Mercer?

MR. MERCER: That's correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Anyone else? Thank you.
(Pause.)
MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Budjevac, I counted six members in you protest group. But there are more than six individuals present today. Is
there anyone present that did not sign the protest letter?

MS. BUDJEVAC: No, I thought there were six people who came forward.

MS. FLETCHER: Let me make sure I counted correctly. Let me see. I'm counting you.

MS. BUDJEVAC: Right.
MS. FLETCHER: Right. Megan?
MS. BUDJEVAC: Megan, correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Farah, Richard. Is it Florindo?

MS. BUDJEVAC: Florindo did not sign. That's right.

MS. FLETCHER: And then I have Amir.
MS. BUDJEVAC: Correct.
MS. FLETCHER: And Ken.
MS. BUDJEVAC: Correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Excellent. Let me count again.

MS. BUDJEVAC: Thanks for doing that.
MS. FLETCHER: Now we have six. Your group is granted standing.

MS. FITCH: Ms. Fletcher? I'm sorry.
MS. FLETCHER: Who's speaking?

MS. FITCH: This is Candace on behalf of the applicant. I didn't receive the addresses to confirm that these folks share common ground to protest.

MS. FLETCHER: You didn't receive the addresses? Hold on one second, Ms. Fitch.

MS. FITCH: I did not.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Hold on one second.

MR. GOLDBERG: Ms. Fletcher, the addresses were not provided to Ms. Fitch for concerns of safety of the residents in the neighborhood. That was --
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. FLETCHER: So who's speaking?
MR. GOLDBERG: This is Robert Goldberg.

MS. FLETCHER: Oh, so Mr. Goldberg, I was going to let Ms. Fitch know about that note in your protest letter. But Ms. Fitch, we'll get the addresses to you. There was a notation in the protest letter that the protestants did not want to provide their email addresses publicly. But they will get you a list of the addresses.

MS. FITCH: Thank you.

MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome. Let me just make a note to provide you with the addresses. There was a notation on the protest letter that they preferred to not provide the addresses publicly. But I'll make sure that you get those.

We have one more group of protestants. This group appears to be a group of 16. They are identified as the Picnic Benchers. Is Mr. Easley present?

MR. EASLEY: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Easley, would you state your name and spell it for the record, please?

MR. EASLEY: Vincent, V-I-N-C-E-N-T. Last name Easley, E-A-S-L-E-Y.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. Is anyone else present from your group today?

MR. PINTO: Yeah, Hector Pinto, Hector, H-E-C-T-O-R, Pinto, P-I-N-T-O.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Anyone else?

MS. GONZALEZ: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. If you could state your name and spell it for the record,
please.
MS. GONZALEZ: Cohrrada Gonzalez, C-0-H-R-R-A-D-A G-O-N-Z-A-L-E-Z.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. Let me do this before we go any further. Mr. Easley --

MR. EASLEY: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: -- you've requested a Spanish language interpreter for today. Is Suzanna Martin present?
(No audible response.)
MS. FLETCHER: Is Suzanna Martin present, the Spanish language interpreter?

MR. PINTO: I'm Hector. I could help with that if you all need some help.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, Hector. We'll let you know. Thank you very much. MR. PINTO: All right then. All right then.

MS. FLETCHER: Appreciate that.
MR. PINTO: All right.
MS. FLETCHER: Is anyone else present from the group?

MR. CAMEROS: Yes, my name is Mynor Cameros, $\mathrm{M}-\mathrm{Y}-\mathrm{N}-\mathrm{O}-\mathrm{R}$ and $\mathrm{C}-\mathrm{A}-\mathrm{M}-\mathrm{E}-\mathrm{R}-\mathrm{O}-\mathrm{S}$.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. I can't hear you too well. Can you state your name one more time?

MR. CAMEROS: Yeah, my name Mynor Cameros, $\mathrm{M}-\mathrm{Y}-\mathrm{N}-\mathrm{O}-\mathrm{R}$. And my last name is Cameros, C-A-M-E-R-O-S .

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. Anyone else?

MR. NOLASCO: My name is Juan Nolasco.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Can you spell that for the record, please?

MR. PINTO: Listen, he's going to tell you in Spanish because he doesn't know his letters in English. He's going to say it in Spanish.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Is that Juan Nolasco?

MR. NOLASCO: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. You can spell it in Spanish, Mr. Nolasco.

MR. NOLASCO: Juan Nolasco, J-U-A-N N-O-L-A-S-C-O.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Thank you very much. Thank you, Hector. Anyone else?

MR. ROZANTE: I signed -- I signed the BANCA letter.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So we broke up just a little bit. Can you say your name one more time?

MR. HERNANDEZ: Mario Hernandez, my name -- my first is M-A-R-I-O.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. HERNANDEZ: Okay. Hernandez, H-E-R-N-A-N-D-E-Z.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
MR. HERNANDEZ: You're welcome. Mr. Ramirez, what's your first name?

MS. FLETCHER: Could you repeat the question, please?

MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Ramirez, what's your first name? Hector?

MR. PINTO: What's up?
MS. FLETCHER: Can you ask Mr. Ramirez his first name, please?

MR. PINTO: Whose?
MS. FLETCHER: Was it Mr. Ramirez?
MR. PINTO: Mr. Ramirez?
MS. FLETCHER: What did he -- I thought that's what he spelled.

MR. PINTO: He spelled Mario Hernandez.

MS. FLETCHER: He spelled Hernandez. Just a second.
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MR. PINTO: That's why we need a Spanish translator. H-E-R-N-A-N-D-E-S, Hernandes.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. I completely -I didn't understand what he said. Thank you.

MR. PINTO: And I'm saying (inaudible) give me an application, ma'am. You all need a Spanish interpreter.

MS. FLETCHER: Is anyone else present?
MR. ROZANTE: I signed the BANCA
letter.
MS. FLETCHER: Can you say that again?
MR. ROZANTE: I did sign the BANCA, B-A-N-C-A, letter.

MS. FLETCHER: You signed the BANCA
letter?
MR. ROZANTE: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: So you're not a part of this group?
(No audible response.)
MS. FLETCHER: You're not a part of this group of 16 ? Can you just give me your
name, please?
MR. ROZANTE: Florindo Rozante, F-L-O-R-I-N-D-O, Rozante, R-O-Z-A-N-T-E.

MS. FITCH: Yeah, Ms. Fletcher. This is Candace. He was part of the other letter, the group of 6.

MR. ROZANTE: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Represented by Ellen Jaffe?

MS. FITCH: Correct.
MS. FLETCHER: No, represented by Blagden Alley?

MS. FITCH: Right, by Jelena and Amir.
MR. GOLDBERG: Ms. Fletcher, Florindo cosigned the letter for the Blagden Alley/Naylor Court Association.

MS. FLETCHER: So who's speaking?
MR. GOLDBERG: This is Robert Goldberg.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. And so what did you say again?

MR. GOLDBERG: Florindo signed the Blagden Alley/Naylor Court Association protest letter -- cosigned it with myself.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So it wasn't
with Ms. Budjevac. That was with --
MS. BUDJEVAC: No.
MS. FLETCHER: -- the Blagden Alley?
MR. GOLDBERG: Correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. Mr. Easley, is any questions from your group today? MR. EASLEY: No, ma'am. No, ma'am.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
MR. EASLEY: Do you need anything else?

MS. FLETCHER: I have counted 13 people from your group present today.

MR. EASLEY: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Which means that your group has standing as a protestant because at least 5 of you were present today.

MS. FITCH: Ms. Fletcher, this is Candace Fitch on behalf of the applicant.

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MS. FITCH: I have multiple addresses from this group. Can you please let us know how you established they have common ground to protest?

MR. PINTO: We all live in the same neighborhood, same block radius, same two-block
radius. We all live in the neighborhood. That's why because we live all together in that same neighborhood.

MS. FLETCHER: I'm going to ask you a question. That's going to be the answer --
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. FLETCHER: And Ms. Fitch, Did you receive a copy of the protest letter that had the addresses included?

MS. FITCH: On this letter, I did, yes.

MS. FLETCHER: Did you have some reason to think that these addresses were not located in the affected area?

MS. FITCH: I don't know that I agree that they have common ground because the addresses range from all the way up to 11th Street.

MR. PINTO: Exactly, because that's the community, 11th Street --
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. FLETCHER: Let me -- excuse me. Excuse me. Hold on. Hold on everybody. Just a minute. So let's do this. Ms. Fitch, I have granted standing to this group based on my
understanding that they live within the affected area. If you have any addresses that you are concerned about, send me an email and I will provide you with additional information. Just let me know which addresses you believe are not located in the affected area or proximity --

MR. PINTO: Tell her come to the neighborhood.

MS. FLETCHER: -- to the establishment.

MS. FITCH: Thank you, Ms. Fletcher.
MS. FLETCHER: Let's do it that way.
MS. FITCH: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: You're very welcome. For the purpose of the roll call hearing today, standing is granted to the group of --

MR. EASLEY: Thank you.
MR. PINTO: Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: -- 16 represented by Mr. Easley and Mr. Pinto. So in this case, we have ANC $2 F$ as a protestant. The Blagden Alley/Naylor Court Association is granted conditional standing until they provide the articles of incorporation. And once they do that and appear for the status hearing before the

Board, the Board will grant full standing to the association. We have the group of 6 represented by Ms. Budjevac who has standing and the group of 16 represented Vincent Easley and Hector Pinto who has standing.

MR. PINTO: Thank you very much.
Thank you very much.
MS. FLETCHER: You're very welcome.
MR. PINTO: Thank you. Thank you very much.

MS. FLETCHER: So I'm going to give you dates for the upcoming proceedings now. We got to have a mediation, a status hearing, and a protest hearing. We're going to have a mediation so that the protestants have an opportunity to meet with the protestants to try to resolve your concerns. Do you have any questions about Mr. Easley or Mr. Pinto, the purpose of the mediation?

MR. EASLEY: Can you repeat that, please?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes, we're going to have -- we're going to schedule a mediation, a status hearing, and a protest hearing. The purpose of the mediation is to give the parties
an opportunity to meet with the Board's mediator to try and result the concerns that you have regarding the application.

MR. EASLEY: Okay.
MS. FLETCHER: Do you have any questions regarding that? It's an opportunity to settle this matter, to resolve your concerns.

MR. EASLEY: No questions at this point. Just need the dates.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. And so you'll receive a Webex invitation from me the same as you did to appear for this hearing. Any questions about that?

MR. EASLEY: What are the dates?
MS. FLETCHER: We're going to set one in a minute.

MR. EASLEY: Okay. Thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome. Before we set a date for the mediation, I'm going to give you a date for a status hearing. And the purpose of the status hearing is for you to inform the ABC Board regarding the status of this case which means you will let the ABC Board know that you participated in mediation and the results. That's what happens at a status
hearing. The day for the status hearing is December the 1st.

MR. EASLEY: December 1st.
MS. FLETCHER: December the 1st at 10:30 a.m. There's going to be a protest hearing set for January 12, 2022 at 1:30 p.m. That's the protest hearing set for January 12, 2022 at 1:30 p.m.

The protest hearing is scheduled in case the parties are not able to resolve their concerns during mediation. If you're able to resolve your concerns in mediation, there is a settlement agreement that all the parties sign. And once the Board approves that, the protest hearing is canceled because the matter has been resolved. If the case is not resolved in mediation, there's a protest hearing. MR. PINTO: What happened to the sandwich lady that came through in our neighborhood?

MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Who's speaking? MR. PINTO: Hector. I'm sorry. It's Hector Pinto.

MS. FLETCHER: And what did you say, Hector?

MR. PINTO: I was asking about the sandwich lady. I don't know her name. It came in my neighborhood giving out sandwiches, trying to divide us. I was trying to figure out who was that lady, the sandwich lady from --
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. FLETCHER: Oh, I actually don't know.

MR. PINTO: Oh, okay. So who could I go about finding out who that person coming in our neighborhood doing that?

MS. FLETCHER: So actually, that is not an issue.
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. FLETCHER: Excuse me. Just a second. That is not an issue that you can resolve through our roll call hearing.

MR. PINTO: I just wanted to figure it out what's going on. That's all.

MS. FLETCHER: Oh, that's okay. I understand.

MR. PINTO: Trying to figure out what's going on in my neighborhood. Somebody else going to say something? You're on mute.

MS. NABER: Oh, sorry. Hi, I'm Jordan

Naber. I'm the GM of Eighteenth Street Lounge. I had a -- we did a menu tasting, and I had sandwiches left over. So that is probably what he was talking about.

MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
MR. PINTO: Say what now?
MS. FLETCHER: Excuse me just one more second. I'm going to need you to state your name one more time. Jordan?

MS. NABER: It's Jordan Naber, J-O-R-D-A-N. Last name is Naber, N-A-B-E-R.

MS. FLETCHER: And so Ms. Nader, you're the general manager of Eighteenth Street Lounge?

MS. NABER: Yes, it's Naber, N-A-B-ER, not a $\mathbf{D}$.

MR. EASLEY: Hello?
MS. FLETCHER: Just a second. Okay. So who was just speaking? Who just said hello?

MR. EASLEY: Oh, yeah, Mr. Easley. And I feel that if someone is in opposition to us shouldn't provide sandwich or say anything.

MS. FLETCHER: So Mr. Easley, that's not a conversation we can have during the roll call hearing. You and Ms. Jordan can work that
out --
MR. EASLEY: Okay.
MS. FLETCHER: -- outside of ABRA.
MR. EASLEY: I'm talking to Jordan then. Okay.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
MS. NABER: Yeah, if you guys are going to be out there, $I$ can come talk to you guys today.
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. FLETCHER: So we're not even going to discuss those -- excuse me, everyone. We are not discussing those sandwiches during the roll call hearing.

MR. EASLEY: All right.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay, okay. So --
MR. ROZANTE: I would like to --
(Simultaneous speaking.)
MS. FLETCHER: -- we now -- who's speaking? Who's speaking?

MR. ROZANTE: Florindo Rozante.
MS. FLETCHER: Yes, Mr. Rozante.
MR. ROZANTE: The alley is become a real problem.

MS. FLETCHER: So Mr. Rozante, those
are the issues that you discuss during mediation, not during the roll call hearing.

MR. ROZANTE: Okay.
MS. FLETCHER: But you will have an opportunity to discuss your concerns.

MS. BUDJEVAC: So how are the dates selected for the mediation?

MS. FLETCHER: They're selected based on the Board's calendar.

MS. BUDJEVAC: Okay.
MS. FLETCHER: And who was just speaking?

MS. BUDJEVAC: That's Jelena Budjevac.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you.
MS. BUDJEVAC: Thank you, Ms.
Fletcher.
MS. FLETCHER: You're very welcome. And so we've got the status hearing set for December 1, 2021 at 10:30. We got the protest hearing set for January 12, 2022 at 1:30.

Now we need to set a data for mediation. And I'm going to give you the next day available for mediation. The next day available for mediation is Tuesday, November 23rd. Or excuse me one minute. We may be able
to do something before that.
MR. PINTO: Thanksgiving, dog. Thanksgiving week, that's when we're going?

MS. FLETCHER: Who's speaking?
MR. PINTO: Hector Pinto.
MS. FLETCHER: What did you say, Mr. Pinto?

MR. PINTO: It's the week of Thanksgiving.

MS. FLETCHER: We won't do it the week of Thanksgiving.

MR. PINTO: Okay. I'm just making sure.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you for pointing that out. What about Wednesday, November 10? Is anybody available on Wednesday, November 10 at, say, 10:30 in the morning?

MR. GUGGENMOS: The ANC could be available. This is John Guggenmos.

MS. FLETCHER: Oh, for mediation, we'll need to have present the designated representatives. Mr. Easley and Mr. Pinto, are you available on November 10?
(No audible response.)
MS. FLETCHER: Wednesday, November 10
for mediation?
MS. GONZALEZ: What time?
