MS. FLETCHER: Okay. The next case on the calendar is Eighteenth Street Lounge, Case No. 21-PRO-00079, YFE, Inc., 1230 9th Street, Northwest, License No. ABRA-118846. This is a Retailer Class CT New Application. The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet, residential parking, vehicular and pedestrian safety, real property values, overconcentration, and proximity to schools, recreation centers, day care centers, and public libraries. Is anyone present on behalf of ANC 2F?

MR. GUGGENMOS: Yes. Good morning,
Ms. Fletcher. It's John Guggenmos present on

So you got the duly held 24 meeting. You gave the seven-day notice, and

you're located in the affected area.

The one

thing missing from your protest letter is whether 1 2 or not you're incorporated in the District of 3 Columbia. We are, yes. 4 MR. GOLDBERG: 5 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Will you be able to provide us with your articles of 6 7 incorporation? 8 MR. GOLDBERG: Absolutely. 9 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. At this stage, 10 I'm going to go ahead and grant standing to ANC 11 And Mr. Goldberg, I'm going to grant 12 conditional standing to your group until you 13 provide all the articles of incorporation. 14 when you submit those, can you submit those to 15 ABRA as well as send the copy to Ms. Fitch --Candace Fitch? You all can share your contact 16 17 information beyond the roll call hearing. 18 Fitch, do you by any chance have contact 19 information for Blagden Alley? 20 MS. FITCH: I do. Mr. Goldberg and I 21 have had communications, yes. 22 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, good. Then Mr. 23 Goldberg, if you will provide Ms. Fitch with a 24 copy of your articles of incorporation of proof

that you incorporated?

11	MS. FLETCHER: Farah, Richard. Is it
12	Florindo?
13	MS. BUDJEVAC: Florindo did not sign.

15	MS. FLETCHER: And then I have Amir.
16	MS. BUDJEVAC: Correct.

23	group is granted standing.

25	MS. FLETCHER: Who's speaking?

This is Candace on behalf 1 MS. FITCH: I didn't receive the addresses 2 of the applicant. 3 to confirm that these folks share common ground 4 to protest. 5 You didn't receive the MS. FLETCHER: addresses? Hold on one second, Ms. Fitch. 6 7 I did not. MS. FITCH: 8 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Hold on one 9 second. 10 MR. GOLDBERG: Ms. Fletcher, the 11 addresses were not provided to Ms. Fitch for 12 concerns of safety of the residents in the 13 neighborhood. That was --14 (Simultaneous speaking.) 15 MS. FLETCHER: So who's speaking? This is Robert 16 MR. GOLDBERG: 17 Goldberg. 18 MS. FLETCHER: Oh, so Mr. Goldberg, I 19 was going to let Ms. Fitch know about that note 20 in your protest letter. But Ms. Fitch, we'll get 21 There was a notation in the addresses to you. 22 the protest letter that the protestants did not 23 want to provide their email addresses publicly. 24 But they will get you a list of the addresses. 25 Thank you. MS. FITCH:

1	MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome. Let me
2	just make a note to provide you with the
3	addresses. There was a notation on the protest
4	letter that they preferred to not provide the
5	addresses publicly. But I'll make sure that you
6	get those.
7	We have one more group of protestants.
8	This group appears to be a group of 16. They are
9	identified as the Picnic Benchers. Is Mr. Easley
10	present?
11	MR. EASLEY: Yes.
12	MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Easley, would you
13	state your name and spell it for the record,
14	please?
15	MR. EASLEY: Vincent, V-I-N-C-E-N-T.
16	Last name Easley, E-A-S-L-E-Y.
17	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
18	Is anyone else present from your group today?
19	MR. PINTO: Yeah, Hector Pinto,
20	Hector, H-E-C-T-O-R, Pinto, P-I-N-T-O.

12	MS. FLETCHER: Is anyone else present?
13	MR. ROZANTE: I signed the BANCA
14	letter.
15	MS. FLETCHER: Can you say that again?
16	MR. ROZANTE: I did sign the BANCA, B-
17	A-N-C-A, letter.
18	MS. FLETCHER: You signed the BANCA
19	letter?
20	MR. ROZANTE: Yes.
21	MS. FLETCHER: So you're not a part of
22	this group?

8	MS. FLETCHER: Represented by Ellen
9	Jaffe?
10	MS. FITCH: Correct.
11	MS. FLETCHER: No, represented by
12	Blagden Alley?
13	MS. FITCH: Right, by Jelena and Amir.
14	MR. GOLDBERG: Ms. Fletcher, Florindo
15	cosigned the letter for the Blagden Alley/Naylor
16	Court Association.
17	MS. FLETCHER: So who's speaking?
18	MR. GOLDBERG: This is Robert
19	Goldberg.
20	MS. FLETCHER: Okay. And so what did
21	you say again?
22	MR. GOLDBERG: Florindo signed the
23	Blagden Alley/Naylor Court Association protest
24	letter cosigned it with myself.
25	MS. FLETCHER: Okay. So it wasn't

1	with Ms. Budjevac. That was with
2	MS. BUDJEVAC: No.
3	MS. FLETCHER: the Blagden Alley?
4	MR. GOLDBERG: Correct.
5	MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. Mr.
6	Easley, is any questions from your group today?
7	MR. EASLEY: No, ma'am. No, ma'am.
8	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
9	MR. EASLEY: Do you need anything
10	else?
11	MS. FLETCHER: I have counted 13
12	people from your group present today.
13	MR. EASLEY: Yes.
14	MS. FLETCHER: Which means that your
15	group has standing as a protestant because at
16	least 5 of you were present today.
17	MS. FITCH: Ms. Fletcher, this is
18	Candace Fitch on behalf of the applicant.
19	MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
20	MS. FITCH: I have multiple addresses
21	from this group. Can you please let us know how
22	you established they have common ground to
23	protest?
24	MR. PINTO: We all live in the same
25	neighborhood, same block radius, same two-block

1	radius. We all live in the neighborhood. That's
2	why because we live all together in that same
3	neighborhood.
4	MS. FLETCHER: I'm going to ask you a
5	question. That's going to be the answer
6	(Simultaneous speaking.)
7	MS. FLETCHER: And Ms. Fitch, Did you
8	receive a copy of the protest letter that had the
9	addresses included?
10	MS. FITCH: On this letter, I did,
11	yes.
12	MS. FLETCHER: Did you have some
13	reason to think that these addresses were not
14	located in the affected area?
15	MS. FITCH: I don't know that I agree
16	that they have common ground because the
17	addresses range from all the way up to 11th
18	Street.
19	MR. PINTO: Exactly, because that's
20	the community, 11th Street
21	(Simultaneous speaking.)
22	MS. FLETCHER: Let me excuse me.
23	Excuse me. Hold on. Hold on everybody. Just a
24	minute. So let's do this. Ms. Fitch, I have
25	granted standing to this group based on my

understanding that they live within the affected 1 2 If you have any addresses that you are 3 concerned about, send me an email and I will provide you with additional information. 4 5 let me know which addresses you believe are not located in the affected area or proximity --6 7 MR. PINTO: Tell her come to the 8 neighborhood. 9 MS. FLETCHER: -- to the establishment. 10 11 MS. FITCH: Thank you, Ms. Fletcher. 12 MS. FLETCHER: Let's do it that way. 13 MS. FITCH: Thank you. 14 MS. FLETCHER: You're very welcome. 15 For the purpose of the roll call hearing today, 16 standing is granted to the group of --17 MR. EASLEY: Thank you. 18 MR. PINTO: Thank you. 19 MS. FLETCHER: -- 16 represented by 20 Mr. Easley and Mr. Pinto. So in this case, we 21 have ANC 2F as a protestant. The Blagden 22 Alley/Naylor Court Association is granted 23 conditional standing until they provide the 24 articles of incorporation. And once they do that 25 and appear for the status hearing before the

Board, the Board will grant full standing to the 1 2 association. We have the group of 6 represented 3 by Ms. Budjevac who has standing and the group of 16 represented Vincent Easley and Hector Pinto 4 5 who has standing. MR. PINTO: Thank you very much. 6 7 Thank you very much. 8 MS. FLETCHER: You're very welcome. 9 Thank you. Thank you very MR. PINTO: 10 much. 11 MS. FLETCHER: So I'm going to give 12 you dates for the upcoming proceedings now. 13 got to have a mediation, a status hearing, and a 14 protest hearing. We're going to have a mediation 15 so that the protestants have an opportunity to 16 meet with the protestants to try to resolve your 17 Do you have any questions about Mr. concerns. 18 Easley or Mr. Pinto, the purpose of the 19 mediation? 20 MR. EASLEY: Can you repeat that, 21 please? 22 Yes, we're going to MS. FLETCHER: 23 have -- we're going to schedule a mediation, a 24 status hearing, and a protest hearing. The

purpose of the mediation is to give the parties

an opportunity to meet with the Board's mediator 1 2 to try and result the concerns that you have 3 regarding the application. 4 MR. EASLEY: Okay. 5 MS. FLETCHER: Do you have any questions regarding that? It's an opportunity to 6 7 settle this matter, to resolve your concerns. 8 MR. EASLEY: No questions at this 9 point. Just need the dates. 10 MS. FLETCHER: Okay. Thank you. And 11 so you'll receive a Webex invitation from me the 12 same as you did to appear for this hearing. 13 questions about that? MR. EASLEY: What are the dates? 14 15 MS. FLETCHER: We're going to set one 16 in a minute. 17 MR. EASLEY: Okay. Thank you. 18 MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome. 19 we set a date for the mediation, I'm going to 20 give you a date for a status hearing. And the 21 purpose of the status hearing is for you to 22 inform the ABC Board regarding the status of this case which means you will let the ABC Board know 23 24 that you participated in mediation and the 25 results. That's what happens at a status

hearing. The day for the status hearing is 1 2 December the 1st. 3 MR. EASLEY: December 1st. 4 MS. FLETCHER: December the 1st at 5 10:30 a.m. There's going to be a protest hearing 6 set for January 12, 2022 at 1:30 p.m. That's the 7 protest hearing set for January 12, 2022 at 1:30 8 p.m. 9 The protest hearing is scheduled in case the parties are not able to resolve their 10 11 concerns during mediation. If you're able to 12 resolve your concerns in mediation, there is a 13 settlement agreement that all the parties sign. 14 And once the Board approves that, the protest 15 hearing is canceled because the matter has been resolved. If the case is not resolved in 16 mediation, there's a protest hearing. 17 18 MR. PINTO: What happened to the 19 sandwich lady that came through in our 20 neighborhood? 21 Okay. Who's speaking? MS. FLETCHER: 22 MR. PINTO: Hector. I'm sorry. It's 23 Hector Pinto. 24 MS. FLETCHER: And what did you say, 25 Hector?

1	MR. PINTO: I was asking about the
2	sandwich lady. I don't know her name. It came
3	in my neighborhood giving out sandwiches, trying
4	to divide us. I was trying to figure out who was
5	that lady, the sandwich lady from
6	(Simultaneous speaking.)
7	MS. FLETCHER: Oh, I actually don't
8	know.
9	MR. PINTO: Oh, okay. So who could I
10	go about finding out who that person coming in
11	our neighborhood doing that?
12	MS. FLETCHER: So actually, that is
13	not an issue.
14	(Simultaneous speaking.)
15	MS. FLETCHER: Excuse me. Just a
16	second. That is not an issue that you can
17	resolve through our roll call hearing.
18	MR. PINTO: I just wanted to figure it
19	out what's going on. That's all.
20	MS. FLETCHER: Oh, that's okay. I
21	understand.
22	MR. PINTO: Trying to figure out
23	what's going on in my neighborhood. Somebody
24	else going to say something? You're on mute.
25	MS. NABER: Oh, sorry. Hi, I'm Jordan

1	Naber. I'm the GM of Eighteenth Street Lounge.
2	I had a we did a menu tasting, and I had
3	sandwiches left over. So that is probably what
4	he was talking about.
5	MS. FLETCHER: Okay.
6	MR. PINTO: Say what now?
7	MS. FLETCHER: Excuse me just one more
8	second. I'm going to need you to state your name
9	one more time. Jordan?
10	MS. NABER: It's Jordan Naber, J-O-R-
11	D-A-N. Last name is Naber, N-A-B-E-R.
12	MS. FLETCHER: And so Ms. Nader,
13	you're the general manager of Eighteenth Street
14	Lounge?
15	MS. NABER: Yes, it's Naber, N-A-B-E-
16	R, not a D.
17	MR. EASLEY: Hello?
18	MS. FLETCHER: Just a second. Okay.
19	So who was just speaking? Who just said hello?
