MS. FLETCHER: Good morning to everyone and thank you for joining ABRA's online roll call hearings being conducted via Webex, which is provided by the DC Office of Open Government.

There are two hearings on the calendar this morning. Once I call your case, I'll make it possible for you to speak and to be seen, and if your case is not being heard, you will remain muted, and at the conclusion of each case, you can have the option to leave the meeting if you like.

I'm going to call the first case. The first case is case number 20-PRO-00046, Goth Wine Limited Liability Company trading as To Be Determined, 2622 P Street NW, license number ABRA-116925.

This is a Retailer Class CR new application. The protest issues are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet, residential parking, and real property values.

My name is LaVerne Fletcher conducting the roll call hearing as the Board's agent. I'm

1	now going to take a moment to make it possible
2	for the parties in this case to hear and use your
3	camera.
4	MS. BENCHIMOL: Good morning,
5	everyone, I'm Elli.
6	MS. FLETCHER: Good morning.
7	(Pause.)
8	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, Ms. Gwendolyn
9	Lohse, can you hear me?
10	MS. LOHSE: I can.
11	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, am I pronouncing
12	your last name correctly?
13	MS. LOHSE: You did fantastically
14	well. No one ever gets that right.
15	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
16	(Simultaneous speaking.)
17	MS. LOHSE: So, thank you.
18	MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome. Ms.
19	Cruse, can you hear me?
20	MS. CRUSE: Yes, I can. Good morning.
21	MS. FLETCHER: Good morning. Ms.
22	Huber?
23	MS. HUBER: Good morning. Yes, I can
24	hear you.
25	MS. FLETCHER: Good morning. Mr.

	Stout?
2	MR. STOUT: Yes, I can hear you.
3	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, so Mr. Stout,
4	you're going to be representing yourself today,
5	huh?
6	MR. STOUT: Yes, and I'm on a cell
7	phone. I don't have a camera.
8	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. Is
9	Ms. Benchimol on the line? Oh, there you are.
10	MS. BENCHIMOL: Yes, I'm here. I
11	apologize. I muted myself because my dog was
12	barking.
13	MS. FLETCHER: Oh, okay, thank you.
14	Thank you. Ms. Benchimol, would you please spell
15	your name for the record?
16	MS. BENCHIMOL: Yes, it's Elli or
17	Ellizabeth, E-L-L-I-Z-A-B-E-T-H and the last name
18	is Benchimol, B-E-N-C-H-I-M-O-L.
19	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Ms. Cruse,
20	would you spell your name for the record, please?
21	MS. CRUSE: Yes, Karen, K-A-R-E-N,
22	Cruse, C-R-U-S-E.
23	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. And Ms.
24	Lohse, you did already.
25	MS. LOHSE: LaVerne, did you need

1	something from us? It kind of broke up. I
2	couldn't hear you.
3	MS. FLETCHER: No.
4	MS. LOHSE: Okay, thank you. Sorry,
5	it just got very staticky on the phones.
6	MS. FLETCHER: Yeah, I could hear
7	that, and I see that is it Koohmaraie, the
8	pronunciation?
9	MR. KOOHMARAIE: Yes, Koohmaraie.
10	MS. FLETCHER: Could you spell your
11	name for the record, please?
12	MR. KOOHMARAIE: Sure, the last name
13	is K-O-O-H-M-A-R-A-I-E.
14	MS. FLETCHER: And the first name?
15	MR. KOOHMARAIE: My first name is
16	Saman, S-A-M-A-N.
17	MS. FLETCHER: And can you pronounce
18	your last name one more time for me, please?
19	MR. KOOHMARAIE: Koohmaraie.
20	MS. FLETCHER: Oh, it is Koohmaraie,
21	okay, thank you. Ms. Huber?
22	MS. HUBER: Yes?
23	MS. FLETCHER: Could you spell your
24	name for the record, please?
25	MS. HUBER: My first name is Lacey, L-

	A-C-E-1, last name nuber, H-U-B-E-R.
2	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Mr. Ghosh?
3	MR. GHOSH: Yes, good morning.
4	MS. FLETCHER: Good morning. Could
5	you please spell your name for the record?
6	MR. GHOSH: Yes, my first name is
7	Atish, A-T-I-S-H, last name is Ghosh, G-H-O-S-H.
8	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you.
9	MR. GHOSH: And this morning I'm also
10	representing my neighbor, Dr. Mahvash Qureshi, if
11	you want me to spell out her name as well.
12	MS. FLETCHER: Yes, thank you.
13	MR. GHOSH: Yes, so she's at 1415 27th
14	Street and her name is M-A-H-V-A-S-H, last name
15	Qureshi Q-U-R-E-S-H-I.
16	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. And
17	Danielle Dukowicz is also a part of your group.
18	I don't see her here today. Am I missing her?
19	MR. GHOSH: I don't know whether she
20	has joined this meeting, but
21	MS. FLETCHER: I don't see her. I'm
22	going to spell her name because I had mentioned
23	it. Her name is Danielle Dukowicz. Her name is
24	spelled D-A-N-I-E-L-L-E, Dukowicz is D-U-K-O-W-I-
25	C-Z.

1	I don't see Andrew Johnson. I'm
2	saying this out loud because this system is new
3	and I want to make sure I'm not missing anyone.
4	I don't see Andrew Johnson on the line.
5	And I just unmuted someone who called
6	in. Can you identify yourself, please? The
7	telephone number is 202-333. Those are the only
8	numbers that I can see.
9	MR. YAHN: 3971, Robert and Linda
10	Yahn, Y-A-H-N.
11	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. Mr.
12	Yahn?
13	MR. YAHN: Yes, we're just calling on
14	a landline. We have no video.
15	MS. FLETCHER: Oh, that's fine. I
16	just wanted to acknowledge that you're there.
17	MR. YAHN: Yes.
18	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, and so you
19	can hear me okay.
20	MR. YAHN: Yes.
21	MS. FLETCHER: So, Mr. Yahn, can you
22	spell your name for the record, please?
23	MR. YAHN: Robert, R-O-B-E-R-T, Yahn,
23 24	

There is also a caller on the line whose 1 much. 2 number begins 240-620. Can you identify 3 yourself, please? 4 COURT REPORTER: That's the reporter. 5 MS. FLETCHER: Oh, thank you. COURT REPORTER: If you --6 7 MS. FLETCHER: No, that's okay. Thank 8 Thank you very much. So, Mr. Yahn, can you you. 9 still hear me? 10 MR. YAHN: Yes, I can. 11 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. 12 so I'm first going to note that the establishment 13 is not located in the Georgetown moratorium zone. 14 I'm noting that for the record because 15 Georgetown has had a moratorium zone in the past, but the establishment is not located in the 16 17 moratorium zone. The Georgetown moratorium zone 18 has expired. 19 We have seven protestants. We have 20 the Citizens Association of Georgetown, which 21 does have standing as a protestant. ANC 2E does 22 have standing as a protestant. Ms. Cruse, you're 23 present on behalf of the Georgetown Citizens 24 Association?

Yes, I am.

MS. CRUSE:

MS. FLETCHER: And Ms. Lohse, you're present on behalf of ANC 2E?

MS. LOHSE: Yes, I am.

MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Ghosh, you're present on behalf -- well, let me start by saying there are three people in your protest group, yes?

MR. GHOSH: That's correct.

MS. FLETCHER: Before the Georgetown moratorium zone expired, there only needed to be three people to file a protest, but now that the Georgetown moratorium zone has expired, there would need to be a group of at least five. For that reason, I have to dismiss the group of three as a protestant.

You have the right to petition the ABC Board to reinstate your group of three as a protestant, but for the purpose of the roll call hearing today, the group of three is dismissed because at this point they would need to be a group of five.

MR. GHOSH: You know, we just combined in a group, not as a group of three or five, but just for the convenience of filing the protest, so, you know, these are three individuals in

addition to the other protestants, so it's not 1 2 that we are a group as such. It's just for 3 convenience, we combined our letters. So, your letter, there 4 MS. FLETCHER: 5 was one letter submitted signed by the three of 6 you? 7 MR. GHOSH: Correct. 8 MS. FLETCHER: And so what that means, 9 Mr. Ghosh, is that unless you each filed as 10 abutting property owners, then you are considered 11 a group of three. 12 You signed the same letter, and so 13 that's the reason that I determined that you were 14 a group of three, but in your protest letter, did 15 you all indicate that you were filing as abutting 16 property owners? 17 MR. GHOSH: We are adjacent property 18 owners. 19 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, well, what you 20 can do, if you want to petition the Board to 21 reinstate your protest, you can inform them of 22 that in your letter seeking reinstatement. I don't see -- I didn't see in your 23 24 protest letter where you were filing based on

being abutting property owners. You appear to be

a group of three by the fact that there was one 1 2 letter signed by three people, so that's how I 3 came to that conclusion. So, I'm going to dismiss the group of 4 5 three, Mr. Ghosh, but you can petition the ABC 6 Board to reinstate the group of three and they 7 will make a decision about that, but for the 8 purposes of the roll call hearing, the group of 9 three is dismissed. We now have Mr. Koohmaraie. 10 Is that 11 the correct pronunciation? 12 MR. KOOHMARAIE: Yes, Koohmaraie, and 13 I'm here on behalf of my brother. He's the owner 14 of the property, so I'm just representing his 15 interests. 16 MS. FLETCHER: Yeah, we received a 17 letter from your brother designating you as the 18 representative. Your brother, could you spell 19 his first name? 20 MR. KOOHMARAIE: Sure, his first name 21 is S-I-A-V-A-S-H. 22 Okay, and can you spell MS. FLETCHER: 23 his last name, please? 24 MR. KOOHMARAIE: K-O-O-H-M-A-R-A-I-E. 25 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, Mr. Siavash

1	Koohmaraie does have standing as an abutting
2	property owner. Mr. Stout?
3	MR. STOUT: Yes?
4	MS. FLETCHER: You and Beverly Stout
5	have standing as abutting property owners.
6	MR. STOUT: Thank you.
7	MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Yahn?
8	MR. YAHN: Yes?
9	MS. FLETCHER: You and Linda Yahn have
10	standing as abutting property owners.
11	MR. YAHN: Thank you.
12	MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Huber?
13	MS. HUBER: Yes?
14	MS. FLETCHER: You have standing as an
15	abutting property owner.
16	MS. HUBER: Yes, thank you.
17	MS. FLETCHER: Andrew Johnson wrote a
18	protest, but he is not present today. Just for
19	the record, Mr. Johnson is dismissed because his
20	letter basically is a letter of concern.
21	It doesn't indicate that he's filing
22	a protest. It's a letter of stating his
23	concerns, but no place in his letter does it
24	state that he is filing a protest against the
25	application for the

No, no, it's fine. 1 MR. GHOSH: 2 MS. FLETCHER: Who was that, Mr. 3 Ghosh? MR. GHOSH: Excuse me, I need to mute 4 5 myself. MS. FLETCHER: Oh. 6 7 MR. GHOSH: Well, at some point, could 8 you inform us exactly how we do the reinstatement 9 process? 10 MS. FLETCHER: Oh, I will. Thank you. 11 MR. GHOSH: Thank you. 12 MS. FLETCHER: Let me just do that 13 What's going to happen, Mr. Ghosh, is that 14 you're going to receive a Board order dismissing 15 the protest for the reason that I stated. The 16 order will give you the option to seek 17 reinstatement within ten days upon receipt of the 18 order. 19 So, you should do that, and if you 20 seek reinstatement of the order, you would need 21 to copy the applicant, Ms. Benchimol, or Goth 22 Wine Limited on your request for reinstatement so 23 that they have an opportunity to respond to your 24 request for reinstatement. 25 MR. GHOSH: Do all three of us have to

do it individually? Because we were never told 1 2 that we have to do individual protests. 3 assumed that this is, indeed, the three individual protests. 4 5 MS. FLETCHER: Well --(Simultaneous speaking.) 6 7 MS. FLETCHER: Well, if there was 8 still a Georgetown moratorium zone, the group of 9 three would have been fine, because when there 10 was a moratorium zone in Georgetown, only three 11 people needed to file a protest. 12 If it's not in a moratorium zone, the 13 establishment, if it's not in the Georgetown 14 moratorium zone, then there has to be a group of 15 at least five. 16 MR. GHOSH: I understand that, but, 17 you know, the other abutting neighbors who have 18 already done their individual protests presumably 19 add to our group, right, or no? 20 MS. FLETCHER: No, no, they filed as 21 individuals. Each one of them filed their own

MS. FLETCHER: No, no, they filed as individuals. Each one of them filed their own protest as an individual abutting property owner, so they're not a part of a group.

MR. GHOSH: Very well, so my only question really is so the three of us have to

1	individually request reinstatement or
2	MS. FLETCHER: Yes, well, so the
3	MR. GHOSH: with three different
4	letters
5	MS. FLETCHER: You can
6	MR. GHOSH: just to be clear?
7	MS. FLETCHER: So, you can make it
8	just the three of you in one letter because you
9	filed your protest as a group of three based on
10	the letter you submitted.
11	There was one letter and you each
12	signed the same letter. So, you can seek
13	reinstatement the same way, so it doesn't have to
14	be three individual letters because you didn't
15	file your protest that way.
16	MR. GHOSH: Very well, okay, thank
17	you.
18	MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome.
19	MR. GHOSH: Could you also advise us
20	of the email address or contact address for the
21	applicant since we're supposed to copy them?
22	MS. FLETCHER: So, Ms. Benchimol, do
23	you want to do that offline or I can provide your
24	email address to Mr. Ghosh if you like?
25	MS. BENCHIMOL: I can provide it now.

1	It's fine. It's very simple. It's just
2	elli@aperodc.com, which is our DBA now.
3	MR. GHOSH: Okay, thank you both.
4	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, so I'm just going
5	to summarize the protestants in this matter. We
6	have the Citizens Associations of Georgetown, ANC
7	2E, Mr. Siavash Koohmaraie, Robert Stout and
8	Beverly Stout, Robert Yahn, Linda Yahn, Lacey
9	Huber. Andrew Johnson is dismissed as a
10	protestant, as well as the group of three. Does
11	anybody have any questions at all? We need to
12	set a date for
13	MR. YAHN: Hello?
14	MS. FLETCHER: Hello?
15	MR. YAHN: Hello?
16	MS. FLETCHER: Hello?
17	MR. YAHN: This is Robert Yahn.
18	MS. FLETCHER: Yes?
19	MR. YAHN: I have had contact with Mr.
20	Andrew Johnson. Since he is being dismissed,
21	will he also receive a letter advising him of the
22	reinstatement process?
23	MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
24	MR. YAHN: All right, thank you.
25	MS. FLETCHER: He'll also receive a

Board order --1 2 MR. YAHN: Thank you. 3 MS. FLETCHER: -- the same as the one I described to Mr. Ghosh. You're welcome. 4 We 5 need to set a date for mediation, but first I'm able to give you your status hearing in this 6 7 case. The status hearing in this case is set 8 9 for December 10, December 10 at 1:30, at 1:30 10 a.m. for the status hearing. 11 PARTICIPANT: Now, wait, that's not 12 a.m. It's p.m. 13 PARTICIPANT: P.M. 14 PARTICIPANT: P.M. 15 MS. FLETCHER: Did I say a.m.? 16 PARTICIPANT: Yes. 17 MS. FLETCHER: Let me put my glasses 18 That's 1:30 p.m. I will give you the next on. 19 available day for mediation. The next available 20 day for mediation is Tuesday -- no, actually, 21 that's not good. 22 The next available day is Thursday, November 12 at 9:00, 10:00, 11:00, 1:00, 2:00, 23 24 pretty much any time that morning or early

1	10:00? Is everybody good for 10:00?
2	MR. YAHN: Any time is good for us
3	PARTICIPANT: Yes.
4	MR. YAHN: for the Yahns.
5	MR. STOUT: What's the purpose of the
6	mediation hearing?
7	MS. FLETCHER: Oh, I'm sorry. Yeah,
8	the purpose of the mediation so you filed a
9	protest. Our procedure requires you to
10	participate in mediation to attempt to resolve
11	the matter prior to a protest hearing.
12	If you're able to resolve the matter,
13	then you enter into a settlement agreement that
14	resolves your concerns, that's mutually
15	acceptable to all. And who am I speaking with
16	right now?
17	MR. STOUT: This is Robert Stout.
18	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, so, Mr. Stout,
19	you are an abutting property owner, so let me
20	make I should say this right now as well. So,
21	there are numerous abutting property owners in
22	this case.
23	If you are an abutting property owner
24	and you're not a part of a group, you're a stand
25	alone. What that means, Mr. Stout, is that if

you enter into an agreement with the establishment, then that agreement is between you and the establishment, and the other abutting property owners can proceed.

So, the independent abutting property owners stand alone. You're not a part of a group, but if the abutting property owners were to decide that they wanted to enter into the same agreement as all of the other parties, then we can do it that way as well. That will be a choice that you have.

There are numerous protestants in this case because there are numerous abutting property owners. You don't have to sign the same agreement as the Citizens Association or the same one as ANC 2E. You can decide that you'd rather enter into some other type of agreement.

Ideally, all of the issues can be resolved at the same time in the same document, but it's not a requirement for an abutting property owner.

MR. STOUT: All right, if I am unable to make that meeting on the 12th, can I have a representative there then?

MS. FLETCHER: Well, ideally, you

1	would be present to speak on your own behalf
2	during a mediation. If that's not a good day,
3	then we can make it another day. The ideal
4	situation is that you would be present. So, what
5	would you prefer, to send someone on your behalf
6	who has the authority to enter into a settlement
7	agreement?
8	MR. STOUT: Yes, I would.
9	MS. FLETCHER: Is that only for the
10	12th or would that apply to any other day?
11	MR. STOUT: Any other day.
12	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, so no matter what
13	the day is, you're going to be sending someone to
14	represent you in mediation?
15	MR. STOUT: Yes, most definitely.
16	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, you're present
17	today, so that's fine. Just a second. Let me
18	make a note.
19	MR. STOUT: And in my protest letter,
20	I designated Robert Yahn.
21	MS. FLETCHER: You designed Mr. Yahn
22	to represent you at roll call. Are you
23	designating Mr. Yahn to represent you in
24	mediation as well?
25	MR. STOUT: Yes.

1	MS. FLETCHER: Mr. Yahn, are you still
2	on the line?
3	MR. YAHN: Yes, I am.
4	MS. FLETCHER: So, is that okay with
5	you?
6	MR. YAHN: Yes.
7	MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. Just
8	one second, please. Okay, so I have made a note
9	of that. So, Mr. Yahn, is November 12 okay for
10	you?
11	MR. YAHN: That's fine.
12	MS. FLETCHER: What about you, Mr.
13	Cruse?
14	MS. CRUSE: That's fine.
15	MS. FLETCHER: Is 10:00 okay for you
16	as well?
17	MS. CRUSE: Yes, it is.
18	MS. FLETCHER: Ms. Lohse, what about
19	you?
20	MS. LOHSE: Yes, I'm good. This is
21	Gwen Lohse, yes.
22	MS. FLETCHER: And Mr. Koohmaraie?
23	MR. KOOHMARAIE: Yes, that's fine.
24	MS. FLETCHER: It's okay for Mr. Yahn.
25	Ms. Huber, what about you?

1	MS. HUBER: I actually won't be able
2	to attend on the 12th, but I've also been in
3	contact with Mr. Yahn, so if he doesn't mind, he
4	can also represent my opinion there too.
5	MS. FLETCHER: Is that okay for you,
6	Mr. Yahn?
7	MR. YAHN: Yes, thank you.
8	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
9	Okay, so mediation is set for Thursday, November
10	12 at 10:00. It's going to be by Webex as well,
11	so I'll send you an invitation for that also, so
12	I'll see you then. Any other questions?
13	PARTICIPANTS: Thank you.
14	MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much.
15	MR. GHOSH: Quick question, LaVerne?
16	MS. FLETCHER: Yes?
17	MR. GHOSH: This is Mr. Ghosh. So,
18	since we don't have standing anymore, we are not
19	invited to the mediation
20	MS. FLETCHER: That's right.
21	MR. GHOSH: until we are
22	reinstated, is that correct?
23	MS. FLETCHER: That's exactly right.
24	Thanks for asking that.
25	MR. GHOSH: Very good.

1 MS. FLETCHER: So, if you are 2 reinstated by then, I'll contact you --3 MR. GHOSH: Very good. 4 MS. FLETCHER: -- or you can contact 5 me and let me know you've been reinstated, but most likely I'll know if you were, but you can 6 7 let me know. 8 MR. GHOSH: Very good. 9 MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. MR. GHOSH: Since this is just in ten 10 11 days' time, I mean, how quickly does the Board 12 respond to a request for reinstatement? 13 MS. FLETCHER: So, this is Mr. Ghosh 14 speaking? 15 Yes, yes, sorry. MR. GHOSH: 16 MS. FLETCHER: The Board meets on 17 Wednesdays, so the Board will meet on --18 actually, they're going to meet on the 5th this 19 week. So, the Board meets once a week. 20 If you were to get your request for 21 reinstatement in by tomorrow around noon, that 22 may very well go on the Board's agenda for 23 Thursday, and they will make a decision on it, 24 your petition, on Thursday. That would give --

if they approve it, then you would be able to

participate in the mediation on the 12th.

MR. GHOSH: Very well. I must say I find it a bit strange that, you know, we sent this letter more than a month ago and nobody said at the time, well, you need five people to sign because it's being considered a group letter.

We actually just thought of it as, you know, for convenience because of COVID and people not being here, that it was just more convenient to write one letter, and now we're told we have basically 24 hours to file a reinstatement. This is not a very fair process if I may say so.

MS. FLETCHER: Well, so, Mr. Ghosh, once you file a protest, you have a right to a roll call hearing, and so we had to invite you to the hearing today.

In terms of the turnaround for the mediation, you actually do have time to ask the Board to reinstate your protest. It doesn't have to be a long petition. It's just a matter of saying I was dismissed at roll call on November 2. I'm asking you to reinstate our protest because.

It just needs to be a couple of sentences. It doesn't have to be a lot. I'm

1 just letting you know it's not very burdensome to 2 request the petition for reinstatement if that 3 helps. 4 MR. GHOSH: Very well. Well, we'll 5 just have to proceed. Just to be clear though, we cannot be invited by the other protestants to 6 the mediation even if we don't have standing as 7 8 their advisor or, not representative, by as their 9 advisors? 10 MS. FLETCHER: No, because of 11 confidentiality. Mediation is a confidential 12 process that can only be attended by the parties 13 that have been granted standing. 14 MR. GHOSH: I see. Okay, thank you. 15 MS. FLETCHER: You're welcome. 16 other questions at all? Okay, then this roll 17 call hearing is concluded. Feel free to leave 18 the roll call hearing and I'm going to call the 19 next case.
