MS. FLETCHER: This is Case No. 20-PRO-00047, Handle 19 Inc., t/a as Handle 19, 319 Pennsylvania Avenue, SE, License No. ABRA-117027. This is a Retailer Class CR, a New Application.

My name is LaVerne Fletcher, conducting the roll call hearing as the Board's agent. The protest issues in this case are adverse impact on peace, order, and quiet, residential parking and vehicular and pedestrian safety, and real property values.

Present on behalf of Handle 19, please. Mr. Thomas, you're the attorney representing Handle 19?

MR. THOMAS: That's correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Could you please state your name and spell it for the record.

MR. THOMAS: Absolutely. My name is Ian, I-A-N, last name Thomas, T-H-O-M-A-S. And I'm representing for Handle 19, the Applicant.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Mr. August, would you please state your name and spell it for the record.

MR. AUGUST: Yes, ma'am, Shane August.

First name Shane, S-H-A-N-E, last name August like the month, A-U-G-U-S-T.

MS. FLETCHER: And Mr. August, you're also present on behalf of the Applicant?

MR. AUGUST: Yes, present on behalf of Handle 19, ma'am.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Mr.
Monaghan, you're present on behalf of the Walter B. Quetsch? I'll spell Walter B. Quetsch until we get Mr. Monaghan back on the line. Walter B. Quetsch is spelled W-A-L-T-E-R B like boy, Q-U --

MR. MONAGHAN: Mr. Quetsch, 310 C Street, SE. Walter, W-A-L-T-E-R, Quetsch, Q-U --

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, can you spell Mr. Quetsch's name for the record.

MR. MONAGHAN: Walter Quetsch. Can you hear me?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. MONAGHAN: Okay. Walter Quetsch, W-A-L-T-E-R Quetsch, Q-U-E-T-S-C-H.

MS. FLETCHER: And so Mr. Monaghan, you're coming in and out a little, but I'll spell his last name for the Court Reporter. It's Q-U-E-T-S-C-H.

MR. MONAGHAN: Correct.

MS. FLETCHER: And Mr. Monaghan, could you please spell your name for the record.

MR. MONAGHAN: Eric Monaghan, E-R-I-C M-O-N-A-G-H-A-N,

MS. FLETCHER: And you're representing Mr. -- you're representing Mr. Quetsch?

MR. MONAGHAN: That's correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Mr. Bhadelia, still there?

MR. BHADELIA: Hi, how are you? First name is Ahmed, A-H-M-E-D, and last name is Bhadelia, $B$ as in boy, H-A-D as in David, E-L-IA.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. Mr. Ready, you're here from ANC 6C?

MR. READY: Yes. Spell my last name for you?

MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. READY: The last name is spelled R-E-A-D-Y.

MS. FLETCHER: And the first name is B-R-I-A-N? Mr. Ready? For the record, Mr. Ready's first name is spelled B-R-I-A-N.

MR. READY: Yes, sorry.
MS. FLETCHER: That's okay. Thank
you. Mr. Wise.
MR. WISE: Yes.
MS. FLETCHER: You're here on behalf of a group of 14?

MR. WISE: That's correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Would you please spell your name for the record.

MR. WISE: Sure. First name is Brian, B-R-I-A-N, last name is Wise, W-I-S-E.

MS. FLETCHER: Are there any other individuals from your group present today?

MR. WISE: We were told we could only have one.

MS. FLETCHER: That's fine.
MR. WISE: So no.
MS. FLETCHER: I'm just checking to make sure I didn't miss anybody.

MR. WISE: Sure.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. There are four protestants -- there are four protestants -Mr. Monaghan, can you -- okay, I was hearing some background noise. So Mr. Monaghan, it looks like you may have your computer not on mute. And I'll continue. The group of 14 is granted conditional standing.

What that means, Mr. Wise, is that you're present today, and at the upcoming status hearing at least four more individuals from your group need to appear in person in order for the Board to grant full standing. Any questions about that, Mr. Wise?

MR. WISE: No questions, thank you.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. Mr. Quetsch does have standing as an abutting property owner.

Mr. Monaghan, Mr. Quetsch is not here today, you're here on his behalf. At an upcoming mediation and status hearing, I know that you're his power of attorney, do you know if Mr. Quetsch will be able to appear for the mediation or the status hearing? Or will you be appearing for him for both?

MR. MONAGHAN: I'll be appearing for him.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Well, he does have standing as a protestant. Mr. Bhadelia, you do have standing as an abutting property owner. And just so that you know, the abutting property owners have been granted standing based on the DC geographic information
system.
Mr. Ready, ANC 6C does have standing as a protestant. Have I left out anyone? It does not appear so --

MR. THOMAS: I believe, I'm sorry, I believe it's 6B, not 6C is the ANC.

MS. FLETCHER: Is it 6B and not C?
MR. THOMAS: Correct, correct.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. That is correct, $I$ made that change. We need to set a date for a mediation and a status hearing. The actual date of the status hearing has not been set yet. So we're going to set a date for mediation, and you'll be notified of the date of the status hearing, and a protest hearing as well if this matter is not resolved in mediation.

I'll give you the next available date for mediation. The next available day for mediation is Tuesday, December 1 at 9:00, 10:00, 11:00, 12:00 or 1:00. Pretty much any time that day prior to 2:00 p.m. That's on Tuesday, November 1 -- December 1, Tuesday.

MR. MONAGHAN: December.
MS. FLETCHER: Yes.
MR. THOMAS: I believe that's fine for
the Applicant.
MS. FLETCHER: Okay, thank you. Mr. Wise, what about you, December 1?

MR. WISE: Yeah, is this a hearing that I will need the other four -- four others involved with that?

MS. FLETCHER: No, you may appear for the mediation on behalf of the group.

MR. WISE: Okay, yeah, that's fine. Any time after 10 o'clock is fine.

MS. FLETCHER: Any time after 10:00? What about --

MR. WISE: One o'clock would be perfect? Okay, thank you. Mr. Thomas and Mr. August, is one o'clock okay for you on December 1?

MR. AUGUST: It is, yes.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Mr. Monaghan, what about you?

MR. MONAGHAN: December 1 at one p.m.?
MS. FLETCHER: Yes. Does that work
for you?
MR. MONAGHAN: That'll work.
MS. FLETCHER: Thank you, and Mr. Bhadelia?

MR. BHADELIA: One p.m. on the first works for me as well.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you very much. Mr. Ready, what about you?

MR. READY: December 1, Tuesday at one p.m. is good for the ANC.

MS. FLETCHER: Thank you. Mediation is set for Tuesday, December 1 at one. You'll receive a WebEx invitation to attend the mediation, just like you did today.

Does anyone have any questions at all?
Okay, then the roll call hearing is concluded, and thank you for participating. And I'll see you in mediation on December 1 at one.
