3	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: The next case on
4	our calendar is Case No. 20-PRO-00045, Logan
5	Circle Liquors, License No. 86950. Ms. Andrews,
6	can you please elevate the rights of the parties
7	in this case, please?
8	MS. ANDREWS: Sure, stand by. Mr.
9	Jackson, your rights have been elevated. I'm not
10	sure how to pronounce but Mr. or Ms. Ketema, your
11	rights have been elevated. Ms. Vikan, your
12	rights have been elevated. Ms. Burnell, your
13	rights have been elevated. Ms. Byrne, your
14	rights have been elevated. Mr. Litner, your
15	rights have been elevated. Ms. Rutledge, your
16	rights have been elevated. Mr. Watkins, your
17	rights have been elevated. Mr. Murphy, your
18	rights have been elevated. Ms. Cruse, your
19	rights have been elevated. And that's all, Mr.
20	Chair.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Ms.
22	Andrews. I would like the parties to introduce
23	themselves. I will start with the Licensee. Can
24	you please identify yourself and spell your name
25	and your affiliation?

MR. JACKSON: Jeff Jackson representing 1 2 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I see that --4 MR. JACKSON: Jeff Jackson representing 5 the Applicant. 6 (Simultaneous speaking.) 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: - Mr. Jackson. 8 I'm sorry? 9 MR. JACKSON: Jeff Jackson representing the Applicant. 10 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is the Licensee 12 on the line with you? 13 MR. JACKSON: Yes. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who is the 15 Licensee? Can the Licensee identify themselves? 16 MR. JACKSON: I just saw him, Mr. 17 Singh. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, who 19 is the licensee? 20 MR. JACKSON: Singh, S-I-N-G-H. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Is the Licensee 21 22 on the line? 23 MR. JACKSON: Yes, he is. I just saw him. 24 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, can the

Licensee please identify -- can the Licensee 1 2 please speak and --3 MR. JACKSON: I just saw him. I'm trying to see him again. 4 5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right, but - all right, Mr. Jackson, I don't - but I know 6 7 that you - I know you are the representative. Who is the Licensee? 8 9 MR. JACKSON: Mr. Singh. He was on the 10 line just a few minutes ago. His picture was --11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's fine. 12 What's his first and last name, Mr. Jackson? What's his first and last name? Mr. Jackson, 13 what is his first and last name? 14 15 MR. JACKSON: That's him right there. There he go right there. 16 17 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can Mr. Singh 18 please speak up? I don't see him, so I don't 19 know. Can the Licensee identify themselves for 20 the record? 21 MR. KETEMA: Yeah, Mr. Estegenet G. 22 Ketema. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Sir, you have 24 been in front of my face this entire time and I 25 have been asking you to identify yourself and you

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1 haven't said nothing. Can you please --2 MR. KETEMA: Yeah, Mr. Estegenet 3 Ketema. I am the owner of the business. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can you please 4 5 spell your first name and please spell your last name, sir? 6 7 MR. KETEMA: My first name is E-T-S-E-8 G-E-N-E-T K-E-T-E-M-A. 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, sir. You've been there the entire time and I've been 10 11 asking you to identify yourself and you just sat 12 there and didn't say nothing. 13 MR. KETEMA: Yes, I didn't hear you 14 correctly, that's why. I thought you were 15 talking to somebody else. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, sir. 17 MR. KETEMA: I apologize for that. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Let me have the 18 19 -- hold on a minute, please. Let me have the ANC 20 represent themselves. Let me hear from the ANC 21 representative please. 22 MR. MURPHY: Yes, Rick Murphy, ANC 2E. 23 I represent single-member district 3 and ANC 2E. 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. What 25 about the Citizens Association of Georgetown?

MS. CRUSE: Good afternoon. 1 Karen 2 Cruse representing the Citizens Association. 3 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And then we have 4 the group of five or more. Who is the designee 5 for the group? Who is representing the group? Can we have all the group members 6 7 (Simultaneous speaking.) MS. GEBREMESKEL: Hello? 8 9 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Can someone from 10 the group speak? There's a lot of folks on the 11 line. Can someone -- can you just open your 12 microphone and speak, please? 13 MR. LITNER: Yes, Nicole Vikan is the 14 representative for the group. She appears to be 15 having a technology problem. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Nicole who? 16 17 MR. LITNER: Vikan, V-I-K-A-N. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who else is here 18 19 for the group? MS. GEBREMESKEL: Hello? Hello? 20 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, who 22 -- identify yourself please. MS. GEBREMESKEL: Yes, I'm from Wonder 23 24 My name is Adanech. Hello? I'm going to Mart. 25 present --

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who are you?
2	Can you spell your name and who are you?
3	MS. GEBREMESKEL: Yes. My name is
4	Adanech, A-D-A-N-E-C-H and last name G-E-B-E-R-E-
5	M-E-S-K-E-L. I'm from Wonder Mart.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, Miss.
7	You're not for this case. I have not called your
8	case just yet. Ms. Adanech, this is not for that
9	case. I need you to take off your microphone. I
10	have not called your cases yet, okay? I have not
11	called your cases yet.
12	MR. LITNER: This is Stephen Litner,
13	Mr. Anderson. There are people from our
14	neighborhood who are working on this. The
15	participants are Nicole Vikan, who has been
16	online. There is also Sue Rutledge, who's been
17	online. There is Tarleton Watkins, who has been
18	online. We have people online and they have been
19	waiting the whole time. I just think there is a
20	technology problem at the moment, sir.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's fine. In
22	this particular case, the group would get
23	standing at the roll call hearing, so we're fine
24	as long as we have someone who's speaking for the
25	group, we're fine. There are some cases where,

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like the abutting property owner has to be there, 1 2 but as long as we have the representative from 3 the group, then we're fine. If anyone else wants 4 to identify them -- if they're able to identify 5 themselves for the record, please go ahead. Give me one minute, please. Hold on one minute, 6 7 please. All right, I'm back. I apologize. 8 MR. LITNER: Mr. Anderson, this is 9 Stephen Litner. Mr. Anderson, we also have one 10 other person from the group that's online that 11 you saw earlier on the screen, and this is 12 Meaghan Byrne. M-E-A-G-H-A-N B-Y-R-N-E is also 13 with us from the neighbors. 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you, Mr. 15 Litner. MR. LITNER: Ms. Vikan can hear now. 16 17 She's connected again. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: All right. So, 19 everyone, so all the group members have been 20 identified? All the folks who want to identify 21 themselves, they have been? Mr. Jackson? 22 MR. JACKSON: Yes? I hear you. 23 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Jackson, 24 please engage your camera. 25 MR. JACKSON: I don't have a camera on.

1	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Just engage your
2	camera please. Please, I need your attention to
3	this matter. Are there any preliminary matters
4	in this case.
5	MR. JACKSON: Sir, I'm having trouble.
6	Hello? I'm having trouble hearing. I can hear
7	you now.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Jackson, are
9	there any preliminary matters as far as your
10	client is concerned?
11	MR. JACKSON: I can't hear you.
12	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are there any
13	preliminary matters as Mr. Jackson, if you
14	(Simultaneous speaking.)
15	MR. JACKSON: Oh no, no. We
16	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: If you would
17	just turn on the camera you keep on moving
18	away. That's why we
19	MR. JACKSON: We're working on we're
20	trying (Inaudible.)
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Jackson,
22	just stay right there. I can see you, I can hear
23	you, but you keep on moving. That's why I can't
24	hear you.
25	MR. JACKSON: Oh I'm sorry.
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CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Mr. Jackson just 1 2 stay right there. Don't move. 3 MR. JACKSON: Okay. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: If you stay 4 right there I can see you and I can hear you. 5 Don't move, okay? 6 7 MR. JACKSON: Okay. I'm just having 8 trouble. I can't hear you guys -- (Telephonic 9 interference.) 10 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: No. 11 (Laughter.) I'm sorry, I'm sorry. 12 MR. JACKSON: We work -- (Telephonic 13 interference.) 14 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: This has been 15 I'm sorry. I'm turning my volume up. working. 16 We have not had any issues. Can you hear? Can 17 everyone hear me? 18 MR. JACKSON: I can, Chairman. 19 MS. CRUSE: Yes. 20 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Do we have any 21 preliminary matters from the ANC's perspective? 22 MR. LITNER: There are no preliminary matters from the ANC. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 23 24 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. What 25 about from the Citizens Association of

1 Georgetown? 2 MS. CRUSE: We have no preliminary 3 matters either, thank you. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I know the 4 5 representative Nicole Vikan, is she able to speak or will you speak for her, Mr. Litner? 6 7 MR. LITNER: My understanding is that Ms. Vikan is connected. If she's not connected I 8 9 can speak for her and clarify the participants. 10 Nicole, can you speak? She needs to be unmuted. 11 She just sent me a message. Can they unmute her? 12 MS. ANDREWS: Please provide the name. 13 If she's the call-in number, please provide the 14 number to me directly in the chat. 15 MR. LITNER: Her number. Just a 16 second, I will give it to you. 17 MR. WATKINS: Stephen, Mr. Anderson, 18 this is Tarleton Watkins. Her telephone number 19 is 917-406-00 --20 MS. ANDREWS: Don't say the whole phone 21 number. 22 MR. WATKINS: Okay. MS. ANDREWS: I don't think she's a 23 24 call-in. What's the name? 25 MR. WATKINS: It's Nicole Vikan.

1	MS. ANDREWS: Okay.
2	MS. VIKAN: Can you hear me?
3	MS. ANDREWS: Ms. Vikan, your rights
4	have been elevated.
5	MS. VIKAN: Yes, can you hear me?
6	Hello?
7	MS. ANDREWS: Yes, we can hear you.
8	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: We can hear you,
9	ma'am. Can you spell your name for the record
10	and identify yourself, please?
11	MS. VIKAN: Sure. My name is Nicole
12	I'm trying to start the video, too. My name is
13	Nicole Vikan. It's V as in Victor, I-K-A-N. My
14	first name is N-I-C-O-L-E.
15	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Are there any
16	preliminary matters you want to bring to our
17	attention?
18	MS. VIKAN: I don't believe so, sir.
19	We've been trying to arrange a date for
20	mediation, and we've had some trouble between Mr.
21	Litner's schedule and Mr. Jackson's schedule, so
22	we're just waiting to hear back from them about a
23	date for mediation.
24	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you. Can
25	I ask everyone if you're not speaking to put your

microphone on mute, please? Just unmute your 1 2 microphone when you need to speak. If you're not 3 speaking, please, because we've had some feedback. This matter will be scheduled for a 4 5 protest hearing at a date to be determined. But there are a lot of parties in this case who are 6 7 This is -protesting this case. 8 MR. JACKSON: I want to apologize for 9 leaving the camera so much, but I'm trying to 10 cook my kids' food. 11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: That's TMI, Mr. 12 TMI, Mr. Jackson. Jackson. I appreciate your 13 comment, but alright. 14 MR. JACKSON: And that ringing may be 15 cutting it out more. 16 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: I'm sorry, hold 17 There are a lot of parties in this case, and on. the Board supports -- if this is an establishment 18 19 that the residents of Georgetown would like to 20 operate in Georgetown, I would support us having 21 -- that the parties get together. I know you 22 haven't had mediation as yet, but I would support 23 either through mediation or that the parties meet 24 and try to come up with a settlement agreement if 25 you are able to do that.

1 The Board supports it. I'm not saying 2 that it's something that you must do, but if the 3 parties believe that this is an establishment that we want in our neighborhood, then I would 4 5 encourage that the parties get together and agree with some terms. If the parties are unable to do 6 7 that, then of course we will have a hearing 8 sometime in the new year and the Board will 9 listen to all the parties and then make a determination. But as I said before, if this 10 11 matter can be settled, the Board will appreciate 12 that, okay? Now that we have scheduled this matter 13 14 for a protest hearing, there are a few things 15 that I would like to instruct you about so that 16 the protest hearing is focused and addresses only 17 those issues that are being protested. You 18 either have already received or will soon be 19 receiving an email from Imani Moreland that 20 contains a copy of a Protest Information Form, 21 PIF, and a copy of an exhibit form. 22 Both parties are required to complete and submit the Protest Information Form and the 23

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exhibit form at least seven days before the date

of the hearing. If we do not receive a copy of

your form seven days before the hearing, your application or your protest may be subject to dismissal. These documents not only need to be submitted to ABRA, but to the opposing party, as well. Please note that these documents greatly assist the Board in narrowing the protest issues, facilitating the process and keeping the parties on point during the hearing.

9 Each side will be provided 90 minutes to present their case. This includes all direct 10 11 and cross-examination of witnesses. The Board 12 does not intend to hear testimony on matters that 13 are not relevant to these issues that are being 14 protested, nor will the Board tolerate repetitive 15 testimony. Are there any questions from anyone? 16 MR. JACKSON: No. 17 MS. VIKAN: I have a question sir. 18 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Who's speaking, 19 please? Identify yourself. MS. VIKAN: Nicole Vikan. 20 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes, Ms. Vikan. 22 MS. VIKAN: Okay, sir, my understanding is that we have this hearing if we can't come to 23 24 a settlement with a settlement agreement, right? 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Yes.

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1	MS. VIKAN: So do we prepare for the
2	hearing before we have the settlement agreement,
3	or do we update you again after we have a
4	settlement agreement if the parties agree
5	together.
6	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: What will occur
7	is that we would provide the parties can I
8	know you're going to have mediation. After you
9	have mediation you can continue speaking, you can
10	sign a settlement agreement. Ms. Vikan, who do
11	you represent?
12	MS. VIKAN: I represent the neighbors
13	who oppose having the liquor store.
14	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: So you are part
15	of the group.
16	MS. VIKAN: Yes, sir.
17	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Okay, If the ANC
18	signs a settlement agreement with the owner, then
19	your protest by law falls.
20	MS. VIKAN: Okay.
21	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: You are the only
22	one who would lose your right to protest the
23	matter if the ANC signs a settlement agreement.
24	If the ANC signs a settlement agreement, the
25	Citizens Association will continue to move

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forward because they have their own standing to 1 protest this matter. I would talk to the ANC to 2 3 make sure that if the ANC decides to settle this matter, that you can be part of it or that they 4 5 take your views in consideration. Because by law, if the ANC signs a settlement agreement with 6 7 the establishment, then your rights will 8 terminate there. That's just an FYI.

9 MS. VIKAN: Even if we have five or 10 more people?

11 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right, because 12 the statute states that if there is a settlement 13 agreement with an ANC, the group falls. The only 14 one that would remain would be an abutting 15 property owner or a citizens association because 16 the way it's looked at is by saying that as a group you are part of the ANC. The ANC is 17 18 representing your interests as a group per se. 19 MS. VIKAN: If one of us is an abutting 20 property owner, that person still has standing? 21 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Only if you were 22 granted standing at the roll call hearing. So, 23 when you went to the Roll Call, did you protest 24 this establishment as an abutting property owner? 25 MS. VIKAN: No, because we did it as a

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group of five or more. 1 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Right. 2 No. 3 Now, if you did not protest it as an abutting 4 property owner, then you have lost that right, 5 then you cannot --MS. VIKAN: Who? 6 7 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: -- because you 8 are part of the group and so therefore your 9 rights fall. If you had protested it as an 10 abutting property owner, even if the ANC had 11 signed a settlement agreement, you could continue 12 on with your protest. 13 MS. VIKAN: Oh wow. Yeah, can you tell me where to find all these details? Because I 14 15 thought I had done my research, but I did not know about that distinction so I want to make 16 17 sure I have all the information before the next 18 thing happens. 19 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Well, what I 20 would ask you to do is at the end of this hearing 21 you can contact our Assistant General Counsel, 22 April Randall. 23 MS. VIKAN: April has been very 24 helpful, yes. 25 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Talk to her.

Talk to her since you have her information. She
can give you further information that you
require.

MS. VIKAN: Okay.

5 CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: And whatever questions you have about -- all the parties, 6 7 whatever questions you have about the process, 8 please speak to Ms. Randall. She is very 9 helpful. Our legal office is here to help all 10 sides to provide whatever information they can. Since you've already been in contact with her, 11 12 she can provide you whatever other information 13 that you require, okay?

> MS. VIKAN: Okay, thank you. CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you for

16 your questions. Unless there are any other issues, I'm going to adjourn this hearing. 17 Ι 18 want to thank you. I apologize for the technical 19 issues, but I want to thank everyone for their 20 participation. I want to wish everyone a happy 21 and safe holiday season. If I do not see this 22 protest in the new year, the Board will not take 23 it personally. We will take it that the parties 24 were able to work their differences out. Good 25 luck. If I see you in the new year then we'll

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1	see you in the new year, and we'll move forward
2	with this matter, okay?
3	MS. VIKAN: Thank you, sir.
4	CHAIRPERSON ANDERSON: Thank you very
5	much then. Have a great day.
6	MS. CRUSE: Thank you.
7	MR. JACKSON: Thank you.
8	(Whereupon, the above-entitled matter
9	went off the record at 3:10 p.m.)
